'LALA SALAAMA' AS 'SAFARI SOUND' AT THE SEVERIN

BACK FROM A SOJOURN that saw them perform in Nairobi earlier this year, the Safari Sound Band has just acquired new instruments which will now enhance the quality of their music.

Performing at the Severin Sea Lodge on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights, the band leader Mr Waiyaki said that the group plans to release new hits as part of their programme for 1991.

This will have a Kenyan beat that will emulate the beat of their famous record "Lala Salaama". The new instruments and the presence of soloist Bruce Odhiambo who joined the band early this year will add impetus to their performance.

The band leader said that the group has continued to grow from strength to strength since inception in 1977 when he gathered a few school boys to form the band.

It was the same year that the band signed a contract with the African Safari Club tour company that owns many hotels in Mombasa, and subsequently they performed for ten years with the organisation.

SIX WEEKS TOUR

The group has visited many European countries with a view to attracting tourists. They have been to Switzerland, Germany and Holland performing three to six weeks during each tour.

Mr Bruce Odhiambo said that the band plans to buy a new Hawaiian guitar which would blend their African beat with soul music.

Twenty Thousand More Telephones

NEW LINES FOR DIANI, MALINDI, NYALI AND BAMBURI

GOOD NEWS from Kenya Posts and Telecommunications at the Coast is that coming into operation soon will be ten thousand new telephone lines, followed by a further ten thousand in 1991/2.

This has been revealed by the Regional Manager of K.P. and T., Mr. P.N. Mutuku, who had been invited to address a committee meeting of the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association at the Oceanic Hotel on the corporation's expansion plans and a more efficient service to subscribers. He said that with a new electronic telephone exchange in Mombasa the public will have more lines and be able to communicate freely within and outside the country.

Mr. Mutuku said they estimated giving about 600 lines each to Nyali, Changamwe, Diani, Malindi and 300 each to Bamburi and Kikambala.

He also mentioned that telephone numbers starting with '2' would be given the prefix '2' thus making them six digit numbers.

However, he added 'there are likely to be some numbers that require a complete change and

information to this effect will be communicated before this is carried out.

Continuing he said that telephone operators were also being instructed on giving a more efficient and courteous service, while greater supervision would ensure the end of long delays in getting an answer from '900'.

In the meantime, he has appealed to subscribers to be pa-

tient for big improvements are on the way.

Mr. Mutuku also mentioned that during the festive season special arrangements had been made for senior technicians to contact hotel switchboard operators each morning to check that their lines are in order. If not, they will try and rectify the fault immediately.

Roads and garbage were again discussed and members noted that following the MCTA delegation to the Mayor to ask for urgent action be taken to make the town cleaner and tidier 'so that tourists can take away with them good impressions of Kenya's second largest town' very little improvement appeared to have been made.

The MCTA again appealed to the Mombasa Municipal Council to ensure that all garbage, including that dumped on roadsides, be collected and more potholed roads repaired.

Members also felt that more supervision is required to ensure that work is properly carried out.

On the questions of 'illegal hawkers' members heard that in certain areas 'quit' notices had already been served.

MCTA was also advised that the Ministry of Health had, with immediate effect, increased the charges for Yellow Fever and Cholera injections. The former has gone up from Shs. 100/- to Shs. 200/-, while the latter has been raised from Shs. 50/- to Shs. 100/-.

The Chairman, Mr. Zul Harunani, gave a report of the Sea Cruise Convention and Exhibition he had recently attended in London as part of the 22-strong delegation from Kenya

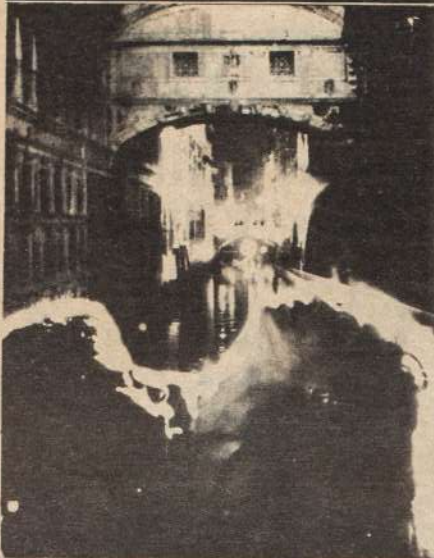

'Desire' Is For Adults Only ...

