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### Hoteliers Explain Attraction Of 'Low Season' At Coast

SPITE the growing influx of tourists, there is still a coast hotel which offers a bed allocation for residents throughout the year.

This comment was made by Fritz Gubler, the general manager of Severin Sea Hotel when he was explaining how a group of local travel agents made leading coastal hotel made a point of keeping a year-round quota of beds so that local people need not feel they had been excluded in favour of tourists.

The chief executive went on to explain how with the "low season" coming up, it was possible to stay at a very low cost at the coast in a five star hotel and to enjoy the full benefits and facilities.

In answer to the questions over the winter during the low season, Mr Gubler pointed out that although there could be a day of heavy rain, such heavy showers normally fall in the early morning or evening but it was rare to have a day without sunshine.

He emphasised that once Easter was over, local people had a chance to avail themselves of the opportunity to obtain reservations and bookings without difficulty, and in fact this period was often chosen by corporations to hold low cost seminars for their staff to visit the Kenyan coast.

He noted that the Severin Sea Hotel with 360 beds and a small conference facility was ideal for upcountry groups to use during the low season.

### TOUR OPERATORS

He added that as vice chairman of the Hotel Keepers Association (coast region), he was normally committed to endorse and ensure that residents could get a chance to enjoy the coast whenever possible, hence he welcomed any moves made by companies, groups, or individuals to promote the low season.

As his corporation will be participating in the Sarit Centre holiday exhibition during March 29-31, he said that he looked forward to meeting many of the tour operators and travel agents based in Nairobi, as well as those individuals interested in having a holiday at the coast.

He strongly commended the initiative of the Sarit Centre management on organising such an exhibition each year and felt that this idea helped many local people to decide where to have a holiday, and such was very educational.

# The Chinese Connection!

## SHENZHEN ELECTRONICS ESTABLISH MOMBASA UNIT

HUNDREDS OF NEW EMPLOYMENT opportunities are expected to be available in Mombasa with the proposed opening of a modern electronic assembly factory — jointly financed by Kenyan and Chinese investors in the 'Ken-Shen Electronic Group'.

This most recent commercial proposition has been confirmed in Mombasa by China's Shenzhen Electronics Group Vice-President Tao Yan Nim, when he paid a courtesy call on Mayor Coun. Ahmed Mwidani, in his parlour.

Accompanied by the project manager Mrs Margaret Hu and Deputy Director Kong Haozhou, Mr Tao Yan Nim, said the proposed new enterprise would be 51 per cent Kenyan owned.

Initial developments costs are set at approximately Shs. 50 million.

Production and assembly plans are to develop a local and export market for wide range of Kenyan assembled electronic goods and appliances.

These might include video cassette recorders, television sets and, even, childrens' toys.

Mayor Mwidani pledged that if the proposed factory 'got off the ground' the Kenyan and Chinese investors could rely on every possible assistance from the Municipality.

Hon. Shariff Nassir, KANU Mombasa chairman, announced that he had a direct interest in the proposed factory, and went on to comment.

"The establishment of this type of company in Kenya clearly reflects His Excellency President Daniel Arap Moi's desire for constructive and viable friendship between Kenya and other nations."

When in full production the Ken-Zhen operation would be expected to employ a labour force in excess of five hundred, and producing at least 153 electronic items.

### PARLIAMENTARY

The new project has arisen as a direct result of the recent Kenyan Parliamentary visit to China, and fits in with a new out-going policy being sought by Chinese politicians and the industrial sector.

The President of Shenzhen Electronics Ma Fu-Yuan noted in a message to the Mayor and Hon. Shariff Nassir.

"The policy of our country is to have flexible economy at home and to open China to the outside world.

"We will work to develop friendship with our old friends and also make new friends".

