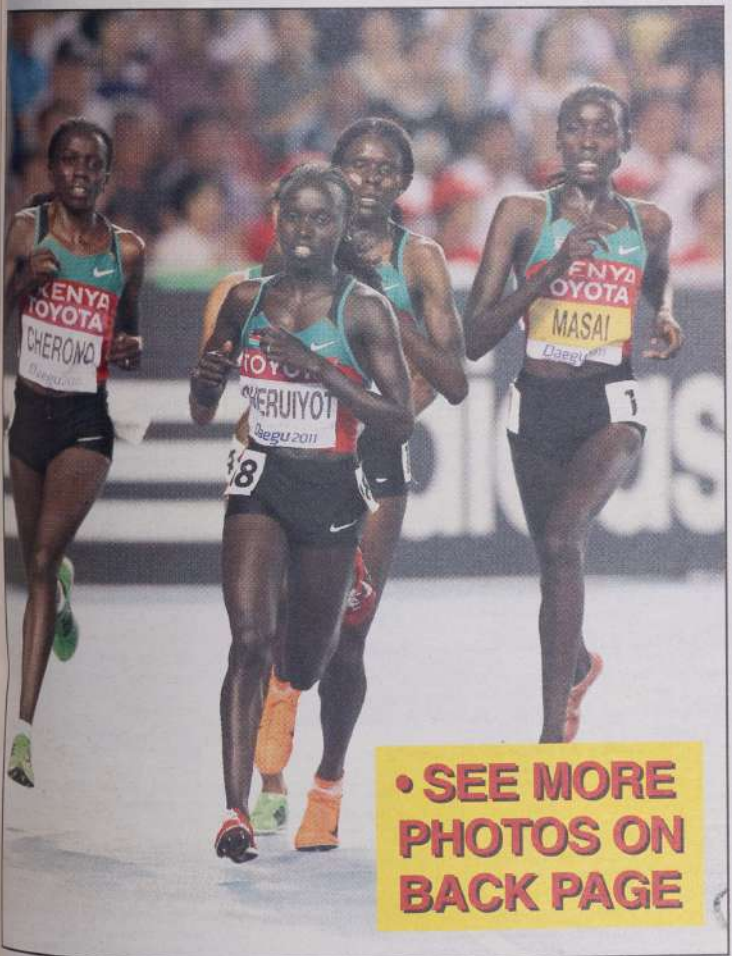

DAEGU, South Korea (Xinhua) -- Kenya's new track super star Vivian Jepkemoi Cheruiyot claimed the women's 10,000-meter world title here with a personal best of 30:48.98.

Kenyan runners swept the podium with Sally Kipyego finishing second and defending champion Linet Chepkwemoi Masai in third, with the other Kenyan Priscah Jepleting Cheronno finishing fourth.

Earlier Edna Ngeringwony Kiplagat of Kenya took the first gold medal of the World Championships in the women's marathon. Her Kenyan teammate Priscah Jeptoo took the silver. Sharon Jemutai Cherop, also from Kenya, took the bronze.

Safe Motherhood Programme Is Launched In 'Kilifi District' !

The Minister for Public Health and Sanitation Hon. Beth Mugo visited the Kilifi District Hospital to launch the Maternity Output Based Approach (OBA) programme.

The ministries of health in Kenya recently rolled out the Programme to promote safe motherhood by providing poor rural pregnant women with Delivery Vouchers to cater for the cost of hospital based deliveries.

The delivery voucher dubbed "Kadi ya uzaaji" is worth one hundred Kenya Shillings and allows expectant women to receive ante and post natal services at selected health facilities within Kilifi District.

The minister also launched the "Kadi ya jamii" and the "Kadi ya Usalama" to be used for family planning services and treatment for sexual violence victims respectively.

The programme will be implemented in Kilifi, Kaloleni and Ganze districts

In her speech, Hon Beth Mugo, emphasized on the importance of safe motherhood and delivery at health facilities.

