MOMBASA WELCOMES UNITED STATES NAVY

'Spending Million Dollars A Day ...'

MOMBASA gave a big welcome to the American Navy - back again after one year - for their visit also gave a big boost to trade in the town which has been quite slack.

It is estimated that about one million dollars a day had been brought into Mombasa. While the ships were buying much local produce including fresh fruit and vegetables.

Eight ships of the USS Midway Battle Group led by Aircraft Carrier, USS Midway - which have been deployed in the Indian Ocean - arrived at Mombasa on Tuesday morning with over 7,000 officers and men eager to go ashore for some rest and recreation after being at sea for some one-and-a-half months.

They are part of the seventh fleet which covers all the Western Pacific and Indian Ocean. The seventh fleet, with around 100 ships at any given time, is known as the "Battle Alfa Group".

The men made the most of their four days ashore - some relaxed in comfortable beach hotels, while others went on two-day safaris to Amboseli/Tsavo National Parks to say "Hi" to Kenya's magnificent wildlife in their natural habitat. This kept many tour operators very busy.

One day after arriving nearly 300 men were involved in a day-long exercise painting the Day Care Centre and Primary School at Freretown.

The first duty ashore for Rear Admiral T.A. Mercer, was to pay courtesy calls on the Provincial Commissioner, Coast, Simeon Mung'ala, and the mayor, Councillor Ahmed Mwidani.

He was accompanied by the American Consul at Mombasa, Stephen Earl Eisenbraun; Colonel Dale Ackels, USS Military Representative in Nairobi, and Captain D.K. Muvas of the Kenya Navy.

In the evening the Rear Admiral, together with the

American Consul and his wife, Mrs Lorraine Eisenbraun, hosted a reception at their Nyali residence for some 300 guests in honour of this visiting American fleet.

Entertaining was the smartly uniformed "Midway Magic Brass Band" conducted by Commander James Prince and comprising talented musicians who do not often have the opportunity of playing together as a group. They were excellent.

Catering was in the hands of experts - Hotel Inter-Continental and there was a big "thank you" to them by the American Consul as well as to the hotel's General

ULTRA MODERN I.C.U. FOR PANDYA MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

MOMBASA'S PANDYA Memorial Hospital is growing fast and a Shs 12 million Intensive Care Unit is going in - the foundation stone of which was laid by a well known businessman and philanthropist, Yusuf Mamujee of Mamujee Brothers Limited, on Sunday, October 15.

He had started the "ball rolling by giving the largest single donation of Shs one million towards this project. So far, just over Shs 3,200,000 has been pledged. The project comprises a four-bedded Intensive Care Unit, Renal Dialysis Unit, second Operating Theatre also conversion and modernisation of four special rooms adjoining ICU

to function as an Intermediate Care Unit.

Dr Ramesh Desai, a member of the hospital Board of Management, when speaking at the stone laying ceremony which attracted a great number of well-wishers from a cross-section of the community, revealed that the Renal Dialysis Unit will be the first of its kind in Mombasa.

He hoped it would be the first giant step towards the initiation of a chronic haemodialysis programme for kidney patients in the Coast Region.

He went on "with the availability of a haemodialysis unit, it is within the realm of possibility to introduce a kidney transplant programme in Mombasa in the foreseeable future".

Adding "indeed, the technical medical expertise is available

but the lack of instrumental infrastructure has prevented such a transplant so far".

Declared Dr Desai "it is hoped that the initiative taken by the Pandya Memorial Hospital will eventually lead to the establishment of a super renal medical and surgical facility".

"It is with this in mind", he said "that the hospital has embarked upon the development of a second major Operation Theatre

SUPERB SEA-VIEW SITES NOW BEING SOLD BY 'HORIZON'

THE Basis of good living is obviously to own a good home, but equally important to most individuals and families is the environment and/or neighbours.

COUNCIL BUS FARE INCREASE

BY agreement with the Mombasa Municipal Council, bus fares will be increased effective from October 16, 1989.

A spokesman for Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited told COASTWEEK:

"The Company regrets that these increases have to be implemented and emphasises that due to ever increasing cost of such major items as vehicle parts, insurance, wages, fuel and other charges such as electricity, and telephone, it has no alternative but to increase the fares.

