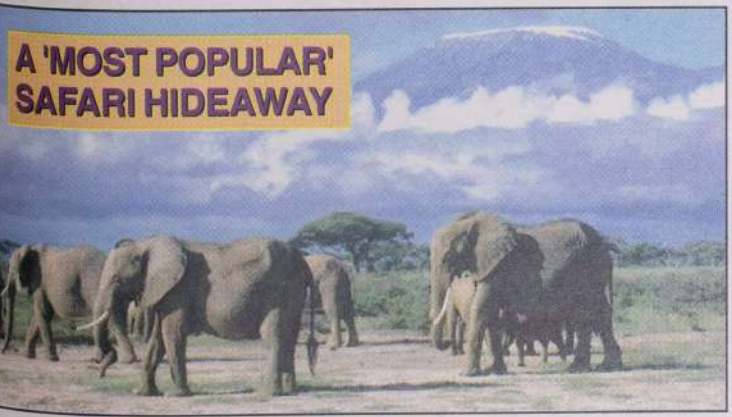

INDIA-KENYA CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

The Assistant High Commission of India, Mombasa in association with Indian Council for Cultural Relations, New Delhi organized a Qawwali Night by renowned Ustad Ghulam Qadir Niazi and his troupe from Delhi at Shree Navnath Vanik Mahajan hall in Mombasa at 7.30 pm on Thursday, the 22nd September 2011 under the auspices of India-Kenya Cultural Exchange Programme.

Around 800 persons including Mr. Khamas Shivogo, Deputy PC of Mombasa, city counselors, police and port officers, museum officials and Qawwali aficionados among the Diaspora attended the event.

Qawwali is a form of devotional music rooted in the mystical tradition of the Sufism, which transforms music into a powerful spiritual realization.

Originally performed at Sufi shrines or dargahs throughout South Asia, Qawwali has gained

mainstream popularity due to the efforts of many renowned Qawwali exponents from the Indian subcontinent.

Qawwalis are performed by a group of eight to nine men including a lead singer, two auxiliary singers and a chorus of four or five men to the accompaniment of harmonium and percussion instruments known as Tabla and Dholak as well as rhythmic hand clapping.

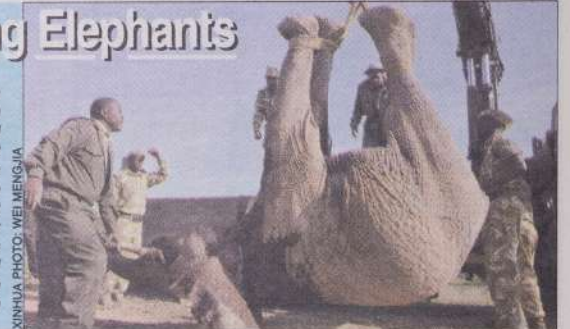

Our Sad Driving Culture Is Being Driven By Behaviour Of Mad Matatu Community

We will continue with the possible reasons why road accidents could happen especially here in Kenya.

The biggest influence on driver behaviour is other road users and the biggest presence on roads in Kenya is the public transport sector - the matatus.

It doesn't matter which corner of Kenya one goes to, one is bound to find a matatu or two or thousand operating.

They are currently the single biggest shaper of driver behaviour in Kenya.

Before the matatu, it was the individual drivers who were the main influence on driver behaviour.

Tracing from the time of independence, the main owners and users of vehicles at the time were the mzungus in the country.

Ownership of vehicles by natives was very limited. In fact it was the Mzungu, followed by the Mhindi and then the indigenous in order of the most populous.

The Hindi and Indigenous ownership was a very small fraction of the total ownership so the behaviours at that time were driven by the Mzungu community.

The Mzungu community was known by and large for its gentlemanly behaviour and courtesy.

There were of course a few bad apples but that was why there was a police force with a traffic section to deal with the errant lot.

The size of the traffic department was commensurate with the demands by the size of non conforming section of drivers.

The other important consideration was that tuition was very thorough and passing a driving exam was a mentally excruciating ordeal almost the same as passing normal school examinations.

Bad behaviour on the road was noticed and the cars recorded and people were quickly apprehended and worked on.

Communities were also able to deal with their own defaulters.

However, over the years, the number of indigenous drivers rose by leaps and bounds, the quality of tuition and examination rapidly deteriorated and the discipline and authority of the police force diminished to a point where it is almost non-existent except for when they are trying to sort out traffic jams.

Fast forward to today. The population of drivers is large and the driving infrastructure is very stretched almost to bursting point.

The boys in blue are a pale shadow of what they were and do not measure at all to what they are expected to do.

Driving schools leave a lot to be desired as there is no reliable central body that controls, licenses and adjudicates their operations.

