MINISTRY TO ACT:

Where Are The Cruise Ships?

MANY people in Mombasa are asking "where are the cruise ships?"

Mombasa is presently going through a "low" season - a time when cruise ships usually start calling.

Great news is that some very positive action is being taken by the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife which is sponsoring a two-day "Cruise Ship Seminar" at Bandari College on October 2 and 3.

It will be officially opened by the Minister for Tourism and Wildlife, Mr Katana Ngala.

At the end of 1987, the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association, feeling concerned at the dwindling number of cruise ships calling at Mombasa set up a sub-committee as a means of improving the handling and receiving of cruise ships at Mombasa in order to attract more.

It was felt that more could be done to make them feel welcome as is done in other parts of the world and that

delays in passengers disembarking for game parks and excursions should be cut to the minimum.

Other suggestions have been that such ships could be more conveniently accommodated at either Berth one or two where customs, immigration and vehicle parking facilities are available, and that the area be provided with a restaurant and bar, comfortable lounge, landing bridge and a sheltered area for curio sellers.

The sub-committee, under the chairmanship of Peter Mangnitz (who is also chairman of MCTA), has had meetings with the Kenya Ports Authority and has been encouraged by the interest being shown, as well as by the fact that KPA has translated this interest into action by now providing welcome banners, one Bandari troupe of traditional dancers and band on the quay-side as cruise ships arrive.

MCTA feels that more cruise ships should be attracted here, as well as being stationed at Mombasa.

It is understood that during the forthcoming 1989 and 1990 high season two small cruise ships might be based at Mombasa

COAST LEADERS TO JOIN IN 'CHARITY CELEBRITY WALK'

THE HEADMASTER of Mombasa's famous 'Tahdhib Muslim School', in co-operation with numerous ex-students, is organising a gala 'Muslim Celebrity Walk' on Sunday, September 24, 1989.

Together they have invited many distinguished personalities and prominent businessmen to participate in the grand fund-raising walk - the first of its kind to be organised in Mombasa in aid of a Muslim development project that will specifically assist the youth.

The walk is planned to start at the Sakina Mosque passing through Muslim Road into Jomo Kenyatta Avenue, Digo Road and will end up at Sheikh Jundani Mosque.

The two mosques have been chosen to be starting and finishing point as a symbol to portray the Islamic event.

The walk will be officially flagged off by the Chief Kadhi of Kenya Sheikh Nassor Nahdi.

According to the programme prepared by the secretary of the project committee Abdulla Tamimi, the walk will be flanked by some smartly dressed pupils of the Madrassa escorted by the Sixth Troop Arab Scouts dressed in Arabian Agals and Kashidas.

Amongst the prominent personalities invited is Sheikh Abdulla Zubedi, well known for his generosity to charitable organisations. Sheikh Twahir Said, Sheikh Mohammed Swaleh Bawazir and his partner Sheikh Rashid Sajjad Bawazir.

Others who have confirmed participation are His Worship the Mayor of Mombasa Sheikh Ahmed Shahame Mwidani, Hon. Shariff Nassir who is also the project co-ordinator, Hon Said Hemed Said and many Councillors.

The Madrassa, has its own unique history in the township of Mombasa. Almost all the prominent figures in the industries who are Muslims have passed through the classes of this school as it was the oldest and is situated in the heart of Mombasa "Mwembe Tanganyika" in the Mvita Constituency.

The Madrassa was established in 1948 by the late Ustadh Alwy Kassim Alwy a prominent scholar who obtained his religious knowledge from Maalim Humed and Sheikh Bereb before travelling briefly to Cairo to attend brief training in the Al-Azhar University.

The late Ustadh Alwy travelled extensively to propagate Islam throughout Eastern Africa. He was well known for his fluency

# Port Reitz 'Polio Clinic' Urgently Needs More Cash

URGENTLY needed is help for the Port Reitz Polio Clinic which is faced with an expected deficit of Shs 435,000/- this year.

It comes under the aegis of the Association for the Physically Disabled of Kenya, which is not in a position to cover this deficit balance through incomes from the Likoni and Bombolulu Workshops.

The Clinic has therefore to depend on support from the local community and overseas donors.

Said its new Administrator, Hubert Seifert "We are now making a special appeal to all our regular donors to try to find additional sponsors locally and from overseas. We depend on special efforts through our friends to help us through this difficult time."

During the first six months of 1989, 46 children were operated on and admitted to the clinic; 657 outpatients were treated there while 435 were attended to by the Mobile Clinic 361 plasters were applied. Most of the patients received crutches, calipers and wheelchairs from its workshop.

