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U.S. NAVY VISITING MOMBASA



KENYA CALL — The United States aircraft carrier USS KITTY HAWK, together with six other war ships, will anchor off Mombasa late April on a several day visit. Other vessels in the 'Battle Group' are USS VANDEGRIFT, USS CALLAGHAN, USS BARBEY, USS MOUNT HOOD and USS CALIFORNIA. The 80,000-ton carrier, whose home port is San Diego, California, is under the command of Capt. F.L. Tillotson, and will be carrying the flag of Rear Admiral R.K.U. Kihune. The KITTYHAWK includes an airwing of more than 85 aircraft, and carries a crew of 5,000 officers and men. The Battle Group is putting ashore approximately 8,000 sailors, who are expected to spend more than 45 million shillings on sight-seeing, shopping and tours to the game reserves. U.S. Ambassador to Kenya, H.E. Elinor Constable, is expected to visit the Navy during its Mombasa call.

FARMER 'SEVERELY INJURED' BY WARTHOG

HOLA (KNA) — Standard One pupil at Dalu Primary School in Tana River District was snatched away by a crocodile

while fetching water from River Tana while in the company of her teacher.

Bingo Karisa, 8, while in the company of the pupils had gone to the crocodile infested river to fetch water for watering trees in the school compound when the tragedy struck.

Teacher and pupils did not see the crocodile until it swept the girl off her feet with a swipe from its tail, and disappeared with her between its jaws into the deep, muddy waters.

Policemen from Garsen post who were on patrol in the area joined the villagers in the search for the body on canoes without success.

MSAMBWENI (KNA) — A farmer who was guarding his crops against wild animals was injured when a warthog attacked him.

Salimu Ali Janji was guarding his cassava crop in his shamba on Friday night when he spotted an animal in his shamba.

Thinking that the animal was a wild pig, Janji attempted to scare the animal and chased it out. But the animal turned on him and bit him on the right side of his rib cage.

The farmer was helped by neighbours who transported him to the Coast Provincial General Hospital to get appropriate treatment.

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Coast Sikhs Celebrate Vaisakhi

THE SIKH Community in Mombasa celebrated the Vaisakhi on 14th April, this year, with their traditional zest and zeal.

On this day in 1699, at Anandpur Sahib, the Tenth Guru of the Sikhs, Guru Gobind Singh, bestowed upon the Sikhs a fresh sense of dignity and pride by creating out of them the distinct Khalsa.

The Guru infused in them a new spirit of bravery and matchless valour, at the same time giving them a great sense of humility, an urge to help the downtrodden and love all, irrespective of colour, creed and caste.

A unique and distinct human form came into being — the Guru called them *Saint-Soldiers*. And today, Sikhs all over the world celebrate this Vaisakhi Day with great sense of pride and joy.

Mombasa Sikhs, likewise, organised and undertook a number of activities to celebrate this day.

Sikhs always begin their religious celebrations with continuous and uninterrupted recitation (*Akhand Path*) of their holy book — *The Granth* — for 48 hours.

It began on 12th April early in the morning and was completed on 14th, the Vaisakhi Day.

The holy hymns were sung. The communal feast (*Langer*) continued for three days. Children of all ages enthusiastically participated in the recitations of the holy-songs and the prayers.

Raising of the Sikh emblematic flag (*Nishan Sahib*) is an annual event. The outer garb of the flag-post and a new saffron flag — with *Khanda-Kirpan* (the Sikh Symbol) — was raised on the Vaisakhi Day.

The whole of the Sikh Congregation, after the end of the celebration in the Temple, participated in the flag-raising ceremony, whilst the singing of the holy hymns continued incessantly.

A week earlier, the *Istri Sabha* organised a glittering *Mela* (Festival) to commemorate the Vaisakhi.

All the ladies of the community cooked food at their homes and then sold the delicacies at the *Mela*.

Hundreds of men, women and children from various Mombasa Communities attended the *Mela* with great joy and merry-making. Funds thus raised will be donated to various needy and handicapped children of the town.

The New Executive Council of the *Siri Guru Singh Sabha*, elected a month ago, organised a very successful Treasure Hunt.

A large number of Sikh men, women and children participated. Numerous attractive prizes were donated by the members of the community.

Coincidentally, the world famous Rock Singing Star, *Peter Singh*, (whose real name is *Narinder Singh*) was present at one of the congregations of the Temple.

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LIONS HOST 'EYE' CAMP

FOR MORE THAN eight years, Lions in Mombasa have organised 'Free Eye Camps' at the Coast, offering free services to needy and poor wananchi for various eye ailments.

To add to the continued free services, the Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani, this year, under the chairmanship of Lion Dalip Dhanjal have decided to organise their first "Free Rural Ear, Nose and Throat" (E.N.T.) CAMP IN Kinango District on 25th and 26th of April, 1987.