DESIRE, a movie that attracted thousands of fans when it was first shown in Mombasa last August, is back again at Lotus Cinema. This film for adult only, back due to great public demand, is a story about a young girl struggling to hold on to her music career and at the same time maintain love between two competing lovers.

Desire is a good film that recorded full houses during its six and three great weeks runs in Nairobi and Mombasa respectively.

A teenage American girl, Jessica Harrison (Josie Bisset) leaves for Venice in the hope of advancing her music career.

It had been attended by more than 400 delegates including exhibitors most of whom were from the continent of Europe.

The chairman said how delighted he was with the way in which cruise ship tourism to Kenya was being promoted and recalled that it was Michael Dunford, an authority on such matters, who had approached MCTA at a time when there was a declining number of cruise ships calling here as they were not too happy with the handling of ships and passengers.

This matter was taken up strongly by MCTA resulting in the Minister for Tourism convening a meeting of senior people interested in its development from which a Cruise Ship Facilitation Committee was set up under the chairmanship of Philip Okundi, Managing Director of KPA.

Already, an increasing number of ships are calling here, while two will be based at Mombasa - Suli-Suli's m.s. *Ambassador* has already started operating cruises to Lamu and Zanzibar, while African Safari Club's Royal Star commences operating soon.

The meeting also discussed the proposed Airport Toll which is being introduced in January.

It was reported that initially the Director of Aerodromes had planned for it to start in December. However, following representations by MCTA and KATO pointing out the problems it might incur if not properly organised and coming at the height of the high tourist season he decided to postpone its introduction until January.

THAT FEELING WHEN YOU DISCOVER THE BRAKES HAVE FAILED!

Our Heritage of Faith...

ONE OF JESUS'S well known sayings was, "I am the good Shepherd".

The Good Shepherd theme has been a great encouragement to us during the past month. We have come to realise that to be given the maximum benefit we need to be good sheep also.

In John chapter ten, versus one to 18, Jesus used this analogy. The typical Palestinian shepherd was in his mind as he taught the people.

First, we see that the shepherd leads and the sheep follow; he goes on ahead of them and his sheep follow (Verse four). He leads them so that he can face and deal with dangers; also he directs the sheep to the best pastures.

Even their equipment is different; the butcher has a rope and forked stick to hold down the sheep ready for the knife while the shepherd has a crook to rescue the sheep from danger.

Jesus said, 'I am the good shepherd'. He wants to encourage us by going ahead of us in everything, if only we will let him.

Secondly, Jesus knows all about us in detail, ministering to

us individually and personally.

'He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out' (verse three) This quality of Jesus's is unique.

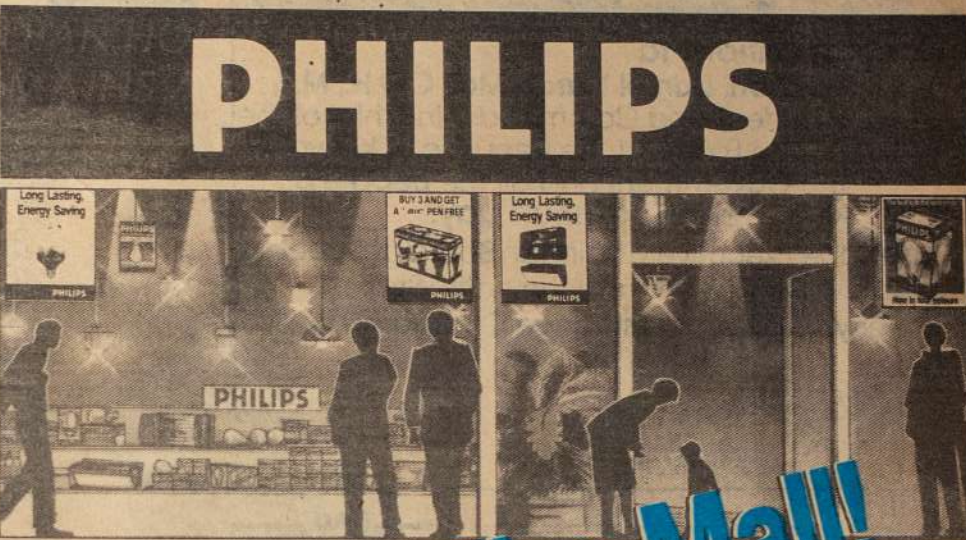
Thirdly, he never abandons his people when they are in danger. In fact, 'the good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep' (verse 11). He does much better than the hired shepherd, who runs away when there is trouble. He is ready to give his life to protect his sheep.