Said Mr Seifert, since most of our patients come from poor families, we only charge Shs. 100/- on admission, while only minimum fees are charged for walking aids."

He revealed that the biggest strain on their budget was the high cost of preparations in private hospitals.

These cost between Shs 800/- to Shs 5,000/- while some patients require multiple operations.

Added Mr Seifert "only a limited number of patients can be operated on at subsidised charges at Kilifi, Pandya, Aga Khan and Mombasa Hospitals."

Here he paid tribute to the tireless and unselfish services of surgeons McVicker, Brahmabhatt, Ambeva and Patel for operating on patients free of charge. Adding "without their valuable work and time we would not be in a position to afford the surgery."

Contributing towards the increased costs of running the clinic was the employment of additional staff. "This," said Mr Seifert "was necessary due to the decline of personnel provided by government."

Their budget was also affected

by the purchase of additional foodstuffs for patients. He said "the provision of food from the Government Hospital is not sufficient and we are forced to buy rice, bread, milk and meat to ensure a balanced diet".

Due to the high deficit in operational costs, the planned expansion programme for the clinic has had to be delayed.

Since May, the clinic has been running a nursery school for in-patients which is managed by Jorun Dalson, a Norwegian Volunteer sponsored by Norad. The clinic is now looking for a Kenyan Nursery school teacher to take over from Jorun who will then embark on a follow-up programme on discharged patients in the rural areas.

### BASIC EDUCATION

Explained Mr. Seifert "most of our patients did not attend school before admission to our clinic. They now receive some basic education which will help them integrate into normal or special schools after they have been discharged".

Seven former patients have been taken by Bombolulu for training in jewellery making and tailoring and will be offered employment after qualifying.

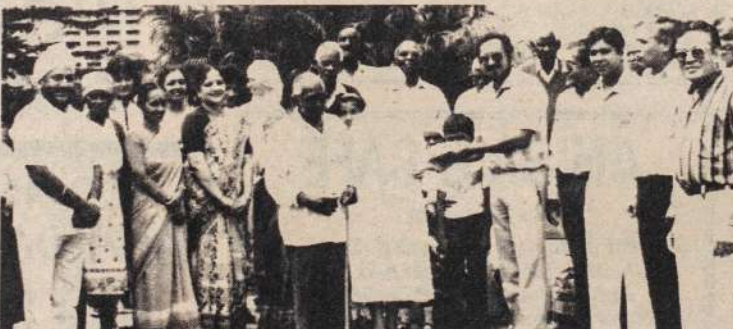

# 'Stabilizer' And 'Police Academy'

LOTUS Cinema is now screening *The Stabilizer* where an Indonesian Police Captain Johnny (Harry Capry) takes aim. In this Punjabi Brothers production, Johnny teams up with American FBI Special Agent Peter Goldson (Peter O'Brian) also known as Stabilizer, to smash a Jakarta-based international heroin ring run by the evil Greg Rainmaker (Craig Gavin).

They are ably assisted by FBI agent Sylvia Nash (Gillie Bean) and Christina Provost (Dana Christina) whose father has been kidnapped by Rainmaker's thugs.

The drug king wants to lay his hands on a narcotics detector invented by Professor Provost.

However, far from wanting to use it for its inventor's patriotic purpose of stamping out illegal drugs to save his country's youth, Rainmaker plans to use it to stamp out his competitors.

There is another side to the story. We learn that seven years before, Rainmaker raped and murdered Goldson's fiancée in revenge against FBI man who had crippled him during an earlier drug raid.

There is plenty of bloodshed as the good guys mow down Rainmaker's evil hordes. Although the film may draw the interest

of Mombasa's action-movie fans with few love scenes.

The films redeeming features include the use of one or two flash-backs and the director's occasional use of the camera to showcase Indonesia's stunning scenery.

Today and tomorrow, Kenya Cinema is screening *Police Academy 5*, an outstanding hit comedy. For followers of the Police academy films, this should provide some welcome change. They should expect a lot of laughs.

## Le Colporteur De La Revolution' Is Coming!

MUCH attention has recently been given to the 50th Anniversary of the start of the Second World War, which admittedly had shattering worldwide repercussions.

Not quite so much attention was given a few months back to the 200th anniversary of an equally important event: the French Revolution.

Tentative plans are in hand to bring to Mombasa a 90 minute spectacle based on the Revolution the Little Theatre Club in conjunction with the Alliance Francaise, hope to arrange sponsorship for a one-night performance of *Le Colporteur De La Revolution* performed by the Compagnie Dominique Houdart - Jeanne Heuclin from the Lavoisier region of Epinal in the Vosges region of France.

