## H.M.S HERMIONE ON VISIT FROM MID-EAST TOUR

THE ROYAL Navy's Leander Class Frigate *HMS Hermione* will be arriving in Mombasa on Monday 20 April for a two week maintenance period and a welcomed break from her demanding Gulf patrol.

She was originally due to visit Mombasa last month with *HMS Gloucester* but the requirement to keep more ships on station in the Gulf necessitated a change of programme.

This unfortunately upset plans for families to fly out to Mombasa and not all those who originally arranged to come

here have been able to reschedule their visit.

*HMS Hermione* is a Frigate of 2680 tons displacement and a complement of 260 men. She was first commissioned in 1969 but has recently been modernized and converted to carry Exocet and Sea Wolf missiles, a Lynx helicopter and anti submarine torpedoes.

Her Captain, Commander Barry Bryant is no stranger to this class of ship or indeed to Kenya as he was the Executive Officer of *HMS Andromeda* when she visited Mombasa in May 1985.

On arrival *Hermione* will spend four days at a buoy before going alongside Mbaraki Jetty.

A busy social and sporting programme has been arranged and the crew will host several functions on board including a party for 20 children from the Port Ritz School for the handicapped.

In addition to many sporting fixtures against local sides the ship's rugby and shooting teams are going on tour to Nairobi.

Safaris to Kenya's game parks will as usual be high on the list of attractions for the crew and 24 sailors will be lending a hand with the Save the Rhino project in Tsavo West.

The next Royal Navy ship to visit Mombasa will be *HMS Cardiff* from 25 May to 8 June and approval has been sought for several other ship visits in the next few months.

# German Tour Figures Up!

DESPITE 'ADVERSE PUBLICITY' MORE ON KENYA HOLIDAYS

GOOD NEWS FROM GERMANY is that despite adverse publicity about Aids in Kenya, NUR Touristic reports a 15 per cent increase in bookings here during the present winter season ending April. This was revealed by its Vice President for Overseas Tours and Cruises, Walter E. Krombach, who is presently enjoying a holiday with Alliance Hotel's on Kenya's beautiful Diani Beach together with his family.

N.U.R. Touristic is among the largest West German tour operators sending tourists here. Mr Krombach described this

increase in bookings as 'very encouraging' and revealed they are also anticipating a slight increase of between five to ten per cent for the coming 'Summer' season.

He explained 'initially, we did suffer a little from adverse publicity given earlier this year by some sections of the German media about Aids in Kenya, which was very bad for business.'

At that time, 'he went on' we were almost fully booked until the middle of March.

While there were some cancellations, these were happily absorbed by new bookings. In other words, while some holiday-makers were a little afraid to come here, others were not.

### 'AIDS World-Wide'

Bookings had started picking up again in March. By that time, Said Mr. Krombach 'the situation and discussion were not so emotional, for almost everyone then appreciated that Aids is virtually a worldwide problem'.

'No one believes any more that this is a particularly serious problem for Kenya, as indicated in some magazines earlier this year.'

## FRENCH NAVY VISIT MOMBASA

### ADMIRAL IN PORT

THREE FRENCH warships - the *Amiral Charner*, the *Protet* - will call at Mombasa harbour from the 18th to 24th April, 1987.

The replenishment tanker *Marne*, commanded by Commander Reye as a company of 13 officers, 2 petty officers and 90 seamen. On board the ship is the Rear-Admiral Lansade, the Commanding Officer French Marine Forces in the Indian Ocean and his Staff.

## 'Umoja Academy' Still Expanding ...

UMOJA has grown since our last visit. There are now the Assistant Headmistress and four teachers on the school team.

Umoja Academy teaches the Montessori way, and last week all parents were able to view how their children had progressed during the Easter term, as well as see how they were on

the social side. Writing rose interestingly from tracing to free-hand.

It is a fact that Umoja Academy treats each child as an individual. In each class there are two in charge - the teacher herself, plus her assistant who helps those who are slightly behind. In any case there are never many to a class.

Then, in the afternoon the assistants will help the weaker pupils to catch up. This school stresses that every child has a chance to be heard.

We like the atmosphere of Umoja in every sense of the

word, for the air too, plus surroundings are excellent.

On the academic side, Umoja has so far reached Playgroup, Nursery, Standard I and Standard II.

