

Born Free Filmstar Virginia McKenna Returns To Enjoy Nostalgic Safari Through Tsavo Park

ENJOYING THE MAGNIFICENCE of an African sunset atop the 600 feet high Yatta Plateau, with a fabulous view of Mount Kilimanjaro, was film star Virginia McKenna. Of her twenty-six films the most famous has been "Born Free" which, she revealed, 'changed our lives'. In it Virginia and her husband, Bill Travers, played the parts of George and Joy Adamson, film locations being around Naro Moru and on Kenya's north coast.

Virginia who has made countless visits to Kenya had been approached by Cara Spencer of Cara Spencer Safaris in the UK to see if she might be interested in escorting a *Born Free* safari group to Kenya.

Declared Virginia, in an interview on the Yatta Plateau, 'this is the second group for me to bring here. Said Virginia 'it is absolutely lovely here and has probably the most wonderful setting of any camp we have been in'.

Camp pets there include a ground hornbill called 'Billy' found by Simon Trevor who produces excellent wildlife documentary films, and four oryx, including a very young one born one hour after Bjorn Waldegaard won the Kenya Safari Rally it was named after him.

Charlotte Johnstone, Assistant Charlotte Johnstone, Assistant Manageress, also nursed a baby Dick Dick who was orphaned and is now a camp resident, plus Maggie a European stork injured on the Mombasa road, rescued and taken to the Camp by a fursity.

camp by a guest a sociation on a Virginia described Kenya 'as a wonderful holiday destination' a wonderful holiday destination. Adding everywhere we go has something different to offer—that is why it has been so exciting. My only fear is that, perhaps sometime in the future, the camps which are just the right size for the space they are in might develop so much that the personal touch might vanish when they become too big.

For some years it has been the hope of KSC to rehabilitate the derelict Sheldrick's Blind at Nthalakana commandi preaths by breathtaking views over the northern area of Tsavo East, into a living memorial to David Sheldrick.

Declared Virginia on hearing this 'I think it is a wonderful idea. It would be so special and David deserves something for he did so much for the conservation of wildlife in this

The 'Blind' which is one hour's The 'Blind' which is one hour's driving time away from Tsavo Safari Camp up the Yatta Plateau and half way down the other side was built by David when he was Warden of Tsavo East National Park from 1948-78. KSC had plans to make the Blind a comfortable place in which to accommodate a small arroun of eight people and assort group of eight people and escort for just one night.

Virginia who met the Sheldricks many years ago also described David's wife, Dapne, as 'a most remarkable woman'. She said 'I shall be staying on for an extra couple of nights with her before leaving Kenya'.

that she could join the group of orphans being looked after by them and eventually return to Tsavo National Park.

But' said Virginia 'we did not want to be party to another elephant being captured as it is so terrible for the herds to lose

So 'Pole Pole' the elephant, went to London Zoo. She was on her own for a quite a long time, her companions having died or had been sent to other

from us and the press she was eventually destroyed because of becoming so difficult'.

Declared Virginia 'we think she was different because she was alone'. Adding 'it is totally unnatural for a female elephant to live by herself.

It was after she had been destroyed that we started giving more thought to the keeping of animals in appropriate captive

Here Virginia hastened to add that 'even before the film 'The Lions are Free' was made we were thinking along these lions which resulted in the formation of the "Zoo Check' Charitable Trust in 1984.

"It was started by my husband, Bill Travers, son, William, and myself together with three other people, its main object being to look into conditions of animals

"As the years have gone by our work has extended, but not changed, and we are still looking into the conditions of animals in captivity'.

Said Virginia 'we try and raise money for what is needed'. On behalf of the 'Born Free' foundation Virginia produces two bulletins and two news letters a year.

She went on 'we are also supporting Dr Leakey in his efforts to ensure that ivory does not get back on to the market again.'

Here he mentioned the enormous pressure there is to do

Virginia revealed that already 1.3 million signatures had been collected in their, 'Ivory Out' campaign, with people pledging not to wear, or buy it.

She hopes that by March 'we shall have two million signatures' Daphne Sheldrick has also collected many signatures which Virginia said 'I will be taking back with me to the UK'.