At this Camp, all patients with Ear, Nose or Throat ailments will be examined and treated free of charge.

Those requiring surgery will be admitted and operations performed freely including food and post-operative care.

Kinango District, like many other areas does not have an E.N.T. specialist and many people have to travel to Mombasa for this specialized treatment.

It has been noticed that a large number of poor patients could not afford to come to Mombasa for treatment.

So considering this, and paying heed to the call of our beloved President Daniel Arap Moi to go to the Rural Areas and treat needy and poor people, a team of doctors under the convenorship of Lion Kuldip Dang visited Kinango District Hospital.

"Detailed discussions were held with the Medical Officer in-charge and other staff regarding screening of patients, provisions of beds, theatre arrangements, laboratory facilities, arrangements for food and drugs.

EATING HABITS

The M.O.H. Dr Tyab Ali with his staff has promised to give all possible assistance. The Provincial Medical Officer Dr Oyoo has kindly given his permission to use hospital facilities at Kinango Hospital.

The operations would be carried out by two E.N.T. consultant surgeons Dr K.S. Dang and Dr Mukesh Shah both Lion members.

Dr Atul Shah from Pandya Memorial Hospital and himself a Lion member has agreed to come for anaesthesia to the patients assisted by Mr Ben from Coast General Hospital. The sponsors for this free E.N.T. Camp have opted to remain anonymous.

E.N.T. diseases are quite prevalent at the Coast said Lion Dang due to the excessive humidity and eating habits. Nose and throat the two natural openings to the body are quite exposed to various abuses and diseases.

Infection in one can effect the other. Any infection in the nose or sinuses and throat in turn can affect the ear causing pus discharge, impaired hearing, pain and sometimes dizziness.

PRECAUTIONS

Continuing, Dr Dang said that most of the E.N.T. diseases can be prevented by taking certain precautions. Many of them can be treated by medicines but, some cases require surgery.

Lion Clubs at the Coast have been providing a very good service to the wananchi who should make full use of these free facilities and services rendering.

Depending upon the success of our First Free E.N.T. Rural Camp, the Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani intends to make the E.N.T. Camp a regular exercise in other rural areas, said Lion Dang.

Major Effort Launched To Clean Out The City's Sewage System

THE COUNTRY'S President, Ali Hassan Mwinyi, this week called upon private industrialists and factory owners to cooperate with Party and Government leaders to unclog the drainage and sewage systems in Dar es Salaam. Mwinyi said that short term measures to unblock the sewage systems could then be followed by a long-term action which would involve experts to undertake extensive research before coming up with permanent solutions.

The President said that the simple draining of the city's clogged sewage systems will temporarily solve the city's long standing problem of floods in industries and filth in the streets. He said that after the preliminary work is done, the Dar es Salaam City Council will be assigned the task of maintaining the drainage system.


Following the President's appeal, a committee has been formed and will draw up recommendations to be submitted to the President later this month.

Meanwhile, the Dar es Salaam City Council has set up 16 garbage collection centres in the city and has drawn up a comprehensive programme for cleaning the city in its latest onslaught to solve the filth problem.

The Council recently got 33 refuse collecting trucks of the 73 donated by the Japanese Government to Tanzania. It was also given 20 cesspit emptiers out of the 47 in the aid package plus another 30 containers to help clean the city.

The Japan Government donated 126 trucks valued at over 300 million shillings which included 47 cesspit emptiers, 76 garbage collectors, 30 garbage disposal units, 3 detachable refuse trucks and 3 pick-ups. The trucks are presently being distributed to seven urban centres in the country. They are Dar es

Salaam, Dodoma, Tanga, Mbeya, Arusha and Moshi.

Following the allocation of trucks to the six town councils out of Dar es Salaam, the councils there are now reported to be contemplating on ways to implement the cleaning exercise in their areas.

HIGH COURT

And in the aviation sector, the Tanzania High Court has given the Beirut based Calendonian Airlines and its owner, George Hallack until June 6 this year to indicate their intent to defend themselves in a suit filed against them by the Directorate of Civil Aviation (DCA) in March this year.

It is reported that the national airline carrier, Air Tanzania (ATC), which is jointly accused with the two defendants, has

already submitted its defence to the High Court.

The summons which was earlier fixed for April 11 has been postponed because summons adverts supposed to appear in the Financial Times of London and the local Daily News did not appear as planned. Delay in obtaining foreign exchange for advertising in the Financial Times was the reason given for the non-appearance of the advert on time.

The central bank has now approved 500 pound sterling to this effect.

The DCA is claiming for the removal of two Boeing aircraft which were wet-leased to ATC eight years ago by George Hallack. The two aircraft developed mechanical faults after operating for only a short time thereby compelling the DCA to withdraw their air worthiness certificates.