Hon. Francis Baya as well as The Director of Public Health Dr. S.K.Sharif and the Coast Provincial Director of Public Health and Sanitation Dr. Anisa Omar among other ministry officials.

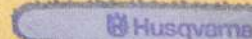

Aga Khan Academy, Mombasa - National Choral Champions!

The Aga Khan Academy, Mombasa won 14 top three placings including five firsts at the 2011 National Kenya Music Festival held in Nakuru.

In one category the Academy was placed first, second, fourth, fifth and sixth.

The school was recognized on Kenyan national TV as the top individual school in a competition which featured approximately 60,000 participants from different parts of the nation.

The festival receives entries from nursery schools, primary and secondary schools, colleges and universities.

Students use different avenues

Thirty Two Years Ago

Coastweek, September 01 - 06, 1979:

Well-Known angler Alfredo Santagati was running water sports and sea safaris from the 406-bed Nyali Beach Hotel.

British Council organised a crash course on language development for 300 primary school teachers at Mombasa Primary School

NAAZ Cinema was commencing its screening of "Pretty Baby," starring 12-year old Brooke Shields in a controversial role which depicted an image of an adult world seen through the eyes of a child. KENYA Cinema was showing "Thank God It's Friday," with the playful catchline, "After 5,000 years of civilization-we all need a break." REGAL Cinema, meanwhile, bowed to popular demand and brought back the epic "The Ten Commandments." CHOX was showing Sanjeev Kumar in "Apne Rang Hazaar," ("I have a thousand colours").

Fond Memories Of Dr. Zahoor Kashmiri

It has been three years since Dr. Zahoor Kashmiri was tragically taken away from us on September 1st 2008.

He was a Mombasa based veterinarian and one of Kenya's unsung environmental heroes, born in Eastleigh, Nairobi in 1951.

He graduated from the University of Nairobi in Veterinary Medicine in 1975.

He seemed so inviolable being full of life either deeply asleep or highly awake, running around always busy.

Dr. Kashmiri gave up 20 years of private veterinary practice, during which his patients were almost exclusively domestic dogs and cats, to concentrate on treating wild animals with human-induced injuries and diseases.

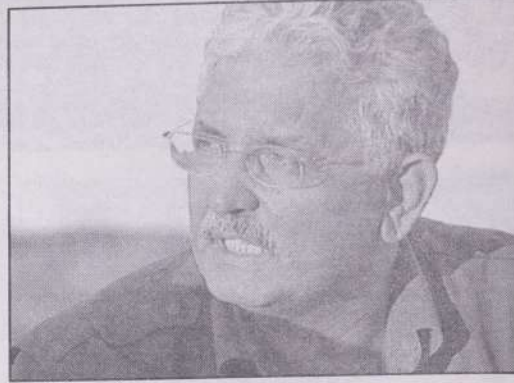
He was called many times to the bush, to remove a snare from a lioness, to rescue a giraffe from a trap, a hippo, the eye of a rhino, a baby zebra from an airstrip, to relieve a buffalo from his puss-filled leg, an elephant from a spear or to dart animals for GPS collar fittings and translocation.

He used to say "nothing beats the satisfaction of nurturing a sick animal to health".

Zahoor had successfully treated more than 5,000 animals. He carried out the first rhino eye surgery in Kenya.

Because of his extensive service to the Kenyan wildlife he had been made an honorary warden with Kenya Wildlife Service.

He was routinely on assignments in National parks and game reserves.



Dr. Zahoor Kashmiri was both an active Rotarian and was the chairman of the Cerebral Palsy Foundation in Mombasa.

An active Rotarian and was the chairman of the Cerebral Palsy Foundation in Mombasa where he spent a lot of time and energy raising funds for children affected by such debilitating disease by hosting International Food Festival.

The festival is still being hosted annually at his ranch and this year it is going to be held on 25th September.

He was affectionately called 'Daktari' by the children living along his ranch.

He was at a crossroad leaving airline and security business behind and fully dedicating his life to wildlife service.

