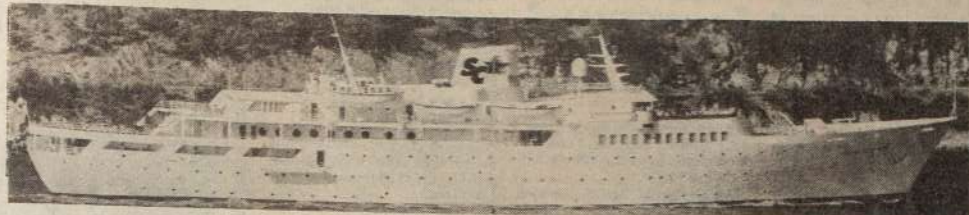
His Excellency the President re-iterated that steps are underway to review other sections of the Kenya Constitution and laws to make them in keeping with the present times.

Womens Clubs Of Kenya ...

THE MAIN THRUST of the Kenya Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Mombasa Branch, has been on Family Life Education and Career Guidance for secondary school students, also in helping women become successful in the small scale businesses they set up.

At a nationwide meeting in Nairobi during October the Mombasa branch won a trophy for 'organising the best youth and women's activities in the country'.

This was presented to them by the District Commissioner, Mombasa, Francis Keitany, Guest of Honour at the Chairman's Annual Ball held at the Reef Hotel where he took the opportunity of congratulating them for their very worthwhile efforts.

He noted they were part of an international Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs and praised the Mombasa Branch for organising three workshops at different secondary schools in Mombasa, Kilifi and Kwale during the year at which students—both boys and girls—were addressed on a variety of subjects including career guidance, sex education and youth problems.

He was also glad to hear that there was a 'follow up' on such workshops.

The DC was also happy to note from the club's activities that women are concerned about other women and in helping them uplift living standards. They were playing a vital role in nation building and the promotion of peace and unity among Kenyans.

On hearing that their work was being hampered by a shortage of funds, Mr Keitany donated Shs 20,000/- to the branch.

There was also Shs 3,000/- from Mrs Okundi, wife of Philip Okundi, Managing Director Kenya Ports Authority, who was unable to attend but sent a donation along instead.

The club has also started organising inter-school competitions and recently one on 'Social Problems facing Youth' took place at the Star of the Sea Secondary School the guest of honour being the Mombasa Municipal Education Officer, Mr Isaac Kavuu. The subject was presented through drama, debate and poetry, the overall winners being the Star of the Sea Secondary School.

The chairman of the Mombasa Branch, Mrs Mary Mwamodo, said that the Annual Ball was also an opportunity to raise funds to enable the club to continue providing service to women and youth in the coast province.

She said that the Kenya Business and Professional Women's Club, which is a non-governmental organisation, is

very much concerned with the progress of women and girls. The club realised she said that many women running small scale businesses do not have sufficient knowledge about managing them effectively. It was also found that most are young mothers and need education in family planning.

As well, youth need training in family life education so as to become responsible parents in the future.

Said the chairman 'to continue with these activities the club needs money. Here she took the opportunity of thanking donors and individual well-wishers for assisting the club in past years.

They included ILO which donated funds to train 20 small scale business women from

Kwale, Kilifi and Mombasa; Norad which made it possible to train the Makiwo Youth Group in Kilifi District on Business and Leadership.

The Centre for Education and Population Activities (CEDPA) an organisation concerned with the improvement of women, gave funds enabling the club to train 40 girls in family life education. From these funds the club was able to buy two dairy cows and two sewing machines for the Makiwo Youth Group.

There were also donors from the Coast including Mr I Chokwe, who sponsored some youth training, while Mr Nderu provided a hall free of charge as well as drinks.

LIONS CLUB HOST LAMU 'EYE CAMP'

AFTER THE FIRST Eye Camp, which was successfully conducted at Lamu in end July this year, Lions Club of Mombasa Central held their second major Eye Camp as well as Dental Camp at Galana Hospital, Malindi last week end.

