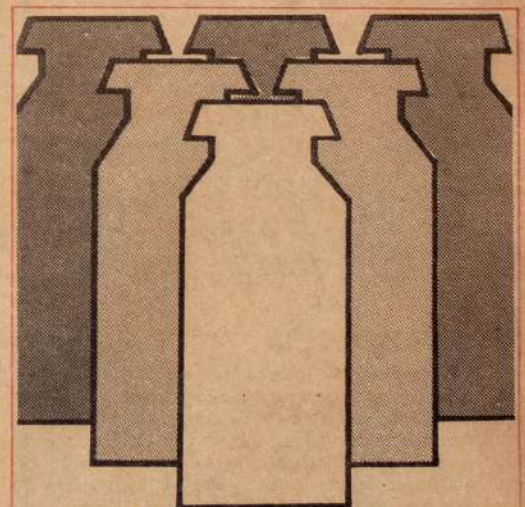

# Coast Party For 'Jambo Umlaut'

GERMAN speaking tourists have since long topped the 100.00 mark, with West Germans being the strongest group besides visitors from Switzerland and Austria.

It is expected that they reach a number of 140.00 by the end of this year, making them Kenya's biggest partner in tourism.

Mr Gerhard Matthiessen, the West German Consul in Mombasa, made this remark when he addressed more than 150 guests during a launching party for a new German-English magazine at German Classes Mombasa Institute last Friday.

The magazine, entitled *Jambo Umlaut*, which will be published half-yearly by the Goethe Institute Nairobi, focuses on cultural links between Kenya and West Germany and offers a forum for all those interested in the German culture and language as well as the cultural scene in Kenya.

Mr Matthiessen said, that the history of tourism, which has reached important proportions as a foreign exchange earner, could be well described as having started 150 years back, when German missionaries, Krapf and Rebmann, had sighted snow-covered Mount Kilimanjaro.

The introduction of this magazine along the Kenyan Coast will help intensifying communication between German tourists and Kenyans and will therefore be in the tradition of mutual friendship between the two republics since Kenya's independence", he said.

The Provincial Director of Social Services, Mr Richard Cheruiyot, said language played an important role in communication and cultural exchange.

"As the magazine is printed in English and German it will help strengthening cross-cultural communication among our two peoples and in this aspect it will be another step towards an even more important aim, which is world peace and freedom", he said.

Mr Christoph Ludszuweit, editor *Jambo Umlaut*, who had arrived from Nairobi, said that the magazine is expected to be successful at the Kenyan Coast.

As the majority of German tourists spend their holidays here it would only be natural that communication between Kenyans and Germans would increase.

"Hence the next issue of *Jambo Umlaut* to be published beginning of next year will focus on aspects of tourism in Kenya

As an introduction to this we have invited entries for a writing competition, entitled "Encounters with foreigners", where the best contestants will be awarded attractive prizes", he added.

"We will also slightly balance the use of English and German in the magazine in order to reach even more readers with the second issue."

Mr Michael Heinemann, who is in charge of German Classes Mombasa, had earlier welcomed the guests and stressed that successful cultural exchange had to be encouraged by various institutions, but would largely depend on the individual's ability to respect foreign cultural values.

Here the magazine could be helpful as it carried personal views on cross-cultural encounters rather than final objective statements.

Also present during the function were representatives of Alliance Francaise and the British Council in Mombasa, Managing Directors of Mombasa bookshops and tour leaders in Mombasa.

## DATELINE: DAR ES SALAAM

### 'Outsiders' to pay Rents in Foreign Currency

IN A MOVE aimed at reducing the alarming scarcity of Foreign Exchange and the massive foreign debt (which stood at five billion US Dollars as at last December), the Government is acting upon the 1986 Finance Act pertaining to the payment of rents in foreign currency.

The Act requires foreigners resident in Tanzania to pay their house rents in US Dollars or other convertible currency approved by the Ministry of Finance.