The planes have subsequently been grounded in Dar es Salaam and the Kilimanjaro International Airports with Hallack not responding to calls for collecting his aircraft. The DCA is also claiming about 10.9 million shillings for accumulated landing and parking charges and for compensation for the alleged damage to the Kilimanjaro airport apron by the aircraft.

The DCA suit calls upon the defendants to pay costs plus an annual interest of 7 1/2 per cent of accumulated landing and parking charges and other costs.

Mr. Fritz Gubler, the general manager of the Hotel commented at the site that it was most important for exhibitors to put in effort to create the holiday spirit and atmosphere with the construction of attractive stands.

He added that the policy of the hotel was to develop ideas, to improve, and to expand upon the Severin services to guests.

THE FUEL SHORTAGE BEGINS TO BITE

ZANZIBAR has been hit by a severe fuel shortage which has disrupted many activities on the island and has led to an increase in items purchased on credit. The fuel shortage has been on for about a week and petrol (gasoline) is now selling at prices on the island.

A gallon of petrol now costs 130/- but the shortage has led to an escalation of prices to up to 150/- for a gallon. The impact of the shortage is not only being felt by owners of motor vehicles but also by other people who depend on fuel in their chores.

Many fishing boats have been grounded because of lack of fuel and a shortage of fuel has ensued hence increasing prices

of fish. It is reported that Zanzibar has its allocated stocks in Dar es Salaam and the problem is in obtaining fuel to ferry the fuel.

Whilst Zanzibar is reported to be completely out of fuel, the stocks in nearby islands are enough to last for some time.

Meanwhile, it appears that the steep increase in prices for cloves announced by the Isles Government together with interest rates to growers, has helped in valuing farmers. A bumper harvest is anticipated but exact figures have not been released.


Unstable export prices because of surpluses in the market together with low production levels of clove at home has been a concern to the Government especially because of the island's mono-crop economy.

In 1985, clove exports of 41.6 million dollars were earned and this was the Government taking measures to rectify the situation.

Whilst a bumper harvest has been projected for the success in reviving the clove industry can be ascertained when actual figures are obtained.

Last year's figure of production of about 154,000 tonnes per annum against the previous year's 8000 tonnes per annum lacklustre performance attributed to high production costs, lower productivity and clove tree diseases.

The island government plans further incentives to producers and will also sustain an attack on diseases with also a thrust on crop diversification programmes so as to ensure economic recovery.

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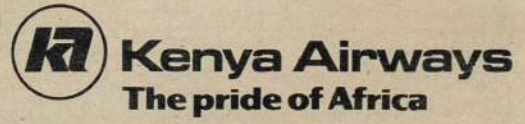

NEW SAFETY RECORD AT REFINERIES

MOMBASA (KNA) — The Mombasa based Kenya Petroleum Refineries Limited last year processed a total of 2,012,366 metric tons of Middle East crude oil.

According to figures released by the company magazine "The Lantern", some 2,040,642 metric tons of crude oil was imported and of this 34,544 metric tons was declared for processing for the Uganda market.

It said that a total of 157,606 metric tons of white oil products were received from Mombasa installations into refinery tankage for delivering into the Kenya Pipeline Company pipeline. These were Premium, Kerosine and Gasoil.

Meanwhile, the Refinery achieved its target of 250,000 manhours safety record last year.

How Did These Stowaways Get Access Into Kilindini Port Area ?

NOTWITHSTANDING THE reduced number of shift over the Easter Holiday, there were six empty berths in Kilindini on Tuesday morning. The maize loaders *Mu Du Bong* and *Magdalena Mare*, however, did not clear the port before the Easter Holiday, as expected, but were hoping to sail on Wednesday this week leaving the Yugoslav vessel *Promina* at No.12 as the last remaining maize loader and scheduled to sail in the first week of May. The wheat discharger *Wonsbon* from Jeddah has been delayed until tomorrow daybreak.

Another Japanese car carrier, the six year old *Orange Surf* one of the smaller class of car carrier is also due tomorrow with some 200 vehicles to discharge; she is operated by Mitsui OSK Lines.

I recently heard about another stowaway incident related to me by Captain Ian Dorse, Master of the *Europa Point* at No. 10 berth and an old friend of many years standing since the numerous occasions he used to call at Mombasa with the *Ellerman "City"* vessels.

Apparently one of the crew went to the forward paint locker over the Easter weekend and found two uninvited gentlemen hiding in the store. They both were carrying Tanzanian passports (surprisingly) and, of course, had hidden themselves away on board in the hope they would not have been detected until it was too late to return to port.

The police were summoned and they were removed from the ship. The vessel was discharging fertiliser and no doubt they were able to board the vessel mingling with the trimmers and/or cleaning gangs.

GERMAN SHIP

Another question is how did they gain access to the port area?

