Action Urged On Water Shortages

DELEGATION WILL VISIT MINISTRY NAIROBI OFFICIALS

WHILE EVERYONE IS DELIGHTED with the news that the World Bank will be financing the second Mzima Pipeline, which should double the quantity of water to Mombasa, they realise that this is not an immediate answer to the present shortage which could adversely affect Kenya's present booming tourist industry.

Tourism is also Kenya's largest earner of foreign exchange, with more than half the total number of holiday-makers coming to the coast.

At its most recent Committee Meeting at the Oceanic Hotel the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association felt that there is a lack of urgency in finding ways and means of improving the present situation.

They agreed that a delegation should go to Nairobi during November to discuss this with

senior officers in the Ministry of Water Development, also National Water Conservation and Pipeline Corporation, to find out what more can be done before Christmas.

Emphasis will also be laid on having spare pumps and parts available in case of breakdowns, and of the equipment

being properly maintained.

Said the Chairman, Zul Harunani, 'everyone was expecting the situation to have improved by early November following three pumps being out of order at Baricho and two boreholes having problems on the south coast.'

Floating Campus Docks In Kilindini

THE ARRIVAL ON November 7 of the 18,000 tons s.s. Universe - a floating campus with 665 passengers, mostly students, on board meant a very busy time for United Touring Company Coast, with many going on safaris, excursions and City Tours with them.

The ship, the only one of its kind in the world, with classrooms, a 10,000 volume library, closed circuit TV system, theatre and sports facilities, including a swimming pool, was at Mombasa until November 12 leaving at 2200 hours for Cape Town.

It is the fourth time for UTC to be invited to handle the ground arrangements based on the very professional services offered previously.

On the first day many went on City Tours while some, by special request, visited the Freretown Primary School. Three Safari Cruisers took others on a cultural tour of Gedi and Malindi, and there were visits by others to the Bamburi Nature Trail.

On Saturday morning, students and faculty members started disembarking at five in the morning, some on a four day safari to Tanzania, others on a one day safari to Tsavo National Parks, while some left for a four day ten-day lodge safari to Tsavo East and West National Parks, as well as to Amboseli.

Another group left for Amboseli and Tsavo and at nine in the morning many departed on a four day safari to the Measai Mara - flying to Nairobi and returning to Mombasa by train.

The phased disembarkation went off like clockwork and there was a big 'thank you' to UTC's management team and staff for such a professional service.

WOMENS' COUNCIL KWALE SEMINAR

The NATIONAL COUNCIL of Women of Kenya (NCWK) have held the first of a series of two day workshops under the theme "The Traditional Practices which affect Women and Children" over the weekend in Kwale.

The NCWK were joined by local leaders, representatives from Non-Governmental Organisations and other experts in discussing a wide range of topics related to women and child welfare in the country, with specific reference to a particular area.

Topics under discussion ranged from: female circumcision, nutrition-marital taboos, childhood marriages and early pregnancies, youth programmes and counselling, laws affecting women and children, child abuse, traditional values in a changing Kenya society, drug abuse, maternal and child health and family planning, income-generating projects and adult literacy.

Similar seminars are planned in the following months, right through to April in Meru, Kisii, Uasin Gishu, Tana River, Kilifi and Mandera.

The NCWK held workshops and seminars throughout the country under the same theme last year and a session of this year's programme will be devoted to evaluation and follow-up reports.

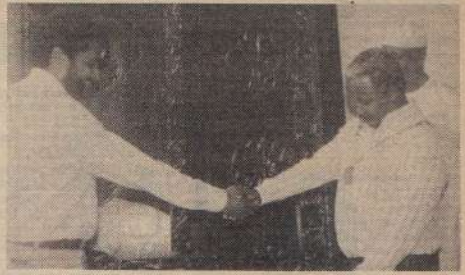

Mombasa Mayor Assures On Fairness In Allocation Of Housing And Market Stalls

IN THE VERY RECENT PAST, I have been receiving complaints from the public regarding allocation of Council Houses and Market Stalls.

These complaints received from a cross section of the general public can not be left unanswered as most of them are quite genuine as they have proved some irregularities by the Council.

I want to assure the public that my Council will not tolerate such irregularities and drastic measures will be taken against any officer concerned.

The Council has its laid down procedure in as far as allocation of its houses and market stalls is concerned. And any Officer found to be flouting these procedures for his or her own benefit shall have to be disciplined.

The allocation of houses that fall vacant has not been pleasant because I have been handling cases whereby a house has been allocated to more than one tenant.

There have also been dubious allocations of houses which have resulted in tenants to fight and refer the matter to court.

I hereby direct the Town Clerk to strictly conform with the Circular from the Ministry of Local Government on the

allocation of Council houses and Market stalls so as to eject public confidence on the housing allocation by the Council and to bring fairness to such allocation.

It is the wish of the Council to house every resident, but since we can not afford to do that, we try our best to allocate to people the few houses we have.

And this allocation of the very few houses should be done fairly.

Allegations have hit the town that it is easier to find a piece of gold than to look for a Council house in Mombasa.

And to my opinion, I think this could be so for those who do not want to apply the honest way of looking for those houses.

And I would like to appeal to the Council officers to be honest because the reports I have been getting about them are very negative.

The allocation of Stalls and Stores in the Council Markets has not been perfect as there have been a lot of irregularities.

This has forced the Council to

make some changes in various sections of the markets and more changes are on the way.