The head teacher, designated as Assistant Headmistress, is a very devoted and dedicated lady whom we have known personally for some time. She gives special attention to pre-primary in the belief that this is good grounding for life. She is Nassim Pardhan.

Nassim already has the books for the library, and she was explaining to us how she hoped the library would soon be constructed on the proposed third floor.

This is one of the few purpose built schools in Mombasa. The third floor will also house the video (now downstairs) and give room to drama and music.

One is accepted at Umoja Academy from 2 1/2 years. At each birthday (and the school has a remarkable pretty open-plan way of knowing who will celebrate next) the pupil has a cake on the house, plus a small gift.

Fees include uniform, transport and refreshments, and this end-of-term saw a free medical check-up too.

French is taught on the premises by the Alliance Francaise who send one of their staff there.

Another outside teacher brings the Hindu religion.

Gujarati has been introduced by Mrs. Dehashri (one of the Umoja teachers), and Mr. Seif comes twice a week to teach swimming the "Self-Safe" way!

The school has its own swimming pool, of course.

Joined recently is Mr. L. Sharp from St. Mary's Nairobi, and he is a man of ideas. All the other staff are highly trained and qualified teachers, and this portrays itself into the general happiness and well-being of the school.

She will be addressing the inaugural meeting of the Progressive Women's Spiritual Association which takes place at the Koblenz Red Cross Hall (opposite Ebrahim's Supermarket) on April 23 at 5.30 p.m. to which all women irrespective of race or creed are invited.

Thereafter, meetings of the PWSA take place at the same venue every Tuesday and Thursday starting at 5.30 p.m.

On the 'physical' plane their self-development will be helped by Yoga exercises, relaxation techniques, nutrition and fasting

days, diet, hygiene, also basic self-defense. Jogging sessions are planned, all to help develop the physical health and vitality of the body.

Of all activities on the 'physical' plane Yoga is of over-riding importance as it also develops the inner mechanism of the body.

Activities on the 'mental' plane include learning the scien-

tific way of how to concentrate. Said Didi 'we believe that women should be well informed about society and for this reason Study Circles will discuss current affairs, relevant topics of the day and women's issues.

The idea being to activate their thought processes and thus develop their intellect'.

There will also be seminars to which Guest Speakers will be invited.

Didi believes that the PWSA will not only attract housewives, but also career women seeking greater mental stimulation and who want to involve themselves in self-development activities.

On the 'spiritual' side, there will be meditation. 'This', it was emphasised 'will have nothing to do with religion'.

The money, he said, should be utilised to renovate the historic Church which was last repaired by the late Mzee Jomo Kenyatta in 1974.

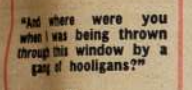

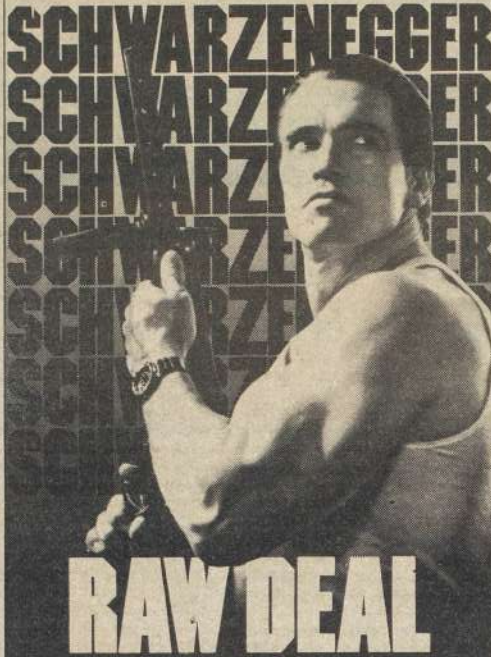

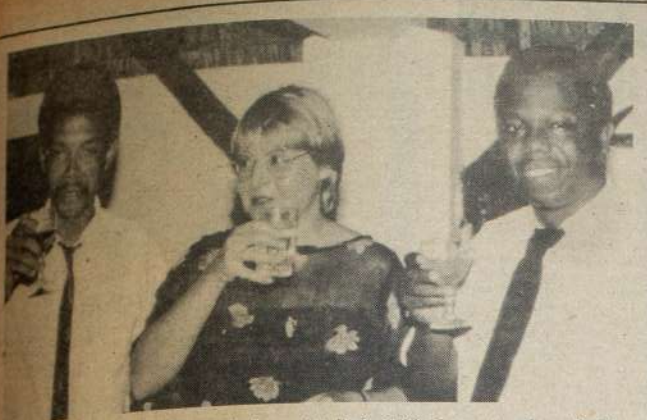

## Japanese Give Welcome Boost To Tanzania's Anti-Malaria Project

THE MALARIA CONTROL PROGRAMME in the country received a big financial shot in the arm this week following a 200 million shillings grant by the Japanese Government towards the project. The programme is based in Dar es Salaam and Tanga regions with an aim to reduce the prevalent malaria menace affecting the local population.