He was about to write a book wanting to share the broad experience he gained over the years during his excursions in the bush.

"Elephants are strong, sensitive, intelligent beings with an amazing social order" is what he wrote before he left for Ethiopia.

"I want to show everyone the bush with my eyes and soul" he used to passionately say.

Blessed are those who risk their lives for a good cause. Zahoor Kashmiri risked everything for the care and safety of wild animals. The respect he carries follows him even after his death.

To me he was strong, sensitive, intelligent and compassionate, both as a brother and an individual; I could not describe him any better.

He is dearly missed by his family, relatives and friends and is still remembered by all those who came into contact with him.

To me he had a heart full of concern, intelligence of a genius, strength of a lion and looks of a hero.

All in all, he was a rare gem.

"Mop" our hearts still cry with the pain of losing you, through doing what you always enjoyed. The consolation is that you are in a better place in shaa Allah.

May Allah grant him Jannah, Ameen

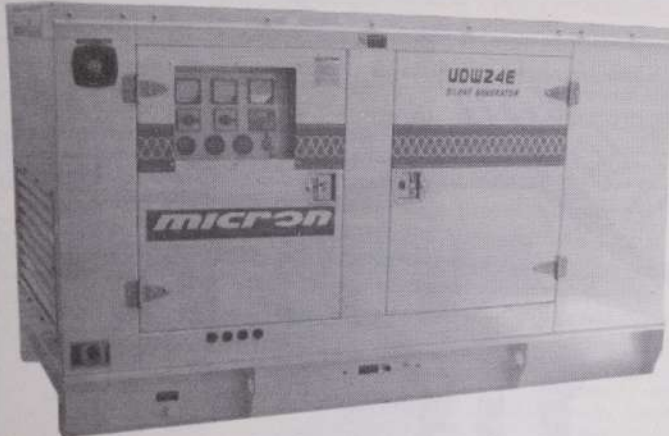

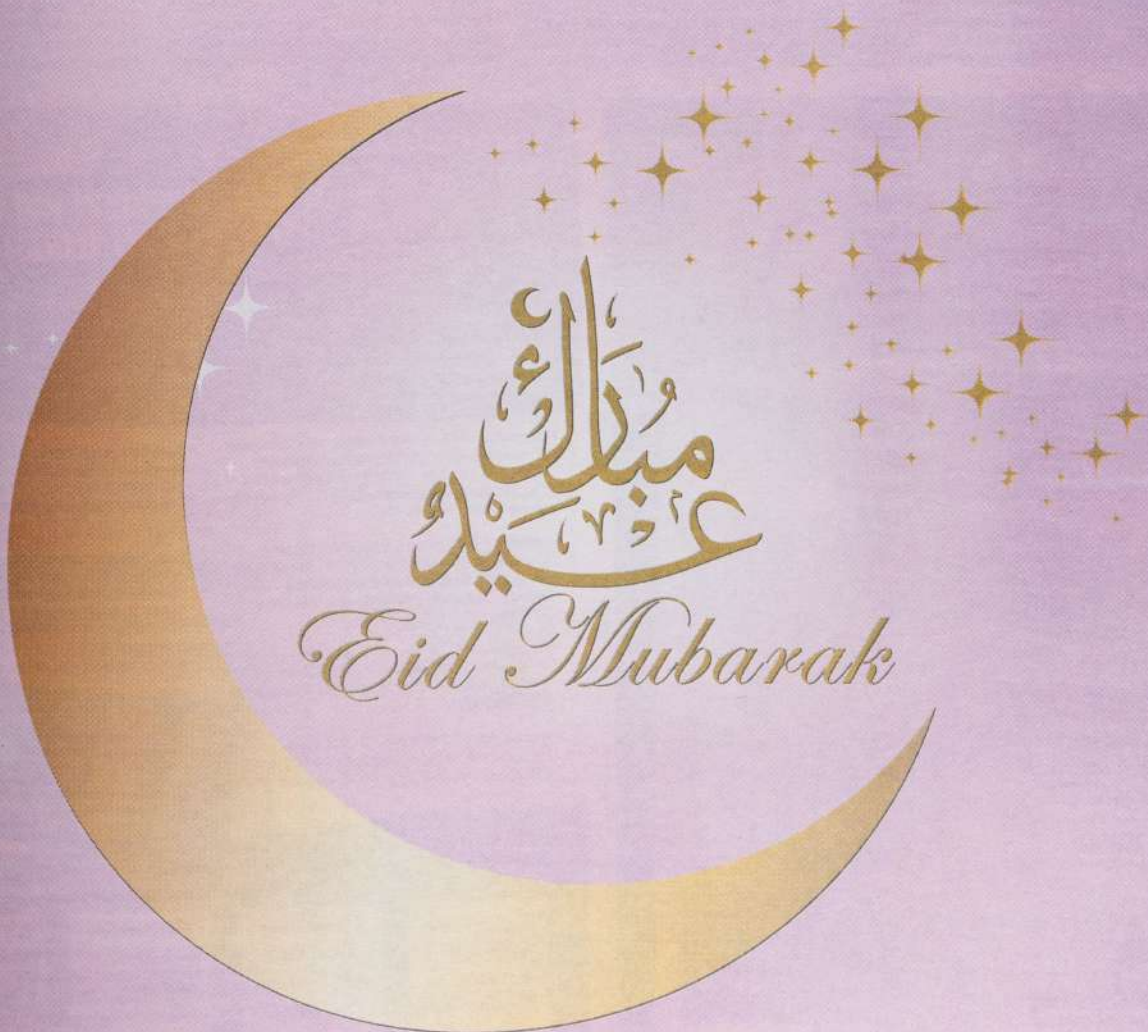

MANY KENYANS STILL LACK BROADBAND ACCESS

By Peter Mutai NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- More than 29 million Kenyans lack access to broadband services, a study conducted by the Communications Commission of Kenya (CCK) has revealed.

The study which was released in Nairobi late on Wednesday says more than 1,100 sub-locations in the country out of 7,149 lack access to voice telephony services. It says only 893 sub-locations in the country have

access to broadband data/Internet services, with 85,000 broadband subscribers.

The study also reveals that five million Kenyans do not have access to communication services while 29 million do not have access to broadband facilities.

