

Mombasa Dar 'Gas' Pipeline

MOMBASA (Xinhua) -- Experts from the East Africa Community (EAC) have been meeting in Kenya's coastal city of Mombasa to urgently devise ways of addressing the persistent power shortages in the region.

The five-day meeting which brought together senior officials from EAC partner states' ministries responsible for energy will also fast track the implementation of the projects and activities stipulated in the Regional Power Master Plan.

"The meeting included sessions of senior officials (technocrats), which were followed by the Permanent Secretaries' session before concluding with a ministerial session on Friday," the EAC Secretariat said on

Monday. The meeting also reviewed progress made in the sector in implementing council decisions and considered other issues of regional importance in the areas of New and Renewable Energy and Energy Conservation and Efficiency, Fossil Fuels and Power sub-sectors.

The Sectorial Council was expected to approve a U.S.A. \$1.89 million dollars budget for the sixth East African Petroleum Conference AND Exhibition 2013 (EAPCE'13) and to adopt the

Final Report for the Feasibility Study for a natural gas pipeline from Dar es Salaam to Tanga and Mombasa.

Kisumu Impala Conservation Boat Race

Kenya Wildlife Service in conjunction with stakeholders is organising the Inaugural Kisumu Impala Conservation Boat Race to be held next month in Lake Victoria.


The race seeks to raise funds to conserve the rare sitatunga antelope found in Kisumu Impala Sanctuary by the shores of the lake by constructing a 3-km perimeter wall fence at a cost of Sh28 million.

The race will also give the participating stakeholders a chance to showcase their products and activities as well as highlight the potential of Kisumu and Siaya counties as tourism investment and attraction destinations. Stakeholders interested in showcasing their activities will hold a consultative meeting to plan for the race on October 21, 2011 in Kisumu Town.

These include the Ministry of Tourism, Kenya Investment Authority, the Fisheries Department, tour operators, non governmental organisations, Kenya Association of Manufacturers' (KAM), Lake Basin Development Authority (LBDA), Integritours and boat operators among others.

Relief Distribution At Magarini Division

People in Eastern Africa continued to suffer in silence; this is due to the worst drought the area has witnessed in 60 years.

This has had a domino effect on prices of basic necessities such as food. The malnutrition rates in the country have risen drastically; the people mainly affected are the children. Families struggle to provide a basic meal and sometimes wonder where their next meal will come from. It is expected that this situation will continue until December 2011.

Magarini a quiet town 50 kms of Malindi (situated on the Coastal Strip in Kenya) has been one of the worst affected areas; the people who reside in this area are mostly farmers.

Due to short rains, erratic and poorly distributed long rains have resulted in poor or no farm produce at all.

Last year this area was flooded and the farms were destroyed thus resulting in failure of food crops. This area has been facing harsh conditions for almost three

maize flour to the locals residing in that area.

People attended the distribution in large numbers, men, women and children to benefit from receive the relief aid.

Over 3700 individuals have benefited from this Relief Distribution carried out by the Mission. The distribution was done in conjunction with Kenya Red Cross, Mombasa and Malindi Branches.