There is a legend that the apostle Peter followed the example of Jesus when in Rome during a time of persecution. He decided to run away, but Jesus met him on the street and asked: 'Where are you going?' He replied: 'I am going to Rome to be crucified, this time for you.'

Lastly, the good shepherd takes time to search for the lost sheep. 'I have other sheep that are not of this flock. I must bring them also.' (verse 16)

The joy of Christmas time can be very special, but it is only a small reflection of that great joy in heaven, when a sinner is found and restored to the place which God intended.

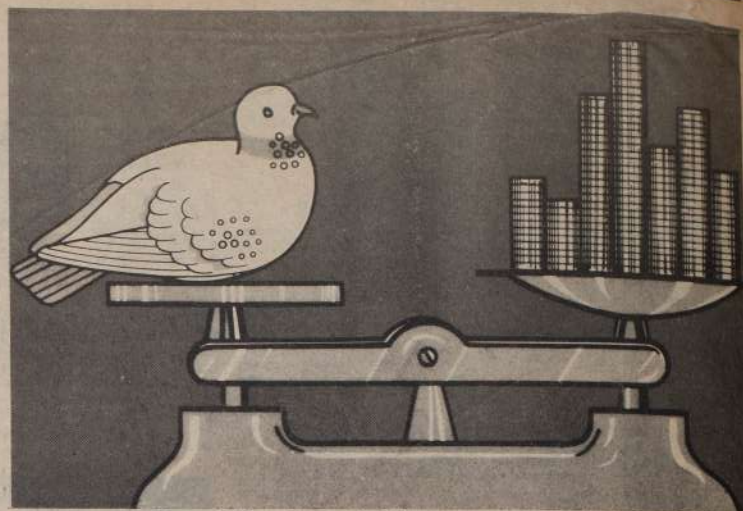

Kenyans continue to build on these firm foundations as they prepare to meet the enormous challenges which still lie ahead of them in the great task of nation building. At this time the Republic must also acknowledge the debt of gratitude which it owes to its many friends abroad who help in this success.

"Lucrative international markets for illicit trade in game trophies is threatening our national parks and game reserves.

"We have limited resources to deal with this prob-

lem, but as custodians of one of the world's greatest areas of wildlife heritage, we are determined to protect our wildlife and its habitat not only for our own posterity but for mankind as a whole."

In this, as in all other aspects of international relations, Kenyans believe that goodwill, justice and a commitment to the principles of peaceful co-existence among nations are the best way of ensuring a better future for mankind.

VIEWPOINT INDIAN HOUSE CROW REMAINS A MENACE!

NOBODY can deny that the Indian House Crow has become a real menace in Mombasa, and every effort should be made to eradicate this highly intelligent and successful bird, and for this reason the authorities are now offering to pay five shillings for every dead crow.

This might encourage a few more people to build a proper crow-trap, the plans of which can probably be obtained from

the Municipal Council Public Health Department, or the Crow Control Committee.

Several coast hotels now have these traps on their premises, and there is also one at Likoni, one at the Bamburi Nature Trail, and one at the Mamba Village Crocodile Farm.

Recently I had occasion to take some visitors to see a local trap, and we were appalled to see several dead and dying crows in the trap which had no shade or water or food; they had starved to death slowly!

I trust that animal welfare organisations will take action on this matter. Nobody likes crows, but that is no excuse to cause them unnecessary suffering.

The traps can be built quite cheaply of local materials, but the most important factor is that the trap MUST be regularly serviced. This means that fresh water and food bait must be replaced daily and a little shade provided.

About four crows should always remain in the trap in order to lure others to enter and feed. When the numbers build up, the surplus crows must be caught and removed.

To avoid unnecessary stress this can best be done at night when they are roosting. They can be put in a large bag which when placed over the exhaust pipe of a running car engine, will gas them painlessly.

The bodies could then be taken to the Coast Provincial Veterinary Officer where (if lucky), Shs. 5/- per bird will be paid over!
