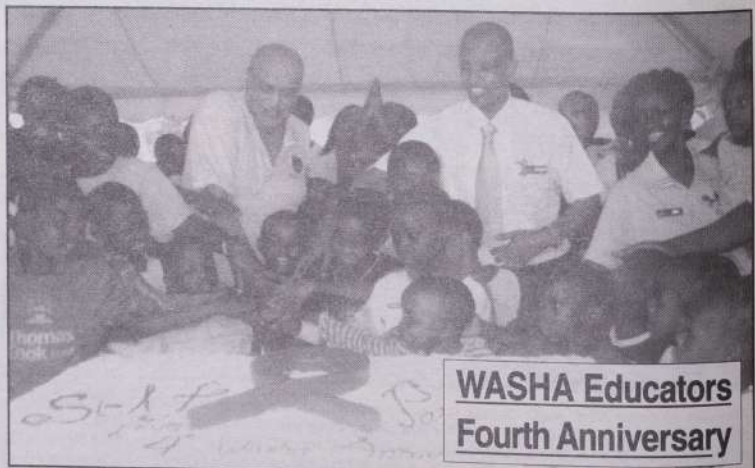

The minister said tourism was an important pillar to the country's economy, contributing 10 per cent to its Gross Domestic Product (GDP), an economy he said, the country would not allow criminal gangs to destroy. ## NEW HELICOPTER HELPS WILDLIFE CONSERVATION

Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) has received a major boost in its air operations following the acquisition of a new Bell 407 helicopter.

The chopper, with a carrying capacity of seven, is set to further enhance conservation work.

The purchase of the helicopter is seen as an important investment expected to generate more revenue in addition to aiding KWS's air services which include air patrols vital in anti-poaching operations, animal censuses and surveillance, large mammal translocation and client personnel transportation, among others. During the launch of the helicopter, KWS Director Julius Kipng'etich also commissioned a new VIP lounge at the KWS Wilson Airport Hangar offices in Nairobi.

Mr Kipng'etich said as part of the organisation's force modernisation and expansion programme, plans are underway to increase its aircraft in the next few years.

This would see the purchase of an additional caravan aircraft in 2013 and ensure that by 2015, each park should have at least one light aircraft to enhance operations.

The Director also challenged staff to come up with a proposal to acquire another hangar at the Wilson Airport aimed at multiplying the airwing's efficiency and increase its productivity.

This would go hand in hand with the training of more engineers, technicians and aircraft personnel at the organisation.

Head of Airwing, Maj (Rtd) Solomon Nyanjui, affirmed that the KWS Airwing is a prime model for law enforcement that serves as an example for the rest of the continent in relation to protecting and preserving wildlife.

# Kenya Wildlife Service Taita Taveta Climate Change And Wildlife Management Workshop

Kenya Wildlife Service is investing Sh275 million for drought mitigation in wildlife management across the country.

This was said by the KWS Director Julius Kipng'etich during the opening of a two-day Climate Change and Wildlife Management Workshop at the Sarova Taita Hills Game Lodge in Taita Taveta County.

With him was the German Ambassador to Kenya, Her Excellency Ms. Margit Hellwig-Boette, who graced the event.

The German Government funded the series of workshops to the tune of Sh3 million within the various KWS conservation areas.

The training workshops were undertaken in Nanyuki and covered Northern, Eastern and Mountain conservation areas and Nakuru for the Central Rift, Mara and Western conservation areas.

Mr Kipng'etich attributed 99 per cent of conflicts in the entire planet to competition for natural resources.

He added that managing such challenges is figuring out mitigation and adaptation measures in combating climate change in the country.

More than 60 KWS employees and wildlife management stakeholders have been trained and a further 30 are undergoing the training.

The workshops target wildlife managers, scientists and stakeholders to empower and enlighten them on the issues related to climate change.

The impacts of climate change are linked with the achievement of key national development objectives including Vision 2030, climate change response strategy, strategy for revitalisation of agriculture and the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

# IS IT MORE THAN JUST A GAME? ONE MIGHT THINK THAT PLAYSTATION IS A CHILD'S PLAY

**Is it More Than Just A Game? One might think that PlayStation is a Child's play, however; PlayStation is more than you can think of.**

From interacting online around the world with PS Users, to playing different games which involve strategic thinking, believe it or not, PlayStation is a modified technology which has, and still will assist us by becoming tactical and spatial thinkers.