The 1986 Act superseded the 1984 Act with a clause calling every tenant who is a resident foreigner and rents premises in such areas as the Regional Tribunal may specify to pay rent in a prescribed foreign currency.

The term "Resident Foreigner" includes any person, body of persons or office of whatever description, title or designation, whether corporate or unincorporate and whether diplomatic, consular, or otherwise who are resident and conducting business or working in Tanzania. However, expatriate employees working for the Government are not included in the scheme.

Resident Foreigners and expatriate employees are now requested to furnish the Government with particulars of their tenancy agreements and landlords have also to supply particulars of their premises and tenancy deals to the District Customs and Sales Tax Office.

The move is expected to make the renting scheme of benefit to both the Government and the individuals.

At present some tenancy arrangements are done clandestinely because the Government does not allow any retention on externally.

However under the new scheme the Government has offered a retention of 35 per cent to landlords with the balance 65 per cent having to be converted into local shillings at the Bank Exchange Rate.

It is not clear what action will be taken on tenants which have already been paid earlier in foreign exchange because ironically no retention was due on them.

However, it is felt that the new scheme will only apply with effect from forthcoming payments and that the Government will close its eyes over previous arrangements in spite of the clause in the Finance Act to this effect in 1976.

Many senior executives in the public and private sector own bungalows or executive mansions leased out to foreigners and considering the numerous Government officers involved in the renting regmarole, it is difficult to comprehend how they will be able to cope with this new arrangement.

The offence for not complying with the new provision is a fine of 50,000/- or imprisonment not exceeding five years or both.



