# TOPAZ Birth Stone Beauty

On the African continent, topaz is mainly found in S.W. Africa, Madagasar, Nigeria and Zimbabwe.

As he was going across the bridge, the bits of timber were calmly mowing down people whilst he was concentrating on getting across the bridge.