They will later be among millions of signatures being presented by different groups from all over the world to the Convention for the International Trade on Endangered Species which takes place in Japan.

Another major project with which Virginia is deeply involved concerns dolphins and is called 'Into the Blue'.

Said Virginia 'we have rescued three from Dolphinariums in the UK and returned them to the sea We did this together with a British newspaper.' Adding we have people monitoring them until Christinas'.

Virginia has also been commissioned by Collins, the publishers, to write a book about Dolphins.

She has three sons and a

daughter. Virginia and Bill also make documentary films about wildlife—one being 'The Lions are Free'.

Referring to her most famous film 'Born Free' Virginia said 'it was tremendously hard work, but so rewarding'.

She mentioned that she had been slightly frightened of lions at first when confronted with some from a circus. These had been changed when it was realised they were quite dangerous

dangerous.

The 'Born Free' safari group visited Anna Merz' rhino sanctuary, afterwards spending three days in a tented camp set up exclusively for Born Free groups by Jock Anderson in the Maasai Mara.

They also went to Lake Naivasha and stayed at Elsamere, the former home of Joy Adamson which is now a museum and conservation centre, also at Larsen's Camp, Samburu, while at Lewa Dhows they stayed at a private rangh for both cattle and game.

There were also visits to the Karen Blixen Museum, Daphne Sheldrick's animal orphanage, a farmhouse lunch at Yvonne Mitchell's tea farm and a visit to Mo and Pat Frere's bird sanctuary in Langata.

Throughout there were talks on the flora, fauna and people, while at Isavo Safari Camp this took place around the camp fire at night.

Looking after their ground arrangements was United Touring Company and Virginia is hoping to escort another Born Free safari group here in

1993.



situation apepars to have deteriorated'.

He mentioned that the Regional Manager, National Water Conservation and Pipeline Corporation, Coast, Mr P.C. Munoru, would be addressing a meeting of Likoni Residents to explain the situation and what is being done to bring more water to their particular area.

A member mentioned that the Tudor area had a critical problem. He said 'l am beginning to feel that the Corporation is far too calm in dealing with it, and that more could be done'.

Another mentioned the difficulty of reaching the Corporation's coast office by telephone, also the fact that there had been several meetings—but with little or no result.

The feeling was that more might be done to alleviate the present situation.

Members asked 'are all sources of water being tapped? and pointed out that large quantities of water are being sold privately to hotels. Did other such sources exist?

other such sources exist?

It is understood that the main thrust of the Corporation at the coast at the moment is to have, initially, four boreholes on the banks of the Sabaki River to extract clean water from an underground river which is free of silt and does not need to be treated chemically.

If production is a synapsized.

If production is as expected, each should produce around 10,000 cubic metres a day. From four boreholes this will be 40,000 cubic metres a day—which will double production from the Sabaki pipeline.

Work has already started on two boreholes (each being one metre in diameter) and it is anticipated that the benefits from these might be felt in between three-six months time.

Coast Delegation Seeking Talks With Nairobi Water Officials

The contractor is working 'as fast as possible' but it is not only digging that is entitled, but the laying of a pipeline and taking electricity to the site.

It is understood that part of the money from the World Bank is earmarked for further development of boreholes on the banks of the Sabaki River.

the banks of the Sabaki River.

On the question of roads, MCTA noted that while it appreciated the work already carried out by the Mombasa Municipal Council and Ministry of Public Works, there are still roads needing attention, including the Causeway leading to Computer Hill and Airport which they hope will receive urgent and speedy action.

'Serena Hotel'

The unadopted tourist road leading to African Safari Club hotels, also Serena and Hotel Inter-Continental is in a terrible pot-holed state.

The Municipal Engineer, Mr J.N.W. Muraya reported that the District Commissioner's Office, Municipal Council, Ministry of Public Works and hoteliers in that area are looking into ways and means of having the road constructed to adoptive standards so that the Municipal Council can maintain it thereafter.

Said the Municipal Engineer

Said the Municipal Engineer 'we have had several meeting with hoteliers, together with the District Commissioner representing the Commissioner of Lands'.

