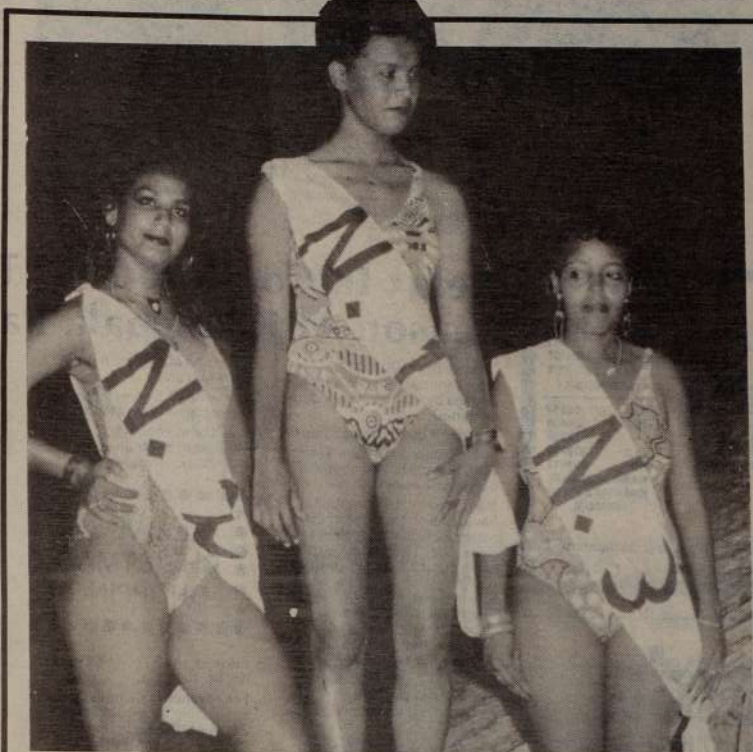

MANGU OLD BOYS HOSTING GALA DINNER IN MOMBASA

TONIGHT, FRIDAY, November 30, Coast branch of Mangu Old Boys Association has organised a grand harambee dinner dance in aid of their former school's multipurpose hall.

The Guest of Honour in tonight's social gathering at the Cattle Hotel roof top will be Mr Joshua Mwendwa, the general manager of the Leopard Beach Hotel.

Expected to attend are guests from Nairobi and upcountry including senior politicians and executives who are former students of the school.

Mangu High School is one of the oldest top schools in Kenya located on the Nairobi-Thika road about six kilometres from Thika town.

It was founded in Kabaa in 1925, a small township 32km East of Thika town. In 1939, the school moved to Mangu Village in Gatundu division. In 1972, the school moved to its present site.

Mangu High, as its popularly known, and where most prominent personalities in Kenya, were educated, was started by the Holy Ghost Fathers who ran it up to 1960. The Marianist Brothers of the Dayton, Ohio USA took over managing the school.

The Ministry of Education Science and Technology took over the running of the school in 1969 where an African headmaster, Mr Raphael Njoroge was appointed.

Mangu High is a national school of high reputation which has produced several prominent

personalities.

Among the prominent former students of the school are Maurice Cardinal Otunga, the Catholic Archbishop of Mombasa, Rt Rev. John Njenga and a top ranking journalist Mr Hilary Ng'weno of the weekly review.

Mangu High is famous for its aviation programme which was started in the sixties. Many students developed interest in flying through the programme which was started by the Marianist Brothers.

The school's original motto was in latin *Fidelis ad scientiam-faith and knowledge*. But this has been changed to a Swahili of *jishinde Ushinde-which roughly translated would "conquer oneself to conquer".*

This motto calls for self denial and sacrifice and exhorts the student to work hard for the good of ones self, the school and the society at large.

But the school could as well have "sky is the limit" motto as it has contributed immensely to the development of Kenya through not only sections like the aviation but even in politics where a number of very prominent ones have been through Mangu.

JAMHURI, CHRISTMAS and New Year relaxation in a family cottage by the sea! What could be better?

But aren't they all booked up? Well, Kikambala's Palm Tree Cottages still have a couple of bungalows vacant.

Palm Tree Cottages actually have a beach frontage of 200 metres which is more than many of the beach hotels along the north coast. They are situated between Whispering Palms and Sun n' Sand, but luckily for them they have a naturally cleaner beach, devoid of seaweed, than the two large neighbouring establishments.