The *Europa Point* sailed South on Monday and after this incident a very thorough search of the vessel must have been carried out to ensure she was 'stowaway free'.

SHIPPING with JOHN WALTERS

Another of the new class of East German container ships, the *Rudolstadt* is due Kilindini on Sunday to discharge some 250 containers from Europe prior to sailing for Dar Es Salaam and returning to load at the end of the month.

One of a series built in Spain with a capacity of 600 containers, her sister ships *Arnstadt* and *Halberstadt* have proved popular vessels for the DSR

Line's East African service and it is evident the company intends to place additional vessels of this class in the trade.

The Yugoslav *Heraj Senjanovic* owned by JSP Line who operate a regular Conference Lines liner service between East Africa and Greece Yugoslavia and Italy is taking on the role of a bulk carrier for today she is due at Mbaraki to load 3000 tons flourspurs in bulk, meantime, her sister ship the *Heraj Kosta Stamenkovic* is loading nearly 3000 tons of general and containerised cargo.

The Japanese NYK Line have two Bank Line 'Fish' Class vessels on charter at present time and both are due Mombasa next week the *Roachbank* to discharge 5300 tons from the Far East and the *Tenchbank* to load 1000 tons for the Far East. Both vessels were British built in 1979. The latter, however, has recently been reported as having been sold.

KENYA UTALII COLLEGE HOST POPULAR TRAINING COURSES

SUCH IS the popularity of Refresher Courses conducted at the Coast by lecturers from Kenya Utalii College that the establishment of a Mobile Training Unit is planned so that this type of training can be intensified.

This was revealed by Mr. M. K. Sio, Principal, Kenya Utalii College, when addressing a graduation ceremony at Mombasa's Hotel Inter-Continental before presenting certificates to all who had successfully completed the two-week course.

Earlier that day Mr. Sio had been Guest of Honour at a similar ceremony in Malindi — the first to be organised by the Liaison Committee, Coast.

• It will enable the college to plan courses on a higher level to cater for those who have already gone through the current Refresher Course programmes, and

Mr. Sio concluded by thanking Bandari College for providing the venue for four refresher course groups.

Also two other course centres — Mombasa Beach and Inter-Continental hotels — which have played a very significant role by providing their facilities as training centres for the benefit of not only their own personnel but also for the benefit of employees from other hotels'.

He went on 'these hotels, together with Whitesands, Nyali and Bamburi Beach have kindly played host to our staff during their two weeks at Mombasa'.

Said Mr. Sio 'we cannot ask for more in the spirit of co-operation, and I wish to sincerely thank all these hotels'.

Hotel Inter-Continental was also thanked for making available their spacious Function Room, for the graduation ceremony.

KENIA VERKAUFT SICH GUT IN BERLIN

VOM 7. BIS 12. MÄRZ 1987 wurde die Internationale Tourismus Börse (ITB), die letztes Jahr ihr 20jähriges Bestehen feiern konnte, in Berlin abgehalten. Rund 20.000 Tourismusfachleute aus über 100 Ländern besuchen jeweils dieses wichtige Kontaktforum, um sich über die Angebote auf dem internationalen Reisemarkt zu informieren.

Zum siebten Mal war auch die kenianische Küste an der ITB vertreten, und die "Kenya Association for Hotelkeepers

and Caterers" stellte im Rahmen einer zusätzlichen Werbekampagne erstmals mit ihrem eigenen ausführenden Prospekt die verschiedenen Hotels am indischen Ozean anschaulich vor. 50.000 Kopien wurden vorerst gedruckt und verteilt an die Filialen von Kenya Airways, kenianischen Verkehrsbüros, Reiseveranstalter und Reisebüros auf der ganzen Welt, um für Ferien in Kenia zu werben. Der Kenia-Stand, der bisher beste und größte, zog viele interessierte Besucher an und war

ein Musterbeispiel guter Zusammenarbeit zwischen der Regierung und der privaten Hotellerie.

Mr. Andrew Omanga, Minister für Tourismus und Wildlife, über 50 Hoteliers und Vertreter von Reisebüros gaben Auskunft über die vielen Vorzüge Kenias, wo man Baderferien mit Safaris kombinieren kann.

Eine Sonderausgabe von *Coastweek* (28 Seiten in deutscher Sprache - gratis an Interessenten abgegeben), die die verschiedenen Hotels, Lodgen und Touristenattraktionen in diesem Land der Kontraste beschrieb, war schon bald "ausverkauft". Die Sonderausgabe wurde freundlicherweise von *Condor* nach Berlin geflogen.

Da die Konkurrenz immer stärker wird und viele Ferienländer keine Kosten scheuen, um ihr Land durch Super Shows, prächtige Prospekte und Plakate anzupreisen, ist auch Kenia gezwungen, mehr Geld für die Werbung auszugeben.

