The compliment was the stimulus for Salima to start fathoming out a way of blending and preserving powdered forms of spices and other ingredients which can give a taste equal to the freshly prepared meal in her own home.

She began to experiment with two of her favourite dishes: chicken masala and pilau rice. She tried them out on some parents at her son's kindergarten, who were of many different nationalities.

The response was so positive she knew she had to go on with the experiments with different dishes, with methods of packaging and marketing

With the help of her husband, she established Aromatic Foods to create and market a range of spice mixes—all with the finest ingredients and without any preservatives

AROMATIC FOODS

Anomatic FOODS Under the name Shailmar, Aromatic Foods now produces nine blends of spices which are essential for preparing certain Indian dishes, such as chicken masala, meat curry, fish masala, vegetable korma and shish kebab.

To achieve and preserve optimum freshness, the spices are presented in heat-sealed foil sachets—each with enough servings for four or six people.

Also, there is a choice of medium or hot blends.

It may seem strange that these Indian foods are coming from Africa. But Kenya has a large and varied Asian community, with families who can trace their origins to different areas and regions of the Indian sub-continent.

With the 'Shalimar' blends, dishes can be created that are a unique mixture of Indian cuisine.

As for quality, a typical comment came from a North American tourist who was holidaying in Kenya. He is fond of Indian food and he has eaten in restaurants all over Europe and North America.

She also has unravelled the mysteries of computer bar codes which are not used in Kenya, as yet. She has cleared the first hurdles of international marketing.

Soon, dishes which delighted and intrigued dinner party guests in the Khimji's Nairobi home can be enjoyed in households in Europe and North America. "In fact," admits Salima, "I quite often use the sachets myself, when I am pressed for time—and my family can never tell whether the meal is from the packet or freshly ground spices!"

"Really?" laughs Sultan, her husband. "Well, I have always said that the Shalimar packs are the next best thing to employing an Indian chef in your home!"

In just over two years, the name of 'Shalimar' has become wall known in Kenya, the sachets are appearing in many of the supermarkets as well as in the specialist food shops.