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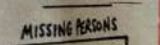

# DATELINE: DAR ES SALAAM JOINT VENTURE FOR CONTINENTAL SERVICES

TANZANIA and four other countries are planning to initiate a joint venture airline project for inter-continental air services. The five countries, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Botswana and Tanzania have signed a 'declaration of intent' in Arusha thereby endorsing a proposal for the joint use of wide-bodied aircraft on international routes.

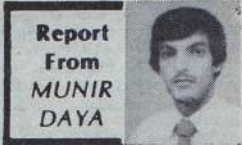
At the Arusha meeting, all countries were represented by their ministers responsible for communications and the session was also attended by government delegations from Lesotho and Malawi and observers from several financial and air transportation organisations in the region.

It is now expected that Chief Executives from each of the participating countries airlines will form a steering committee which will then come up with policy options to establish the joint venture aircraft organisation.

At the meeting, the urgency of the project was noted and assistance will be sought from the African Development Bank, The East African Development Bank and from other financial agencies so as to ensure quick implementation. The coordination of the project will be done by Tanzania.

The Minister pointed out that most African national airline carriers are not economically sound have to put in great risks when making big investments especially because of competition from established carriers in the aviation field.

Nyanganyi said that in the past two decades, a lot of emphasis had been put on air transport cooperation under the auspices of the Organisation of African Unity (OAU) and other specialised regional organisations. He said that the proposed joint venture project would be another chapter in the history of Africa and an important milestone in the economic liberation of the African continent.

Under the joint venture, it is anticipated that the airlines will jointly use wide-bodied aircraft such as the Boeing 747, Boeing 767, DC 10 or an Airbus so as to consolidate their market.

The Tanzanian Minister for Communications, Mustafa Nyanganyi, who chaired the Arusha meeting said that the proposed venture is likely to face stiff competition. The Minister however acclaimed the proposed move saying that this will enable joint buying of high technology aircraft which the countries in Eastern and Southern Africa cannot afford alone.

The Airline had planned to operate two flights a week to Europe and Asia following a Government directive at the end of 1985 asking it to study the viability of embarking on long range flights.

The joint venture move is now expected to supersede the Tanzanian carrier's earlier plans.

Meanwhile, the British transnational firm, LONRHO, has concluded a study on the viability of extending the National Electricity grid so as to extend power to the tea plantations in Mufindi district of Iringa region.

## FUEL IMPORTS

The project will cost about 90 million shillings but will save the country close to 9 million shillings in foreign exchange which is presently being spent every year for fuel imports to run tea curing plants and power generators, on the plantations.

It is estimated that the tea plantations use 1.7 million litres of diesel to run the curing plants and power generators each year. Through the project, the Tanzania Electric Supply Company (TANESCO) will earn an estimated revenue of over 22 million shillings, in tariffs, every year.

# PRICE INCREASES FOR FOODSTUFFS

RESIDENTS of Zanzibar will have to dig deeper into their pockets following an increase in the price structure of foodstuffs which was announced this week by the Zanzibar Price Commission.

The prices for the items, which include sugar, wheat, flour and rice have been raised by an average 21 per cent. This is the second time in four months that the Zanzibar Government has raised prices for the commodities in a move, apparently to bridge the gap created by the devaluation of the shilling last June and the present increased costs of importation of the items in face of an appreciation of the dollar against the Tanzania shilling.

Previous adjustments to the foodstuff price were made last December on the basis of an exchange rate of 40/- to a dollar but the value of the shilling has since depreciated and presently stands at about 56/- to a dollar.

There has however been no mention of the prices of other imported commodities which should also be costing more now.

Meanwhile teachers on the island will soon benefit from a new scheme of service now being prepared by the Zanzibar

Government with an aim of improving the educational standards here. It is also planning to improve study conditions in schools.

## NEWSLINE FROM ZANZIBAR

The workshop was organised by the Zanzibar President, Abdul Wakil who called the Isles Minister of Education, come up with clear plans of improving conditions of schools, and raising the standard of education.

