Helping Hand From Mombasa Beach!

ONE hundred and forty new
blankets were presented by
Mombasa Beach Hotel em-
ployees to St. Luke's Hospital,
Kaloleni, which gives so much
loving care to sick wananchi.

It was probably the first group
of hotel workers to make, with-
out assistance from manage-
ment, a gift of this kind to such
a deserving cause, their motiva-
tion coming from President
Moi's words about 'being mind-
ful of others'.

The value of the blankets
was Shs. 12,000/- and the work-
ers intend giving further help
to those in need in the commu-
nity.

They had raised this sum
through donating part of the
'Service Charge' which each
month the hotel distributes
among them.

Mr E H Buko the hotel's Exe-
cutive Assistant, said that manage-
ment was very proud of them.

Commented Dr Edward Mwa-
ringa, i/c St. Luke's Hospital
'this is the first gift we have
received from hotel employees.
I am absolutely delighted, particu-
larly by their thoughtfulness
in helping others.'

In saying a big 'THANK YOU'
the Matron, Mrs Latifa Chondo,
said 'I can just imagine how
delighted in-patients will be
when they find these warm
blankets on their beds when the
weather is much cooler in June
and July.'

Said the shop steward, Solo-
mon Musyoka 'this is the first
but not the last project by
workers here, for there is going

to be more'.

Dr Mwaringa invited them to
visit the hospital to see how
their blankets are being put to
good use.

It is understood that some of
these employees go to St Luke's
when the Coast General Hospi-
tal is full.

It was after Solomon Mus-
yoka, Shop Steward, had been
approached by the Hospital
Administrator, Patrick Kalume,
seeking help in acquiring blank-
ets, that employees decided to
make this hospital, which deals
with 70,000 out-patients and
around 6,000 in-patients a year,
their first project.

St Luke's was established by
CMS missionaries in 1929 and
has maintained a high standard
of medical and loving care to
wananchi. Although now receiv-
ing a government subsidy they
still have to rely on the local
community for assistance and
are presently seeking more beds,
sheets, cutlery etc.

NEW SCHOOL

Opening soon is a new School
of Nursing for 120 students,
their training being geared to
take the Kenya Enrolled Com-
munity Nurses government exa-
mination. Opening within the
next year will be a children's
ward with fifteen beds.

The hospital has a scheme
whereby wananchi are offered
an out-patient medical service
for Shs. 15/- a month. The hospi-
tal charge for in-patients is
Shs. 40/- a day, which does not
include the cost of operations.
