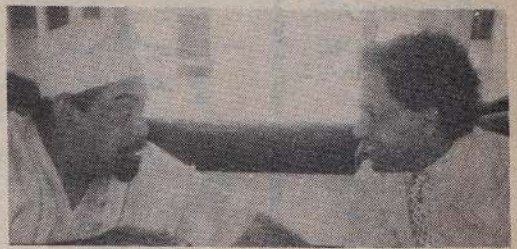

## KENYA AEROTECH OPEN MILLION SHILLING PROJECT

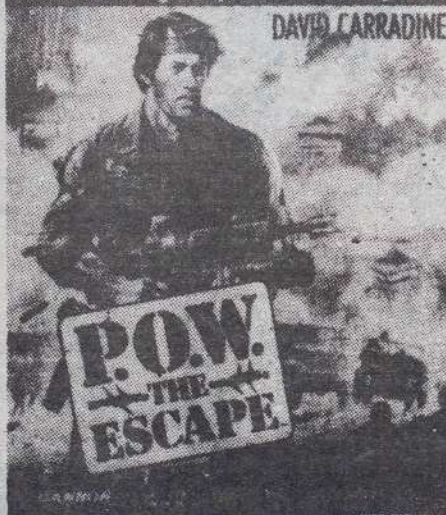

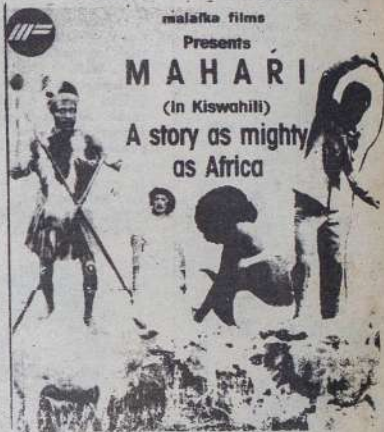

# New Extensions To Moi Airport

The guest of honour being the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Transport and Communication, Andrew Ligale, representing his Minister Mr J.J. Kamotho, who is out of the country on official business.

The Provincial Commissioner, East, Mr Simeon Mung'ala appeared in to congratulate Kenya Aerotech but could not stay because of a prior engagement.

The new extension was festively opened for the occasion, while a small and made from coloured paper were the words 'Kenya Aerotech Serving the World's Airlines'.

Its chairman, Samson M. Juhui, explained that the company had started in 1971 as an aircraft ground handling organisation.

It provides ramp handling services and has now been authorised, and is capable of, providing passenger handling and storage services at Kenya's two international airports.

There was also a special 'thank you' and a handshake for Thomas Buchert who was in the forefront of the planning of these facilities'. Said the chairman 'I have not met Thomas Buchert before. The temporary extension was his idea and he worked very hard to see it materialise'.

Added Mr Buchert 'I would like to thank all who helped make it become reality'.

By increasing the check-in facilities by 100 per cent will ease a lot of bottlenecks at Moi International Airport. All its users will benefit.

He thanked the chairman, board of directors and management of Kenya Aerotech for so quickly realising the need for such facilities and of seeing that a temporary extension was erected within the shortest possible time.

He congratulated Kenya Aerotech for doing a very good job since its inauguration in 1971.

Said Mr Rotich 'the Board of Directors of the new parastatal are going to co-operate with everyone who is involved in the running of the two international airports so that all can achieve the goal of customer satisfaction'.

# BIG WELCOME FOR AIRPORT EXTENSIONS

AEROTECH WAS also congratulated for its wise decision in helping improve facilities at Moi International Airport by providing a 'temporary extension' with extra check-in counters by the Minister for Transport and Communications, Mr J.J. Kamotho, who is also a Director of the new Kenya Airports Authority.

His speech was read on his behalf by Andrew Ligale, Permanent Secretary, who said 'I have been requested to represent the Minister who is unfortunately out of the country on official duties'.

In his Minister also noted the new Kenya Airports Authority had been inaugurated this week and we are now looking to it to provide a professional overall management of our airports.

He explained 'they will be the main co-ordinators of the airport activities on behalf of all users and we expect the Authority to provide the required facilities which will continue to meet international standards.'

In addition KAA (Kenya Airports Authority) will co-

ordinate and oversee the services of customs, immigration and police and other related essential personnel stationed at the various airports.

This is a new major role and challenge to the Authority.

He went on a long term project to rehabilitate Moi International Airport is already in the design

stage, it is being undertaken by the Kenya Government in conjunction with the Japanese government and will cost nearly KShs. 1.45 billion.

As far as Jomo Kenyatta International Airport is concerned the Minister said 'the government has so far spent KShs. 19 million in re-carpeting the runway. A further Shs 37 million has been approved for future maintenance and related work.'

As far as long term projects are concerned 'the Authority is planning to spend a further KShs. 1.55 billion to modernise all major airports in the country.'

Said the Minister 'Shs 1.35 million will be used mainly to acquire new equipment, power supply and refurbishing of the terminal buildings throughout the country.'

The Minister noted 'the eight new check-in counters which Kenya Aerotech has provided will also be available for use by other handling companies, like Kenya Airways etc.' Adding 'Kenya Aerotech will obviously have the first priority in recognition of their good job.'

He went on 'the check-in counters, although temporary, will greatly ease congestion to passengers and their baggage.'

Saying that Moi International Airport had been doing relatively well in the air transport field, the Minister gave some comparative figures over a five year period 1985-1990.

In 1990 the number of aircraft landing and taking off were 27,008 compared to 22,054 in 1985. International passengers arriving and departing were 565,622 (293,078); of whom 466,592 (226,394 in 1985) were tourists. Transit passengers were 73,326 (48,431 in 1985) and domestic passengers 391,754 compared to 278,575 five years ago.

Said the Minister 'we notice a steady increase over this period and our facilities must keep up with it.'

He went on 'our country as a tourist receiving country is conscious of the importance of facilitating easy movement of passengers through our air terminals.'

## CIVIL AVIATION

He noted that Annex 9 to the Convention on International Civil Aviation is wholly devoted to facilitation and every contracting state to the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) has an obligation under the Convention to prevent unnecessary delays to aircraft, crew, passengers and cargo.

This, declared the Minister, calls for co-operation between various government departments and other related agencies. Adding 'Kenya

complies with most of the international standards and recommended practices applicable to the travelling public worldwide.'

Said the Minister 'we are aware

of the need to modernise our facilities and to apply new methods of handling passengers and cargo.

'However, there are a few obstacles which we have to

overcome gradually as we move along. An example of these is the financial priorities in the development of our airport infrastructures and facilities.

'While the runways have to be maintained to acceptable standards, terminal buildings have to be expanded and facilities in those buildings have to be modernised at the same time.

'The available resources have to be shared equitably between all these requirements.

'As we try to improve our facilities and services at the airports, there is one element which all of us should not overlook. That of security.

'We all have a collective responsibility to prevent such evils as aircraft hijacking, bombing, drug trafficking and the like. While we endeavour to provide speedy services to our clients, they in turn will also expect an assurance of a safe flight to their destinations.'

## BUSINESS CALLERS

'Facilitation has a direct bearing on our economy. If we are friendly and efficient to our visitors, they will be inclined to visit us again. They will advertise our efficiency and hospitality abroad and thus many more tourists and business travellers will visit our country.'

'While we continue emphasising more on tourists, the Minister said 'we should also not forget the business traveller. One businessman can bring as much foreign exchange as so many tourists.'

After delivering the speech, Mr Ligale then cut the white satin ribbon across the front entrance to the 'temporary extension', and declared it officially open amid cheers.
