ITALIAN TOURIST MARKET NOW REALISING ITS POTENTIAL

AN 'EXCELLENT' HIGH TOURIST season has been forecast by members of the Kenya Association of Hotel-keepers' and Caterers', Coast, with indications that the Italian market, at long last, is picking up again.

Water continues to be a big problem, particularly on the south coast, and such is its concern that the association invited the Regional Area Manager, National Water Conservation and Pipeline Corporation, Mr D.K. Kapsandoy, to address them at their recent meeting at Mombasa's Castle Hotel.

Some south coast hotels are still having to pay a lot of money to bring in supplies from outside by water tanker. On an average about three deliveries a week are needed, each trip costing around Shs.2,200/-.

Many hotels now have their own bore-holes, some providing only brackish water which help in keeping toilets flushed. However, this is not suitable for drinking.

Meanwhile, north coast hotels have also been hit by a shortage due to the lack of sufficient pressure in water pipes.

Mr Kapsandoy outlined the present position and advised what is being done and planned.

MARERE PIPELINE

He said that before Christmas three more boreholes on the south coast would be commissioned making a total of eight, while early next year the Marere-Mombasa pipeline will be rehabilitated.

Meanwhile, Mombasa continues to suffer due to low water pressure caused by power

(General Manager, Severin Sea Lodges) as Vice-Chairman following the resignation of James Wilson, and Adam Mussa (Mombasa Beach Hotel) as the north coast representative.

NETA PEAL reports

fluctuations and failures.

As far as the north coast is concerned he advised that following a feasibility study two big boreholes had already gone in and many more are planned along the edges of the Sabaki River as a means of avoiding the situation problem.

Members complained bitterly about the telephone service and difficulty in putting through international calls. Most affected are those on Mombasa Island and the south coast.

The association also expressed concern over the Ukunda Airstrip where work on its rehabilitation had come to a standstill. Many tourists staying on the south coast were now having to get up very early in the morning to travel to Moi International Airport for air safaris to game parks and elsewhere, whereas before it only took about ten minutes to reach the airstrip at Ukunda.

As far as malaria is concerned hoteliers are continuing to co-operate with government's effort in eradicating the mosquito and its breeding grounds by spraying, clearing bush and ensuring no stagnant water remains.

The meeting concluded with the election of Beat Koch

THREE NAIROBI CYCLISTS ARRIVE IN MOMBASA ...

THERE WERE SWEET smelling garlands to greet three cyclists on their arrival at Nyali Beach Hotel whose gruelling 318 mile journey from Nairobi had raised around Shs 20,000/- to enable the East African Wildlife Society to embark on another of its many projects—the publication of a brochure to go into all hotels aimed at discouraging visitors from buying or taking shells from the sea.

The three cyclists were—Nigel Arensen, Managing Director of Bike Treks; Charles Nganga, a professional cyclist and member of the Nairobi Provincial Amateur Cycling Association (he being the pace-setter) and Joseph Kimatu, a student at the Kenya Polytechnic, Nairobi.

Accompanying them in a Land Rover was Donald Mombo, a lecturer on Tourist Geography at Kenya Utalii College, Nairobi, which also covers environmental ethics; wildlife ecology and natural history. He is a 'Friend' of EAWS. The vehicle carried equipment to give film shows with Donald also giving lectures at Kiboko, Voi and Mombasa.

Said Nigel 'this safaris was to generate a general interest in conservation, also to raise funds for a brochure to discourage visitors from collecting shells. If there are no buyers the fishermen will no longer bother to bring them from the sea.'

They arrived at Nyali Beach Hotel at sundown on Sunday November 18 to an official welcome from Michael Werikhe, Kenya's famous rhino man who has raised US Dollars one million for 'Save the Rhino Fund'. He was representing the Executive Director of the East African Wildlife Society, Mr Arap Otich, and told the cyclists 'we are very grateful for your tremendous effort and great contribution in helping highlight the very important issue of marine conservation along the coastal belt'.

"I greatly admire what you have done". Adding "we need a lot more people like you to raise interest, awareness and also

funds for conservation projects including marine and national parks'.

He appealed to hoteliers and tour operators to join hands by helping the society as much as possible. One way of doing this was by discouraging visitors from buying anything that will harm our ecology and national

All were using mountain bikes from Bike Treks.

Declared Nigel 'the trip was great and problem free. The first half had been wet and on the first day we were going terribly fast at around 24 kph. The next day speed dropped to 16-17 kph due mainly to a very strong wind against us.'

Mr Werikhe also mentioned that the society is trying to discourage people from dumping anything in the sea that will cause problems to the marine ecology.

He said "it is very important to have a well balanced, healthy marine ecology. I hope that what these cyclists and lecturer have done will give many youth along this area something to think and do something about".

Flagging them off at the Bellevue Petrol Station, Nairobi, at 9 a.m. on Friday morning November 16 were Dr Joseph Misoi, Chairman of the East African Wildlife Society and Mr Arap Otich, Executive Director.