Palm Tree Cottages were taken over by their present management just over two years ago.

And to get there you go north for 21kms along the Mombasa-Malindi Road where you'll see the sign (adjoining that of Whispering Palms) saying Palm Tree Cottages.

Turn right and go two kms due east straight to the seafroint. If you go too far along the main road and reach Sun n' Sand, then still turn right and when you get up to the hotel, turn right

again and after eight meters there you are!

The whole 3.5 acres containing the cottages is a walled area. You'll be welcomed by either Mr Joseph or Mr Julius, caretakers, who are residents of



the area. And at night the guard will be there too.

For advance bookings you should ring Mombasa 26436/21178 or 494759, or (evening) 20368 — either Mr SJ or MK Shah.

A Nairobi can contact Kenya-villas, Box 57046, tel: 229161/338072 and ask for Mrs Grace. Despite these cottages being on the quiet of the north coast they are on both mains water and electricity. Gas is supplied too.

The whole place is fully furnished

with the exception of towels, and even mosquito nets are there.

If there are many people in your party then extra beds can be added although the cottages are basically for six.

Palm Tree Cottages have more than 200 coconut trees on the site. There are swings for children in their playground.

Shops with provisions ("dukas") are nearby for all essentials—say maximum five minutes walk away—just by the two hotels.

Bring your servant if you wish, but there is a daily cleaner, and bed linen is changed on alternate days—all on the house.

GIVING A BIG BOOST to the Rotary Club of Mombasa Central's Shs two million project to improve and extend the 40-bed Mental Unit at Port Reitz Hospital is Kenya Airways which has donated an economy class return air ticket Mombasa-Bombay — this being first prize in a raffle this Rotary Club is organising to help raise funds for this project.

There was a big "Thank you" to James Kabui, KA, Manager, Coast, from Mamujee K Mamujee, the club's project officer who was delighted with KA's response.

It is Mr Mamujee who is the instigator of this very worthwhile project which is not only aimed at uplifting facilities for patients, but also assisting the Ministry of Health in its task of maintaining standards when finance is in short supply.

Raffle tickets will be on sale by mid-December, and the draw takes place on January 12.

The KA Manager, Coast, told Mr Mamujee that KA will soon be flying into Bangkok to tap the lucrative Japanese market which has high potential, and that as part of its on-going fleet and equipment modernisation, KA will be receiving two new B757s (making a total of three) plus a third F50 in the very near future which, he said, will make the KA fleet of aircraft the youngest on the continent of Africa.

He also mentioned that KA continues striving hard to improve its customer care service.

Another major fund raising event for this Rotary project will be an Open Golf Tournament at Nyalali Golf and Country Club on Sunday, December 16, the Guest of Honour, and player being the Minister for Health, Mr Mwai Kibaki.

provision of occupational therapy medical and kitchen equipment.

By the end of this year, the club hopes to have raised Shs one million to enable work to commence in March.

Confirmation has been received from Rotary International's HQ in Illinois, USA for a 'dollar to dollar match fund' enabling it to reach its target of Shs two million for this project.

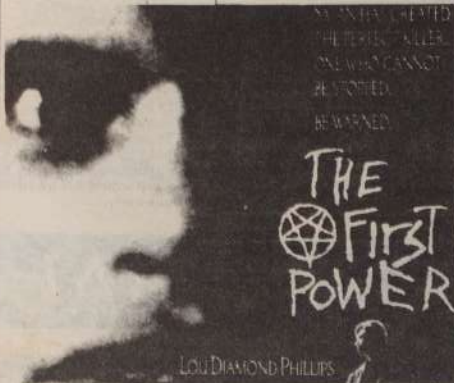

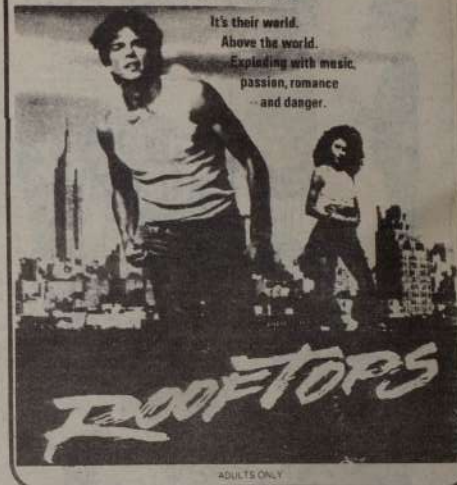

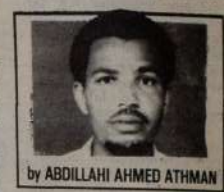

and is due to end on November 30 1990 is an international workshop on Dialogue and Training for the promotion of Root, Tuber and Legume crops in Africa.