19 Lions from the Club were present at the Hospital to give their services.

Dr Bhandari and Dr Larsen, the Eye Surgeons also travelled to Malindi with their assistants to carry out cataract operations. Dr J.D. Shah from Mombasa and Dr Mark Solomon from Kilifi District Hospital, the Dental Surgeons were also there to carry out dental checks.

In total 480 eye patients were screened. There were 25 cataract surgeries carried out plus four other eye ailments surgeries were done such as removal of foreign bodies.

The club also dispensed 144 pairs of reading glasses to needy patients.

In the dental camp, a total of 170 patients were checked and 102 of them needed dental extractions which were carried out. Further 20 patients were referred to Kilifi District Hospital for treatment. Later medicine worth over KSh. 3000/- was dispensed free of cost to all the needy patients.

Both the above camps are sponsored by the club on charity basis. The Club intends to hold another Eye Camp in Msambweni in February-March 1991.

You Have To Get Off Your Asses To Solve This Problem ...

SOME SMART FELLOW recently took Lamu by storm. He decided that he would break with tradition and take a new sport to the older parts of the town—resulting in a small financial dent in his cash reserves.

Kachumbari visited the town recently and came back with a report that had a touch of some "foreign journalism" in it. His story follows.

Lamu has been the home of asses for donkeys years. They have been in use as beasts of burden ever since someone found out that they could be tamed to work for the homo sapien.

A certain protocol was developed in Lamu whereby no one was allowed to ride on a donkey in the centre of town.

All those who wanted to ride donkeys were supposed to do so on the sands outside the town.

This was more so because most people who would want to ride donkeys would not be heading for Jerusalem in solemn triumph but would be involved in the sport of donkey racing.

With the limitation of space on the town's streets, the authorities, in their wisdom banned racing of donkeys a long time ago.

So along comes this fellow who decides that donkey racing is a good idea. He goes hires himself an ass and heads for town to show off his prowess.

The hawk-eyed law is there and as he hastens his way through the centre of the town, he is arrested for speeding.

They could have thrown the book at him — and there plenty of books to throw... Could he have been driving dangerously? Was his mount in a road worthy condition? Did he have a license to drive (ride)?

I am sure there are more books than those listed above.

I am still deciding whether Kachumbari's report was accurate but there is one that I know is and it raises a whole series of questions.

One of the larger companies in Kenya has an "official" donkey that is used for distribution of its products. To identify it the ass has a branded cloth draped on its back.

It is useful in Lamu since vehicles are not allowed on the island (bar one). So in keeping with the spirit of the place it would be natural to adopt the common mode of transport.

The authorities also have "official" donkeys. These animals are part of the property of the authorities and are registered as assets in the inventory of items that whoever comes in anew has to sign for.

I presume that by the very fact that they are registered as

assets, the donkeys are assigned a value in the books and they are depreciated at the end of every financial period.

I am also sure that there is an item in the budget that covers fuel (napier grass), maintenance (vet), cleaning costs (daily brush and an annual dip), licensing fees etc.

The Town Council must be still asleep! Our City Fathers are thinking of charging heavy goods vehicles and buses for entering the city.

How nice it would be if the residents of Lamu also had to face increasing tolls like the rest of us on terra firma. Each laden donkey should be charged a fee for a load it is carrying.

Each journey into and out of

the island town's centre could be charged. The donkeys would need a road license over and above the animal license one currently has to buy.

This would go towards the cost of keeping the roads in good shape. The clip clapping of hooves on the tar does cause a certain amount of damage you know.

The old bill could have their field day. Each ass would need a rear reflector of some sort—so the only car that is allowed on the island would be able to avoid them in the dark.

Some form of forward illumination would be necessary

in case the ass has to be used at night.

In case the ass is to be involved in competition of whatever nature then the organisers would need permission (in return for a small fee) to hold the event. All asses would have to be medically examined (witness what happened in the Maralal Camel Derby) to ensure they can withstand the rigours of competition and they would also have to be controlled by their users.