"The new fare structure will increase the minimum fare from Shs. 2/- to Shs. 2/50. Thereafter the peak fares in most cases will increase by -50 cents.

"However, the Company presently does not propose to increase the students fares and would continue to provide the concessionary week-end fares which will be available for the half days on Saturdays and for the whole days on Sundays and Public Holidays.

"The Company will also continue to offer the cheap "off-peak" fares between 9.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on weekdays."

The Spokesman concluded: "These increases are absolutely minimal and the Company continues to apply strictest economy in all areas of its operations."

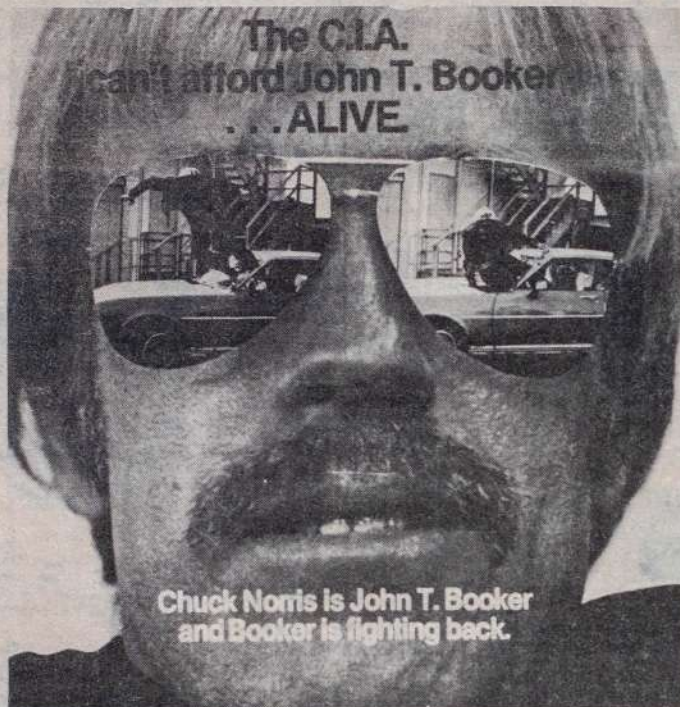

Scandinavia Flight

AFTER a lapse of nearly ten years, Kenya Airways will resume its flight from Nairobi to Copenhagen in Denmark. Commencing early in the month, the once-weekly flight will depart Nairobi at 10.00 a.m. on Friday arriving Copenhagen at 6.55 p.m. on the same day, then return to Nairobi on Saturday at 10.00 a.m. The Southbound services will depart Copenhagen on the day at 8.30 p.m., arriving at Nairobi the following day (i.e. Sunday) at 9.00 a.m.

A DC.8 aircraft will be used to operate these services. This aircraft has 12 First and 224 Economy seats, and will have the usual passenger amenities, including entertainment (films and music). It will also have a cargo capacity of approximately five tonnes. The re-introduction of this flight will bring about the fastest way of travelling between East Africa to the Scandinavian countries, with only 50 minutes stopover in Rome, in each direction. In addition, the available cargo capacity will assist the Kenya horticulture farmers in exporting their produce to the Scandinavian countries faster.

There is a large Scandinavian community in Kenya and Lamu and the new Kenya Airways service will provide direct air transportation between the two areas. The postal authorities will also derive considerable benefits.

WHY KENYANS CONTINUE TO CHERISH SUCH FOND MEMORIES:

JOMO KENYATTA IS RENOWNED AS OUR FIRST NATIONALIST

GREAT men of history are ever remembered by their good, noble deeds and wise thoughts whose words form axioms. We shall always remember Mzee Jomo Kenyatta as the great architect of the indestructible edifice of our culture.

As a man, who before anything else, Mzee Kenyatta stood up on his own strong feet as a great defender and protector of our indigenous culture at such a time when it was inconceivable for a black man to have an audacity of holding a pen and writing on his own traditional values and practices, at an environment where nothing else is civilised but Western mode of life.

It was a period when the Western civilisation considered a black man incapable of thinking and appreciating anything of intrinsic cultural manifestation.

Indeed during the year 1938 there were very few black Africans who were literate enough as to go deep into western values, if at all there was a need for such an exercise by African great thinkers such as our founding father of our beloved nation, Mzee Kenyatta.

