Oil Price Shock For Tanzanians

PETROL PURCHASES MAY NOW INCREASE BY ONE THIRD AT THE PUMPS

FOLLOWING THE CRISIS IN KUWAIT, Iraq and Saudi Arabia which has raised the price of fuel to about US Dollars 32 per barrel on the World Market, Tanzanians are now bracing for a hike in local fuel prices. The country presently does have a reserve to last until mid-October this year but the working of fuel costs is based on a price of 19 US Dollars per barrel of crude and if intermittent price increases effected over the previous year are condoned, with the Government wishing to maintain the same level of mark up over cost, then the price on the local market could soar upto Shs. 180= per litre, writes Coastweek correspondent *Munir Daya* from Dar Es Salaam.

At present Tanzanians are paying 120/- for a litre of petrol but the price is way above the actual cost which is believed to be less than half of this.

A local paper recently reported that one businessman was prepared to sell fuel at 70/- per litre if allowed to import petrol under the Open General Licence Scheme.

However, for obvious reasons he was refused a permit to import because this would mean a direct challenge to Government Revenues.

If the oil price is raised, prices of almost everything in the country will shoot up and one

OSHWAL ACADEMY entered 45 candidates in this year's University of London Overseas 'O' level examination and most of the students obtained excellent results.

The most outstanding student was Jiten Surendra Shah who obtained eight 'A's and one 'B' in nine subjects that he took. Others who excelled were: Sachin Lalseta, Khilan Sobagchand Shah, and Minesh Jaysukhlal Shah with six 'A's and Priya Pankaj Shah and Kalpen Patel with five 'A's.

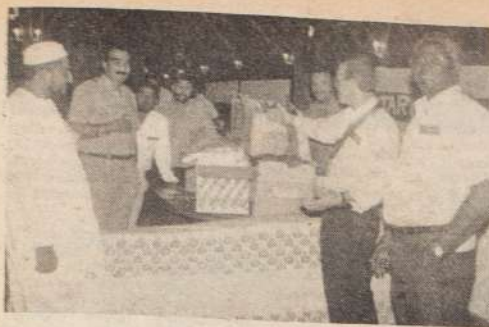

KILINDINI PORT HAS CAPACITY CARGOES

THE PORT of Mombasa is experiencing one of its most busy times as all berths for the general cargo are full and the fast working container terminal is dealing with the maximum

four ships at a time. The Kenya Ports Authority has released the number of expected ships in the next fortnight showing 44 vessels were expected to dock and discharge thousands of tons of cargo. The daily arrivals are continuing as expected.

M.V. Yaraa is at the port discharging the largest volume of cargo of 19,000 tons of bulk wheat. The wheat is being bagged simultaneously on discharge by facilities available at the berth. M.V. Indian Express is scheduled to discharge another big volume of 10,716 tons of various general cargo.

According to the list of expected in the next 14 days just 36 ships will call at the port. Among the cargo to be discharged are palm oil, wheat, crude oil, coils, gunnies, and motor cars.

Those to be loaded include soda ash, coffee, tea, horticultural products, sisal, heavy machinery, cattle, camels, hay, molasses and maize.

Meanwhile, the discharging of 351 motor vehicles from aboard M.V. Phoenix Ace last Monday was finalised in the fast speed of three hours.

This largest number of motor vehicles to come to the port on the ro-ro vessel, was discharged at berth number one usually not reserved for such vessels. This berth is now an additional facility for handling ro-ro ships besides berth no.13.