The President, who has shown sympathy on the progress of the Isles education programme and said the Government will ensure the welfare of teachers is proved.

# Much Activity At Mbaraki Wharf

AS expected the number of waiting vessels has shown a considerable reduction and at the beginning of the week the number had reduced to nine of which five were at ship's convenience or, to express in another way, even if there was a berth available the ship concerned was unable to occupy it through no fault of the Port Authority.

The three remaining vessels waiting to load 27,200 tons white maize are expected to berth within 710 days; these are the North Korean owned record holder *Mu Du Bong* here since 22nd January and the *Magdalena Mare* and *Promina* which both arrived on 2nd February.

The demurrage [waiting costs] for these vessels must amount to a colossal sum of money and I wonder who will pay?

The heaviest loader in port the 3 year old Greek owned *Seamaster II* in occupation of No. 11 berth for the past 2 months has almost completed loading her 25,000 tons for Iran and should have sailed yesterday or today; similarly the *Leona* at the adjacent No. 12 berth should be sailing at the same time.

The Japanese owned, Liberian flag motor vehicle carrier *Prosper World* arrived this week to discharge 573 motor cars from Japan - once again mainly reconditioned vehicles for Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda.

She is one of the smaller class of pure car carriers and this is her first visit to Mombasa.

Engine trouble has befallen the modern smart looking P+OCL vessel *Gerrans Bay* engaged along with her sister ship the *Oyster Bay* on the company's liner service between East Africa, Karachi, Dubai, Bombay and Colombo.

## SHIPPING with JOHN WALTERS

I gather the trouble is not too serious but it has cost her a 5-6 days delay at Mtwange anchorage whilst repairs were put in hand.

She was expected to reberth at the container terminal this week to load some 75 containers. Mbaraki Wharf was the scene of much activity on Monday morning and my early rise to watch the sailing of the P&O 45000 ton cruise vessel *Canberra* in all her magnificence was well worth the effort.

She was off the berth at 7 am swinging and heading for the harbour entrance, Suez Haifa, Gibraltar and Southampton.

With her twin yellow funnels, gleaming white paintwork and her flags creating a splash of colour on her signal mast, she presented a picture of opulence and beauty. One and a half hours later the Royal Navy destroyer HMS *CLOUCESTER* took her place for a two week visit.

A chemical tanker on her first trip to Kilindini arrived on Monday to load 3000 tons Molasses on account of E.A. Storage Company at NO. 9 berth. She was the 5 year old Panamanian flag, Japanese owned, *Liquid Bulk Explorer* of 12900 deadweight tons.

She is one of four modern chemical tankers all having the prefix words *Liquid Bulk* - a strictly functional naming system if nothing else.

The only large import of bulk cargo this week is by the 22000 d.w.ton *Europa Point* bringing in 15000 tons fertiliser from Glomfjord in Norway. This vessel is flying the red ensign and her owners are Acomarit Maritime Services Ltd., London, who I have not previously come across.

No doubt she will have a wait of some days in the same way as the Hungarian vessel *Csokonai* at the buoys is being subjected with 3000 tons bagged fertiliser to discharge; she arrived on the 18th march.

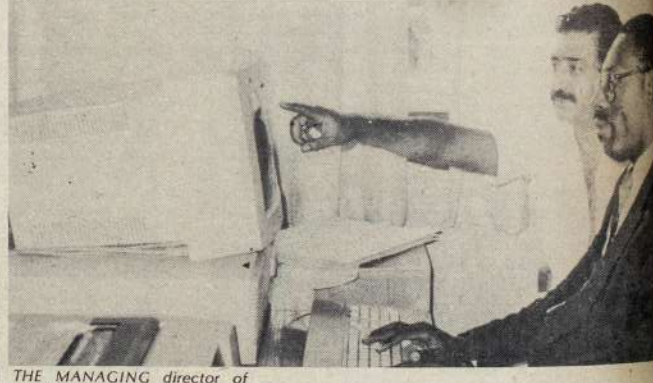

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# Mit der Dhau SUBIRA entlang der Südküste

IN DER Geschichte der ostafrikanischen Küste haben Dhau schon immer eine bedeutende Rolle gespielt. Vor mehr als 2000 Jahren haben vor allem die Araber die Monsunwinde voll ausgenutzt und segelten aus ihren Ländern in die ostafrikanischen Gewässer und zurück, um Waren zu tauschen.