All in all forgery has been noticed in some places at the same time some market officials have colluded with businessmen to under-invoice them at the expense of the Council.

Illegal structures have been constructed in the markets with a view to creating more stalls which are not in the Council records.

I appeal to the Chief Internal Auditor to investigate all these allegations immediately and report to the Council.

Already the Service Charge Department has had some transfers of some officers. Transfers and reshuffles for the betterment of the Council will continue to be carried out without fear.

In the Service Charge Section the irregularities discovered involved officers issuing 1990 stamps instead of the 1991 stamps of the current year.

I am calling upon all the Heads of Department and Sectional Heads not to favour anybody who will be found not to be honest or dedicated, necessary action should be taken.

Any employee who fails to discharge his or her duty simply because of "Godfather" in the Council shall not be tolerated, the Council shall take necessary action against anybody who deliberately does things the way they so wish simply because they shall be defended.

Any employee who will be seen to be defeating the cause of the Council of disciplining

the few dishonest will have to be dealt with severely.

Anyone who wishes his or her grievances be known should channel them through the section head or head of department who will pass them to the Council, and the habit of writing to the councillors directly should stop forthwith.

My appeal not to the Council employees is to be devoted and to be honest. We are a service oriented organisation and we must perform our duties to the expectation of the public.

We are here to serve the public but not to serve ourselves.

From now Councillors, Chief Officers and I shall redouble our efforts to check and see to it that there is a lot of honesty in the Council, and the public are called upon to report any irregularities to the Town Clerk directly so that immediate action be taken.

I would also like to praise the Cleansing Section for the good work they are doing of making the town clean.

Estates in Mombasa are now very clean as containers are removed without much delay.

The general public also have answered our call of assisting us in making the town clean and this is commendable.

Now as everyone can see the roads in town have been repaired and recarpeted and the exercise is continuing and will cover all roads in Mombasa.

The Service Charge has enabled the Council to undertake this project and from 1989 to 1992 a sum of KShs. 50 million has been earmarked for

this project.

The repairing and recarpeting of the roads is being done in phases and very soon those areas which have not been reached will be reached and the roads will be repaired.

The patching of the roads is continuing in some areas and the aim is to boost the image of the town.

In an effort to put the image of the town very high, the Council has been urging businessmen to paint their houses, and I praise

the Acting Medical Officer of Health Doctor B. Lugogo for serving notices to the businessmen and landlords to this effect.

The Municipal Engineer in an effort also to see to it that Mombasa residents get water adequately has instructions to mobilize the Fire Brigade to send water in the estates to assist the people during times of critical water shortages.

The Chief Fire Officer with his crew are under obligation to see that water is sent in their fire tanks to the people in the estates when shortage of water arises.

Lastly the Council re-affirms its total loyalty to His Excellency the President, the Government and the ruling party KANU.

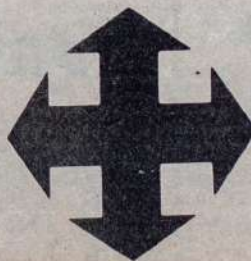

Learning The Trade With A Professional Comedian

DEFENSIVE DRIVING IS talked about in a lot of countries. In some of them there are associations that have been formed to promote defensive driving.

Initially they were started by a group of people who were concerned about the deteriorating standards of driving leading to increases in accident rates.

In Kenya, the association concerned is the Institute of Advanced Motorists, Kenya.

Their style is modelled on and verified by the U.K. Institute hence the standards the examiners require are reasonably stiff.

There is however no formal education system that has been set up for defensive driving. One still has to get information and books and then try the ideas out.

Once you feel you are ready to try the test, you approach the institution and you are taken for an observer run and told whether it is worth your while going for a full test.

Few of the institutes that have been in touch with have formal training sessions.

Except, Kachumbari has been to one that trains with a difference and he tells me that there are others that also train even more differently.

Kachumbari was in the U.S. recently visiting his brother. His brother has two sedans and he was willing to lend Kachumbari one of the sedans on condition he proved that he was a competent driver.

Kachumbari asked what he needed to do to be proved to be a competent driver and his brother told him that he had to go for defensive driving training and pass his exams.

Kachumbari jumped at the thought since he had been trying to get some training for quite some time and could not find an institution that run specific training in Kenya or most of the other countries he had visited. He duly registered and was told to report in a fortnights time.

On the due date he arrived at the school and was told to take off his tie and jacket and roll up his sleeves. He did not complain and did as he was told.

He was asked who his favourite comedian was and he said it was Ojwang. The fellow registering him did not click but asked him to write it down anyhow.

He was then ushered into the class with 20 other students of all shapes, sizes, hue and demeanours.

They sat staring at each other whilst they waited for the resource person to turn up.

The nearly jumped out of their skins when a small smoking tube (t)rown to the front of the class exploded into a cloud of

thick, black smoke from which a fellow dressed up like a clown appeared.

For a few seconds there was silence then one of the very obviously American chaps started to complain bitterly about the fact that it was unfair not to be warned in advance

about such loud noises in case certain people may have had heart or other problems that the loud noise could have aggravated.

The fellow dressed like a clown then took off the costume in front of the class and emerged dressed casually like the rest of the class.

He introduced himself as their tutor and told them that the whole learning exercise was going to be informal.

He then proceeded to introduce himself in detail and by the time he finished, the whole class was nearly in tears.

The fellow turned out to be a professional comedian who decided that he would open up a school teaching defensive driving.