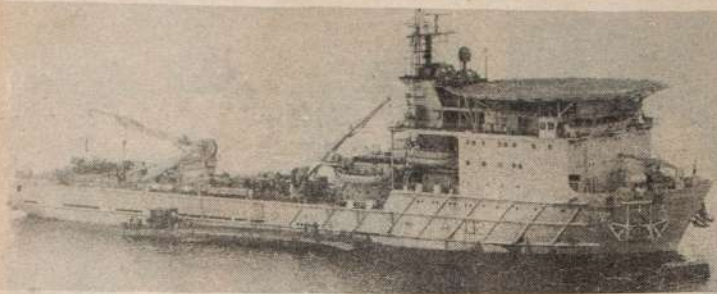

Kenya Ports Authority Praised For Efficiency By Minister Kamotho

THE CURRENT availability of modern cargo handling equipment at the port of Mombasa is to be boosted further and well maintained as a deliberate means of creating confidence in the port's efficiency in the years to come.

According to the Minister for Transport and Communications Mr Joseph Kamotho, the government is very pleased with the existence of a continuous dialogue between the Kenya Ports Authority and port users that has, in turn, enabled port operations to improve tremendously.

Addressing chief executives of ships' agents, clearing and forwarding firms, rail and road

transporters at the KPA headquarters in Mombasa, the Minister also noted it was gratifying that the KPA has already embarked on training of port users on port operations and customs procedures and that the Belgian Shipping Line, the CMB, has also mounted a similar course at the Bandari College that included staff of the KPA and firms using the port.

DISCUSSIONS

The Minister, who had a two hour cordial discussions accompanied by his two assistant Ministers Mr Philip Mbatia and Dr Protus Momanyi, the Permanent Secretary Mr Andrew Bigale and other top Ministry officials, said it was the first time he had a chance of meeting those who make the port a valuable asset to the nation.

He promised to look into all pertinent issues raised with regard to other departments working within the port and outside the port so that faster delivery of cargo is effected in future.

He said the Government through the KPA is fully out to make cargo handling at the port the most efficient for the good economic performance in the entire region of East and Central Africa.

Introducing the Minister, the KPA Managing Director Mr Philip Okundi said positive and cordial discussions are taking place with port users on the tariff rates and the need for new maritime trade and technological changes.

He said the port of Mombasa is not an exception and must change to conform with changing trends and that is why discussions with port users which relevant experience and knowledge will continue to be welcomed in order to achieve international standards expected in maritime trade.

Mr Okundi, who was accompanied by the KPA Chairman Mr Stephen Mwakisha and all top managers, also revealed discussions with shippers include the need to increase transshipment traffic through the port.

He said this will be in addition to the steps already taken to boost cruise ship tourism through collaboration with all private and public sectors concerned.

IMPROVEMENT

Speaking on behalf of ships' agents association, the chairman Mr Brown Ondego thanked the KPA for recent improvement in port performance and the introduction of dialogue between users and the authority that has created an amicable working environment.

and the like may once again come up.

Alternatively it is believed that Tanzania can get its oil cheaper if it imports finished oil products rather than the crude oil because the refinery process in the country is now outmoded and therefore expensive.

Along with the Government surcharge, the oil companies have their profits while taxes and fees have also to be paid to the Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC).

BLACK MARKET

The Gulf crisis is certainly going to lead to higher prices in the local economy and already the US Dollar is being sold at 360/- at the black market whilst the Pound Sterling is valued at plus 700/-. The official

exchange rate for the US Dollar is 197/- whilst the Pound compares at about 378/-.

The plus point to the imminent fuel crisis is that there is no problem with supply lines since Tanzania does not have any supply contract with Iraq or Kuwait for crude. Both Iraq and Kuwait are presently weblocked in a tussle with the United Nations who have imposed a trade embargo on them.

The next ship bringing in fuel into Tanzania will have a higher price.

It remains to be seen how the Government will tackle this problem, either to reduce imports or to transfer additional costs to consumers (thereby risking drastic inflation) or taking a lower share of profits and thereby increasing fuel prices marginally.