Kenia konnte sich mehrere Jahre lang an der Spitze der beliebtesten Fernreiseziele halten, doch hat sich in letzter Zeit infolge übertrieben negativer Presseberichte über Malaria und Aids ein Rückgang der Buchungen bemerkbar gemacht.

Die Hotels waren voll ausgebucht in der Hochsaison, die allerdings früher als in den vergangenen Jahren zu Ende ging. Einige Charterfluggesellschaften mußten deshalb bereits Ende Januar Flüge einstellen, die ursprünglich bis Ostern durchgeführt werden sollten.

Angesichts dieser Tatsachen hängt die Zukunft des Tourismus zu einem großen Teil von einer gezielten Werbung ab. Die ITB in Berlin war deshalb die beste Gelegenheit, den Besuchern Kenia in Bild und Wort vorzustellen.

Swissair meldet zunehmenden Flugverkehr nach Kenia

DER STÄNDIG steigende Touristenstrom nach Kenia und die wachsende Beliebtheit Nairobis als attraktiver Treffpunkt für internationale Konferenzen haben viel zu dem beachtlichen Aufschwung des Flugverkehrs nach Kenia im letzten Jahr beigetragen. Dies wurde von Herrn Max Hauser, Manager von *Swissair* in Kenia, berichtet, dessen Fluggesellschaft auf drei wöchentlichen Flügen zwischen der Schweiz und Kenia im vergangenen Jahr insgesamt 28.000 Passagiere transportierte, was eine Zunahme von rund 20 Prozent gegenüber 1985 bedeutet.

Wie Herr Hauser bestätigte, erfolgte diese Zunahme in erster Linie dank *Swissairs* eigenem erfolgreichem Marketing und der aktiven Unterstützung durch die kenianische Tourismusindustrie.

Für Konferenzen und Kongresse, so Herr Hauser, liegt Kenia äußerst günstig in Afrika, weshalb viele weltweite Organisationen Nairobis als idealen Tagungsort gewählt haben und auch in Zukunft berücksichtigen werden.

Balair führte 85 Flüge durch mit insgesamt 23.000 Passagieren in einer Richtung und mit einer Auslastung von 91 Prozent. Eine kürzlich durchgeführte Erhebung hat ergeben, daß der Schweizer Tourist sich durchschnittlich 17 Tage in Kenia aufhält.

Da *Balair* nur einen Teil des gesamten Schweizermarktes bedient, wird die Anzahl aller Schweizer Touristen in Kenia im vergangenen Jahr auf rund 45.000 geschätzt.

1200 TONNEN EXPORTFRACHT
Swissair ist zuversichtlich, daß Kenia weiterhin eines der populärsten Reiseziele der europäischen Touristen bleibt.

Einer der Höhepunkte im letzten Jahr war die Einführung des Express-Dokumentendienstes *SPEx*, eine Neuerung mit etlichen Ausbaumöglichkeiten.

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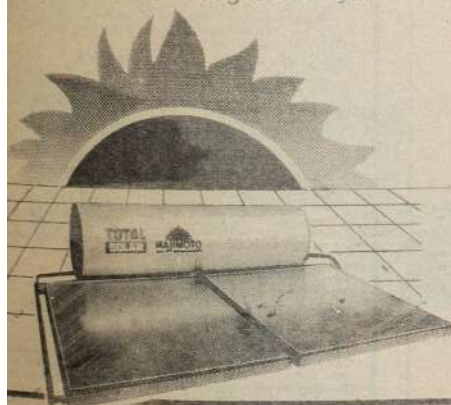

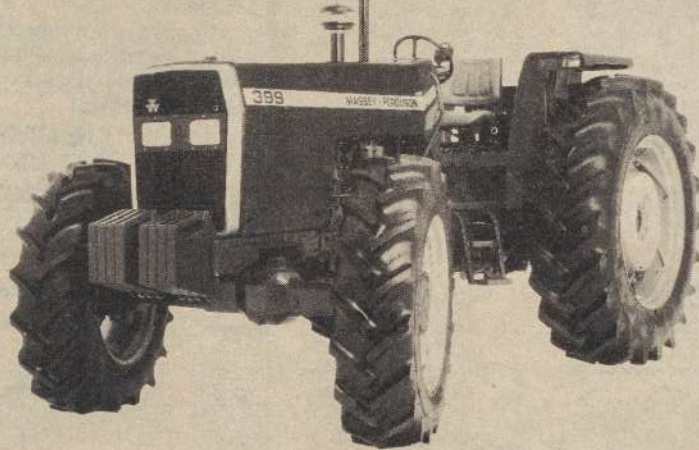

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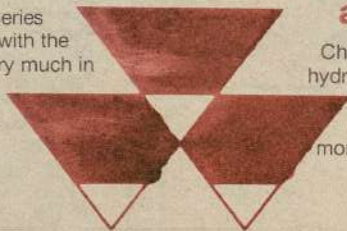

'Kachumbari Was Only Just In Time'

KACHUMBARI always seems to make it to places just in time. However, the other day he very nearly didn't make it on time for his flight due to circumstances that can be corrected and makes bums sore. It's that new road disease that started in Changamwe and seems to be spreading like wildfire to all the newly tarmacked or re-surfaced roads in Mombasa.