The Malaria programme is part of the National Malaria Control Programme planned by the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare and the grant money is expected to go towards buying of insecticides, spraying equipment and vehicles.

The Japanese have given a further 160 million shilling grant for an agricultural transportation project. These funds will be used by the National Transport Corporation (NTC) to buy trucks for regional transport companies.

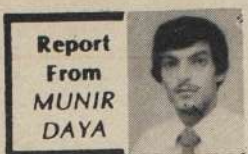
Meanwhile, the National Shipping Agencies Company (NASACO) has decided the habit of some individuals and companies of converting containers into storage places, stores or even living houses.

The company has called upon its customers in Tanzania and other neighbouring countries to return the cargo containers because they belong to overseas owners.

### CONTAINERS

The normal trend is for containers to be leased from the Rotterdam based Container Transport Institute (CTI) which charges between 2.5 to 7 US dollars per container per day, the charge depending on the size of the container.

It is reported that Tanzania is losing a lot of foreign currency by paying demurrage charges to ship owners in Europe and America who have com-

plained that Containers are not being returned or are being returned too late.

Some ship owners are reported to have increased deposit charges on the containers together with demurrage charges so as to discourage recipients from keeping the containers.

The normal turn-round rate for containers is about 150 days but in the Dar es Salaam port it is not uncommon for containers to stay idle for upto 18 months or not to be returned at all.

And in another move, the Government has raised telephone and telex charges for calls outside Tanzania by 10 per cent as a part measure to cover a projected deficit in the country's 1986-1987 budget.

The increase has caught many unawares especially because the postal authorities raised service tariffs on international telex and telephone services just two months back, in February this year.

The price increase is apparently meant to discourage unnecessary calls because the

country has to pay in foreign currency for international service facilities used.

Along with the telephone and telex increase, the prices of soft drinks, beer and cigarettes have also been raised and the Government is also reviewing customs duty for products which local industries can satisfy the national demand. This is aimed at protecting the local industries from goods currently being imported under the trade liberalisation policy.

The affected items will include cigarettes, beer, wines, soap, tooth paste, cooking oil, light bulbs, soft tinned drinks and ceramics amongst others.

The Government has a deficit of about 3.35 billion shillings in the 1986-87 budget and the increase in tariffs are meant to reduce this deficit.

And finally, the European Economic Community (EEC) will give 15 million dollars in EEC aid to finance a road link between Blantyre in Malawi and the port of Dar es Salaam.

### NORTHERN MALAWI

The road will be constructed between Karonga in northern Malawi and Ibanda in Tanzania and is expected to close the missing link in the Blantyre - Daressalaam transport route. This final link will run to about 51 kilometres.

While the EEC support is upto 15 million dollars, the total projected cost is about 19 million dollars.

## SOMALI PLANE RETURN

The plane was handed over to the Somali Ambassador in Kenya, His Excellency Sheikh Mahmud on behalf of his government by the Deputy P.C. Mr. ... on behalf of the Kenya Government.

The ceremony was conducted at the Malindi Airport about 10:00 a.m. after a day delay caused by non-arrival of a Somali Air Force crew to take the craft back to the country.

The crew of seven landed at the airport a few minutes to ten in a Matchless. They included Colonel Mohamed and Lieutenant Colonel Ahmed Sheikh, Colonel Shahir Abdi.

Handing over the plane, Kiti said that the relations between Kenya and Somalia improved greatly, that the people of the two countries were living like brothers and sisters.

He recalled that President Moi and President Hassan advised that the nations concentrate on development when they (presidents) previously.

The Kenya Government officials at the ceremony were the Coast Deputy Provincial Police Officer, Mr. Henry Wamubey, the Kilifi D.C. Mr. James Muhoro.

The trainer aeroplanes commandeered to Kenya in February by Lieutenant Mohamed Hussein and Ali Hassan Mohamed who left their country from Kisumu south coastal port town, were defecting.