Nevertheless, it was exactly that time when Mzee Kenyatta emerged a great thinker of our cultural values and as such he was bold enough, without any inhibition, to hold his pen and start writing about his people's way of life, their cultural practices, rites, norms and their government institutions.

They are all well expressed in a compact and witty language in that authentic document of a

well researched anthropology: "Facing Mount Kenya."

As a great man of culture, Mzee Kenyatta, offered his nation an indigenous tongue as a national language. It was as early back as 1964 when he told the National Assembly that it would not take long for the Parliament to conduct its deliberations in Swahili, the language understood by the majority of the people.

It took ten years for his dream to be realised and indeed it was himself who interpreted that wise dream when he declared

in July, 1974 that Swahili is the national language of the Republic of Kenya and the medium of the Parliament. He was a man of great foresight; whose statesmanship was internationally respected and whose passionate love for Culture is well endorsed in all national cultural institutions in the Republic of Kenya.

Thus, aptly Professor Ali Mazrui describes Mzee Kenyatta; "Jomo Kenyatta was a cultural nationalist before he became a nationalist of any other kind. He was pre-occupied with the defence of the traditional culture of his people before he became interested in the cause of African political participation as such."

He was cultural nationalist in a more profound sense than was normal in much of British Africa at that time.

Aspiring writers shall always be invoked with courage when they remember Mzee's epithet: "I owe thanks also to my enemies for discouragement which has kept up my spirits to persist in the task. Long life and health to them to go on with the good work."

Mzee had high regards for the vitality of the youth of the Republic of Kenya and thus he told them: "Throughout the long struggle for freedom the burning faith which sustained me and my brothers was that the youth of this country would be free to give their love, loyalty and readiness for personal sacrifice to the development and welfare of all our people."

Mzee shall for ever remain a unique political figure with exceptional perception of political problems facing the continent of Africa. This is well reflected in his wise saying: "Africanism to which we aspire in this country is the Africanism which combines the best from the past, present and future the Africanism which seeks to fulfil what our people want to be, to do and to have."

There is no better way of remembering our great man than ever reading his biography and learning his wise sayings. In fact we should take upon ourselves as parents to make sure that our children are properly taught the life of this internationally accepted statesman, the son of a poor peasant.

A 'STARS AND STRIPES' MONOPOLY!

WELL, no doubt you must have heard or at least seen, they're here. The nine vessel group arrived on Tuesday, with the *Midway* and the *Kilauea* anchoring outside, the rest either alongside or tied-up in Kilindini. The two "outside" have at least provided some timely employment for a couple of vessels engaged on the shuttle service between ship and stage landing.

The personnel on the whole appear to be a little more subdued than on previous occasions. Perhaps it's part of the "kinder, gentler" theme!

Vessels flying the Star's and stripes have certainly monopolised the port this week, what with the Navy nine, then the *Joseph Lykes* at No.5 and the *Pride of Texas* at K anchorage, although she is scheduled to move to No.7 berth.

This Friday is the tenth anniversary of W.E.C. Lines at Mombasa with their first vessel calling at Mombasa on this service arriving on October 20, 1989, she was the *Eva Del mar* which discharged a number of empty containers from Jeddah, then loaded 120 TEU's, for her outward leg.

Their second vessel to call here was the *Hilda Del Mar* on April 18, she also discharged and loaded containers, as well as four giraffes destined for the Lisbon Zoo.

In the summer of 1982 the first of a new generation of vessels were introduced into the service, these being the *Julia*, *Gala* and *Gracia Del Mar*, each with 530 TEU capability, 100 cubic metres of Roro space and "garage" for 60 cars, not to mention reefer connections.

W.E.C. Lines was established in the mid seventies with service from the European West Coast and UK 1978 the service was then expanded to Jeddah and later to East Africa, firstly to Mombasa, with *Dar-es-salaam* put on the service "map" in 1983.

An innovative method of loading containers with bulk, rather than bagged coffee was

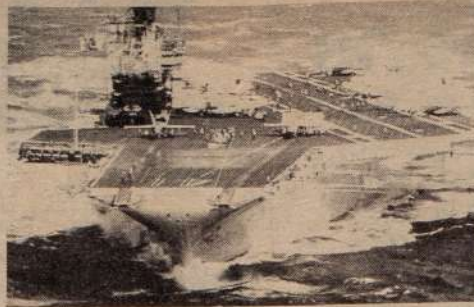

experimented with by the line in 1987 increasing the "stowage" from around 300 bags to equivalent of 320 bags in bulk.

