Sugar Remains In Short Supply

Supermarkets chain Nakumatt Holdings, has implored the government to urgently step in and seek a permanent solution to what is increasingly becoming an annual cyclic sugar shortage around this time.

The shortage has been occasioned by the recent closure of leading factories for their annual maintenance and low supplies from other millers.

On its part, Nakumatt Holdings had earlier on embarked on a move to protect consumers

against the effects of the prevailing sugar shortage by officially limiting purchases to two packets per customer across its branch network in Kenya.

The shortage has particularly affected the factory packed 2kg and 1kg store keeping units (SKU's) which are the preferred units in supermarkets.

Speaking when he confirmed the rationing move, Nakumatt Holdings, Managing Director, Atul Shah, explained that the move will enable the firm to spread its current supplies while helping maintain retail prices at a reasonable level.

The government and sector regulator Kenya Sugar Board (KSB), Shah reiterated, should also consider seeking a permanent remedy to the shortage which has now become an annual problem.

"It's only fair that we limit current stocks before the situation gets out of hand particularly as we continue to receive below normal

The competition is organised by Muslim Mercy Youth and usually take place during the fasting month of Ramadhan.

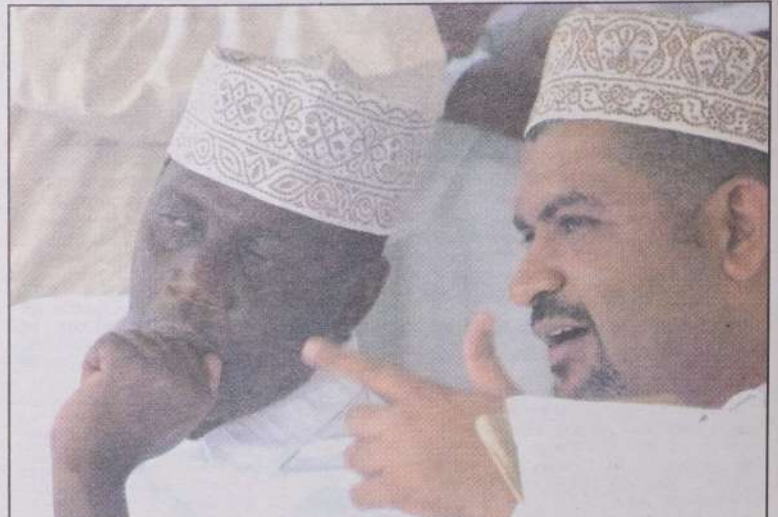

Thirty Two Years Ago

Coastweek, August 24 - 30, 1979

Operation Census: Kenyans were gearing up Friday night for the 1979 population census which was estimated to cost KSh 45 million. In Mombasa, projected to have about 413,000 residents, all bars, restaurants and nightspots were to close at 5.00 p.m. to facilitate the exercise and allow people to be counted at home.

According to the 1979 Kenya Population Census Guide, the 1969 census showed that Kenya's population was just under eleven million and growing at a rate of 3.3 per cent each year, the highest rate in the world. This meant that if the population continued to grow at that rate, Kenya's population would double in another 21 years.

Muslims were celebrating Idd ul Fitr marking the end of the holy month of Ramadhan with a special Idd message from Kenya's Chief Kadhi, Sheikh Abdullah Saleh Farsi.

NAAZ cinema was ending its run of 'Scandal in the Family' and moving on to 'Heroes' starring Henry Winkler and Sally Field.

REGAL cinema was showing 'Edge of Fury' a Kung-Fu flick starring Yasuki Kurata and Bruce Lee look-alike Ho Chung Tao.

At the CHOX it was Randhir Kapoor and Jaya Badhuri in 'Jawani Diwani,' (Crazy Youth).

Letter writers included Abdala wa Khalidi of Takaunga who urged readers "In the name of women's rights" and "In the name of unadulterated Christianity" to "not abolish the right to polygamy" following "recent debate and rejection of the Marriage Bill by Parliament which focussed attention on the African and Islamic institution of polygamy."

Others were Mboghohi wa Maghanga, G. L. Antoni, Mishi Mwachatam of Kwale and Nabila Ali and Shelina Vellani of Mombasa.