Diese arabischen Segelschiffe — aus Teakplanken oder anderem Hartholz von der Küste, ohne Nägel, nur mit Schnüren aus Kokosfasern zusammengehalten — orientierten sich auf ihrem Weg nur nach den Sternen und brachten als Ladung unter anderem wunderschöne Orientteppiche und mit Messingbeschlägen verzierte arabische Truhen nach Ostafrika.

Heute verkehren diese traditionellen Segelschiffe aus dem Mittleren Osten nicht mehr entlang der ostafrikanischen Küste. Es werden jedoch weiterhin Dhau in Lamu gebaut, und nachdem sie etwas abgeändert und mit Motoren versehen sind, kommen sie in der sich ständig weiter entwickelnden Tourismusindustrie zur Verwendung, wo sie eine romantische Attraktion für unternehmungslustige Urlauber darstellen. Dhaufahrten sind außerordentlich beliebt.

Zuletzt hinzugekommen ist die SUBIRA. Sie wurde kürzlich eingeweiht und getauft anlässlich einer vom Reef Hotel organisierten Champagner Party an Bord, um sie fortan in den Dienst des Tourismus zu stellen.

Die geladenen Gäste waren hauptsächlich Vertreter von Reisebüros, Reiseveranstalter und Hoteliers. Die SUBIRA ist vor der Shimoni Reef Fishing Lodge stationiert und erweitert die bereits vorhandene Flotte, die aus drei Fischerbooten (COUNTDOWN, SEA HUNTER und SEA RAIDER), einem Glasbodenboot und einer weiteren Dhau ZIYADA besteht.

Die SUBIRA segelt täglich entlang dem Wasini-Kanal und serviert während der Fahrt ein an Bord zubereitetes, köstliches Mittagessen aus Meeresfrüchten. Das Essen beginnt mit einem von der Schiffsleitung offerierten Cocktail Drink. Dann gibt es Garnelen Cocktail mit Grapefruit und Orangen, gefolgt von Kuku und Kamba-Kebab — aus Garnelen, Peperoni und Zwiebeln am Spieß, serviert mit Knoblauchbutter — Taffi mit Gewürzen oder Kingfisher mit Limonenbutter, auf dem Holzkohlegrill zubereitet. Zum Abschluss werden frische Früchte und arabischer Kaffee gereicht.

Bevor die Passagiere an Bord der SUBIRA gehen, besuchen sie die riesigen Zibwa Grotten in Chakwa, in denen seit Urzeiten spezielle Gebete verrichtet werden, da sie von einem guten Geist bewohnt sein sollen. 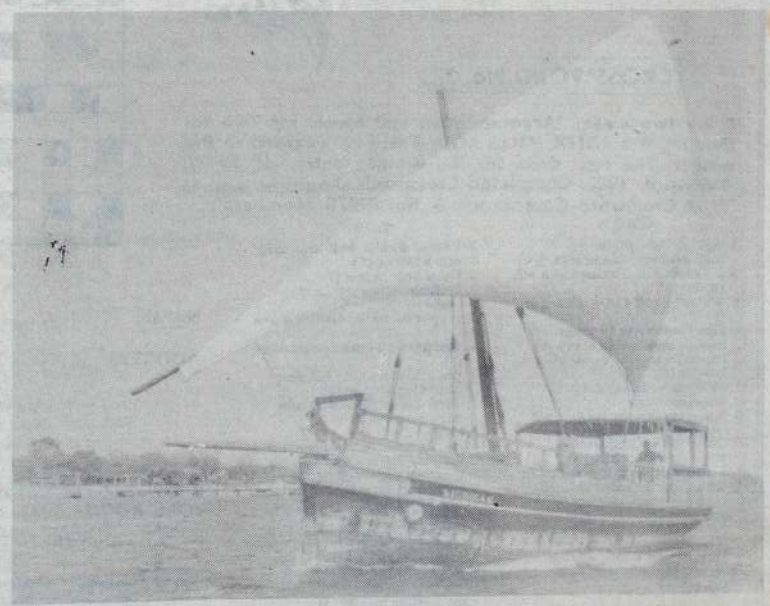

