# Jonathan Scott Takes Off In His New 'Land Cruiser'

WELL-KNOWN photographer and writer, Jonathan Scott, whose work has done so much to create awareness of Kenya's wildlife, recently took delivery of a new Toyota Land Cruiser, which was "tailor-made" by Toyota Kenya to suit his exacting lifestyle.

Winner of the 1987 BBC Wildlife Photographer of the Year award and author of six books on African wildlife, published during the past 10 years, Jonathan Scott works and sleeps in his vehicle for weeks at a time when researching material and taking photographs for his books and television programmes, which include the BBC's 'Africa Watch' series.

When looking for material for his recently published book 'Painted Wolves', he spent

long in his previous Toyota Landcruiser that he was able to identify each of the wild dogs he was observing individually, staying with the pack until its puppies were old enough to follow the Land Cruiser on their own.

When the old Landcruiser was nearing the end of its useful life, Jonathan Scott asked Toyota Kenya to help him acquire a new one.

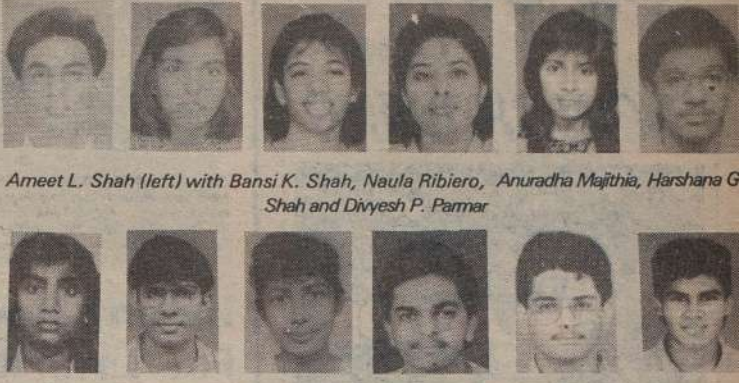

Helen is someone of whom Kenya can be proud for she always maintained the highest standards of service and courtesy wherever she went and has trained many local people who have looked upon her with the greatest respect.

Everyone who knew Helen Shaw was sorry to see her leave and wished her every happiness in her retirement in the Argentine.

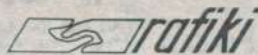

## Kenya Red Cross Society Host An 'Eye - Dental' Clinic At Utange

THE KENYA RED CROSS SOCIETY Mombasa Branch has hosted a most successful Eye and Dental Camp held at Utange Refugee Camp.

Having felt the need of organising a Mini Camp for Eyes and Dental check up of the Somali refugees at Utange Camp in order to minimise demands for such treatment requests, the Branch Secretary, Mrs K A A Molu contacted Mr Ali Raza Karim the proprietor of Kenya Optical Company and Dr (Mrs) Lata Magon (Dentist) to request them to volunteer their services on a convenient day.

Both of them responded positively and the Mini Camp was set up on Sunday. The team conducted the Eyes and Dental check-ups from 10.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. under the banner of the Lions Club of Mombasa Island.

The Chairman Mr Al-Noor Jivan and Mr Abid Vejlani also joined.

Mr Ali Raza Karim single handed checked about 120 eye cases and provided 75 cases with reading spectacles and about 10 cases were given bi-focal spectacles.

### 'Spectacles Given Free'

The spectacles were provided free of charge by courtesy of Lions Club.

There were nine cases of ripe cataract ready for surgery. These will be sent for screening at the laboratory before they are recommended for surgery which will be carried out by the Lions Club at Malindi on

November 9 1991.

Lions Club has pledged to transport them to and from Malindi, and surgery and hospitalisation will be free of charge.

Three cases needed special glasses which Mr Ali Raza Karim undertook to make the spectacles for them free of charge.

There was one case requiring sun glasses and eye drops which were provided by Mr Ali Raza.

Two cases were found to be requiring Corneal Transplant and such operation cannot be done in Mombasa. The only place known to be competent for such surgery is the P.C.E.A. Hospital at Kikuyu near Nairobi. Efforts are being made to contact Doctor Wood to take these cases.

Dr (Mrs) Lata Magon carried out the dental check-up single handed and managed to examine at least 150 cases. In absence of facilities at the camp no treatment could be provided. However, Dr (Mrs) Magon pledged to attend to the cases at her own surgery free of charge.

In the meantime she prescribed anti-biotics for the patients to take prior to seeing her at the surgery which the Branch Secretary of Kenya Red Cross Society will arrange systematically.