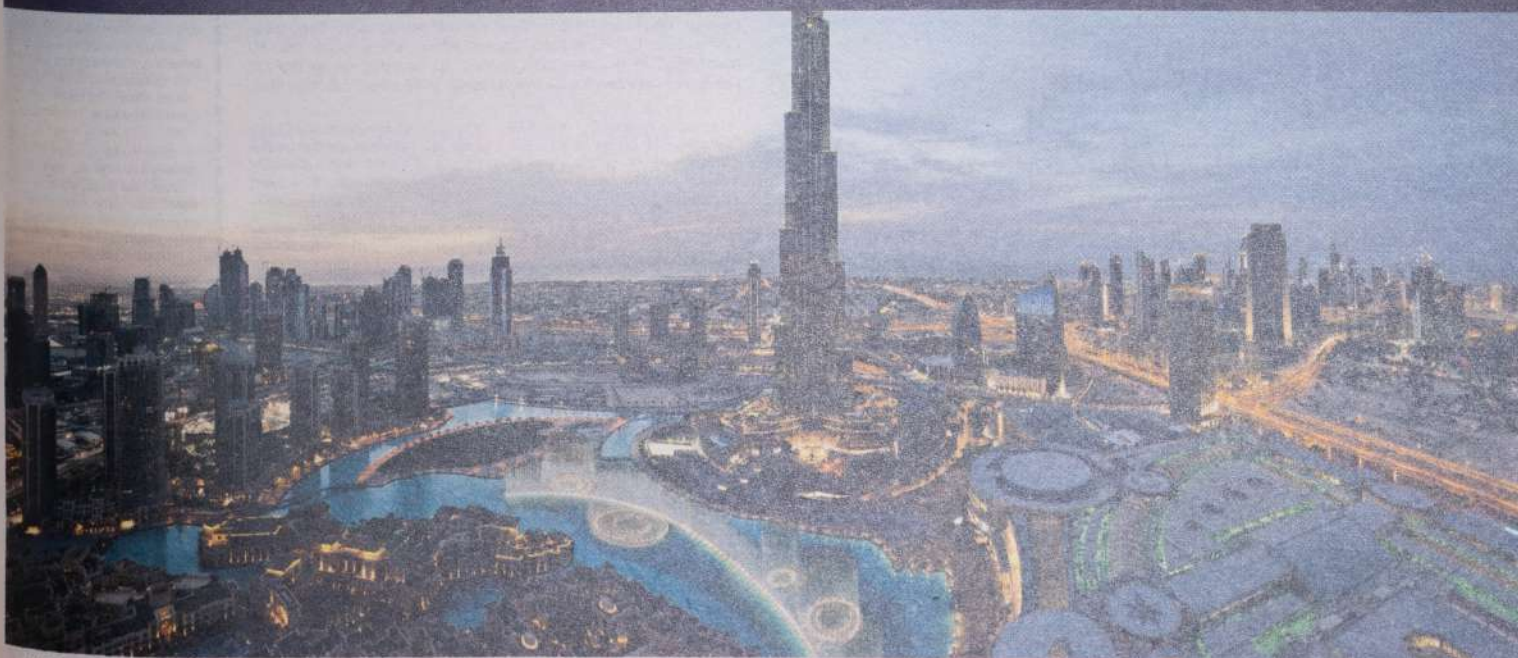

Mombasa Dar 'Gas' Pipeline

FROM FRONT PAGE transfer of natural gas and oil products through pipelines as key to building energy security in the community and the Dar es Salaam-Tanga-Mombasa natural gas pipeline project is one of the initiatives being promoted in order to link energy systems in the region.

EAC Energy ministers were also expected to adopt the Inter-Government Memorandum of Understanding (IGMOU) and the Inter-Utility Memorandum of Understanding (IUMOU) for the establishment of the East African Community Power Pool (EACPP) at the Mombasa meeting.

Meanwhile Tanzanian President Jakaya Kikwete has directed government executives to speed up decision making in tackling the power crisis gripping the country and threatening its economy, local media reported on Tuesday.

"We are in an emergency situation and I don't see the sense of urgency in making decisions and taking the required steps to overcome the power problem," Kikwete was quoted by Daily News in a special meeting with energy stakeholders held at State House here on Monday.

"We cannot continue dillydallying in taking action to relieve the country from the power crisis," he said. Kikwete made the remark during the meeting as he called to discuss the construction of a natural gas pipeline from Mtwara to Dar es Salaam and to increase availability of the input for generating more power.

The pipeline which will be constructed by the government will be completed in a year and is expected to increase gas availability for industrial use and power production.