The chairman of the conference Prof. Dr. D. Leihner said it is a follow-up of two previous conferences on the same subject held in Germany.

The conference has attracted participants from 12 East and central African countries namely Burundi, Ethiopia, Germany, Kenya, Madagascar, Malawi, Nigeria, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, Zaire and Zambia.

The aim of the conference is to show the significance and importance for human nutrition economic value and cost-benefit aspects of the promotion of roots, tubers and legumes in East and Central Africa.

These foods are mostly considered inferior by most people especially those staying in towns and they tend to depend mostly on cereals.

The conference aims to look

for ways in which increased farming of crops like cassava, yams, sweet potatoes etc can be encouraged among farmers.

Members from each participating country will be expected to give accounts of the problems and success of growing these crops in their respective countries and out of these will come ideas on how to increase their farming.

It is hoped that the African governments and international organizations will consider the workshops results in a way that agricultural training and food policies are changed or adapted in a way that positive preconditions prevail for the promotion of the root, tuber and legume sector.

D.S.E. will use the workshops result for the development of a programme package consisting of a bundle of national and regional dialogue and training programmes for the promotion of the traditional food sector in Africa. The package can hopefully come to realization 1991-92 onwards.

Importance Of 'Small Business'

REALISING THE IMPORTANCE of the informal sector to Kenya's economic growth the Kenya Institute of Management set up in 1987 a Small Business Training Department focusing specifically on the training needs of small businesses.

Such has been the demand for this training that it now attracts international participation and among the 18 participants of a four week workshop entitled 'Training the Trainers on Small Business Creation' at Mombasa's Bandari College were some from the Philippines, Indonesia, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Somalia, Zimbabwe, Uganda, Tanzania as well as from Kenya.

It was conducted by Dr Ralph Engelmann, Associate Director; Deepak Adhikary from Nepal and Mrs Doris Thurau, Training Advisor. All are working with KIM on secondment from GTZ (a German Technical Aid programme), while some of the participants have been sponsored by GTZ.

The workshop was officially opened by Natu Nathwani, a Fellow of the Kenya Institute of Management, who spoke of the importance of such training in view of the fact that many entrepreneurs set up ventures with high determination and enthusiasm, but are generally unprepared to counter inhibiting factors.

Consequently, entrepreneurship training was not only useful but absolutely necessary if one is to succeed.

He concluded by stressing the dire need for 'training of trainers' since entrepreneurship activity has a direct bearing on a country's economic growth and social well being.

Mr Nathwani is the Executive Director of Mackenzie Maritime Limited, Mombasa.

Said Dr Engelmann in an interview 'KIM is placing particular emphasis on small business development and now has a clear cut policy on this which

institutions'. The workshop, he went on 'lays particular emphasis on practical training along the lines of three distinct modules.

1. Learning what type of people are entrepreneurs, how to identify them and how to bring

These three modules, said Dr Engelmann are from KIM's 'Entrepreneur Development Programme'. He explained that at the end of the six-seven week programme they present a Business Plan to real Bankers. Here in Kenya, he said 'we have

focuses quite a bit on the informal sector'.

He pointed out that 'in the informal sector we talk about a job being created with about Shs 5,000/- to Shs 10,000/-, whereas in large industries this would be around Shs 300,000/- to Shs 400,000/-'. Adding 'with the many school leavers each year many new jobs have to be created and one needs to focus more on the informal sector'.

ASSISTANCE

He said that KIM's role in this is 'more in the way of assisting other institutions to come up with proper training, as is happening in the present 'Training of Trainers' course at Bandari College with participants coming from small development enterprise

Part of it is the preparation of a Business Plan to submit to a few invited Bankers at Mombasa who will decide who has the best project for which a small prize will be given.'

EXPANSION

Dr Engelmann mentioned that KIM has similar courses for Business Start-Ups as well as for Business Expansion—all to help with proper planned development.

He said that the course at helping the entrepreneur to become aware of his qualities as an entrepreneur, to help him identify a project and then to guide him in the preparation of a scheme'.