Ministry of Information and Communication Permanent Secretary Bitange Ndemo, who launched the report, said Kenya must leapfrog from agricultural production based economy

to a knowledge-based economy through deployment of basic infrastructure, including electricity, for widespread of ICT services.

Ndemo said while this phenomenal growth of the ICT sector is envisioned to serve as an engine for economic growth in the 21st century, it may also if not properly managed, create a disparity between those without and those with access to the ICT infrastructure and services.

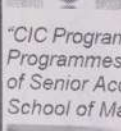

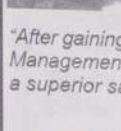

Tourist Arrivals To Kenya Increased By 14 Per Cent In First Half Of 2011

MURROBI (Xinhua) -- Total tourist arrivals to Kenya in the first half of 2011 increased by 13.6 per cent to 483,463 compared to the same period in 2010 when the figure closed at 423,468, a senior government official said on Thursday.

Tourism Minister Najib Balala said the traditional source markets of the West maintained the top five positions with Britain leading the pack with 78,785 arrivals, representing 14.3 per cent of the total arrivals followed by the United States

with 51,302 visitors representing 9.3 per cent of total arrivals.

"Others countries in the top five positions were Italy (43,282), Germany (31,016) and India (27,917) after overtaking France," said the minister who also outlined that projections point out that international tourism will continue to grow in 2011 for the second consecutive year, but at a slower pace.

Uganda maintained its lead in the arrivals from the African region, recording 22,626 visitors, a growth of 50.9 per cent compared to the same period in 2010.

South Africa recorded 16,667 arrivals with Tanzania following closely with 15,665 visitors.

China was second in the Asian market with 15,139 arrivals representing a 28.3 per cent growth from January to June 2010.