In 1984 they were probably the first line in conjunction with the Kenya Railways in running the first unit train into the container terminal at Embakazi, and since then have been the largest single operators of TEU's into and out of Embakazi.

The local agent's of W.E.C. Lines are Spantfreight, who have been instrumental to a large degree in the success of this service, as well as introducing an intensive advertising campaign on the back of matatus.

is presently at Mtongwe anchorage and expected to load bulk maize for the Reunion sometime next week.

Vehicle carrier *Crystal Ace* is due in towards the week end and naturally will discharge a consignment of garis.

Tankers feature quite predominately in the expected vessel's list with eight expected within

the next ten days or so.

The Ostasiastiske Kompagni's *Pascagoula* mouthful there, should have arrived by now and discharged her white oil at SOT, the *Captain Lucas III* due in over the weekend with lube oil, as is the *World Kinship* with crude.

The beginning of next week should see the arrival of the *Essigina* with Octel, that's the

highly toxic "anti-knock" petrol additive.

The *Neptune Otome*, *Global Uranus* and *Sea Princess* arriving around mid week to discharge crude oil, palm oil and lube oil respectively.

Finally the *U.N. Trader* expected at the end of the month with white oil.

I received some interesting mail this week, the note, rather tongue in cheek, mentioning that the correspondent doesn't need to read this column, but is able to pick up the info at Majengo Market!

Her onions and tomatoes having been wrapped up in an eleven days list! No comment.

Waiting at ship's convenience with 10000 tonnes bagged sugar for discharge, is the *osman*. The *Arraqib* duly arrived and is now at No. 9 where she's loading 9000 tonnes bulk soda ash.

The International Maritime Organisation, commonly known as the IMO recently celebrated their 30th birthday at London, and also introduced the new secretary general, Mr William O'Neil, from Canada.

The IMO is facing it's most serious funding crisis in history because member countries have not met their commitments with some 40 members in default, 10 of them major, with the kitty roughly five million sterling in arrears. Quite a short fall on any account.

The tanker *Pacificos 268.467* DWT was damaged by weather whilst off the South African Coast last week, and suffered 200 metre fracture to her shell plating.

It is estimated that between 2—10,000 tonnes of crude oil was lost. It was intended that a second tanker be engaged in order to carry out transhipment.

NEW D.C.8 FOR K.Q.

KENYA Airways has taken delivery of a more modern DC.8 aircraft to replace an earlier model which had been in the airlines' fleet on lease from September last year.

The DC.8 aircraft, also on a four year lease from Guinness Peat Aviation of Shannon, Ireland, has a configuration of 12 First and 224 Economy seats. It has the usual passenger amenities including entertainment facilities (music and films) which the earlier model did not have.

Since the beginning of this year, Kenya Airways, through its subsidiary company, Kenya Flamingo Airline Limited, has embarked on passenger charter operations between Europe and Kenya, and the DC.8 will be mainly used for this purpose, particularly from December onwards.

It will also be used on regional routes to destinations such as Jeddah and Bombay and will be available for use during the peak periods to operate services in and out of Mombasa, Kilifi, Bujumbura and other cities in Africa.

PASSENGERS

The DC.8 is a passenger aircraft but has a capacity of about six tons of cargo. Like its predecessor, the aircraft is in Kenya Airways colours. The inflight attendants are all Kenyan nationals while the flight deck crew are employees of Guinness Peat Aviation.

convenient location. Motorists are most welcome to visit us to discuss their requirements."

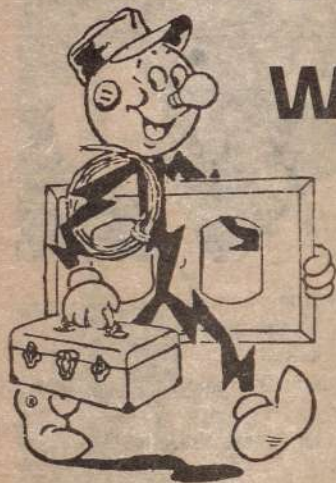

Adding "now that Air Seychelles has stopped operating from Athens, the Greek market is showing increasing interest in Kenya as witnessed by the growing number of individuals and groups staying at Alliance Hotels.

operating theatre will become the subsidiary facility once the project is completed".