Kachumbari was heading for the airport and had barely three minutes to time bar. As he came to the Changamwe roundabout he ran into a slow moving queue of lorries at a point opposite the Kobil petrol station where the road divides into two. Being in a hurry he decided to overtake at this point.

He did not realise the folly of his decision till he found himself jammed on top of the lumps of tarmac that continue on from the apex of the lane divider. He pushed his car off these lumps and continued less speedily to the airport arriving just in time. Damage! Bent stabiliser bar.

It could be worse. The relentless pounding that these under-designed and incorrectly constructed roads take is no mean matter. The problem is compounded by the fact that very few transporters within the town concern themselves with the

statute that restricts the axle loading such that a uniformity of design can be achieved i.e. if one builds a road to the traffic density and loads anticipated then it will LAST.

Anyhow, the disease I refer to is the way in which recently constructed road surfaces seem to turn gelatinous and move.

What started off as mere surface ripples has now consolidated into horrendous lumps in the middle of each lane. And these lumps are slowly getting higher (or is the road sinking one wonders!?) What is at stake currently is people's lives and livelihoods.

The lowest important parts of the car are the differential at the back and the oil sump at the front. The average clearance of family cars ranges between 120 millimetres and 250 millimetres. It has happened and continuously threatens to do so - witness the number of scratch marks one finds.

Kachumbari met his Mkokoteni at the Mwembe Tayari roundabout. He was heading for town and following a lorry. The lorry indicated to turn off the roundabout so Kachumbari decided to slip round.

koteni speeding in his direction oblivious to the fact that he was heading on a collision course.

The minute the Mkokoteni driver noticed him he let go of the handles to execute the "emergency brake" but unfortunately the rubber strips at the front that normally stop the motion peeled off (i.e. he suffered brake failure) and the Mkokoteni, unaided, rammed into the side of Kachumbari's car.

The owner quickly retrieved it but not fast enough to get away. Kachumbari grabbed him by the short and curly, looked him straight in the eye for a minute without saying a word.

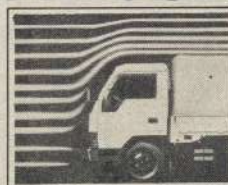

Secretaries' Club Present Mosquito Nets To Disabled

THE HIGHLIGHT of the 'Annual Awards' luncheon of the Nyali Beach Secretaries Club was the presentation of seven badly needed mosquito nets for the APDK's Polio Clinic at Port Reitz.

The clinic is presently looking after forty in-patients from 3 1/2 to 16 years, and relies completely on charity to keep going.

In an Harambee, led by the hotel's General Manager, Abdul Ali, Shs 2430/- was also raised for the clinic after hearing that it was in urgent need of corrugated iron sheets to protect it from rain.

It included a donation from the APDK staff invited to the luncheon to receive the mosquito nets as well as gifts of children's clothes from members.

With several pledges of further financial support it was expected that this sum might be doubled.

George Kimani, the APDK's administrator at the Coast, thanked members for their continued support and said how much such gifts were appreciated.

The Polio Clinic treats 11,000 cases and undertakes 88 operations a year. It costs - Shs. 450,000/- to run per annum.

The service it offers, for which there is increasing demand, is completely free of charge.

It has a physiotherapist seconded by government, also a mobile clinic which sends polio victims from all over the Coast Province to Port Reitz for treatment.

Those admitted for an operation to enable them to walk again with the help of calipers and crutches, stay at the clinic for about six months.

Mr Kimani revealed that whereas they had received considerable help from the community during 1986, there had been much less this year.

One of its most pressing needs at the moment is for food, including fruit and eggs.

Mr. Kimani also mentioned how the children would be delighted by a visit from members of the Secretaries Club.

The general manager, Nyali Beach Hotel, Abdul Ali, in appealing for donations, told members 'it is a very worthwhile cause'.

He went on to reveal that 1986 had been a record year for the hotel, and that in the first four months of 1987 a 97 per cent room occupancy had been achieved.

Declared Mr Ali 'this would not have been possible without your support, for which we thank you'.

DATELINE: DAR ES SALAAM

Government Acts Over Plague Outbreak In Lushoto District

FOLLOWING THE DEATHS of over 40 people in an outbreak of plague in Lushoto District of Tanzania, the Tanga Integrated Ryal Development Programme (TIRDP) unit has organised a seminar to deliberate on the subject and to come up with permanent solutions, if possible.