There is no dynamic curriculum for driving nor is there a set of basic principles of etiquette.

With these challenges in place, the only thing left is for drivers to react to what others are doing and the ones with the biggest muscles are the ones that get noticed most.

In Kenya, it is the matatu drivers that fall into this category.

They drive behaviour in Kenya like nobody else and most drivers in Kenya are driven by the idea of "one up man ship".

No matatu wants to be stationary so they will do whatever it

takes to keep on the move.

They always want to be in front so they will do whatever it takes to be in front.

They believe they own the road so they will do whatever it takes to win every piece of road to the detriment of other drivers.

The environment decay is simple.

The condition of our roads has been getting worse but with the formation of the different road management authorities, the decline has at least been arrested.

The nation is in a maintain state and there is very little upgrading of existing facilities.

Patching potholes and re-carpeting are but only fire fighting measures.

It is necessary to begin proper asset replacement where roads are dug up and built from scratch - TO THE PROPER QUALITY.

Cosmetic upgrades will not help. Roads need to be rebuilt to cater for future needs.

They need to have good drainage, be properly marked, have working facilities such as traffic lights and pedestrian controlled crossing points and they need to be lit, lit, lit.

We have no roads outside of cities that are lit because we do not have the regulations in place as to how this should work.

We also need to have the correct maintenance philosophies and policies in place.

All the above needs to be ruthlessly executed and managed so that there is nowhere for any miscreant officer to hide.

So behaviour by other road users is being quickly assimilated by all drivers, each influencing the other and we are spiralling downwards in terms of etiquette and safety on our roads.

The environment will follow close behind if we continue the way we are now despite the small improvements.

It is therefore no wonder that we get these regular jolts of accidents in August and September every year that serve to remind us that we need to take drastic and sustained action to stop and correct the decline.

We need a new champion who will start the process just like Uncle John (Michuki) did with his famous rules.

Not only do we need a champion but we also need a sustainable system that has the right culture to continue the change and implementation of the new ways long after the champion is gone.

We all fondly remember the so called Michuki Rules.

They addressed driver behaviour through ruthless enforcement of compliance of existing statutes.

We are calling for not only this ruthless enforcement but also for a complete review of the whole driving environment in Kenya leading to setting up of effective and permanent structures that will start and manage the changes needed to bring sanity back to our roads.

In the meantime, our driving culture will continue to be driven by the behaviour of the matatu community and the quality (or lack of) of our infrastructure.

As Kachumbari says, survival is only for the fittest.

He then ruffed a spade with Nine of Trumps, (East discarding a Heart) and led King of Hearts.

West could do no better than win the Ace and lead a Spade, but Declarer left East powerless by ruffing with Dummy's remaining low Trump.

East chose to overruff but Declarer in turn overruffed, drew East's last Trump, cashed his Fifth Club and scored the last trick with Dummy's Queen of Hearts. Twelve tricks and small slam made.

"I met buses and cows on my way, so was frustrated about that. Then I knew I could put pressure on him (Naushad).

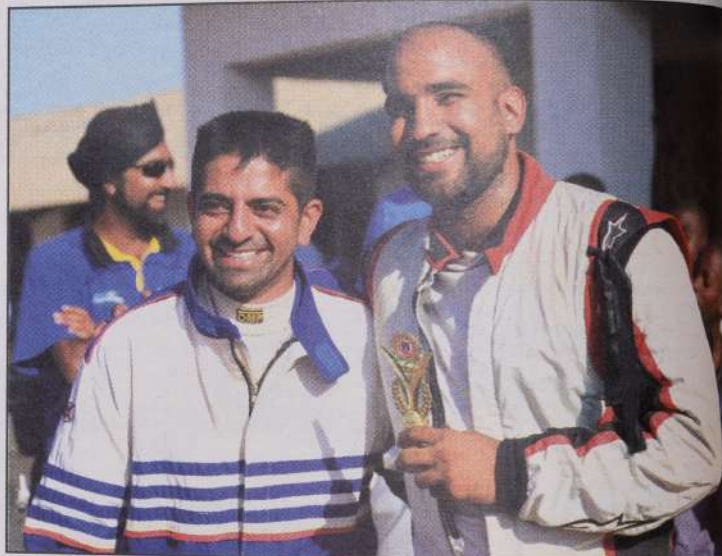
"We nearly hit some cows as well coming over a maximum brow, but luckily avoided it.

"So I got the lead. And then I backed off in the last stage but was only one second behind him.

"I knew he was gonna push it for the last stage so couldn't back off too much either. I was happy I managed to find the balance. The win has definitely upped my ante.

"But I know I still have a long way to go in matching the pace