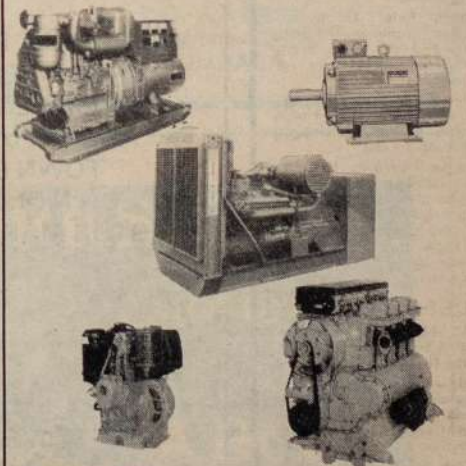

KARL POLLMAN

KARL POLLMAN—founder of Pollman's Tours and Safaris, first came to East Africa when he was only seven years old and died at Mombasa on May 14, 1988. He was 74 years old.

The company he founded is one of the leading tour operators in Kenya today representing many tour operators from all over Europe and offering considerable professional expertise in arrangements for 'incentive' groups and conferences. It also caters for visiting foreign navies and cruise ships.

It employs over 300 people at its Head Office in Mombasa's Taveta Road, and branch offices in Nairobi, Malindi and Diani.

Born in Hamburg, West Germany, Karl Pollman loved Kenya and her people. He spoke not only Swahili fluently but also Kikuyu and Maasai.

It was 50 years ago when he started organising his first safari here.

In those days his clients travelled in open pick-ups across the open bush, living in tents and accompanied by professional hunters.

While many things have changed since those days—the name of the company remains as a tribute to a great man—Karl Pollman.

Guns have been replaced by cameras and open pick-ups by comfortable 'mini' buses with sliding roofs and professional drivers. Or to save time today, one can travel to the national

parks in a light aircraft. Accommodation is in comfortable lodges or camps which have acquired a good reputation worldwide.

In his early days, Karl farmed in Nanyuki and on the Kinangop. He later became a professional hunter—but his tremendous love for animals made him replace his rifle for a camera.

For a while he was mining in the Tsavo area and it was during this time that he was made an Hon. Game Warden of the Tsavo National Park.

He then became manager of the Ziwayi Sisal Estate, near Taveta, returning to Nairobi where he joined the Overland Driving School as an Instructor.

It was his love of the bush and wildlife that made him decide to start a safari business—Pollman's Tours.

He was also an expert ornithologist. Soon his name was attracting tourists from all over the world who wished to share his love of birds and animals.

his daughter Anita (now Mrs Bruk-Jackson) who lived in Kenya for 25 years and now resides in Zimbabwe. She said 'he was passionately fond of Kenya's game parks, wildlife and birds'.

FILM COMPANY

In his Eulogy at the service, John Bland, a great friend of the family, said 'Karl was probably one of the most underrated people as far as

wildlife is concerned for he was an incredibly knowledgeable person to be with in the bush'.

According to John, Karl had, on behalf of a film company, driven a model T.4 car from

Kenya to Italy in 1938—a very hazardous journey, particularly in those days.

Among those at the funeral service was Mr E. Wulkop, the then Managing Director of Pollman's Tours and Safaris who

described Karl as a 'great man'.

On his death Karl left a widow, Joan, and their four year old daughter, Dawn. Also three daughters by a previous marriage as well as five grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

The latter part of his life was spent at Diani on the south coast, also at his farm in Voi.

Karl was cremated and his ashes scattered over the game park he loved so much—Tsavo.

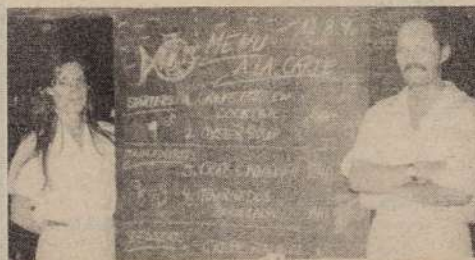

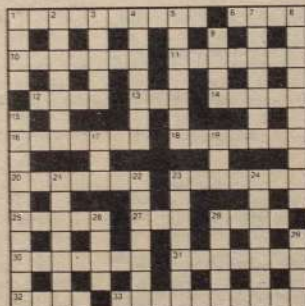

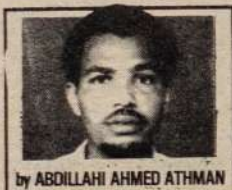

ITALIAN TOURISTS have shown renewed confidence in Kenya as a tourist destination. Following a visit to the country by 120 Italians, another group of 50 has arrived back in Mombasa from a successful completion of an extensive tour of the country using self drive Panda Fiat 4x4 cars, under co-sponsorship of Agip.