The main thrust of the workshop will be to look into the possibilities of introducing the

ies abroad, have raised deposit and demurrage charges for cargo containers to discourage users from retaining the containers.

The deposit charges on each container have shot up from 5000/- to 100,000/- for one container destined to East and Central Africa through the port of Dar es Salaam.

The Rotterdam based Container Transport Institute (CTI) has also increased demurrage charges for its containers assigned to Dar es Salaam at an average of between 2.5 to 7 US dollars per container per day.

The increases however were inevitable because many consignees did not bother to return the containers and instead used them as storage places or resold them to other parties hence making profits on the same.

Owners of the containers in Europe and the United States had been complaining bitterly that containers assigned to the region took a long time before being returned or were never returned at all.

The National Shipping Agency Company (NASACO) has now called upon its consignees in the country as well as those from neighbouring countries to return the containers immediately after unloading.

It is reported that over 2000 containers are being held by customers in Tanzania and neighbouring countries. Figures quoted are:

Tanzania - 866; Zambia - 788; Zaire - 28; Malawi - 143 and Uganda - 7.

The plague problem first erupted in Lushoto in 1980 and has affected the district annually by also claiming a number of lives.

Buoys have also been free which has enabled the ships to be accommodated both alongside and in the stream at the commercial shipping. A convenient berth for the passenger ship *Maksim Gorkiy* is Number one and nearest to town.

The vessel *Zulfikar* (which unable to trace in Lloyds Register) called for Bunkers and Water last Saturday prior to proceeding to Dar Es Salaam.

After sailing from Mombasa I understand two stowaways were discovered - one Tanzanian and one believed to be a Ghanaian.

The Master of the vessel decided to continue his coastal passage to Dar Es Salaam. Dodwells looked after the vessel during her short call.

There has been considerable activity over the past week involving Japanese and Korean fishing vessels at Mtongwe anchorage.

The Japanese mother ship *Kyoku Shin Maru* loaded some 300 tons Tuna Fish transhipped the ship to ship from the South Korean catcher vessels *Dongwon 909* and *Taewoong 502*.

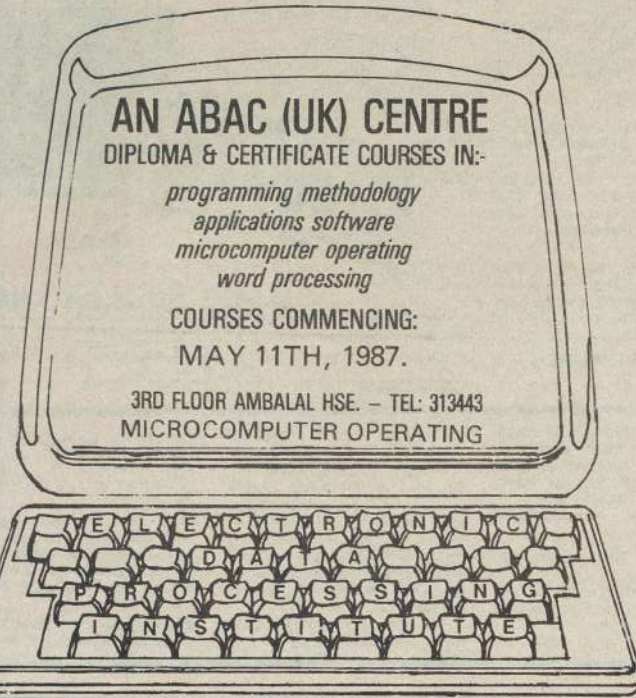

GUTE NACHRICHTEN erreichten uns aus der Bundesrepublik Deutschland, denn NUR Touristik konnte trotz negativer Presseberichte über Aids in Kenia eine Zunahme der Buchungen um 15 Prozent während der am 30. April zu Ende gegangenen Wintersaison melden.

Diese erfreuliche Nachricht wurde bekanntgegeben von Herrn Walter E. Krombach, Vizepräsident für Übersetouren und Kreuzfahrten, der kürzlich mit seiner Familie bei Alliance Hotels am wunderschönen Dianstrand auf Urlaub war.

NUR Touristik ist einer der größten deutschen Reiseveranstalter, die Touristen nach Kenia schicken.

Herr Krombach findet diese Zunahme sehr ermutigend und erklärte, daß auch zwischen 5 und 10 Prozent mehr Buchungen für die kommende Sommersaison zu erwarten sind.

Er erwähnte, daß anfänglich die Buchungen etwas zurück-

gingen infolge der negativen Berichte in der deutschen Presse über Aids in Kenia. NUR war damals fast ausgebucht bis Mitte März. Während einige Annullierungen eintrafen, wurden die freien Zimmer an andere Interessenten abgegeben. Mit anderen Worten, während einige vorsichtige Urlauber absagten, nahmen andere gerne ihre frei gewordenen Plätze ein.

