It hopes to raise Shs 500,000- for this purpose.

While at the Coast, the British Airways Manager for Kenya, Steve Sturton-Davies took the opportunity of personally handing to the Royal Naval Liaison Officer, Lt. Commander Mike Beckett, who is also chairman of the Missions to Seamen Executive Committee, two British Airways return tickets Nairobi to London which he hoped might help towards meeting their target.

Said a delighted RNLO 'we are most grateful to BA for this enormous boost to our fund-raising efforts'.

The presentation took place in BA's Mombasa Office and also present were the Missions to Seamen Chaplain, Richard Diamond, and BA's Manager, Coast, Mrs Vicky Leleipan.

With a quick turn round of ships these days many seamen spend their one day ashore-at the Missions where they can completely relax for a while, enjoy a swim and convivial company.

It is self-supporting and relies on donations and its own efforts to keep going. Its service to seamen also extends to helping with what is now a regular problem that of the non-payment of wages.

Thanks to the thoughtful and timely intervention by H.E. President Moi, the Mama Ngina Drive allocations were cancelled to preserve this open space for the public.

This football pitch, also valuable open space, should also have been preserved.

How much more open space and playing fields can we afford to lose, to satisfy the greed of developers?

AS EVERYBODY IS well aware, the water situation in Mombasa is steadily getting worse and worse.

I live in a second floor in Tudor 4 and for the past eight months not a drop of water has reached our tank which means that all our water has to be carried, everyday, up 48 steps.

We wash out of a bucket and our toilet stinks, because we cannot carry water in sufficient quantities to keep it clean.

Frequently the stand pipe downstairs from which we obtain our water is also dry.

This is the norm now for many people in our area.

I have been told by a consultant plumber that the only way to supply piped water to our flat is to install a tank-and-pump system.

The estimated cost is KShs. 10,000/-.

It seems that unless one is very lucky or very rich, a piped water supply in the home is soon going to be a thing of the past in Mombasa.

Previously Mombasa had a good water supply, and the water was safe for drinking. Government money needs to be put into restoring this facility now, before the situation degenerates even further.

INS TIR, INDIGENOUSLY designed and built by Mazagon Dock Limited. Bombay was commissioned into the Indian Navy on February 21, 1986.

Totally dedicated to Officer Cadets Training, she presently leads the First Training Squadron, and is based at Cochin under the Southern Naval Command.

Naval Cadets passing out of the National Defence Academy and the Naval Academy join the ship every January and early July for their atfloat training.

The ship is fully self-contained to provide the cadets with practical training in Seamanship, Navigation, Marine and Electrical Engineering, Communications, Weapons and above all give them their Sea-legs

The ship has facilities to accommodate 120 cadets at any time and is fitted with all modern navigational aids and advanced communication system

Equipped with the latest training aids, reprographic equipment and computers, and staffed by a team of dedicated professionals, the ship leaves no

stones unturned in initiating the young cadets into the hightech age and preparing them to meet the challenge of the 21st Century Navy.

INS Tir is 106 metres in length 4.8 metres draught, displaces about 3000 tonnes and has an endurance of 6000 nautical miles which give her the capability to operate and sustain herself in blue-waters for extended periods.

She also has the facilities to carry and operate an Alouette size helicopter from her flight deck. The ship has a complement of 22 Officers, 235 Sailors and 47 Officer Cadets are presently undergoing training on board.

The ship derives her name from an earlier ship of the same name Tir employed for cadets training, which is no longer in commission. The Old Tir was converted to the Cadets Training Ship of the Indian Navy in 1950.

The Tir has been alma-mater of many an illustrious admiral of the Indian Navy.

MASSEY-FERGUSON tractors continued to be market leaders over the past 12 months in Kenya, achieving 36 per cent market penetration.

Out of 830 units sold over the period, Farm Machinery Distributors (FMD), distributors in Kenya for Massey-Ferguson, sold 295 tractors.

This makes Massey-Ferguson the highest selling tractor model in Kenya for the sixth straight year.

Announcing the figures at the end of FMD's financial year, Ian Allen, General Manager of FMD said:

"We have been very successful in one-off sales to the individual farmer despite the very tough economic times and have also been competitive in the fleet business where pricing is very sensitive".

Highest sales were recorded in the medium range 50-80 horsepower category which includes a number of models in the popular 300 series, accounting for 46 per cent of total sales.

The higher 80-110 hp range tractors were the next most popular, contributing 29 per cent to overall sales, said Mr. Allen.

The new models we introduced this year, the 375H which is specifically designed for haulage; together with the 390E and 375E tractors, contributed significantly to our overall position", he added.

The E series are extremely simple and robust which makes them easy to operate and maintain, and they give the rugged reliability required for tough local conditions, said Mr Allen.