Adding 'this training is quite different from the normal management training for here we have participants playing the role of entrepreneurs and in simulated situations learning through experience'.

VIER NEUE FÄHREN FÜR DEN LIKONIKANAL

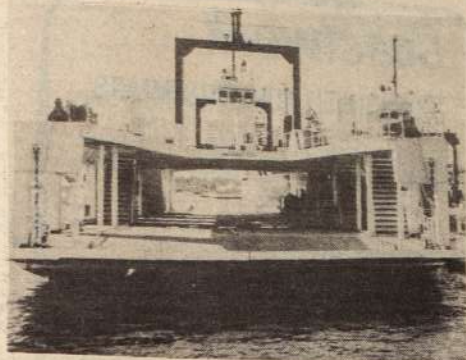
DIE GESCHICHTE der Likonifähre beginnt im Jahre 1936, als der Stadtrat von Mombasa der Kenya Bus Services (MBSA) Ltd. die Konzession zum Fährdienst erteilte. Zuerst wurden zwei Plattformen eingesetzt, die von je einem kleinen Motorboot auf beiden Seiten angetrieben wurden. Sie konnten nur wenige Fahrzeuge und Passagiere befördern.

Bis zum Ende der fünfziger Jahre änderte sich nur wenig; 1957 wurde "St. Christopher" die erste richtige Fähre in Betrieb genommen, die 10 Fahrzeuge und 250 Passagiere transportieren konnte.

Im Zuge der allgemeinen Entwicklung an der Küste wurde diese Fähre 1960 nach kaum drei Jahren durch die viel größere Fähre "St. Michael" unterstützt, die 21 Fahrzeuge und 300 Passagiere aufnehmen kann und auch heute noch im Dienst ist. 1969 und 1975 kamen zwei weitere Fähren hinzu, "Mvita" und "Safina". "St. Christopher" wurde aus dem Verkehr gezogen.

Anfänglich wurden über den Likonikanal nur wenige Autos und Passagiere transportiert; im Jahre 1988 waren es gemäß Statistik 800.000 Fahrzeuge und 24,5 Millionen Passagiere; gegenwärtig sind es täglich rund 3000 Fahrzeuge und 72.000 Passagiere.

Im November 1989 wurde der Fährdienst der Kenianischen Hafenbehörde übergeben. Seither ist ihre Tochtergesellschaft Kenya Ferry Services Ltd. für

den Betrieb, für Reparaturen und Unterhalt der Fähren und Rampen verantwortlich. Die Probleme mit den alternativen Fähren nahmen jedoch ständig zu; Warteschlangen auf beiden Seiten dehnten sich kilometerlang aus.

SINGAPUR

Deshalb bestellte das Trans-

portministerium vor einem Jahr vier neue Fähren, die Ende September 1990 an Bord eines Spezialschiffes M/V "Transshell" in Mombasa ankamen. Die vier neuen Fähren, die von der Firma Otto Industrial Company Ltd. in Singapur gebaut wurden, heißen: "Nyayo", die 60 Personenwagen oder 20 Lastwagen und 1210 Passagiere transportieren kann;

"Kilindini", nur für Fahrzeuge, 60 Personen- oder 20 Lastwagen; "Harambee", nur für 1210 Passagiere; "Mtongwe", eine reine Passagierfähre für 150 Personen.

Die M/V "Transshell", die unter russischer Flagge fährt, gehört zu einer Flotte von sieben Schiffen der Wismüller Transport B.V., Holland. Diese Schiffe transportieren schwere Ladungen wie Schleppkähne, Leichter, Fähren, Kriegsschiffe und werden auch für Bergungsaktionen eingesetzt.

Die vier neuen Fähren wurden Ende September von Präsident Daniel arap Moi während seines offiziellen Besuches an der Küste dem Betrieb übergeben. Sie sind eine hochwillkommene Erleichterung für den Tourismus und die Bewohner an der Südküste.

KILIFI

Unterdessen versucht die kenianische Regierung, Mittel und Wege zu finden, um eine Umfahrungsstraße zu bauen, die die Insel Mombasa mit dem südlichen Festland verbinden soll.

Im Laufe der Jahre und im Zuge der weiteren Entwicklung wurden bereits die Nyalibrücke und die Mtwapabrücke gebaut; die im Bau befindliche Kilifibrücke wird 1991 fertiggestellt und für den Verkehr geöffnet, so daß auch die langen Wartezeiten an der Kilifibrücke entfallen und Malindi und die anderen Orte an der Nordküste ungehindert zu erreichen sein werden.