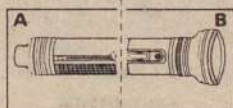

Already a cross-section of the hotel facilities have been demolished and an improvement project started approximated at a cost of Shs 25 million he advised.

Mr Menyhart noted that Eden Roc Hotel has continued receiving visitors especially from Germany, some of whom

have made repeat visit for as many as 15 times and so have been put into a special category of VIP status as "friends of the Eden Roc".

The hotel has undergone many phases of development since its humble beginning in 1971 when the management constructed the second phase including a hall, a large modern kitchen, three bars, and a conference hall.

He added that in 1975 the hotel had further expansions when the management built a night spot to cater for the young disco enthusiasts, as club 28 discotheque.

Mr Menyhart said that the hotel management investment of shs 25 million is a positive sign that his establishment had confidence in the future of tourism in the country, and hence was planning its own contribution towards its success and the attainment of the target of one million tourists.

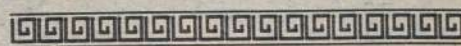

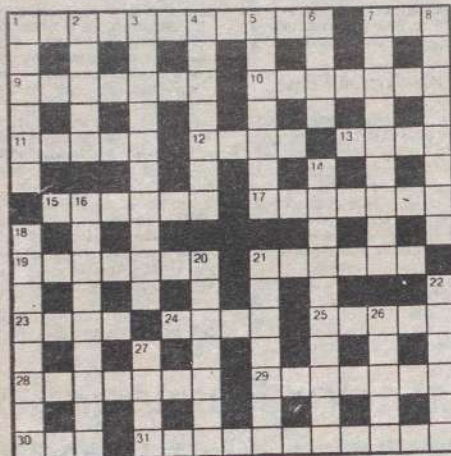

PEOPLE SOMETIMES FIND themselves in situations that are not of their own making and which they cannot hope to influence in any way.

Sometimes the occurrences are quite comical to the observer although the person involved in the activity could be at great risk.

Kachumbari was witness to an incident recently that left him and a couple of other drivers in tears.

The Makupa causeway is notorious for traffic jams. At the best of times, traffic flows quite easily and what cops are worried about is the great risk of a pile up involving a large number of vehicles.

That is why bumps were put on the causeway in the first place. That they caused their own hazard is neither here nor there.

carriage way such that there is only single line traffic either way.

## RABI SPORT CLUB WIN BREWERY

Rabi Boys who are in the Premier Mini-League after a particularly crushing Nyundo F.C. 4-1 victory that Chelsea United 2-0 recently carried with a sparkle from the break to their delight of the crowd but three Breweries defence marshalled by goalkeeper Wanyama and Captainly and Ndekei thwarted all efforts Rabi who missed several scores.

## Mtwapa Fishing Report 1990-1991 SEASON

The 1990/91 Fishing Season at Mtwapa turned out to be a record one for the total weight recorded! 18,132 kgs.) and also the best year we have had for marlin - a total of 44 were weighed in. The sailfish score was much the same as the season before but the average weight dropped from 29 kgs. to 25.5 kgs. It was the same with the striped marlin where the average weight dropped drastically from 60 kgs. to 43 kgs.

The best fish of the season was a black marlin of 203 kgs. caught by Roland Wudenigg fishing on "Vuma". Roland's fish was only 500 grams short of the Kenya record, but could not have been claimed anyhow due to I G F A rule infringements. It was also the largest marlin we have weighed in since 1982. We did not record any blue marlin, and the best stripey was a 67.2 kgs. fish caught by Matthias Meyer from "Maverick". Gotz Bless (a regular visitor from Germany) caught the heaviest sailfish - this weighed in at 50 kgs. and was caught from "Oona". There were not many shark and most of them were small. However, Gerhard Schleicher got one of 103 kgs. while drift fishing on "Samvuke".

Although we only landed one good sized marlin, there were signs of an increase in the presence of the larger blacks. Certainly there were more about than in the past few seasons. Wilfried Wegner, one of our most regular clients, who fishes every season on "Samvuke" paid two visits to Kenya during the season. He had the fortune to hook a large black on both visits, but the misfortune to lose them both. The first one was in early December - it was sighted by the "Samvuke" crew swimming right by the boat and only a few hundred metres from the reef. A large bonito was already out as live bait (with a double hook for kingfish) - within minutes the bait was taken - the line was freespooled for a long time, and eventually the fish was struck. The huge black piled out of the water and made many spectacular jumps. It was fought for just on an hour before the 24 kg. line parted (unfortunately it had been badly damaged during the fight). This fish was estimated at well over 200 kgs. but Wilfried tried again at the end of March, and hooked into another (estimated at 150 kilos) but sadly it came off the hook on the third jump! The "Samvuke" crew witnessed another hour long fight with a black - this was a fish of about 70 kgs. that was fought by Karl Manhard on 8 kg. tackle. Unfortunately, when all things seem to be going the way of the angler the line popped for no apparent reason. That's fishing!