Technology has impacted the device to a certain extent that it is possible to use it as a computer, as a gaming software, as chat messenger, also as a DVD and Blue ray disk player.

It is also possible to play the games in high definition which gives clearer graphics and use Bluetooth to connect to wireless internet.

Through personal experience this software has opened my eyes to various ways of utilizing modern day technology.

One being: using it to learn different skills in sports such as Football, Mixed Martial Arts, Golf and Go-carting.

Recently research has been under taken and the outcome was the improvement in tactical thinking, logic, coordination, time management, multi-tasking, quick analysis and reflexes, strategy, anticipation, determination, memory, judgements,

teamwork and cooperation, active and thus it also acts as a mind taster.

Most of all these techniques and skills learnt from PlayStation apply in various ways, such as in school, we should have the ability to think in a strategic way whilst solving problems, time management is vital when doing tests and oral presentations.

Thus, memory and teamwork is highly recommended in order to listen to others views and opinions about a specific topic, hence it would be easy to recall discussions in class while talking about a similar topic.

Though we might not learn actual skills from the PlayStation game, we are able to link it with our surroundings and think of creative ways to showcase our talent on the field.

At the Aga Khan Academy Mombasa, we have a very rigorous and challenging curriculum which tests all students to their level best, however this is such an intense curriculum, playing PlayStation is considered a waste of time.

As technology advances, video games have been programmed in such a way that a person might think that they are in the

game. This then gives a lot more body movement than sitting and playing with a controller.

As a result more skills would be learnt due to more actions with different parts of the body.

From surveys, more people would rather play the sport than the game on PlayStation, but as there are new discoveries a higher percentage of people would then chose to play the game which involves actions and movements as it would be a kind of replication of the sport in reality.

Many gaming software's are now competing on the new systems they can create, currently Xbox has recently developed a modified software of the Wii, which is more realistic, sensitive and more of a simulation rather than a game.

Playing Playstation also has some risks, therefore it is suggested to take fifteen minute breaks in an hour if the player is feeling nauseous or the player should take a break from playing if he/she has a migraine.

Recent surveys done at The Nyal Golf and Country Club and Vipingo Ridge suggest that your concentration skills, observation, hand/ eye coordination and

ascertain iron yardage would improve different skills, though more than 75 per cent of the data received mentioned that PlayStation would not affect their golf game.

On the other hand, whilst investigating the impact it had on football, after an interview with Mr. Jesal Asodia, he mentioned that:

"In order to prove your hypothesis, it would be important to look at both sides of the problem, whether PlayStation impacts they way you play the sport or whether the sport impacts they way you play PlayStation.

After obtaining results, it was clear that some skills on the PlayStation cannot be done in reality and vice versa.

Do you think you could improve your skills by using PlayStation or do you think it is a waste of time?

Have a go, and see how you fair in different activities after playing PlayStation.

The outcome will prove itself immensely.

The third of the precious moments was in one of the mass transit systems I have had to use in my travels.

In the recent past I have described in detail the many mass transit systems there are in the different cities that Kachumbari had travelled in.

The one abiding constant about this mode of transport as indeed with all other modes is that the occupancy goes from almost nil to crowded then to packed in several cycles each day.

All have to run to fit in with the needs of the population that they serve and also in a lot of instances, to satisfy economic performance criteria.

A lot of mass transit systems have started off as government or state controlled entities that provide a needed service and that are backed by public funding.

This method of operation lends itself to inefficiencies since the costs are almost guaranteed irrespective of the quality of the delivery of the service.

The attitude seen is that this is a free state delivered service and you take it or leave it. That is the customer end of it.

Internally laxity tends to creep in, in terms of maintenance and operations efficiencies leading to a challenge in the regularity of the service and morale of the staff.

There has been a marked change over the years as mass transit systems that once used to be run by the state have been gradually transferred into public corporations that run as private companies but with certain minimum deliveries imposed by the state in terms of providing marginal services.

These are services that would not create a return for the operator but are required to meet

the social needs that the government has promised to deliver on.