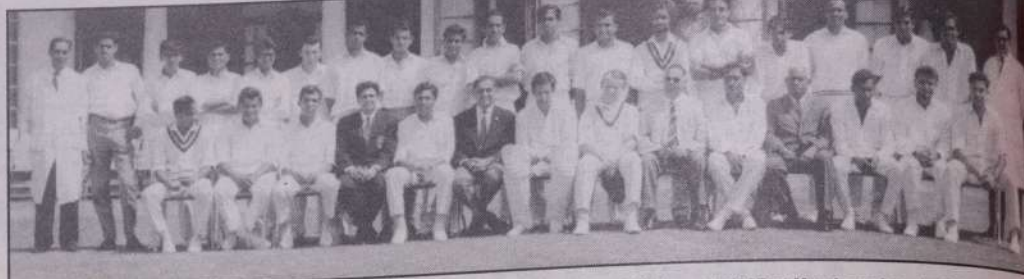

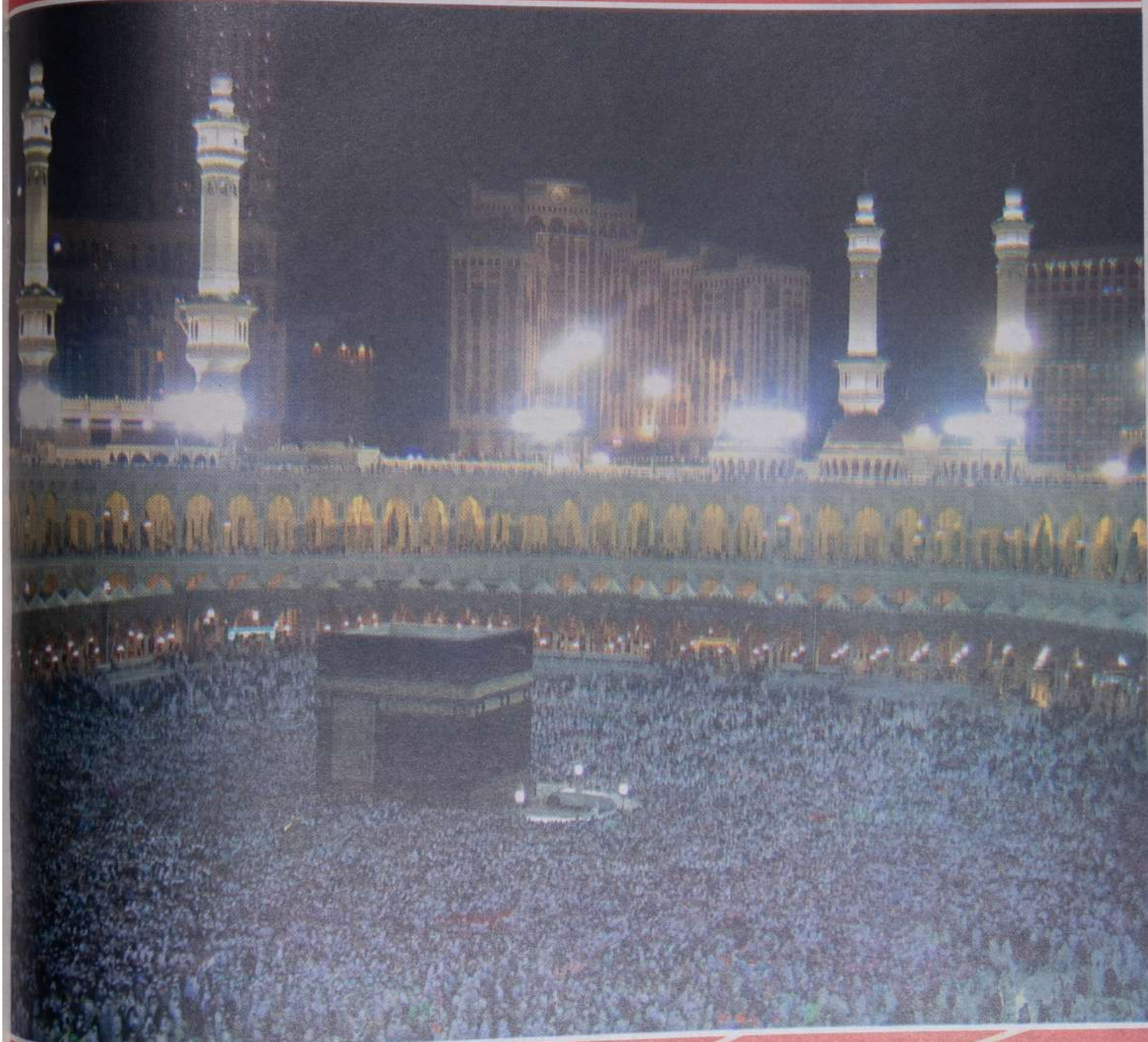

Using Internship Programmes To Find Potential Employees

Emirates Boost Kenya - Pakistan Trade

Trade between Kenya and Pakistan has received a boost after Dubai based international carrier, Emirates unveiled major expansion plans for Pakistan with the launch of additional flights to Islamabad, Lahore and Peshawar.

 Statistics from the weekly tea auction in Mombasa showed that Kenya exported 23.4 million kg of tea to Pakistan between January and March, representing a jump of 30.7 per cent when compared to a similar period of 2010.
 The volume of exports to Pakistan between January and March this year represent 21.7 per cent of total exports weighing 107.66 million kg.
 The shipments to Pakistan were the highest over the three-month period compared to other traditional leading destinations such as the United Kingdom and Egypt that bought 17.4 per cent and 16.4 per cent of Kenyan tea respectively.
 The services will be operated by Boeing 777 and Airbus A330-200 aircraft offering the highest standards of passenger comfort, with luxurious lie-flat beds in Business Class and generously sized Economy Class seats.
 Passengers in all classes can lose themselves in the much enjoyed and celebrated ICE inflight entertainment system. 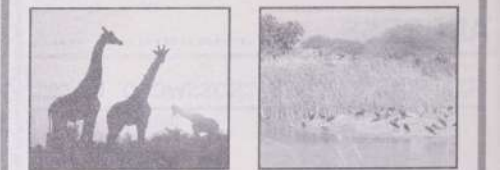

VETTEL WINS RACE WITH PIRELLI

Newly-crowned world champion Sebastian Vettel has won his 10th grand prix of the season, after claiming the lead on the opening lap from his grid position of second place and using the correct pit stop strategy to maintain his advantage.

He now has the chance to equal Michael Schumacher's record of 13 wins in one season.

With Vettel's team mate Mark Webber finishing third, Red Bull Racing has sealed the manufacturers' championship for the second year in a row - taking its 25th win at the same time.