The tour itinerary had to be slightly changed due to the rough conditions in the northern part of the country, but the 'Safarian' participants were never the less enthusiastic.

The tour, entitled 'Courageraid-Kenya', has been a positive counter to the negative publicity to which Kenya had been exposed in Italy and was a positive sign of the confidence that Agip has in Kenya.

On arrival in Mombasa the group said that their predecessors had confirmed to them that Kenya is safe, secure and hospitable to visitors.

Such positive exposure and

information may well induce Italian investors to invest in the hinterland of the country, which request was passed to the first group by the Minister of Tourism.

Their spokesman Mr Ivo Carascoli said that additional tourists can be expected to come to Kenya from Italy this year. He confirmed that following a report by doctors who were in the earlier group, the team had complete confidence that there was no need to fear unusual malaria attacks in Kenya.

PUBLICITY

The self-drive cars which are specially equipped with folding beds on the roof have powerful four wheel drive that enables the tourists freedom to explore the rugged areas of the country without depending on lodges.

The message sent to this group by the Minister for Tourism Hon. Ngala was to thank the

Italians for the confidence they had shown in Kenya as a safe holiday destination and in particular the Italian tour operators Safarianland.

He said that Kenya for some time had been attracted to negative publicity in the foreign press media.

This, he added, had prompted him to make a trip to Italy in October last year, "isolated cases of malaria and incidents of banditry had been highlighted, apparently deliberately, to scare potential travellers from coming to Kenya," the Minister said, adding that of late attempts have been made yet again to portray Kenya as unsafe holiday destination.

The tourists, he said, had seen for themselves the situation prevailing in Kenya as regards safety and security. "I am sure you will not need any prompting to assure your friends that this country is hospitable, he commented.

Mr Ngala hailed the cordial relationship between Kenya and Italy in every sector of economic development saying that Italy has contributed significantly to the growth of Kenya's tourism industry especially in Malindi-Watamu at the coast.

He exhorted Italian investors to explore other areas which offer tourist attractions in Kenya's hinterland, thanking Agip for their faith in Kenya.

SPOKESMAN

Indications show that the flow of tourists from Italy is on the upward trend. In 1988 Kenya received 43,000 Italians while during 1989 46,000 visitors came from that country.

Earlier a spokesman of the group Ms Novella Caligaris had thanked Kenyans for their hospitality. She singled out the police force which she said gave them all the assistance needed.

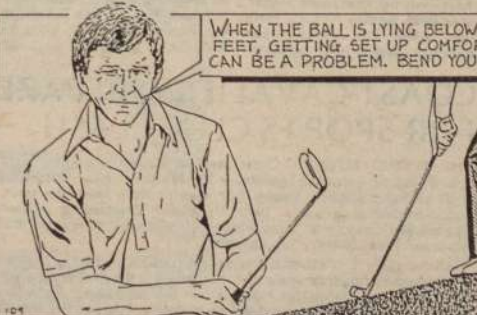

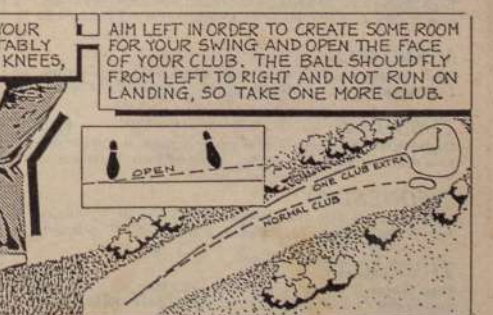