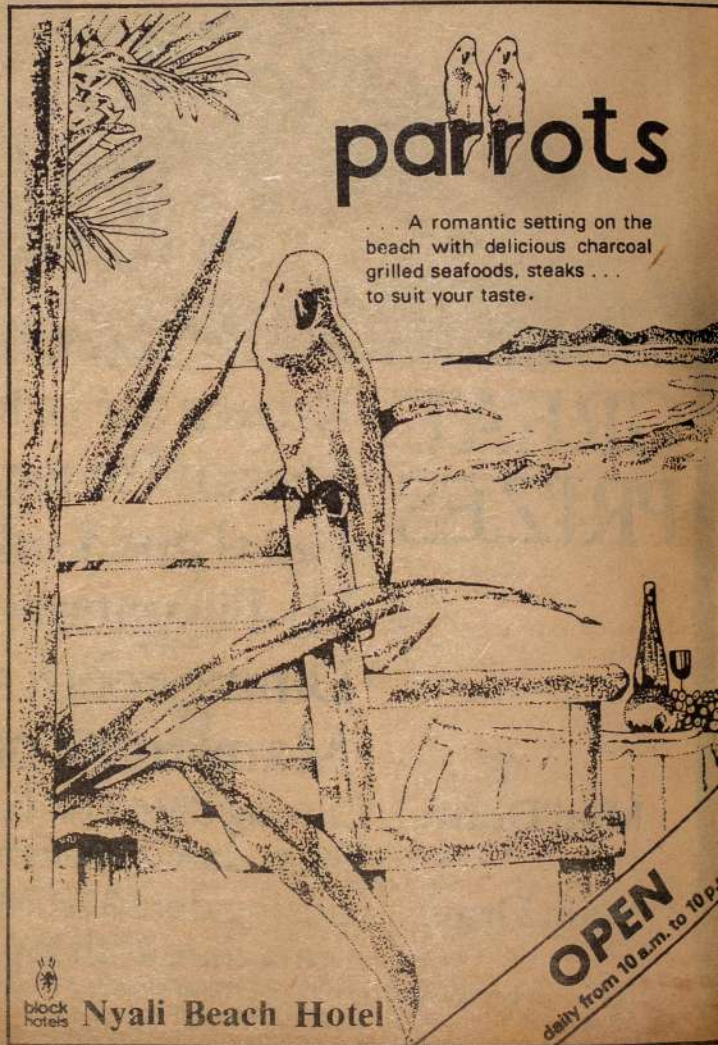

# "JAMBO UMLAUT" WIRD VORGESTELLT

ÜBER 150 STUDENTEN und Freunde der "German Classes Mombasa" hatten sich am Abend des 17. November auf der Terrasse des Freed Buildings in der Moi Avenue hoch über den Dächern von Mombasa bei Sonnenuntergang eingefunden, um das Erscheinen des ersten Heftes der neuen Zeitschrift JAMBO UMLAUT zu feiern.

Das Magazin, herausgegeben vom Goethe-Institut in Nairobi, bezweckt, den deutsch-kenianischen Kulturaustausch zu fördern und bietet ein Forum für alle, die an der deutschen Sprache und Kultur interessiert sind. Das Goethe-Institut Nairobi bietet Sprachkurse seit seiner Gründung im Jahre 1963 an, und seit den siebziger Jahren wird Deutsch an der Hotelfachschule *Utalii College* in Nairobi und bei den *German Classes Mombasa* gelehrt.

"An der *University of Nairobi* ist das Fach Deutsch inzwischen als ein dreijähriges Grundstudium etabliert, und ein M.A.-Studiengang befindet sich im Aufbau. Noch in diesem Jahr wird an der *Kenya University* ein Deutschprogramm für zukünftige kenianische Deutschlehrer anlaufen.

"Wir verspüren den Bedarf nach einem Ideen- und Erfahrungsaustausch, denn Deutsch ist als Fremdsprache inzwischen in vielen Facetten vom Anfängerunterricht bis zum Fortgeschrittenbereich und zum Germanistik-Grundstudium in Kenia vertreten.

"Wir wollen mit dieser Zeitschrift die Kommunikation zwischen Lernern, Lehrern, der deutsch-sprachigen Gemeinde in Kenia und ihren kenianischen Freunden verbessern und beleben. Sie wird zweimal im Jahr erscheinen, und die Beiträge können in Deutsch oder Englisch geschrieben sein.

Als Ehrengäste erschienen an der Party Mr. Richard Cheruiyot, Provincial Director für Sozialwesen im Ministerium für Kultur und Sozialwesen, und Herr Gerhard Matthiessen, der deutsche Honorarkonsul für Mombasa und die Küste.

Herr Matthiessen erwähnte in seiner Ansprache, daß die ersten deutschen Touristen schon vor 150 Jahren nach Kenia kamen, nämlich die beiden Missionare und Sprachforscher Krapf und Rebmann. Mr. Cheruiyot, Provincial Director für Sozialwesen, bemerkte unter anderem, daß die Sprache eine wichtige Rolle spielt beim Gedanken- und Kulturaustausch. A TWO-WEEK workshop to train Health Education Officers on how to evaluate the programmes and projects they implement, has been taking place at Safari Beach Hotel, Diani.

Organised by the Division of Health and Education in the

A few days later, Kachumbari's photograph appeared in all the dailies saying that he was no longer authorised to transact any business for that particular company.

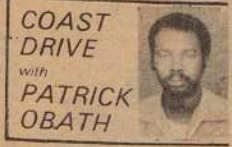
In the meantime the formalised communication process was grinding away slowly.

Matters are no different concerning the high rate of carnage in this country.

There is a lot of talk about how people should be careful.

Various punitive measures are instituted when all of a sudden the problem seems to have reached chronic proportions.

These firefighting measures will not make the problem go away but will instead make people more frustrated and lead to more accidents.

The Automobile Association of Kenya recently issued their recommendations on a long term strategy to cure this disease that is prevalent in Kenya.

Over and above making good reading, the paper has some sound ideas which, if taken in the same spirit, will reduce the level of accidents in this country to acceptable levels.

The ideal is to have no accidents, but as Kachumbari says, who's perfect?