TOP TEN on the music charts compiled by 'Disco Bug' saw 'Bad Girls' by Donna Summer rising from sixth place to the number one slot, pushing 'Good Times' by Chic down to number two. Three new entries, 'Bright Eyes' by Art Garfunkel, 'Bridge Over Troubled Waters' by Linda Clifford and 'Ring My Bell' by Anita Ward filled in slots seven, eight and nine respectively, while 'Boogie Wonderland' by Earth, Wind and Fire looked set to leave the Top Ten, sliding to number ten from number three the previous week.

Vatican Message to Muslims for Ramadan

"Working Together for Mankind's Spiritual Dimension"

Here is a text published today by the Vatican of a message sent to Muslims by the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue. The message was sent on the occasion of the end of Ramadan, Aug. 29.

Dear Muslim friends,
• The end of the month of Ramadan offers the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue a welcome occasion for sending you our most cordial wishes, hoping that the efforts you have so generously made during this month will bring all the desired spiritual fruits.

• This year, we have thought to give priority to the theme of the spiritual dimension of the human person.

This concerns a reality which Christians and Muslims consider to be of prime importance, faced as we are with the challenges of materialism and secularization.

The relationship that every human person has with the transcendent is not a moment in history, but is part of human nature.

We do not believe in fate; we are convinced - moreover it is our experience - that God guides us on our path!

• Christians and Muslims, beyond their differences, recognize the dignity of the human person endowed with both rights and duties.

They think that intelligence and freedom are indeed gifts which must impel believers to recognize these values which are shared because they rest on the same human nature.

• This is why the transmission of such human and moral values to the younger generations constitutes a common concern.

It is our duty to help them discover that there is both good and evil, that conscience is a sanctuary to be respected, and that cultivating the spiritual dimension makes us more responsible, more supportive, more available for the common good.

• Christians and Muslims are too often witnesses to the violation of the sacred, of the mistrust of which those who call themselves believers are the target.

We cannot but denounce all forms of fanaticism and intimidation, the prejudices and the polemics, as well as the discrimination of which, at times, believers are the object both in the social and political life as well as in the mass media.

• We are spiritually very close to you, dear Friends, asking God to give you renewed spiritual energy and we send you our very best wishes for peace and happiness.

Tsavo East is world renowned for its mane-less lions, whose looks can easily confuse the untrained eye into believing a macho hairless male is actually a lioness.

Fully maned species are normally sighted in our cooler northern areas such as Nairobi National Park and the Massai Mara.

So, coming across this handsome fully maned lion at Ngutuni Hill in Tsavo East was a spectacular and very rare sight.

With less than 2000 lions left in Kenya and their numbers diminishing fast, the extinction of the lion in Kenya is predicted by 2020.

We must, at all costs, aim to preserve this magnificent animal.

Vision 2030 is all about economic growth and social development as a nation, but what about the protection of its wildlife and their habitat?

Loosing the lion would not only mean a complete failure of this country's conservation efforts and reputation, but it would mean a complete loss of Kenya's identity.

Pals Plan On Pedalling 6,200 Miles To Kenya

THREE pedalling pals are planning to cycle more than 6,200 miles from the UK to Kenya.

Daniel Cooper, Nderim Bajrami and Daniel Welch, all 21, are attempting the epic ride to raise cash for Glad's House, a charity which helps break the cycle of poverty for children living on the streets of Mombasa.

Taking the most direct route would be challenging enough at about 4,200 miles. But instead, the trio decided to add the odd couple of thousand miles to make things more interesting.

The five-month ride will take them through at least 15 countries on three continents.

The friends will set out on Sunday, September 11 carrying everything they need with them and aiming to cover 60 miles a day and sleeping under canvas.

Mr Cooper, of Parkanaur Avenue, Southend, said: "I'm looking forward to all the ups and downs. I'm sure there will be days where we'll be knackered and don't want to talk to each other, but I'm sure we will have amazing experiences and will meet some amazing people, too. "We'll learn a lot more about ourselves as well."

Mr Bajrami, of Mendip Crescent, Westcliff, added: "We're extremely excited about it. I can't wait to go. It'll be a real challenge, but that's why we are doing it."

The pair have known each other since they met as sixth-formers at St Thomas More school, Westcliff.

Both went on to study at the University of East Anglia, where they met Mr Welch, who is from Gloucester.

The group came up with the idea of the trip while at university and decided to put it into action after they graduated.