The defectors intended to land at Mombasa based International Airport but, due to an alleged fuel shortage, landed at the Malindi Airport. Kenya authorities and the United States as well as Canada.

## GOVERNMENT STILL 'NEGOTIATING' NEW FERRY BOATS DEAL

THE ZANZIBAR Government has refused radio reports that it will soon receive ferry boats worth about 1.4 billion shillings from Italy together with fire fighting equipment from Britain.

The isles Government is still working out a loan request with Italy and if negotiations are fruitful then the ferry boats could be imported.

To this effect, a high ranking Tanzania Government team supposed to be led by the Minister for Finance, Planning and Economic Affairs, Cleopa Msuya was to travel to Rome last month but the recent reshuffle in the ministries forced a postponement.

The boat project was set as a priority in the 1986-87 annual development plan and is intended to ease transportation problems between Zanzibar and Pemba islands so that Pemba produce can be made available in Zanzibar markets.

The ferry boat link is later expected to extend to Dar es Salaam and Tanga which will then release the Zanzibar ships M.V. Mapinduzi and M.V. Maenedeleo from operating in Tanzanian waters and instead, to make trips abroad which could earn Zanzibar more foreign exchange.

With regard to the fire tenders, the Government has clarified that no fire tenders were on their way from Britain because they had not been ordered.

# Last Of The Maize Loaders Preparing To Leave Port

AS THE LAST of the maize loaders prepare to sail, except for the *Promina* which is not likely to complete until early May, a wheat discharger is due today with 11,600 tons in bulk. The carrier is the 12 year old South Korean *Wonsbon* of 21,500 deadweight tons with her cargo loaded in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia; I have commented in earlier articles on the thriving export of wheat from Saudi Arabia, a part of the world one does not normally associate with the production of cereals. I understand that this shipment may be the forerunner of several more bulk wheat shipments in the near future whereas there is a definite lull in the export of maize.

Regular exports of Molasses are a part of the Kilindini scene. Due on Sunday is the two year old Japanese chemical tanker *Golden Sanwa* to load 4200 tons at No.9 berth from the

is in port this week loading and discharging namely the *Boleslaw Krzywousty*, a caller of many years standing, better known in shipping circles as the "BK".

Dodwells are the Agents for Polish Ocean Line. AGIP is a well known name in Kenya, but not for a long time has one of their fleet of tankers called at the port.

Due on Tuesday of this week from Chisimayo, Somalia is the 30,000 ton *Agip Ravenna*, flying the Italian flag I am please to say, discharging 7400 tons of white oil products at Shimanzu Oil Jetty.

AGIP have a large fleet of tankers ranging from 30000 to 140000 tons deadweight.

The well known BEACON container vessel *Ubena* owned by Deutsche Ost Afrika Linie (DOAL) unhappily had a collision with a Russian vessel in the River Elbe last week bound from Hamburg to Antwerp. The accident occurred in the middle of the night and both vessels have suffered considerable damage. The *Ubena* last sailed Northbound from Mombasa for Europe on 9th March.

MOMBASA (KNA) A total of 11 eye patients have been operated on at the start of a five day eye camp mounted by the Lion Club of Mombasa Pwani at the Burhaniya Primary School on Mombasa island. Ten other patients also received minor surgical treatment.

# PUBLIC IN NEED OF ACCURATE A.I.D.S. INFORMATION

MOMBASA (KNA) A dermatologist at the Coast Provincial General Hospital has criticised the local and international press for sensationalising reports about the Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).

Dr. Hosea Waweru, in his address to the Mombasa Branch of the Business and Professional Women Club called for the media to launch a widespread public information campaign about the killer disease, rather than cause panic among wanan-chi through sensational reporting.

Dr. Waweru, a skin diseases and sexually transmitted diseases (STD) expert stressed that although the disease was infectious, "it was not contagious as some people had been led to think".

He said it was difficult to pick out certain groups of people who ran the risk of contracting the disease in Kenya unlike in the western world where drug users and homosexuals, who were most vulnerable.

Dr. Waweru however singled out sexually promiscuous individuals as those who ran the risk of contracting aids and called on Kenyans to maintain single sexual partners to counter the spread of the AIDS syndrome.

He said the Ministry of Health was screening blood donations as a measure of curb-

ing the spread of AIDS and urged those identified as AIDS patients to desist from sex.