Mitte März nahmen die Buchungen wieder zu. Bis dahin hatten sich die Gemüter etwas

beruhigt, die Diskussionen neutralisiert, denn fast jedermann hatte eingesehen, daß Aids ein weltweites Problem darstellt und in Kenia nicht gefährlicher ist als anderswo.

Am 28. April kam das russische Kreuzfahrtschiff *Maxim Gorki*, das während der letzten 13 Jahre ganzjährig für Kreuzfahrten gechartert war, für einen zweitägigen Besuch nach Mombasa. In der Wintersaison führt die *Maxim Gorki* (das Flaggschiff von Neckermann) Weltreisen durch.

Ihre gegenwärtige Kreuzfahrt von 149 Tagen ist wohl eine der längsten von einem Kreuzfahrtschiff durchgeführten Touren. Von Mombasa aus geht die letzte Etappe via Madagaskar, Seychellen, Jemen und durch den Suezkanal nach Genua.

Die Kreuzfahrt ist in sieben Etappen unterteilt, und durchschnittlich befinden sich 550 Passagiere an Bord.

Während sich das Schiff im Hafen von Mombasa aufhielt, führte die United Touring Company (UTC), die mit den Landarrangements von Neckermann betraut ist, die Passagiere auf eine Reihe interessanter Bus- und Flugsafaris sowie auf andere Ausflüge in ganz Kenia.

Manche Passagiere buchen zwei oder drei Etappen einer Weltreise. Auf diese Weise verlassen nie alle Passagiere zusammen das Schiff, außer in Genua am Ende der Kreuzfahrt.

Während der Sommersaison, die am 18. Mai beginnt, führt die *Maxim Gorki* ab Genua und ab Bremerhaven Mittelmeeresreisen und skandinavische Kreuzfahrten durch.

NECKERMANN

Als Neckermann im Jahre 1964 mit den Keniareisen begann, wohnten die ersten Kunden in Malindi. Viele waren von diesem Badeort so begeistert, daß sie immer wieder zurückkehrten.

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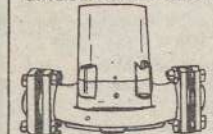
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ASTER PILGRIMAGE FOR THE TANAHIH SHIELD' IN NAIROBI

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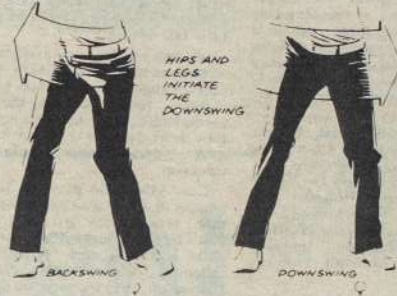
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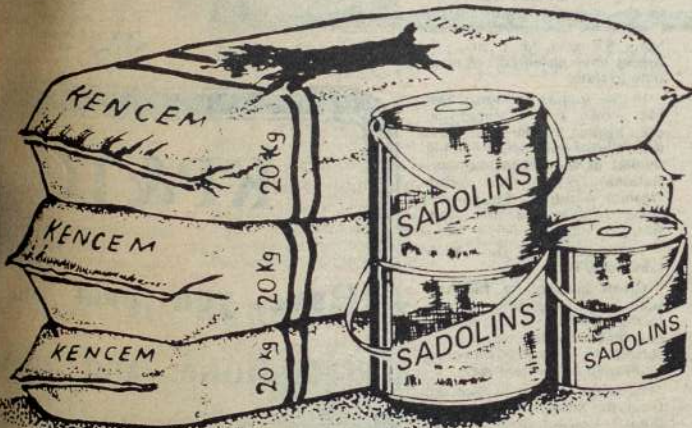

The Kenya Football Federation Coast Branch Secretary Khamis Ali Khamis informed Coastweek that though they have postponed all Coast Premier League matches until after Ramadan, they have organised Bandari-Warriors clash on the request of COTU Coast Branch.

The two top contenders will be contesting the two league points as well as the May Day trophy. If the game ends in a draw in the original 90 minutes period, the two teams will share the two points. The cup winner is to be determined by penalty kicks.

Bandari, still holding the unbeaten record (the other being Mombasa Wanderers) are slightly favoured to win the match against Warrior. However, having rested since returning from KECOSO Games, could affect their performance especially against a confident Warriors side.

The cyclists can show their talent only if they are:

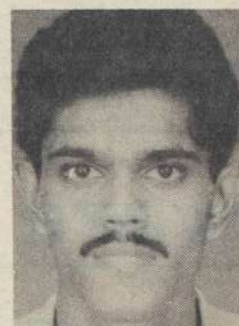
Given appropriate facilities such as training time, proper racing bicycles, equipment, coaching, experience and sponsorship of more Coast-cycling races such as the Reef race.