"The causes of this year's predicted slower pace of growth on the international tourism arena include persistent world economic woes and increase in government taxation on travel."

Balala said the government has doubled its marketing expenditure to 1 million U.S. dollars in

the drive to salvage the dream of welcoming by 2015 3 million visitors to the country through aggressive campaign and marketing.

"We have increased our spending on marketing Kenya as a tourist destination.

"Soon I will travel to Brazil as part of this campaign because Brazilians, boosted by years of economic boom and a strong currency, have started traveling long haul."

The minister said Kenya has seen an increase in airlines expressing desire to open new routes to Nairobi, with Gulf Airline already operational whereas Malaysian and Singaporean Airlines were in a state of negotiations with Kenya to fly into the country.

Balala said America's Delta Airline's willingness to operate direct flights to Nairobi to cash in on the huge American market has been hampered by refusal of the Department of Homeland Security, which is responsible for securing the nation's transportation systems, to grant it flying rights owing to the Somali security factor.

SMUGGLERS 'PROFIT' AS SUGAR SHORTAGE ENTERS THIRD WEEK

By Chris Mgidu MALABA (Xinhua) -- The serious sugar shortage facing Kenya currently has opened a window of opportunities to some local businessmen at Kenya-Uganda border of Malaba who are now smuggling the commodity from the neighboring country to cash in on the crisis.

The traders have surfaced in Malaba border and are using motorbikes and bicycles to smuggle sugar from Uganda through the main customs entrance.

Some of the sugar has also been passing through illegal routes by the same bicycle operators who fear to pass through the main entrance at the border.

But there were also reports that sugar is being smuggled into Uganda mainly from some of the local milling companies that had previously complained of experiencing an upsurge in the demand of the commodity from the major dealers.

Sugar started going to Uganda in plenty from last week in 90 kg bags and nobody stops those taking it on bicycles as they cross the Malaba Uganda, one of the security officers at the border, who declined to be named, told Xinhua.

Cases of smuggling have come at a time when Kenya is experiencing a serious shortage of sugar with retail outlets in major towns selling it at exorbitant prices while others have started rationing the commodity forcing the buyers to either buy only one packet or buy another commodity in order to

get sugar. Investigations have revealed that sugar being smuggled into Kenya from Uganda is from Kakira Sugar Company in Uganda, one of the leading sugar manufacturers in Uganda.

Businessmen at the Malaba border and even some from other adjoining counties in Western Kenya County were purchasing a 50 kg bag of Kakira sugar Company at 87 U.S. dollars unlike in Kenya where the same quantity was going for 110 dollars.

"Sugar from Malaba-Uganda was being smuggled to Malaba Kenya through illegal routes during day and night hours," one of the people who ferry the commodity from across the border said.

He said they were paid depending on the number of bags of sugar they ferried from Malaba Uganda to the Kenyan side.

"We are paid well because we are risking our lives by being forced to pass with bags of sugar through Malaba River before we reach on the Kenyan side," another runner said. "There is ready market for sugar from Uganda because most of the businessmen cannot afford the current price of sugar that is manufactured by local Kenyan factories which was being sold for 110 dollars per one 50 kg bag," the businessman said on condition of anonymity.

Sugarcane farmers in the cane growing area of Western Kenya have been complaining that they were operating at losses because their cane were being harvested when they had not matured as milling factories grapple with acute shortage of cane.

MORE MARKETING

The tourism boom recorded in Kenya over the past few months is a result of an intensified marketing campaign undertaken by the country's Tourism Board, which is done during international exhibitions, trade fairs and roadshows.

Apart from the lack of enough beds to accommodate the increased tourism numbers, Kenya is also grappling with the need to upgrade aviation facilities.

This will attract international flights to the key tourism resorts across the country.

Kenya's tourist arrivals grew 15 percent in the first quarter, but the arrivals by cruise ships, the biggest source of foreign arrivals took a serious dip due to the growing piracy threats along the Somali coastline, the Tourism Board says.