The Korean Grand Prix weekend got off to a wet start on Friday, meaning that the teams only had one hour of dry running on Saturday morning to assess the performance of the Pirelli P Zero slick tyres on different fuel loads before qualifying and the race. This meant that the teams

still had many unanswered questions as they lined up on the grid for the very first start in Korea under dry conditions: the inaugural race last year started behind the safety car. The Red Bull Racing duo of Sebastian Vettel and Mark Webber adopted an unusual strategy during qualifying by running exclusively on the P Zero Red supersoft tyres in order to save the P Zero Yellow soft tyres for the race. By contrast, McLaren and Ferrari opted to save as many sets of the P Zero Red supersoft tyres as possible.

All the drivers who finished the race stopped twice, with the exception of the Sauber duo of Kamui Kobayashi and Sergio Perez, as well as HRT's Vitantonio Liuzzi, who all stopped three times.

Vettel however used the supersoft tyre for his first two stints before taking the soft tyre for the final stint, meaning that

he did not need to use his full allocation of tyres to win the race by 12.0s.

Webber finished third after a race-long battle with McLaren's Lewis Hamilton, who qualified on pole for the first time this year and finished second: his first podium since winning the German Grand Prix this year.

Positions two to five in Korea were covered by just four seconds at the end, with Toro Rosso's Jaime Alguersuari equalling his best career result of seventh place. The Spaniard used two stints on the supersoft tyre and a final longer stint on the softs: a similar strategy to Vettel.

The Korean Grand Prix marked the final appearance for Pirelli's P Zero Red supersoft tyres this year, having also been used in Monaco, Canada, Hungary and Singapore.

The remaining three races will all use a combination of the soft and medium P Zero compounds.