It is impossible to give an exact translation of "Colporteur" but this was basically a street actor and musician whose skills ranged through a very wide variety of the dramatic arts: actor, singer, mimic, puppeteer, etc.

In an action packed performance, the Compagnie Houdart-Heuclin (only four artistes) will condense the events of these hectic years of the 1790s into 90 minutes on the LTC stage.

Apart from the human actors there will be marionettes, and unusual visual and sound presentations. The Company will be bringing with it 560 kgs of costumes, props and technical equipment.

*Colporteur* is suitable for audiences of all ages, and although dialogue and songs are entirely in French, this should not put off non-French speakers from attending: the spectacle itself will more than make up for this slight hindrance.

Nevertheless, the show will be of particular appeal to the French speaking community, historians and students of French in the high school and of the Alliance Francaise.

in Arabic and hard-hitting religious speeches every Friday.

He died in a road accident on the Nairobi-Mombasa Road in 1974 after attending an Islamic Conference in Nairobi.

The late Ustadh Alwy was then using a private house donated by a Muslim brother in Mombasa, as school premises until the death of the landlord, following his death, his heirs demanded that the house be returned to them. There was no choice but to vacate the house and use a vacant hall nearby owned by a small welfare society and later to a nearby mosque as a temporary Madrassah.

Unfortunately pupils are still under these temporary and precarious conditions since 1978.

While the number of students tended to increase year after year totalling now to 350 pupils, the situations constantly deteriorated even with the establishment of shifts.

In order to overcome the above mentioned precarious condition, and the urgent need to provide suitable premises, Al-Ustadh Tawhir Kasim, the brother of the late Ustadh Alwy Kassim called upon the parents of the pupils and explained to them the need of building a permanent school to cater for the studies of their children.

## PARENTS

The parents who most of them were students in the Madrassah willingly responded to the call and later a committee was appointed to steer the fund-raising for the project.

Since its appointment, the Committee managed to raise funds to the tune of 500,000/- and managed to purchase a house at Mwembe Tanganyika.

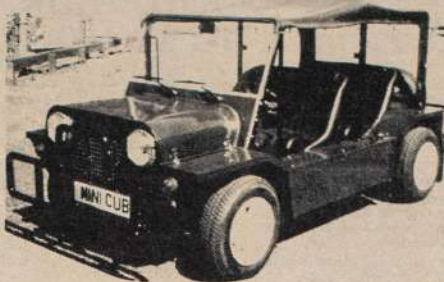

# TOURISM SEMINAR WILL DISCUSS 'CRUISE VESSELS'

At the two day seminar, the Director of Tourism, Mr D. Musila, will talk on "Cruise Ships — a new element in Kenya's tourist industry", while the Managing Director of Kenya Ports Authority, Mr P.O. Ukundi, will address the forum on "Mombasa Port and the Challenge of the Cruise Ship Industry".

Michael Dunford, a member of the MCTA sub-committee will speak on "What is a Cruise Ship".

MCTA feels that this ministerial focus and in depth dialogue on this aspect of the tourist industry will do much to help attract more tour operators to

include Mombasa Port in their itineraries.

Both Michael Dunford of Nairobi and H. Atkinson, with considerable experience of cruise ships worldwide, have been helping with this promotion.

The MCTA committee, recently meeting at the Oceanic Hotel, with the Vice-Chairman, Z. Harunani presiding, also welcomed the establishment of the Association of Kenya Game Fishing Boat Owners' under the chairmanship of Gary Cullen of Hemingways, Watamu.

## LARGE INCREASE

It was formed mainly to try and stop the large increase of unlicensed, uninsured and illegal deep sea fishing charter operators by getting them to bring their boats up to the required safety standards together with a licence and insurance.

MCTA has for some time been concerned about the operation of such boats. It was suggested that a representative from the association be invited to join the MCTA committee so that it can be kept abreast of developments.

During discussion on the illegal operation of such boats the very long delays in the processing of licences in Nairobi was mentioned. It was a matter needing urgent attention by those concerned.

It was also considered that before any deep sea fishing boat is licenced it be inspected to ensure it conforms to all laid down regulations, as the safety of tourists is paramount.

The first issue of the MCTA tourist guide, in colour, will be out soon and is to be officially launched during October.

It will be published monthly and the Guide will be distributed free of charge to hotels, international airlines, tour operators and travel agents.

It is being produced by James Muchungu, Managing Director of Orchardson Advertising and an editorial sub-committee has been elected by MCTA comprising Rahah Mwendwa, Lorna Hayes and Neta Peal.