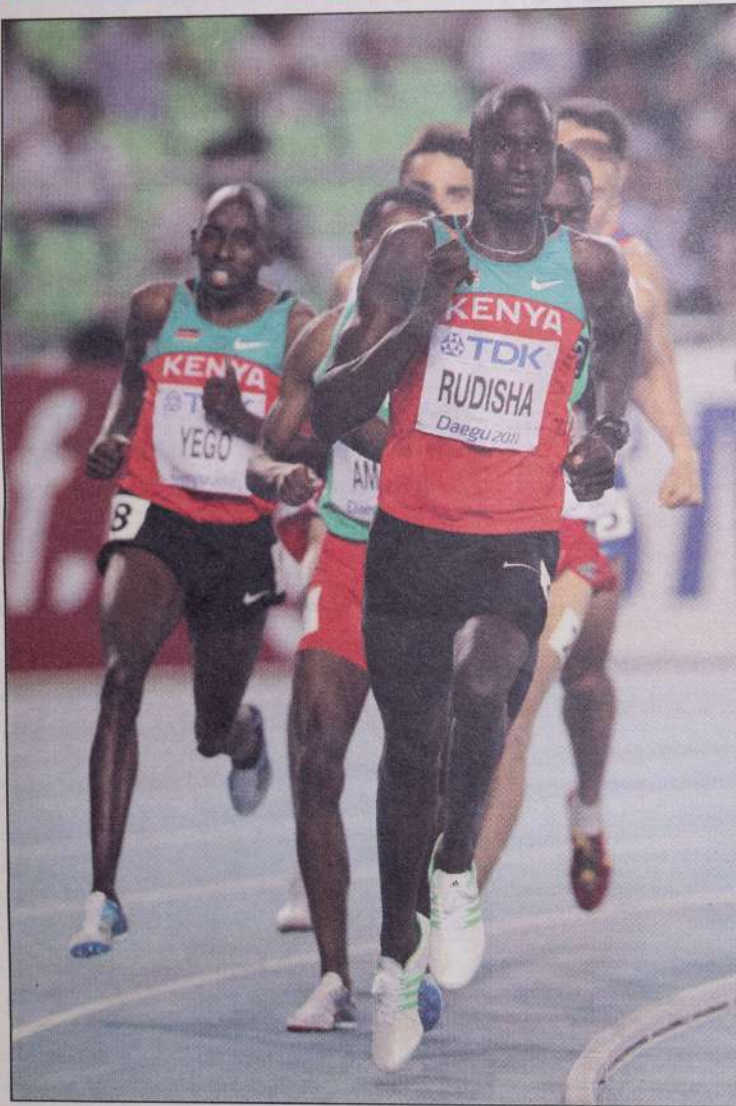

Rudisha Claims Men's 800m World Title In Daegu

DAEGU, South Korea (Xinhua) -- David Rudisha of Kenya has won the gold medal of the men's 800m race in one minute and 43.91 seconds on Tuesday night at the Daegu World Championships.

Abubaker Kaki of Sudan took the silver by clocking 1:44.41. Yuriy Borzakovskiy of Russia collected the bronze in 1:44.49.

Rudisha, though at 22, is already a big name in the men's 800m. He set the current world record of 1:41.01 in the Italian city Rieti last August.

Actually, he holds four of the 10 fastest times for this event.

With the victory, he added a gold medal for the African athletic power, which swept all the six medals in Day 1 of the Daegu worlds on Saturday.

"I controlled the race from the start, (and) that was my plan. I did not want to make a mistake," Rudisha told reporters after the game.

"I knew I was in good shape. Nevertheless, I spared my energy until the last 150 meters."

The Kenyan said he would continue training hard and see if he could improve his personal best in the next races.

Rudisha's 2011 best is 1:42.61, and he is the only runner of the eight in Tuesday's final whose mark is in the sub-1:43 territory.

Kaki, another African talent six months younger than Rudisha, said it was the first medal for Sudan in the history of the World Championships.