These can range from personalised promises - where a senior government official ensures that their constituency or home village is served by the transport system - to where the state requires that really marginalised communities, where the operations will definitely, not raise money are served in terms of the promise to promote the development of such communities.

Other requirements could be that the service must run during hours that the number of passengers is not economic but that the area of operation is a productive or essential area that is required to be served.

This would be typical of a large industrial zone that runs round the clock and requires that the workers are provided with transport or instances where the central business district runs 24/7 and needs to get people in and out at a reasonable cost.

It is this later one that sets the scene for our third precious moment.

Typically efficient mass transit systems are set up in such a way that a passenger purchases a ticket at the start of the journey

and they are able to interchange through the system till they get to the end of their journey where the ticket then gets "invalidated" so that it cannot be used again.

Such systems will also have stations or terminuses that serve other forms of transport such as intercity trains or cross country bus stations.

More often they also now tend to provide transport up to the nearest major airports and cruise shipping ports.

This allows the passenger to plan their journey and minimise the number of transport mode changes that they have to make.

However it also means that each passenger must be alert to where they are supposed to change their transport mode or move from one line to another within the same system.

A passenger got on to the Metro in Washington and went and sat down quietly in a corner of the cabin.

It was in the mid afternoon when the system is relatively uncluttered and the frequency of the service is reduced to cater for the number of passengers expected to use the service.

After the stop the quiet passenger asked the person next to them whether the train was going to Baltimore, to a city some eighty kilometres away.

The other passenger was stunned at the question and was quiet for a few moments before

responding that the train they were on only served the urban area of Washington and did not go to the distant city.

The quiet passenger then asked the question again and got the same reply.

The passenger went back to contemplate and then asked a different person in the cabin the same question.

This time he was a bit louder and got the rest of the passengers to lower their voices and listen in on the conversation.

He got the same answer but was dismissed by the second person and told that if they did not know how to read the map of the Metro then they should not be on it.

The quiet passenger went ballistic at the affront to his "intelligence" and he began to berate the person who had told him to consult the Metro map.

A spirited argument ensued and the quiet passenger pushed the person away and began to address the whole cabin about how stupid they were and that they were not able to read the Metro map.

He told all and sundry that he was educated up to University level and reading a map was the easiest thing in the world and that he had done exactly that and was sure that he was on the right train.

The other passengers in the cabin moved away from him slowly and he walked up to them

show him where to get off.

This immediately made the formerly argumentative and abusive passenger to quieten down and begin to have a normal conversation.

At the appropriate stop, the remaining passenger told this mad guy that they should now get off.

He walked him up to the main train station at the terminus where they had got off and handed him over to the information desk having explained what had happened in the Metro.

The helpful passenger immediately vanished into the crowd and left the originally quiet passenger with the people who would now have the problem of working with him and who had hopefully been trained to handle such cases.

As Kachumbari says, there are many ways to skin a cat.

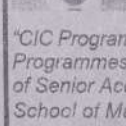

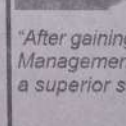

# Hamdan, Maria Declared Best Swimmers In Kenya

It is said that the National Swimming Competition which took place over the weekend at Oshwal Academy School was one of the toughest competition ever held.

With a total of 37 teams taking part from around Kenya and also teams from Uganda and Tanzania were present.

More than 480 swimmers took

part with a total of more than 2600 entries being witnessed.

And as this was a National event teams were only allowed to enter their cream swimmers in order to meet the qualifying times set by the National Federation.

This was another scary event for most of the swimmers but not for Mombasa Academy team!

With only six boys and six girls representing the Mombasa

Academy team in the individual events; they managed to finish in second place position scoring 445 points and also finishing in second place position in the medal standing.

The team also managed to break 15 records in total which includes 12 meet records and 3 Kenya records. Not forgetting the 46 medals which the team won. And that was not all!

Two Mombasa Academy swimmers were declared as best swimmers in Kenya in the open and age group category.

Among the top record breakers were the team captain Hamdan Bayusuf and the upcoming star Maria Brunlehner.

Hamdan Bayusuf smashed the 200m butterfly Kenya record which was held by Hamid Nasser set in 26<sup>th</sup> June 1999.