MCTA asked that this matter be given urgent attention as thousands of tourists use it each day and are expelled by its

state. Tourists from Italy who had just arrived from the Maasai Mara described going over this road as 'like being on safari again!'

again!'
The lack of adequate street lighting was also noted.
On the question of the Tusk Arches in Moi Avenue, the MCTA renewed its plea for these to be repaired and repainted by the Mombasa Municipal Council.

The Chairmen and that daily

Municipal Council.

The Chairman said that daily hundreds of tourists from all over the world are taking pictures of these Tusk Arches, described as the 'Gateway to East Africa'. It was a shame they couldn't be kept in a good condition, cleaned regularly and posters removed.

He also asked the Municipal

and posters removed.

He also asked the Municipal Engineer if gardens and parks also street lighting, could be better maintained.

The Municipal Engineer said there had been a problem in the upkeep of gardens and parks due to the shortage of water and lorries.

Englateing that

Explaining that a number of street lights had been replaced, he revealed that recently all equipment in the Control Pillar for roads at Nyali Bridge had been stolen, which they were now trying to replace.

Members noted how dangerous it is when no traffic lights are working there.

MCTA is also requesting Council to make available the adjacent plot to its Information Bureau as the Glory Car Hire kiosk is closed.

Extra space is needed to expand and it is the wish of the Kenya Association of Hotel-

there.

MCTA has been asking for this plot for some considerable time, but it was Glory Car Hire which was granted a Temporary Occupation Licence.

Abdulrahman Tamimi, an architectural student at Nairobi University, displayed plans he had drawn up for the extension to the Bureau on its present site. They include a meeting room, offices for chairman and executive officer, also a store. He pointed out the Swahili

He pointed out the Swahili architectural characteristics that had been incorporated include a beautiful carved front door, Lamu-style niches for display purposes and some elaborate plasterwork.

The cost, including labour and materials, was estimated to be around Shs one million.

While agreeing that an extension is necessary some members felt that it could be done more cheaply.

done more cheaply.

Mr Tamimi was thanked by
the Chairman for his excellent
plans which would receive
further consideration.

'Kenya Airways'

Miss E.W. Kanyago, Kenya Airways Ag. Manager, Coast, spoke of KA's very ambitious schedule which includes Mauritius, Pakistan and soon Johannesburg.

The importance of advising passengers about delays was mentioned at the meeting. She said 'there had been a problem when the runway at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport, Nairobi, had been blocked due

to repairs.

'It was difficult to tell passengers exactly when a delayed flight might be leaving. However, she said 'we have trained our personnel to disseminate information and have recently received letters

from passengers telling us how delighted they were with the courtesy and attention they had received in such situations.

It is reported that the Provincial Tourism Liaison Committee had agreed to set up a Development Planning Sub-Committee.

Committee.

Its chairman, the Provincial Tourism Officer, Mr S Okungu, will be calling a meeting to discuss how best to handle certain situations, including essential services, before projects are developed. Reports of these meetings will be submitted to the Office of the President.

On the question of Reach

On the question of Beach Boys it was reported that government is taking this matter very seriously with a view to ensuring that no further harassment of tourists occur on the beach.

the beach.

It was pointed out that while some had been removed and taken to court, the fine was far too low and the beach boys were soon back again. MCTA is of the opinion that much stiffer fine should be imposed.

It has also been recommended that African traditional markets be set up on the north and south coast, and it is understood that land has already been allocated for this purpose.

allocated for this purpose.

A member suggested that these could become very attractive African traditional market places with stands built to different traditional architectural styles of Coast tribes, and an area within set aside for ngomas.

Beach Boys could do more business as the market for their wares would be much larger with tourists coming from many

Tour operators and hotels could arrange visits and provide transport. Ngomas should be of a high standard which would also be a big attraction, as well as for photographers.

Thereafter, beach boys would no longer be allowed to trade on the beach.

Said a hotelier, guests continue complaining of harassment on the beach. There is also a lot of illegal money changing going on, as well as trade in drugs and prostitution.

It was suggested at the meeting that this matter would best be dealt with at district level and a committee formed to deal with it.

The urgency of the matter is that the 'high' tourist season is now here. Many more complaints are expected which would ruin the good name of kenya's fourist industry. If work could start soon, these African Traditional Markets should not take long to set up.