"These two medals are for Africa. I will continue to race for Sudan ...

"Next goals will be the World Indoor Champs and the (London) Olympics," he added.

Kiplagat Leads Kenya Sweep In Daegu Worlds Women Marathon

DAEGU, South Korea (Xinhua) -- **Edna Ngeringwony Kiplagat of Kenya took the first gold medal of the World Championships in the women's marathon in this South Korean city on Saturday morning, by clocking 2:28.43 hours.**

Her Kenyan teammate Priscah Jeptoo took the silver, 17 seconds behind Kiplagat.

Sharon Jemutai Cherop, also from Kenya, took the bronze by clocking 2:29.14, which is her personal season best.

The winner's timing is far poorer than the world record of 2:15.25, which was created by former British runner Radcliffe Paula in London in 2003.

It was also poorer than Kiplagat's personal best of 2:20.46, which she achieved at last November's ING New York City Marathon.

The timing partly resulted from the sweltering conditions in Daegu, though the weather was much cooler on Saturday than previous days.

The three Kenyan runners began their collective hunt for

the medals after running some 35 kilometers together with other competitors, and since then they continued their lead all the way to the finish line.

Bezunesh Bekele from Ethiopia, Africa's another formidable athletics power, ranked the fourth by clocking 2:29.21.

Japan's Yukiko Akaba was the fifth.

Zhu Xiaolin of China was the sixth by clocking 2:29.58.

Her teammate Wang Jiali ranked the eighth by running 2:30.25. Another Chinese runner Chen Rong was the 11th.

The Chinese team ranked the second, by clocking 7:31.34 hours collectively, after Kenya's 7:26.57.

Such performance by the Chinese runners was better, if not much better, than expectations since China had fielded a team without defending world champion Bai Xue and Zhou Chunxun.

Bai Xue snatched the gold at the Berlin World Championships in 2009 by surprise, while Zhou took the gold medal at the 2006 Asian Games in Doha and won the silver medal at the 2007 World Championships in Osaka.

Zhu told Xinhua at the finish line that she was satisfied with the mark.

"My goal is better than the eighth place.

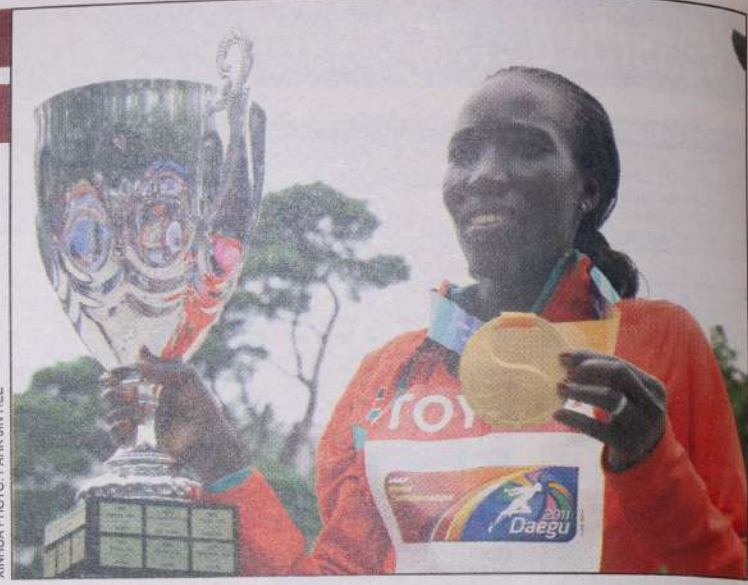
"Today's timing gives me more confidence.

"I wish I can enter the London Olympics, and could have better performance there," she said, admitting there is some gap between her and world's top runners like those from Kenya.

Zhu said the weather in Daegu is a bit sweltering so that better results are unlikely.

Gao Shijun, a coach with the Chinese marathon team, was also pleased with the team's results.

"Our runners have basically met our target. After all, the Chinese team lags behind strong teams such as Kenya... since some team members debut the marathon race internationally here in Daegu," he said.