Speaking of the other "new facility", that of an Intermediate Care Unit, he explained this would take care of those patients discharged from ICU but not yet well enough to be sent to routine wards.

Adding "the standard of care and monitoring here will be higher than in the routine wards, but not as intensive as in the ICU".

"Should a patient deteriorate suddenly after transfer from ICU, it will be easier to transfer him back to ICU without many problems," he explained.

He noted that "with an Intermediate Care Unit, patients discharged from ICU will not suddenly feel "abandoned" when transferred to general wards". In other words there is a wide "care" gap between an ICU and routine wards.

In welcoming guests to the ceremony, the chairman of Pandya Memorial Hospital's Board of Management, Mr Dalip S. Obhrai, thanked them for their support and encouragement of this project.

So far just over Shs 3,200,000/- had been raised which included proceeds from a Charity Walk and raffle of a motor vehicle, plus pledges from philanthropic members of the community.

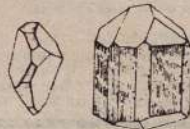

TURMALIN - der Glücksstein für Oktober



Turmalinkristalle

DER TURMALIN ist bei den Sammlern wie auch bei den Juwelieren einer der beliebtesten Edelsteine wegen seiner außergewöhnlich breiten Farbskala. Turmaline kommen eigentlich in allen Farben vor.

Der Name Turmalin stammt von dem singhalesischen Wort "Tourmal", das verschiedenfarbige Steine bedeutet, denn es kann leicht zu Verwechslungen mit anderen Edelsteinen kommen.

Andere Steine werden einfach Turmaline genannt mit der entsprechenden Farbe als Vorsilbe. Turmaline sind dreieckig oder sechseckig kristallisiert; die Kristalle sind gewöhnlich lang und prismatisch mit vertikalen Streifen. Sie erreichen einen Härtegrad von 7 bis 7,5 auf der Moh-Skala (Diamanten 10).

TANSANIA

I WAS emptying a few jars with Kachumbari at our regular watering hole the other day. He had just completed a survey of bus routes and their effectiveness transporting wananchi from place to place.

As he quaffed down his first half litre of Triple J he noticed some funny markings on the bottle. Listed were the months of the year and then a choice between 1989 and 1990.

On closer observation, it turned out that the marks indicated the date by which the brew had to be sold. So he went round a few other tables and examined the bottles there. He found some with markings and others without.

This caused some consternation to some of those gathered at the watering hole. They decided that all the old bottles without dates were not fit for human consumption and returned them to the proprietor.

The proprietor of the watering hole had to be called in to quell the riot.

This little incident led Kachumbari to look at containers that had consumables in them. He found that the writing on all of them was the same. They all said "sell by" and gave the date.

This, he told me later, was no good to the consumer. All it does is to tell the retailer that the product should leave his shelf by a certain date.

That date is determined by the stability of the components that go into making the product. After the "sell by" date, the stability can no longer be guaranteed by the manufacturer.

What would be of more use to the consumer would be a date beyond which the product should

not be consumed or used. I can imagine one buying a bottle of pickled products which one tends to use in small quantities.

The sell by date may be two months from the time of purchase but the period of use may be four or five months after the "sell by" date. The onus is on the consumer to decide when he will finish the contents of the package and whether the contents will still be safe to use. The consumer is getting a raw deal.

He gets lumbered with stuff he doesn't know when it will go off. A more appropriate way of getting the information across would be to either have an "expiry", "best by" or "consume by" date.

This would be the date by which the ingredients that go into making the product would be considered to getting to a stage where it could become dangerous for human beings to consume.

This will make it irrelevant when the material was purchased

and will make a clear and unambiguous statement to the consumer.

Medical preparations have had an expiry date for a long time. By making such a statement, users of such preparations are comfortable that whatever infu-

sions, tablets or suspensions are prescribed will not poison them.

However in pharmaceutical circles it is not unknown for certain people to dispense drugs although the expiry date is passed.

Before this is done, however, the drugs are tested to ensure that they are still stable.

This is only done in the event