FMD recently launched its Rework programme, a tractor rehabilitation scheme that

transforms old, dilapidated tractors into as-good-as-new units, and which, it is forecast, will introduce a new generation of efficient tractors to Kenya's farmlands.

The recently announced figures put FMD ahead of their nearest competitor—Ford with 28 per cent of the market, over the same period, according to figures made available from the Kenya Motor Industry (KMI).

### THIRD POSITION

Occupying third position was Same with 15 per cent market share.

Massey-Ferguson maintained its market share when compared to the same period in 1990, despite a 22 per cent decline in the total number of tractors sold in the country over the period.

## 'Ignorance Is No Defence — Most Of These Times'

IN KENYA MOST pedestrians are well schooled in the fact that drivers will not stop at zebra crossings and similar places where the pedestrian is supposed to have the right of way.

Similarly the average driver in Kenya does not have the courtesy to stop and let wazee and watoto cross.

The only time they will stop is when cows and goats are threatening to cross the road.

This beats all logic since human beings are more valuable than most animals. Kachumbari's comment to this is that most drivers expect that a human being will think and avoid getting onto the road when a vehicle is approaching whereas animals cannot make such a conscious decision unless they have been trained ... like guide dogs for the blind for example.

Where drivers are more disciplined and are expected to be courteous, one gets disastrous results when either the driver or the pedestrian makes a mistake.

Kachumbari was telling me

about a recent excursion to a European country where he was amazed at the degree of discipline that all the drivers exercised.

They were all eyes at zebra crossings and when they saw anyone come to a crossing and look to one side, they would slow down in anticipation of the fellow crossing the road.

When they saw children playing next to the road, most

drivers would slow down until they had passed the potential hazard.

In a nutshell, they were extremely conscious of what was going on and were prepared for the worst should it happen.

However, not everything was perfect. An accident occurred that illustrated how easy it is to have a fatality even in such a

'perfect' driving atmosphere.

A driver of a large lorry was moving cheese from a port to the wholesalers premises in another town.

As he came off the motorway, he slowed down and started to drive a bit more cautiously than on the motorway.

He had a mate in the cabin and from what was going on he seemed to be taking instructions from the mate.

They went through the centre of the town and got the outskirts on the opposite side from the motorway exit.

They came to a traffic light controlled junction and indicated to turn left.

There was however no left turn allowed at that point but both the driver and his mate had not noticed the sign.

When the lights changed to green, the driver started to turn left but from the height of his cabin, he could not see the road immediately next to the cab.

A kid on a bicycle was intent on crossing the road that the truck driver intended to turn into at that point.

As the lights turned green for the rest of the traffic on the main road, they also turned green for the kid on the bike.

As the kid started crossing, unsighted lorry driver also started his turn and the kid ended up crushed under the front wheels of the lorry.

The driver did not realise what had happened until some pedestrians who saw what had happened started running after the car and shouting at him.

The cops came fairly quickly but the kid was dead by the time the ambulance arrived.

In another incident, a driver who was new to an area was approaching a set of traffic lights. He intended to turn right.

However, the traffic light that should have indicated that he could turn right was on the blink.

Another driver was following him behind and as they came to the lights, the driver who was new to the area decided that he would err on the side of caution and decided to stop.

The driver who was following behind saw the red braking lights come on and assumed that the driver in front was going to turn and was just slowing down.

He rammed into the car in front and was followed by a few others.

At the end of the incident, the police had to sort out seven vehicles out of which three had intended to turn right and the others were going straight ahead but got entangled with other vehicles that were trying to avoid the primary crash.

The driver who was new to the area got off with only a slightly dented bumper.

All the other cars had more substantial damage as a result of either being sandwiched or knocked at high speed by other vehicles.

It just goes to show that even with the best traffic behaviour there are always things that will crop up when one least expects them.

This is mainly when one finds themselves in an unusual situation or unfamiliar roads.

It cannot be over emphasised that every driver needs to exercise extreme caution whenever faced with new conditions.

As Kachumbari says, ignorance is no defence...most of the times.

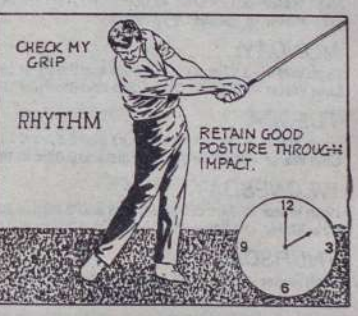
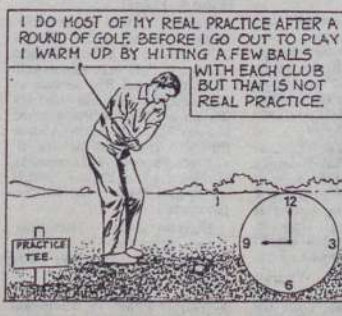