Mr Cooper said: "We were always talking about going off travelling together to places such as South Asia or South America, but then we decided it would be better to have a goal, something to aim for."

"After I spent time working with Glad's House last year, we decided we could cycle from the UK to where the charity was based, and do it to raise money for it."

Mr Cooper first heard about

Glad's House through his sister, Jenny, 24, who spent a year working there.

He says the outreach work it does – often through organising football and other sports – offers a vital lifeline to children who would otherwise spend their whole lives on the street.

He said: "The guys who run it are incredibly caring and loving, and it's great because it's a small organisation, so it's an immediate way of helping people. Using sport as a tool to help get kids out of poverty really appeals because I love sport."

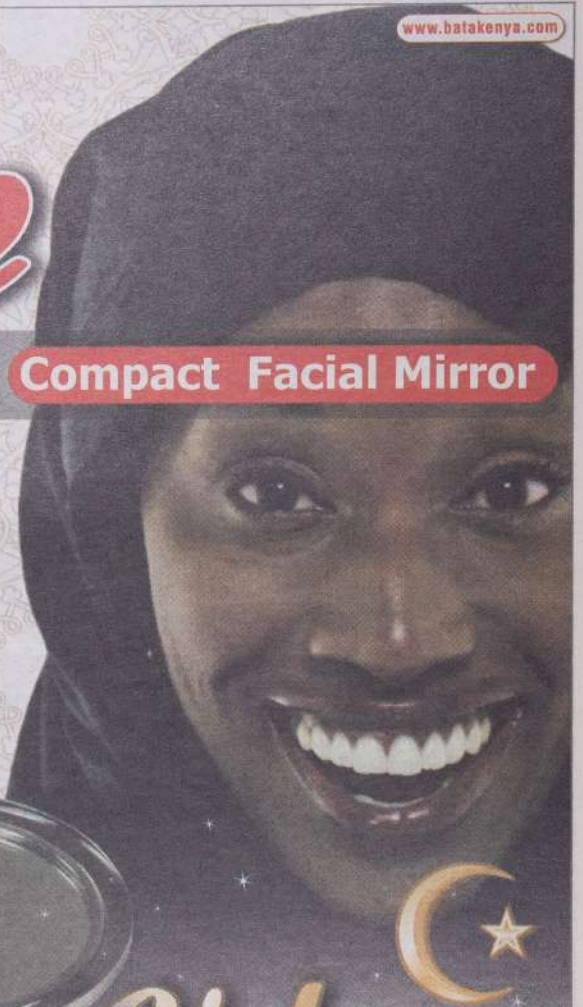



Coast Pekee Up Against Nairobi Buffaloes

The East Africa Premier League and East African Cup commenced on 20th August and features six newly constituted teams from Kenya and Uganda playing in a round robin league format, writes Reserve Umpire **VIPUL PATEL**.

The top two teams in each competition will compete in live televised finals at the end of October. The competitions are designed to improve the standard of domestic cricket in the region,

develop more players capable of playing at international level and stimulate interest in the game throughout East Africa.

Four teams from Kenya will participate, the Nairobi Buffaloes, Kongonis both based in the capital, The Rift Valley Rhinos from Nakuru and Coast Pekee in Mombasa, while Rwenzori Warriors and Nile Knights will represent Uganda.

Teams will be comprised of international players, senior club players and age group cricketers aiming to make the national

squads of both countries. In Mombasa, EAPL (T20) and EAC (50 over) took off last weekend with local team Coast Pekee playing against Nairobi Buffaloes.

The Saturday match was a 20 over game with Coast Pekee winning the toss and scoring 99 runs. Only Sagar Karia coming in at 4th position managed to score 39 runs with 7 boundaries.

Otieno, an influential defender in his days in Kenyan league and South Africa, has also been working as an assistant coach at Cape Town based Sanlam Santos.

Harambee Stars team manager Edward Oduor confirmed the appointment of Otieno and said it was due to the former captain's long-term experience.

"Otieno has played for this team for a long time and he has something to offer at the coaching level.

"His presence will be a great motivator especially for the young players who just saw him playing.

"We believe he has a lot to give back to the team and this informed our decision to invite him to take up the new post," said Oduor on Tuesday in Nairobi.

Otieno could not travel early enough because his club required that he be present when they play their league matches on Tuesday.