VETTEL CONTINUES HIS LEADERSHIP WITH PIRELLI

Spa-Francorchamps, - After an action-packed race that was dominated by tyre strategy, Red Bull Racing's Sebastian Vettel converted pole position to another race win this year, the 17th of his career, over 44 laps around the epic Spa-Francorchamps circuit.

Zero White medium tyre to finish the race.

His team mate Mark Webber stopped twice to finish runner-up, making excellent use of the P Zero White medium tyre to claim second place with nine laps to go.

All the drivers apart from McLaren's Jenson Button and Mercedes driver Michael

Blistering occurs when the compound overheats, causing parts of the tread pattern to degrade.

Following a comprehensive review of the situation overnight, the conclusion was drawn that this was a consequence of some car set-ups, affecting compound life rather than structural rigidity.

As it was, the blistering did not

rain at all during the grand prix this year.

"Heading into the race, all the teams had very little information about dry running in Spa; and this clearly increased the challenge.

"There was an issue with the front tyre blistering but we are confident that a similar scenario will not arise again, provided that our usage recommendations are followed.

"Of course, if any team had been concerned about their situation, they had the option to change their set-up and start from the pit lane.

"However, the majority of teams felt that no change was necessary.

"The problem was seemingly a consequence of some cars placing an excessive load on the inner shoulder of the front tyre due to their set-up and so overheating the compound, but it did not at all affect the structural integrity of the tyre.

"As there was no safety issue and because it would have been unfair to the teams that were unaffected, the decision was taken to start with the qualifying tyres as per the usual regulations.

"Although we did have the capacity to substitute the soft tyres after qualifying it turned out not be necessary.

"The harder tyres performed with no problems at all throughout the weekend. Both Michael Schumacher and Jenson Button started the race on the P Zero White medium, which formed an integral part of their great fight back up the field."

He then cashed the Queen of Diamonds, discarding the no-longer-needed Knave of Spades from hand (West also throwing a Spade). He crossed back to hand via King of Spades and promoted Ten-Seven of Hearts. On this last Heart, a double squeeze operates.

West had to throw down to two Clubs in order to retain a high Spade. Dummy's Spade can now be discarded. Whereupon East is also squeezed down to two Clubs (he needs to retain a high Diamond).

A Club to the King and a Club back to the Ace fell all the opposing Clubs and the last trick is scored with the promoted Ten of Diamonds. Twelve tricks and slam made.



Vivian Claims 10,000m

DAEGU, South Korea (Xinhua) -- Kenya's Vivian Jepkemoi Cheruiyot, debutant of the 10,000-meter distance this year, claimed the women's world title here on Saturday with a personal best of 30:48.98.

The defending champion of women's 5,000 meters took the first step in her bid for a double in Daegu as she emulated Olympic champion Tirunesh Dibaba in winning the gold medal at the world championships 10,000 meters in the same year as her debut at the distance.

Kenyan runners swept the podium with Sally Kipyego finishing second in 30:50.04 and defending champion Linet Chepkwemai Masai third in 30:53.59.

The other Kenyan Priscah Jepleting Cherono overcame Ethiopia's Meselech Melkamu to finish fourth with a personal best of 30:56.43.

The 27-year-old Cheruiyot started to sprint with 600 meters to go and successfully broke out from the leading bunch of five to take the gold medal on the opening night of the Daegu worlds.

In April, a week after she had

won the World Cross Country title, Cheruiyot ran 31:07.02 in Pontevedra, Spain.

Her only other race at the distance was the Kenyan trial, to make the team for the championships. The ambitious Kenyan is

to compete in the 5,000 meter heats next Tuesday with the final taking place on Friday.

In her most recent race at the distance, she won at the Diamond League in Stockholm, running a personal best

14:20.87. Melkamu, the runner-up of the Berlin worlds two years ago, was fifth despite clocking a season best of 30:56.55.

Shitaye Eshete, 21, set a national record for Bahrain as she finished sixth in 31:21.57.