The old record time was 2.28.07 and Hamdan's new time now stands at 2.24.30.



It's all smiles for Mombasa Academy team after breaking 12 meet records and 3 Kenya records during the National Swimming Championships held at Oshwal Academy over the weekend. The team also won 46 medals in total with four of their swimmers being declared as best swimmers in Kenya. The team also finished in second position in the overall standing as well as in the medal standing.

Brunlehner also smashed the 4x100m Individual Medley Kenya record which was set back in 2001 by Nasra Shehan.

Old record time was 6.10.40 and Maria's new time now stands at 6.05.16.

Hamdan also broke 8 meet records which include 400m I.M, 200m I.M, 100m backstroke, 200m freestyle, 100m butterfly, 200m butterfly, 50m backstroke and 200m backstroke.

The 'super dolphin' Maria

Maria also went on to break the 100m freestyle Kenya record by erasing the old time of 1.09.50 to a new time of 1.08.97 which was held by Maria herself set two weeks ago during the CASA Age group swimming Championship.

Maria also broke 3 meet records which include 200m I.M, 50m backstroke and 50m freestyle.

The 46 medals won by Mombasa Academy swimmers came from the following swimmers; Danilo Rosafio won a silver medal in the 50m butterfly.

Melody Chiu, Priscah Maoga, Yusuf Salim and Alekh Singh each won a bronze medal in the 4x50m Medley relay.

Swaleh Talib won one gold, one silver and three bronze medals. Swaleh was also awarded a trophy for being the second runner up best swimmer in Kenya in 10-11 years category. Omar Talib won two bronze and one silver.

Deeyn Shah won two silver and two bronze medals. Maria Brunlehner won eight gold and two bronze medals. Maria was also awarded a trophy for being the best swimmer in Kenya in the 10-11 yrs girls' category.

Catherine Mason won four silver and three bronze medals. Catherine was also among the swimmers who broke the meet record in the 100m breast stroke and was awarded a trophy for being the second runner up best female swimmer in Kenya in the Open category.

Hamdan Bayusuf won seven gold medals, three silver and two bronze medals.

Hamdan was also awarded a trophy for being the best swimmer in Kenya in the open category seven times in a row.

Reasoning that West playing the Queen of Hearts made it more likely that East held the King, Declarer discarded a Club from hand.

West discarded, so Declarer cross-ruffed the last two tricks and claimed the slam.

## WORLD BANK AND KMSF ROAD SAFETY INITIATIVE

Kenya Motor Sports Federation (KMSF), the World Bank and various stake holders have entered into an innovative Road Safety initiative seeking to curb road carnage in the local transport sector.

To set the ball rolling, the World Bank has designed a modern drivers training institute which will be centered at Kasarani to combine Assimilation Training as well as the actual physical testing of knowledge of road rules and signals.

The reason to put up the Centre at Kasarani is as a result that the FIA (World Motorsports Governing body) and KMSF have taken a leading role in addressing issues pertaining to safety.

Last year, FIA President Mr. Jean Todt was in Kenya to address pertinent issues of road racing and road safety after which he expressed great concern on road accidents which are prevalent on Kenyan roads.

World Bank regional Road Safety specialist Victor Ako Mengot said the venue is ideal and convenient.

"We are looking at a combined way of working and there is no need to just provide the commercial side to the venue.

"We can also use it as an opportunity to train people in motorsports on road safety. So it's quite complementary to what we are doing and it's suitable as it's away from the main roads.

"It's also away from large

developments and you can give people the opportunity to learn, concentrate and test their skills," remarked the World Bank official.

This initiative is a partnership between the private sector, transport operators and owners

"The government is also working hard to ensure there is a curriculum for driver training, testing and certification.

"Once we put that together then we actually know the standards which we expect our drivers to

"The ball is in your court and football fraternity eyes are on Nyamweya to deliver", said Awiti.