Dr. Waweru added there was need to launch a sexual education programme for the Kenyan youth who were venturing into adult life-styles which he said would help inhibit the contraction of sexually transmitted diseases.

He advocated for the screening of both friends and relatives of AIDS patients who could be prevented from spreading the AIDS virus among the people.

Dr. Waweru said contrary press reports, no real cure for the killer disease had been covered.

He said Kenyan hospitals where AIDS patients had been identified were effectively treating skin infections, blotches, blisters and ulcers which characterize AIDS.

## DIAGNOSE

The doctor said the disease whose virus is spread through the contact of body fluids, had been contracted by only a number of Kenyans.

The first AIDS case in Kenya was diagnosed in Nairobi in 1981 and in Mombasa in 1982. The figures purported to be those of Kenyan AIDS patients carried by the foreign press merely alarmed, Dr. Waweru stressed.

tanks of the East African Storage Company situated at Shimanzu High Level.

Most of these molasses shipments are destined for Europe. An identical sister ship to the *Golden Sanwa* was the *Global Venus* which arrived and berthed last Sunday to discharge 800 tons chemicals. She was also built in 1985 and like most of the smaller class of chemical tanker was spotlessly clean and had a blue coloured hull - normally these tankers sport blue, red, yellow or green coloured hulls so they can be easily identified.

Nine athletes from the coast are being selected to join the Kenya team which will be participating in the International Special Olympics being held in the USA during August 1987.

The cost of sending a team from the coast will be around Shs. 200,000/- and a most welcome gift at the Coast Special Olympics came from the Guest of Honour, Hussein Anjarwalla a prominent businessman and Rotarian, who donated Shs. 10,000/- towards this.

Addressing guests and participants Mr. Anjarwalla noted that in the past mentally handicapped children had been considered 'taboo' in the family and society generally.

Adding, through such events as these Special Olympics I am sure we shall be able to open up venues for more interaction between these children and others, so that they can be considered as part and parcel of our community.

He noted that Special Olympics in Kenya had been taking place over the past eight years, and that in 1983 a team had been sent to the International Special Olympics in the USA with two participants from the Coast doing exceptionally well there.

In reply, Dr. Zahoor Kashmiri, chairman, thanked the Chief Guest for his very generous donation, as well as numerous officials who had sacrificed their time to make the event such a success.

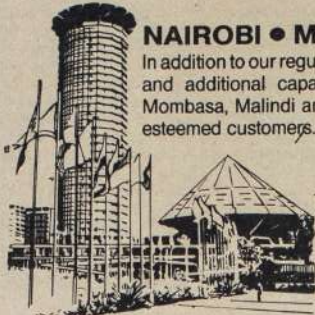

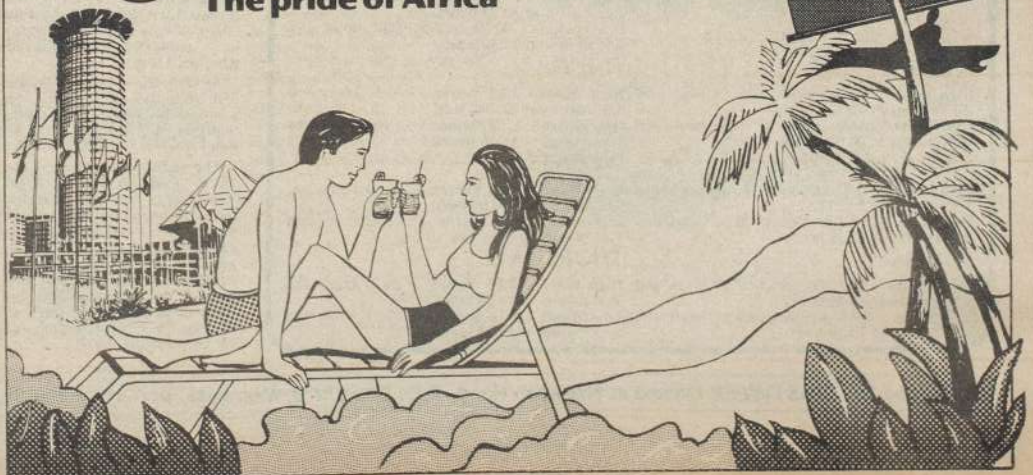

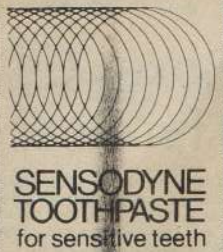

From Irima, it is down the tarmac through Voi to the Voi Safari Lodge arriving at 17.20 hrs for a well earned rest.