In fact the possibility of earning revenue from asses are myriad if only the Town Fathers can put their heads together and be a bit more creative.

As Kachumbari says, anyone for polo?

Cargo Handling At Peak Performance

CARGO HANDLING ACTIVITY at the port of Mombasa since the middle of last month has maintained its peak position. The dominant cargo items still remain fertiliser, wheat, coal, millet, soda ash and cement.

M.V. *Ar Rabu* is discharging 10,000 tons of millet and 5,000 tons of cowpeas in bulk while M.V. *Salvador* also discharging 19,000 tons of coal. Wheat to the tune of 17,000 tons has also arrived aboard M.V. *Sea Happy*.

The Kenya Ports Authority's list of expected ships to arrive in the next two weeks has 36 vessels.

The major import items also shown on the list include coal, crude oil, gypsum, rolled paper, white oil, motor cars, billets, coils, palm oil and wheat.

With the advent of cruise ship calls at the port, water has become an essential export commodity and several tons are required with each call.

Other items of export include,

sisal, coffee, tea, soda ash, cement and flourspar.

Meanwhile, with the launching last week of M.V. *Ambassador I* as the first home based cruise ship at the port of Mombasa by the Minister for Tourism and Wildlife Mr Noah Katana Ngala, Kenya is poised for more business in this lucrative foreign currency earning tourism area.

M.V. *Caledonian Star*, a passenger ship which was here a fortnight ago, returns early this week.

LAMU VISIT

The *Royal Viking Star*, also here recently, steams back into the calm Kilindini channel at the same time.

The *Ambassador I* is in Mombasa every other two days after cruises to Lamu and Zanzibar. To most passengers, it is a discovery of old dhow trading route by the Arabs and other Far Eastern countries.

LIKE GRASS SPROUTING after the short rains, boutiques have grown up in Mombasa at a phenomenal rate. Some have flourished; others have silently retreated, but one which is definitely here to stay is Fine Design Boutique which has put down deep roots.

Fine Design is in Kibokoni Road, passed all the import export agencies and hardware shops. It is the third shop after Seife Bakery. One can drive down this street starting at Bank of Baroda opposite Central Police Station, Makadara Road. Telephone 311215.

It is worth a visit, for owner, Mubina, has created her own designs, of which 90 per cent of the clothes are thought out, designed, cut and sewn by her.

Fine Design premises was previously half Asmasons (the fishing shop, who uses his nets and tackle for decor—and what about Christmas specials? and half Fine Design.

Fine Design has now taken over the whole premises, and the fishing shop has moved back to its original place near the Majestic. Mubina has renovated to her own wish, using bamboo and other materials which are in keeping with her fashions.

The name, Asmasons, by the way? The fishing shop belongs to Murtaza, who is one of Asma's sons, and Mubina (Fine Design) is one of Asma's daughters.

When we asked Mubina how she got into this line of business, having known her as an accountant of some repute, she told us that from a youngster she had a flair for design and artistry.

Three quarters of Mubina's stock is Shalwar Kameez. For Westerners, this is the tunic with traditional slacks usually worn by Indian women.

Sometimes office-oriented women wear these items too.

Besides Mubina's ready stock of Shalwar Kameez, you'll find that she can be busy with a customer discussing style or colour. Or you might find her cutting to the client's wish, often their own material, before passing the item for stitching by her tailors.

Another Asian dress is the Chanya Cholis. Here Mubina combines east and west. Originating from Gujarat this mode of dress is made by her using local materials, like khangas and kikoiis.

This ethnic fashion is becoming very popular and is the latest

trendy look with young girls. Older women, a little daring, are also diversifying their dress style and opting for these Chanya Cholis too.

You might like a Kaftan (Maxi Dress) or Evening Dress. At the other extreme is the Unisex Beach Wear, and a little swim wear. Small Girls' dresses are fancy in contrast to the plain school uniforms which Mubina also turns out.