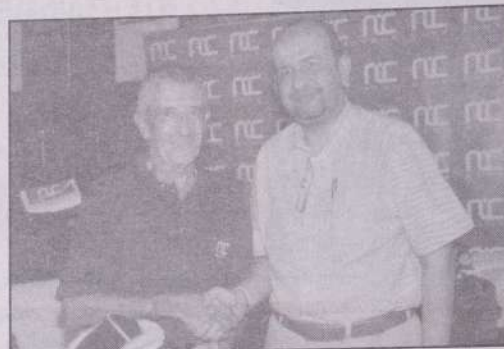
Awiti who spoke at the weekend after launching his football tournament at Khadija Primary School in Kisauni Constituency within Mombasa County, urged

## VETTEL KEEPS ON TRACK WITH PIRELLI

By winning his 11th grand prix this year, Red Bull Racing's Sebastian Vettel is still on course to equal the record for the most number of wins in one season: 13, held by Michael Schumacher from 2004.

The brand-new Buddh circuit on the outskirts of Delhi evolved considerably over the course of the weekend, with the times getting faster as the track cleaned and more rubber was laid down on the track.

The P Zero Yellow soft tyre and P Zero Silver hard tyre were nominated for the race, with the softer tyre proving to be around two seconds per lap faster than the harder compound.

This gave rise to some interesting strategies as the drivers tried to limit their running on the hard tyres.

Force India's Paul di Resta, Lotus Renault's Vitaly Petrov, and Sauber's Sergio Perez were the only drivers to start the race on the harder tyre, but they swiftly moved onto the soft tyre within five laps.

Vettel led from start to finish,

using a two-stop strategy to win from McLaren's Jenson Button — who made up two places from his grid position at the start of the race.

The top six all used a two-stop strategy, with Lewis Hamilton the highest-placed three-stopper in seventh following a collision.

Having dropped out of the top 10 following the clash with Hamilton, Felipe Massa was the first frontrunner to switch to the hard tyre on lap 31 but the Ferrari driver was unable to finish the race due to broken suspension.

His team mate Fernando Alonso used pit stop strategy to help secure a podium finish, stopping two laps after Red Bull Racing's Mark Webber for the hard tyres on lap 37.

The pair of them were separated by less than two seconds all the way to the finish.

Vettel, who had claimed pole position on Saturday, moved over to the hard tyre for his final stop with 13 laps to go.

The German also set the fastest lap of the race on the final lap with the hard P Zero Silver tyre, winning by 8.433s from Button.

Lotus Renault's Bruno Senna carried out the longest stint on the soft tyre during the race, lasting 34 laps, while Williams driver Rubens Barrichello completed the longest stint on the hard tyre, for

exactly 34 laps as well. Conditions were dry and warm throughout the race, which started with an ambient temperature of 31 degrees centigrade

and a track temperature of 37 degrees, in hazy sunshine.

Pirelli's motorsport director Paul Hembery commented:

"Without knowing exactly how the circuit would be, we decided to bring the hard tyre to India, which was a deliberately conservative choice.

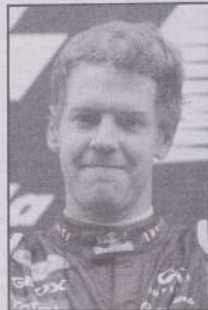
"This led to some very interesting strategies, with a few drivers running the hard compound at the very beginning of the race and others using it at the very end.

### FINAL PHASE

"The key element during the final phase of the race for the two frontrunners was understanding at which point a new set of hard tyres was quicker than a used set of softs.

"It was a tough race, but we saw very good durability from both compounds as well as excellent performance — with Vettel setting fastest lap of the race on the hard P Zero Silver tyre.

"We've also accumulated plenty of information which will be very useful when it comes to selecting our nominations for next year."

KMSF Chairman Dave Macharia said the Institute is a project that will start precisely early next year.

"Apart from Rallying, it's also aimed at going a long way in assisting in road safety initiatives but we would like to maintain this land mainly for the sport.

"Apart from development of the road safety initiative, we intend to have a Formula 3 track constructed on this land, which is at the lower side of the world famous Formula 1 sport.


"We will also build motocross, autocross and karting tracks," Macharia hinted.

In the meantime, KMSF is gaining ground on the proposed allocation of a 100-acre parcel of land on which a motorsports complex shall be constructed.

The same land where the Road safety institute will stand is located behind the main M.I.S.C. Kasarani Complex.