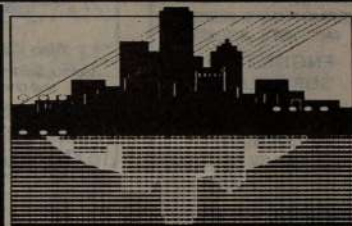

Memories And Monuments ...

WHENEVER A PEOPLE want to mark or commemorate great deeds or great people the common thing is to post-humously erect some form of monument or artifact in their honour.

The practice started in early history and is still with us now.

Some of the leaders in early history had a slight twist in their nut and would order for a large group of people to be commandeered to erect monuments before their very eyes!

Fortunately that type of person is a rare animal to find in the 20th century.

The change that has occurred with "civilisation" is that monuments are more often built to commemorate occasions rather than people.

In this country there are plenty of monuments some of which commemorate landmarks in the country's development.

Others were erected in honour of visiting dignitaries and, more solemnly, for the War dead. Once erected these monuments, especially public ones are entrusted into someone's care.

They are supposed to be cleaned and spruced regularly. However, a quick tour round the country revealed that most monuments are cared for only while they are being built.

By virtue of the fact that people have to be there to build them they get all the TLC they need and once handed over, they will only be looked after on special occasions.

Kachumbari had a lot to tell me when he returned from a recent trip up country but I will concentrate on our local versions.

In the early fifties, a princess came to visit Kenya and during the visit passed through Mombasa. The most famous monument put up for that visit are the tusks along Moi Avenue.

These feature in literally, anything that says I am (or are or have been to) Mombasa.

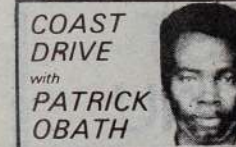
For some time they used to get regular coats of paint and some TLC but eventually they

lost the glitter and our Town Father, who are charged with looking after them, also lost their interest or shall we call it apparent interest.

The only people who seem to take a keen interest in the monument are visiting seamen who spend their community work time rehabilitating the tusks.

An association recently spent money on lighting it up during the 25th anniversary and that spectacular showing should be seen more often on national festivities.

Other monuments of royal visits that are less well known than the tusks are at the Makupa round about. On September 23 1956 a little baobab tree was



planted to mark the passage of Princess Margaret through town but obviously due to its size it has been neglected.

Baobab trees take an eternity to grow so I get the feeling that once it was planted, some soul kept an interest in the tree but since that soul moved on, the tree has been neglected.

It is due to the hardy nature of the baobab that it has survived the lengthy neglect.

On the opposite side of the round about is another plaque that dedicates a tree to the Queen Mother who is alleged to have planted it on February 15 1959.

I say alleged for a very simple reason. Kachumbari and I spent a considerable amount of time searching in a wild growth of bougainvilleae which is adjacent to the plaque.

After suffering countless scratches and other forms of abuse at the hands of this thorny flower we could not find any

exotica near the plaque and we wondered what it was put there for. The bougainvilleae!

I sincerely hope that 200 years from now those it was planted for and those that took a serious interest in the welfare of the tree will be able to look down from the Firmament and see the evolution of the Skyes monkey swinging from the bare branches of the baobab in the dry season whilst the residents of the town will be able to rest under its leafy shade on the rare occasion that it bursts into leaf.

The Queen Mother is still a sprightly lady and for the sake of our Town Fathers I pray that she doesn't remember her tree and pay a visit to check on how vigorously it is growing.

What a put down that would be! The more recently erected monuments are an example of the way we treat our heritage. A lot of effort went into making the town presentable for the 25th anniversary.

A large group of eminent people spent time on the panel that judged the arches that were built for this occasion.

A lot of thought was put into their design and construction. Instead of regular maintenance and care they are only spruced up when the town is expecting revered visitors. The problem is that it costs one to put them up.

Once they are up the Town Fathers expect one to pay for the "advertising" space.

Those who erected them then say tough, it's yours and they are left.

It is only when someone important is coming along that the pride of the erectors come in and they spruce them up.

It would seem certain that they will eventually fall into disuse and present more of an eyesore than a boon to the town sights.

As Kachumbari says, some people are blessed with the gift for conveniently forgetting things when it suits them to!