Our Heritage of Faith...

"OUR STRUGGLE is not against flesh and blood" Ephesians 6:12.

Christian combat is with a non-human enemy, whose aim is to mislead Christians and to keep them out of heaven. To stand up against such an enemy we need to "put on the whole armour of God".

St Paul describes this armour in Ephesians 6:13-17, taking his imagery from the battle dress of the Roman soldier of his day. He urges that all Christians need to make use of the whole armour.

What is this armour? The *breastplate of righteousness* reminds us that we are made right with God because of Christ's sacrifice on the Cross.

The *belt of truth* binds all the armour together, as sincerity and truthfulness typify the true believers.

Feet fitted with the gospel which brings peace. God's peace

which surrounds us in the midst of trials and troubles helps us to meet and overcome temptation which comes to us daily.

The *shield of faith* enables us to keep trusting God even in difficult times, as we know he is working out everything for our ultimate good.

As we receive and confess God's salvation, and put it into practice in our lives, it becomes a *helmet of salvation* covering our head.

After all this defensive gear, we have one weapon of offense, the *sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God*. We need to know God's word by regular study of the Bible, so that we can claim its promises and use them to defeat the devil.

Having armour and not using it would have been disastrous for the Roman soldier. Similarly Christians who do not prayerfully use the armour of God are in trouble.

Paul concludes with an exhortation for us to pray for one another. Let us heed all of his advice.

FLORIDA TOURISM FIRM WILL OPERATE 'CROCODILE CAMP'

CROCODILE CAMP on the banks of the Galana River—where regular crocodilian visitors have all been given names and which boasts of probably having among the largest tents in Kenya, complete with dressing table—has since June been taken over by Florida Tourism Promotions (K) Limited.

It is situated five km from Sala Gate, the eastern entrance to Tsavo East National Park, and 110 kms west of Malindi. Crocodile Camp became operational again at the end of August, and leading tour operators are sending clients there, while among the recent visitors were 18 travel agents from the UK on a 'Familiarisation Tour' of Kenya hosted by Thomson Holidays—the largest tour operator in the world.

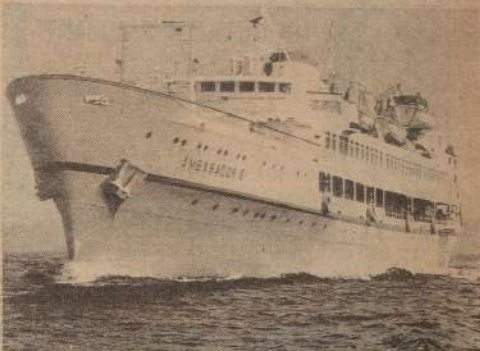

THE 1990 EXHIBITION of work of Coast Artists is to be seen in the Ratna Square Exhibition Centre. It remains on view until November 30 and is of exceptional interest. 14 artists have work on show.

The work of *Mary Nicholas* is well known throughout Kenya. She is a graphic artist whose beautiful commissioned murals can be seen in hotels especially at the Coast.

She has done a series of small paintings of the small animals of Kenya and of Kenya flowers. Those small paintings are of outstanding accuracy and from every point of view are exceptional records of a very high standard.

They have now been reproduced and printed on paper with a textured surface, signed, in limited editions. Anyone fortunate enough to acquire some of those before they disappear for ever, will own something to treasure.

CHARM AND SKILL
 Prominent amongst Mary's exhibits was her latest painting, a small delicate painting of a Coastal scene where, just before a rainstorm, the wind was coming in from the sea, ruffling the grass and blowing leaves around.

It is delightful, full of life, movement and charm, painted with rare skill and rare vision.

A visitor to Kenya, a professional painter had arranged in the Show the five paintings she has done during her stay in country. Most striking is her portrait of two life-size African girls, Giriama seated relaxed on a sofa.

She is *Sophie McCormick*, and she has exhibited a charming view over Kilifi Creek where the tranquil water changes from moment to moment over a great distance towards the North a very difficult subject to capture on canvas.

It is a lovely painting full of space, colour, light and peace. The two "still lives" she showed one of a pair of yellow shoes beside a couple of oranges on a cement step was charming. So was the large rendering of a silver grey sisal plant.

Kathleen Fielden, showing work for the first time in Mombasa had a series of arresting oils. The immediacy of her work lies in her handling of colour and design and a very personal aesthetic sense. She has exhibited in Nairobi and has carried out commissions for murals in private houses.

Two of her murals are in the country house near Nakuru of the Provincial Commissioner for Nairobi. Her painting of a girl under a pawpaw tree was much commented on and admired, as were a flower arrangement in a jug and a stilllife of a Caladium plant with two lemons.