In response to a request by MCTA, Crown Paints will be presenting to the Mayor of Mombasa a gift of paint to re-decorate the Tusk Arches in Moi Avenue in readiness for the national celebrations during October.

## KENYA BUS SERVICE

The work of repairing the dents in the Tusks and repainting will be undertaken by the Municipal Council.

The Kenya Bus Service to and from the Airport from Likoni was discussed. Mr T. Juma Assistant Traffic Controller, KBS, Coast, explained what they had done to improve the service and to reduce long delays for staff working there.

He promised to have a representative at the airport for one week to study staff movements to and from buses, with a view to further improvements being made.

MCTA is still pressing the Municipal Council to take over

responsibility for illuminating the Coffee Pot traffic island facing Fort Jesus Museum. At the moment it is Ali Burhan of Ali's Curio Market who is paying the bill for the electricity consumed. It was he and his Old Town team which turned

an unkempt island into something unique and beautiful which is admired by visitors from all over the world.

It was felt that council should accept some responsibility towards its upkeep as it was done to benefit the town.

This indicates that we should find out the best method to answer the salutation.

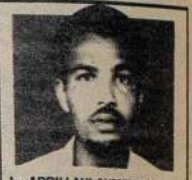

## Trust in TOYOTA KENYA

THE cargo handled through the port of Mombasa during the first six months (January-June) of this year has shown a marked increase over cargo handled during the same period last year (1988).

The available port statistics indicate that a total of 4,120,938 tonnes were handled between January and June this year compared to 3,023,950 tonnes handled during the corresponding period last year (1988).

This is, of course, an increase of 1,096,988 tonnes (36.28 per cent increase) over that of last year and indeed an early indication that the cargo throughout for the whole of 1989 is likely to exceed the 6,671,943 tonnes handled during the year 1988.

The breakdown of 4,120,938 tonnes over the first six months of this year include 1,469,371 tonnes of dry general cargo, 505,780 tonnes of dry bulk cargo, 2,112,603 tonnes bulk liquid and 33,184 tonnes of transshipment cargo.

It is, however, interesting to note that transshipment cargo handled between January and June, 1989, has also exceeded that of the corresponding period in 1988, and has proved to be

the highest during the corresponding period over the last four years.

Moreover in 1985 the port handled 14,109 tonnes of transshipment cargo over the first six months, while the tonnage increased to 15,781 in the corresponding period in 1986.

During the first of 1987, transshipment traffic handled was 11,810 tonnes and last year

11,872 tonnes of transshipment cargo was handled during the first half of the year.

The available statistics covering the first half of this year clearly indicate that 33,184 tonnes of transshipment cargo has been handled at the port.

In fact, this reflects increases of 21,312 tonnes (179.51 per cent increase) over the tonnage

handled during the first half of 1988.

This conspicuous increase is an indication that this year's transshipment cargo will record a major increase in the history of the port, thus surpassing the cargo handled during the whole of 1988.

The management is, nevertheless adopting a deliberate policy of attracting more and more transshipment traffic in order to take advantage of our geographical location.

In cognisance of the upsurge in container traffic in the port of Mombasa the port management has carefully effected several measures aimed at ensuring that the efficiency of the container terminal is sustained.

Among the measures which so far have had a positive impact on the performance of the container terminal, have been stationing of a container terminal engineer on permanent basis

at the container terminal and attaching a supplies officer to the terminal.

This well calculated changes are however aimed at ensuring that the container terminal operates as a specialised unit under the terminal manager so as to be able to cope efficiently with the increasing container traffic.

And to be candid enough about the effectiveness of the changes one should easily note improved performances at the terminal.

Performances have constantly averaged over 250 TEUs per day, a mark which is well above the 160 TEUs agreed upon between ISCOS and the East African Conference Lines due to improved equipment availability at the terminal.

A case in point is m.v. Victoria Bay which called at the port in July and attained 535 moves in one day.

cent, Rwanda+21.6 per cent and Sudan-43.9 per cent.

With the above trend it is anticipated that the annual tonnage for transit countries will be more than the previous year (1988). This will and might surpass the all time high record of 507,156 tonnes recorded in 1987.

The number of ship arrivals with respect to dry cargo ships used to be as high as 90-100 vessels per month upto 1980. But with increasing sizes of ships coming up in the international maritime world, however, few ships are carrying the same or higher volumes of traffic.

Consequently, the ship arrival rate at the port of Mombasa and indeed in other Eastern African ports declines to the current level of some 75-80 vessels per month.

However, during the first half of this year, the port of Mombasa has received a total of 764 vessels comprising of general cargo, oil tankers and containerised vessels.