For Muslim women there are the scarves called Hijab ready for sale here, and for the Bohra community Mubina is often busy with their modern *ridah*.

Fine Design also has a lot of hair care products on the cosmetic side. Mubina has made luminous bands in green or pink for those who simply wish to get their hair out of the way in the heat.

There are perfumes too: Qourum, Poison, Cobra.

Besides fame, Mubina derives great pleasure and satisfaction in seeing ladies wearing outfits styled and tailored by her. She feels, therefore, that her efforts have paid off.

One last item: A Christmas present for your house—Mubina stocks sisal runner mats for corridors, door mats for the front entrance and linoleum carpets.

15 KREUZFAHRTSCHIFFE BESUCHEN MOMBASA

KENIA HAT mit Erfolg an der "Holidays and Sea Cruise Convention" im Lancaster Hotel in London teilgenommen, welche Tagung von rund 300 Kreuzfahrt- und Reiseveranstaltern besucht wurde.

Die kenianische Delegation, angeführt von Mr. P.O. Okundi, Managing Director der Kenianischen Hafenbehörde und Präsident des im vergangenen Jahr gegründeten "Cruise Ship Facilitation Committee", setzte sich aus Vertretern von Reiseveranstaltern und von Reedereien zusammen.

Das Komitee hat die Aufgabe, den lukrativen Kreuzfahrt-Tourismus in Kenia zu fördern, den Hafen von Mombasa als ideale Basisstation anzupreisen für Kreuzfahrten zu den Inseln im Indischen Ozean und auch für das einzigartige kombinierte Safari-Kreuzfahrt-Angebot zu werben.

Der Stand an dieser Kreuzfahrt-Tourismus-Ausstellung wurde gemeinsam von der Kenianischen Hafenbehörde, Kenya Airways und dem Ministerium für Tourismus und Wildleben aufgestellt. Die attraktiven Hostessen von Kenya Airways waren ein besonderer Anziehungspunkt. Auf riesigen Wandgemälden wurden Kreuzfahrtschiffe im Hafen von Mombasa sowie die exotische

Flora und Faune in den kenianischen Nationalparks dargestellt.

Kenia hat als einziges afrikanisches Land und als zweites Entwicklungsland an dieser Tagung als Aussteller teilgenommen.

Das erste Kreuzfahrtschiff, das Mombasa als Basisstation ausgewählt hat, ist die "Ambassador", die Ende November mit Kreuzfahrten begann. Die Suli Suli African Cruises (K) Limited veranstaltet anfänglich 3-Tage-Kreuzfahrten nach Lamu und Sansibar. Später soll die "Ambassador" auch andere Inseln wie die Seychellen, Komoren, Mauritius und Madagaskar besuchen.

KILINDINI

Im ersten Halbjahr 1990 kamen sechs Kreuzfahrtschiffe nach Mombasa. Im nächsten Jahr werden mindestens 15 erwartet.

Als der Luxusdampfer "Royal Viking Sea" am 3. November 1990 mit 475 Passagieren im Hafen von Kilindini ankam, wurde er mit traditionellen Girimatänzen und von der Scotch Band von der Hafenverwaltung empfangen.

Die "Royal Viking Sea" ankerterte nur für einen Tag in Mombasa, der Endstation ihrer 1990 Indien-Afrika-Kreuzfahrt. Die Hälfte der Passagiere (99 Prozent davon Amerikaner) verließen das Schiff und neue Passagiere stiegen ein,

um die nächste Afrika-Indien-Tour mitzumachen.

Am Kai warteten am frühen Morgen die Minibusse von United Touring Company Ltd. (UTC), um die Passagiere entweder auf eine Tagessafari nach Tsavo-Ost zu fahren oder auf eine Stadtrundfahrt, die mit einem sagenhaften Mittagessen im Freien, einem reichhaltigen kalten und warmen Buffet im Nyalí Beach Hotel endete.