These were the ones that got away but there were also a lot that came into the boat. Quite a few new Mtwapa records were set including one new Kenya record - a 24.5 kg. yellowfin taken by Karl Manhard on 8 kg. line. Karl also landed the best kingfish ever weighed in at Mtwapa - a beautiful one of 31 kgs. taken on 15 kgs. tackle. This fish unfortunately could not be claimed as a Kenya record since the rod was passed to the angler. Amongst the other species of fish, Ferdinand Matt had the best karambesi - a 35 kg. fish taken from "Maverick", while Wilfried Wegner (fishing on "Samvuke") weighed in the largest cobia (black runner) - a 37.2 kg. specimen.

Our boats had a lot of success in competitions. This started with "Buccaneer" (Jeff Pereira, Kit Pereira) winning the B A T. Competition at Bahari Club in January with a striped marlin. The following weekend the same team took the two day CMC Competition (also held at Bahari Club) with two striped marlin and a sailfish. In this competition Sigi Finimento, fishing on "Raha" with Sammy Mucheru, came third with a fine sailfish of 38 kgs.

"Raha" was again successful in the Bahari Club's Century Automobile Tournament when Ahmed Ali Jiwaji and Ron weighed in a striped marlin of 52 kilos to take first place, while Jeff Pereira, Hakim Bhajjee and Walter de Souza took third place in the Freight Forwarders Competition fishing on "Sasumai".

Up at Mnarani Club, Kilifi, our boats also had a lot of success. The Delamere Competition was won by Karl Manhard on "Vuma" with a black marlin of 80.2 kgs. taken on 15 kg. line - a really superb effort. "Samvuke" fished by Gunter Seipp, Kenneth Adcock and James Adcock gained third position despite battling heavy seas on the first day of the tournament on the way from Mtwapa to Kilifi. Gunter caught a small black of 47 kgs. (which incidentally jumped into the boat and out again) and Kenneth Adcock a sailfish on the second day.

The Kilifi International Classic held on the 16th and 17th March drew a large entry. "Samvuke" (Reinhold Kahl, Heinrich Schmitt and James Adcock) managed to get in the frame again with a small striped marlin caught by Reinhold that was enough for second place overall. "Raha" also did well with the ladies team of Moo Harris and Anita Taylor. The best yellowfin of the competition (19.5 kgs.) was caught by Anita. While we don't go to competitions to win prizes, we feel that the Mnarani Fishing Club should be highly commended for organising two first class fishing competitions with fantastic prizes and a really delightful venue at Mason's boatyard. We will all certainly be back next season!

Our two local competitions were very successful but unfortunately the fish were most uncooperative. The Mtwapa Cup (sponsored again by Gunter Seipp) and held on the 20th and 21st January was won by "Jicho" fished by Norbert Nagengast. Over the two days he weighed in a sail and numerous bonito to edge out second placed "Adnan" (Nic de Souza, Dick Chater and Farouk) who landed a 32 kg. stripey and some dorado. Dick (besides catching the marlin) also landed the largest dorado (9.3 kgs.) to win the beautiful Dorado Trophy (presented by Richard Joanno). Third place went to Jorg Klebba and Manfred Fricke fishing on "Oona" with a good sized king and some bonito. This competition turned out to be a bit of a "bonito bonanza" so in future competitions we will be using a different points system.

In our other competition on the 3rd March the fish also spooked! Nils Lassen, fishing with Bernard and Brita Ruck on "Pomboo" managed to find a striped marlin and this was enough to give them victory but only by one point from second placed "Vuma" (Mike Custance, Mike Aitkens and King) who landed a sail, a yellowfin and several dorado. Third place went to Wudenigg and Fries on "Raha" with a large haul of dorado.

Our report ends on a sad note. One of our best friends and keenest fisherman, Fritz Zwickbauer, passed away in May. We'll all miss his friendly manner and especially the crew of "Oona" who must have had lots of laughs and pleasure in fishing with Fritz the beer!