David Venters work in oils is of very fine craftsmanship and shows a feeling for atmosphere where light and colour produce a mysterious and luminous quality. He is a Mombasa businessman and is a most accomplished Artist, a dedicated Painter.

ACRYLIC PAINTINGS

Roger Jessop is showing a good number of acrylic paintings of the boats and Dhows he knows so well; and coastal scenery. All his paintings have been framed by himself for he is a clever craftsman and wood-carver as well as being a rapidly developing painter.

Joanna Corse had some delightfully free and fluid drawings of Coast people going about their daily work, skilfully enhanced with washes of water colour.

Then she had also drawn in charcoal very bold studies of Lamu streets, and very vividly observed old Lamu men; old characters oblivious of the relentless march of times. Her work has a most winning directness and freshness which gets at the essence of what she sees without strain.

Ed Cross uses pen and ink followed by water colour washes to create clever drawings of Mombasa Old Town. The minute detail does not interfere in any way with the freedom of his work, and the pen creates

infinite detail in a manner which is light and almost ethereal.

Patsy Hechtermann's love of scenery shows in everything she does and her paintings speak of the out doors, even safari life. One outstanding painting is a recent one and much admired, showing a tree on a beach's sandy beach strewn with seaweed and the sea crawling in.

Jane Malcolm-Smith's decorative studies of bougainvilleas with almost transparent bracts and Elizabeth Organ's water colours of orchids display the love of flowers which passionate gardeners rejoice in and which has inspired both these painters.

Flowers are ephemeral things, and the paintings record something of their image before they fade.

Sudharsham Singh is another

professional painter. He has a great variety of style in which he experiments from time to time. Impressionism to surrealism; all are within his understanding and scope.

He is very well known and well regarded and he has broadcast documentaries on Painting methods, both on the Voice of Kenya and on Television.

GOOD CRAFTSMEN

Besides painters in the Exhibition, there were some highly skilled craftsmen showing their work.

Jany Gastellier is a trained Art teacher who over the last 20 years has developed great skill in creating jewellery.

She uses copper and silver and fired enamel to make necklaces, bracelets and ear-rings; all

GOOD RESULTS FROM COAST SWIM TEAMS

A SQUAD OF 33 swimmers accompanied by six officials and two supporters represented Coast Province and obtained very good results during the Jubilee Insurance Inter-Provincial Swimming Championships held at Nyayo National Pool.

For the first time the Coast Girls team comprising 13 swimmers were overall champions scoring 244 points to Nairobi's 229 with Rift Valley and Central nowhere in the race.

The Coast girls won both senior relays and also took seven individual titles.

Particularly impressive was Claire Henderson in the 17 and Over Age Group who won the Freestyle and Breaststroke events and came second in Butterfly and Backstroke.

Karina Jessop in the 15/16 Age Group was first in Freestyle and Butterfly, second in Breaststroke and third in Backstroke.

Atika Sabharwal in the 13/14 Age Group won the Backstroke

and came third in the Butterfly and fourth in Breaststroke. Maureen Ndegwa was first in Breaststroke in this group and was third in Butterfly.

Sapna Shah was first in the 11/13 Group Breaststroke event.

Although the Coast boys were beaten into second place by Nairobi the margin this time was reduced to only 60 points compared to 150 points when the teams last met in early October.

The "evergreen" Abdalla Hemed continued to surprise everyone by winning both the Backstroke and Freestyle events in the 17 and Over Age Group.

Other successes by the Coast boys were Hassan Taib (11/12 years) who won the Breaststroke and came second in Butterfly and Backstroke and third in Freestyle.

Gaddafi Mohamed (13/14 years) who was first in Butterfly and Abdulaziz Abdulkarim (17 years and over) who also won the

Butterfly event.

Altogether the 33 Coast Swimmers collected a total of 15 FIRSTS, 18 seconds, 17 fourth, three fifth and two sixth places.

The teams included swimmers from Coast Swimming Club (10), Mombasa Academy (10), Coast Academy (3), Loreto Convent (2), Kensec (2), Burhaniya Secondary (2), Aga Khan High School (2), Aga Khan Primary (1) and Tudor Secondary School (1).

The credit for the improved performance goes to the swimmers themselves and to the coaches, Anne Freeman, Hassan Karama and Shayef of Khamis together with the management of the Mombasa Academy and Coast Academy who made their school swimming pools available for training in the evenings.

The next event on the calendar will be a meet between Coast Academy and Mombasa Academy on November 24.

On December 15, 1990 selected swimmers will travel to Nairobi

for selection trials for the team travelling to Morocco, Iran and Swaziland in February-March next year and also for the FIBA All Africa Games in September in Cairo.





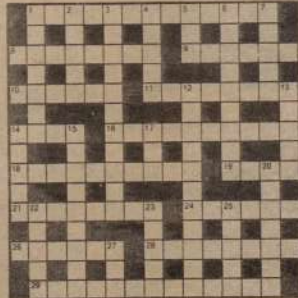