Dieses Passagierschiff, 1973 in Finnland gebaut und in den Bahamas registriert, steht zur Zeit unter dem Kommando von Kapitän Peder Veberstad. Es gehört der Royal Viking Line (mit einer Flotte von vier Kreuzfahrtschiffen) — eine Tochtergesellschaft von Kloster Cruise Ltd. Ihre Agentur in Mombasa ist Express Kenya Ltd.

Auf der "Royal Viking Sea" gibt es nur eine Klasse mit 5-Sterne-Plus Unterkünften. Die Kreuzfahrt begann in Bombay und führte über Goa, die Malediven, Seychellen und Komoren nach Mombasa.

Um Verzögerungen zu vermeiden, wurden die Beamten der Zoll-, Einwanderungs- und Gesundheitsbehörden auf die Seychellen geflogen, damit sie während der Seereise die notwendigen Formalitäten erledigen konnten.

187 Passagiere verließen das Schiff in Mombasa; 210 Passagiere waren drei Tage vorher mit einem von der Royal Viking Line gecharterten Großrausflug-

zeug Lockheed 1011 von Amerika nach Nairobi geflogen, um eine Safari durch den berühmten Masai Mara Nationalpark zu unternehmen.

Mit der gleichen Chartermaschine flogen sie anschließend nach Mombasa, wo sie von UTC empfangen und zum Schiff gebracht wurden. Die UTC Busse holten auch die Passagiere vom Nyalí Beach Hotel ab für den Transfer zum Flughafen und ihren Flug nach Nairobi. Drei Tage verbrachten sie in der Landeshauptstadt; die eine Hälfte der Passagiere wohnte im Hilton Hotel, die andere Hälfte im Safari Park Hotel. Sie besuchten den Nairobi Nationalpark, das Karen Blixen Museum und das Giraffen-Reservat. Der Rückflug nach Amerika erfolgte ebenfalls mit dieser Chartermaschine.

TSAVO — OST

Unter den 30 Passagieren, die auf der "Royal Viking Sea" blieben, war eine 92-jährige Dame, die die Tagessafari nach Tsavo-Ost mitgemacht hatte und begeistert war von den vielen wilden Tieren, denen sie auf freier Wildbahn begegnete.

Mr. Shafket Pervaiz, General Manager von UTC Küste, war sehr zufrieden mit der erfolgreichen "Operation", die er wie folgt kommentierte: "Es freut uns sehr, daß wir von der Royal Viking Line ausgewählt wurden, um das Keniaprogramm für Sie durchzuführen. Das ganze Arrangement ist reibungslos und planmäßig abgelaufen."

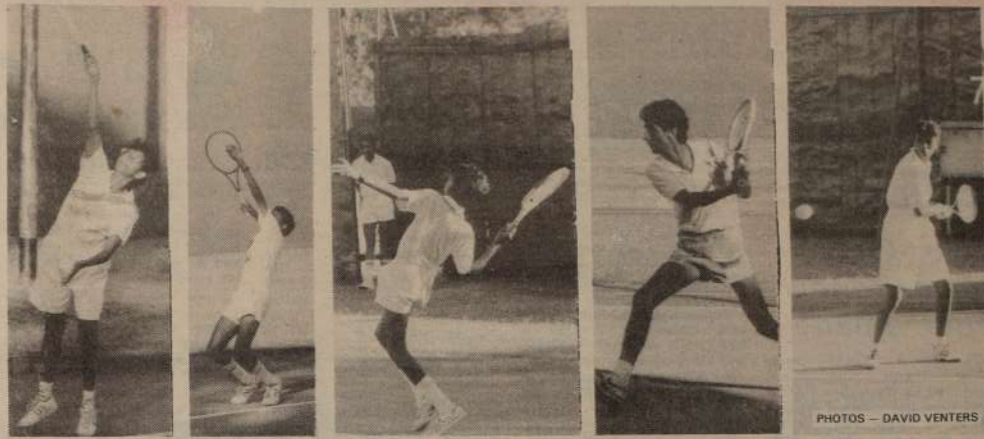