This figure shows an increase of ship traffic compared to the corresponding period last year when 744 vessels called at the port. This indicates an increase of 20 vessels.

The port statistics for the first quarter this year (1989) have also indicated that the transit traffic through the port of Mombasa had significant increase compared to the corresponding period last year (1988).

This port, of course, handles transit traffic for Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Eastern Zaire and Southern Sudan.

### TRANSIT CARGO

In the quarter under review, a total of 73,164 tonnes of transit cargo was handled through the port of Mombasa compared to 37,989 tonnes during the corresponding quarter of 1988. This is an increase of about 52 per cent over the corresponding quarter.

The highest increase in transit cargo handled during the period is for Burundi which rose to 209 per cent from a mere 3,308 tonnes in first quarter of 1988 to 10,209 tonnes in the first quarter for this year (1989).

All the transit countries recorded increases in the cargo they routed through our port except of Sudan which recorded a decline of 44 per cent. This is to be expected due to the prolonged turmoil reigning in the Southern Sudan.

Corresponding increases in figures in the countries are: Burundi+208.6 per cent, Tanzania+90.5 per cent, Uganda +53.4 per cent, Zaire+39.9 per

Modeschmuck feilbieten, und überdies Transport für die Hotelgäste, die gerne die Schmuckwerkstatt und das Schneideratelier in Bombolulu besichtigen und dort einige dieser gediegenen Artikel kaufen möchten.

Die Schmuckwerkstätte wurde von Holland Millis, einem Mitglied des amerikanischen Peace Corps, vor rund zwanzig Jahren ins Leben gerufen, während heute für die Verwaltung Hubert Seifert vom deutschen Entwicklungsdienst verantwortlich ist.

Vor sieben Jahren kam Herr Seifert nach Kenia, um den "Likon Sheltered Workshop" — eine Lehrwerkstätte, wo Körperbehinderte im Schreinerberuf ausgebildet werden und Qualitätsmöbel herstellen, die vor allem von Strandhotels gekauft werden — zu leiten und kam 1987 nach Bombolulu, wo er der Schmuckwerkstatt zu einem großen Aufschwung verholfen hat.

Bombolulu steht unter der Schirmherrschaft des kenianischen Verbandes für Körperbehinderte (Association for the Physically Disabled of Kenya), Sektion Küste.

Herr Seifert hat sich stets voll für die Behinderten eingesetzt und ist aufgrund seiner Erfolge jetzt auch mit der Verwaltung der Poliklinik in Port Reitz — eine wohltätige Einrichtung, wo durch Kinderlähmung behinderte Jugendliche und andere Körperbehinderte freie Behandlung und Therapie erhalten können — betraut worden.

Ein Teil des Erlöses aus den Verkäufen von Bombolulu und Likon wird für den Unterhalt der Poliklinik verwendet.

Die kürzliche Modenschau im Whitesands Hotel fand im geräumigen Foyer in der ersten Etage statt. 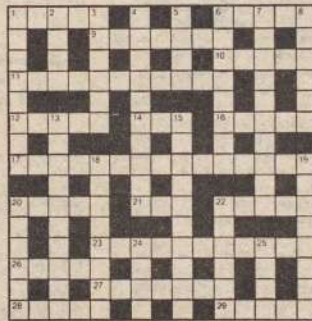

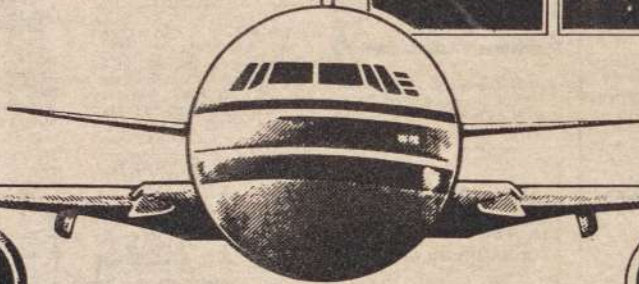
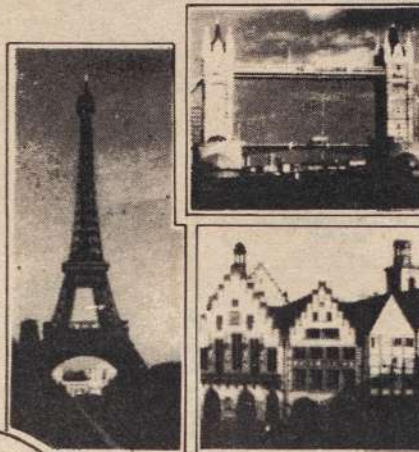