The first car departs from the Lodge at 02.30 hrs on Monday

morning and goes straight down the tarmac to Bachuma Control where they start the foray through the ranches.

The cars will go through Rukanga Ranch to join the Maungu Rukanga road at Nyangala. From here they will go to Kitege and round the bottom of Kasigau

Hill through Makwasinyi, Bungule and Jora to Rukanga Control where the first car is due at 03.45 hrs.

From Rukanga the cars turn right and head straight for Mwatate through the sisal to arrive at Mwatate at 04.14 hrs

There is then an easy drive up to Dembwa where the cars turn off the tarmac at 04.19 hrs.

This is the last selective section in the Coast that takes cars through Wusi, Wesu, Wundanyi, Werugha, Mgange and Bura Mission to the Bura Control at 04.46 hrs.

The Taitas are reckoned to be the sting in the tail for this year's rally and since most cars are new, there has been extensive testing carried out in the Taitas.

In one weekend alone there were no less than five teams running up and down to Wundanyi and Ronge. With the amount of mileage done in the Taitas the pace is expected to be quite hot.

HOW TO GET THERE

BACHUMA - Approximately 110 km up the tarmac from Mombasa and turn left at the blue "Kuranze Dam Contract" sign. Control 100 metres from the road.

BURA - Turn left at Voi Caltex

towards Taveta for approximately 32 km. After end of the road proceed a further 18 km. Control is on your right.

DEMBWA - Turn left at Caltex on Taveta road for 30 kms. On reaching Mwatate turn right towards Wundanyi. Control is 6 kms up the road to the left.

IRIMA - Continue on Caltex towards Mwatate approx. 4 kms. Control is road to your left approx. 100 metres from the tarmac.

KASIGAU - Turn left at Voi Mombasa road and proceed for about 10 km. The Control is about 100 metres before Rukanga village.

VOI SAFARI LODGE - Turn left at Voi Gate to the East. The main Control is at the Safari Lodge approx. 4 km from Voi Gate.

The wildlife Department kindly agreed to keep the Gate open for both the Safari Rally and the Safari Rally. The rally organisers request that you obey all instructions posted at the Gate.

Do not proceed into the Park apart from the Safari Lodge.

Also, have the extra 100 and 1000 Cedis ready for speedy processing at the Gate otherwise a traffic jam will develop and delay the cars.

Most important, SAFETY!! Safari Rally organisers want to lose its status as any one accident could rally fever.

## Taita Secondary Runners Impress

DALMA Moka Harambee Secondary School in Taita Taveta District produced the best boy and girl cross country runners in this year's Coast Provincial Secondary Schools Championships, at Wundanyi Stadium.

The two were Kitimo Mwiwani, who clocked 33 minutes 3 seconds to lead in the boy ten kilometre race, and Anolda

Mwaiwo, who took 30 minutes 24 seconds to lead in the girls 6 kilometre race.

Others who excelled were Ezekiel Wangusha of Kitumbi Secondary who came second in the boys event with a time of 34 min. 22 seconds, followed by Samuel Mwasi from Ngangao Secondary in third position with a time of 34 min. 32 sec.

In the girls race Juliana Mwandembo from Murray Girls took the second position after clocking 30 minutes 46.8 seconds and in the third position was Jacqueline Mwangulu from Mwakichuchu Secondary who took 34 minutes 31.4 secs. to finish the race.

A total of 33 boy teams with an average of ten boys per team and 22 girl teams with an average of eight girls per team were entered from all the secondary schools in the province, in the event which was used to select a team to represent Coast Province in the national championships in Nakuru from 9th to 11th this month.

The winning team for boys was Saint Mary's High School Lushangnyi who lost 100 points followed by Ngangao who lost 107 points and third position was taken by Mwakichuchu who lost 132 points.

As for Girls, Mwakichuchu lost 26 points to emerge the winners, followed by Ngangao with 41 and Moka with 67 points lost.

The guest of honour was the Taita Taveta D.O. I. H. John Juma, who observed that improper training and hurried preparations for the games made competitors perform poorly, and called on sports organisers in schools to ensure a comprehensive sports programme was adhered to throughout the year to keep the sportsmen prepared for competition.