## Pro-Angler Battaia Sets New Bahari Club Record

A PROFESSIONAL Angler, Eligio Battaia based on the South Coast, established a Bahari Club record when he landed the heaviest fish during the current fishing season, a superb 117 kgs Black Marlin on a 24 kgs light tackle fished from Sea Raider and won the inaugural V.M. Patel-Rado Watches spored fishing competition staged at Bahari Club over the weekend.

This is the third heaviest Black Marlin of over 100 kgs ever gaffed at Bahari Club since 1971.

It was on 16th October 1971, a professional angler, James Adeock who is based at Mt Wapa on the North Coast, had landed a 213 kgs Black Marlin caught on a 60 kgs line from "wahoo". This fish was followed by another Black Marlin of 228.2 kgs caught on a 36 kg line boated from "Tamam" by Maurice Robinson, in 1978.

Eligio who fought for about fifty minutes to gaff his 117 kgs Black Marlin was ably assisted by Oliver Abranches and Hans George Wiyenk. Apart from this superb Marlin, they also added three felusus for overall boat prize with a total of 720.2 points.

These catches were enough to beat "Monica" to the second place fished by Andrew Sonon who was assisted by husband and wife, anglers, Quintain and Cecilia Coopers. They boated a 59.9 kgs Shark together with two Bonittos and scored 242.2 points and piped "Volare" to the third place.

"Volare" fished by the popular team of trio anglers, Nick De Souza, chairman of the club, Mr. Dick Chater and Farouk Deen. They hooked the second heaviest shark a 45.5 kgs. They added seven felusus and a Barracuda and managed to earn 212.3 points to beat "Cymerline" on the fourth overall place fished by a regular team of the club's treasurer, Harry Watson and Chrissie Michaelides who were assisted by George Webb.

They fished the third heaviest sail of 28.1 kgs together with Harry's Wahoo and Chrissie's Chrissie's yellow fin. George Webb took the third heaviest sail fish prize while Chrissie won the ladies prize for her yellow fin.

Apart from winning the overall boat prize, Eligio Battaia

and also awarded the heaviest fish prize for his 117 kgs Black Marlin - an elegant wrist watch.

The sponsors were rewarded with further three sailfishes. But unfortunately, none of them were in the reach of the winning bracket of overall boat prizes. However, all three sails landed by various anglers. Peter George's 28.8 kgs boated from Sasumai, George Webb's sail 28.1 kgs from Cymerline and Salim's 22 kgs Sail from Aliya were each qualified in the columns heaviest fish prizes.

Before he presented the prizes worth over 19,000/- to the winners and runners up, a director of m/s. V.M. Patel and Company of Digo Road, Mombasa who are the local agents of Rado and popular other brand of watches, Mr. Jitu Patel assured members of Bahari Club that his firm would continue to support this popular sport, during the next season. The elegant prizes mainly comprised of wall clocks, Rado and Seiko table and wrist watches.

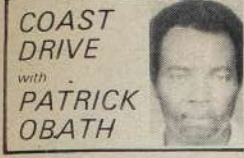

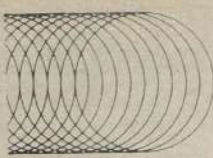