The 38-year-old defender said he had enough on the pitch and it is time for him to give outside of it.

"It is great to be back home for good. There is so much to do to develop the sport but I cannot say what I will do now.

"I'm looking around and getting a feel of what is going on before deciding my next move," Otieno said in a telephone interview from Cape Town.

The last time Otieno played for Kenya was in 2009 when Harambee Stars lost 3-2 to Nigeria in their last match of the 2010 Africa Cup of Nations and World Cup qualifiers. He has played for Kenya since 1993.

He joined Santos in 1997 after brief stints with Tusker and AFC Leopards in the Kenyan league.

Otieno has made over 300 appearances and scored over 30 goals for Santos helping them win the PSL Championship in the season 2001/02.

He was named the South African Premier League Player of the Year in 2007.

In 2008 he briefly joined Cleveland City Stars in the United States of America (USA) making his debut as a 64th minute going on to score a goal and helped the club win the U.S. League two title. Harambee Stars will only play one friendly with a small side on August 30 before their African Cup of Nations qualifier against Guinea Bissau.

Kenya Sends A Strong Athletic Team To Daegu Athletics World

NAIROBI, (Xinhua) — Four years ago, International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) council congregated in Mombasa and awarded Daegu the honour to stage the 13th edition of the World Athletics Championships.

The athletics fraternity had come to Kenya for the world cross country championship in Mombasa, which the host country won.

But alongside the action on the ground, another battle was fought in the board room and what was initially a dream idea has finally evolved into a competition and from Saturday, the world will be focused on the coastal city of Daegu, South Korea for the nine-day biannual competition.

The provisional entry list for the championships, which was published on Monday, confirms that 202 national teams and some 1945 athletes have been entered to take part in Daegu.

In Berlin a total of 1,895 athletes from 200 countries took part in the competition with 19 countries managing to clinch at least a single gold medal with 17 winning something silver or bronze.

Well Kenya will be having 49 of its best athletes lining up in Daegu. Four of them, Ezekiel Kemboi (5,000m steeplechase), Vivian Cheruiyot (5,000m), Janet Masai (10,000m) and Abel Kirui (marathon), will be keen to defend their crowns.

The team left Nairobi on Monday afternoon in confident mood with head coach Peter Mathu claiming at beating the record he set in Berlin two years ago.

In 2009, Kenya wound up third with four gold medals, five silvers and two bronzes. That was only surpassed by two giants overall winners, the United States who clinched ten golds and Jamaica with holder Usain Bolt.

But championship are about pride and building national pride and it comes as no surprise that even when Kenya team was departing there was only one word on their lips, Ethiopia.

For a long time, these two East African states

have battled over the dominion in the middle and long distance races. Kenyans and Ethiopian athletes evenly contest events starting from 1,500m to the marathon, though Qatar, Bahrain, France, Morocco and the United States have of late tried to break through and stake claim to several medals.

But crucially, most of the other athletes making attempts at these events are exports from this two states.

Talk of Maryam Jamal of Bahrain a former Ethiopian, Bernard Lagat and Yusuf Said Kamal both former Kenyans hold titles at the world stage, having run away from explosive championships to make their native country teams.

But when the championship start on Saturday, friends will battle against friends, teammates will take on each other and sibling rivalry will come to the fore. But all this will just be helping to add more spice to the stew that is the premier track and field championships.

From the Kenya team, however, there will be a few exceptions that will have the championship to lose. Taking 5,000m world champion Vivian Cheruiyot, to come up and look in the eyes of her opponents and declare she is fit to double up in her speciality and the 10,000m race, is no mean feat.

But she deserves it. Two years after demolishing Ethiopian dominance over 5,000m at the three previous championships, Cheruiyot is brimming with confidence about defending her title in this year's race.

Using her tremendously strong finishing kick to outpace fellow Kenyan Sylvia Kibet but much more importantly defending champion Meseret Defar in Berlin's historic Olympic Stadium in 2009, has helped Cheruiyot to grow in stature and confidence.

The 27-year-old after that memorable victory, which finally indicated Kenya, was finally getting to grips with their northern neighbours exceptional strike force led by world record holder Tirunesh Dibaba and Defar, has added last year's IAAF Continental Cup, Commonwealth Games and the overall Diamond League titles to her illustrious collections of memorable silverware.
