

Muslims Conduct Idd Prayers

He called for peaceful co-existence between Kenyans who he said, should respect the rights of each other for a lasting peace

The chief scrutineer is Karl-Heinz Goldstein who for many years was responsible for engineering Safari-winning cars.

He and his team will look at all the cars entered to ensure that they comply in every way with the technical, safety and sporting requirements.

Meanwhile the assistant clerk of the course, Mike Summerfield from the UK, has been working hard with event director, Surinder Thatthi, to ensure that the eight days of rally route as well as the marshals to man the controls are clearly identified.

Already, the Kronos Vintage team from Belgium has arrived and they had tested their four beautiful Porsche 911 rally cars in Belgium before they were shipped.

Their drivers have expressed a great deal of optimism and hope to stage a great performance during the KQ Safari Classic.

Also spotted at Whitesands was

Canadian, Dr. Steven Funk of the Race4Change team. Race4Change has entered a Porsche 911 for Funk himself, another for Björn Waldegård and a third 911 to be driven by Travis Pastrana and Patrick Njiru who will share the driving.



The co-driver of this third car is Fabrizio Pons, famous for winning World Championship events in the 1980s with Michèle Mouton in an Audi Quattro.

Belgian Gerald Marcy and his team

have checked in at White-sands and their Porsche 911 is expected sometime tomorrow while Geoff Bell from South Africa landed in town last week.

What with the chance to see the rally cars at Whitesands, the spectator activity at this palatial hotel has been largely centred on its car parks but there has been plenty to observe else where. This is principally in Kilindini Harbour where the containers and rally cars are being unloaded and at Mombasa's Moi Inter-national Airport where the arrival lounge is full of people coming to take part in or to watch the KQ Safari Classic.

KQ Safari Classic traverses Kenya and Tanzania and will cover some 4,100 kilometres (2,500 miles) in eight days of competition before returning to finish at the Whitesands Hotel in Mombasa.

Just ten days after that, Mombasa also hosts the final round of the 2011 Kenyan National Rally Championship, the KCB Mtaani Rally.

When one travels extensively one has all sorts of experiences that enriches their lives and sometimes their repertoire of stories.

As you may have guessed, Kachumbari was out of Kenya recently and yes she did get to hear of another of those special moments whilst out there.

In this modern day and age hygiene has become an important aspect of the way we live.

It is expected that people will look after their bodies well and also look after their surroundings well also.

Translated to day to day activities, one is expected to have a shower or bath or some form of cleaning at least once a day but preferably twice. The need is normally accentuated when one has to go forth into the world and mingle with others.

It is all about avoiding odorous encounters but also just feeling fresh.

There is also a need to freshen up when one has been working hard or has been in an unclean environment.

This could be dusty, dirty, very hot or humid.

There is also the expectation that we all wear clean clothes and sleep on clean sheets and have clean houses and so forth and so on.

With all this cleaning and grooming going on there is a high demand for water to carry out these activities. This obviously puts a strain on water supplies that leads to innovations for supplying the water.

Recognising this, a large number of hotels in the world have started programmes that encourage guests to reuse their bedding and towels.

Typically most hotel visitors

and users expect that they will get fresh crisp linen and towels every day as part of what they pay for and expect as service.

So in response, the house keeping staff are instructed to change sheets, pillow cases, towels, mats and any other loose linen in the hotel room.

This obviously results in a heavy load for the laundry.

This in turn puts a lot of stress on the effluent water from the hotel.

Some have tried to condition the water before it leaves the compound and gets into the public sewers but this is an onerous task.

So innovation is that guests are now asked to volunteer and agree that they can reuse their linen several times before it is changed.

Most hotels ask the guests to take positive action when they need their linen to be changed.

The common way is to ask guests to put whatever they want changed on the floor in the bathroom.

Should the guest not want the linen changed they are expected to hang them on the hooks behind the doors or on the racks provided.

Kachumbari arrived to check in to a five star hotel in Helsinki and found a big argument going on.

There was this couple who were having a go at the front office desk fellow. The lady was berating the employee about the fact that the linen in their room had not been changed.

The employee, who had by this

time called the housekeeping manager, was trying to explain that the hotel's policy was very clear.

When the guest wanted the linen changed, they were to put the items on the ground and that would be the sign for the housekeepers to do so.

At this point in the proceedings, the hotel manager arrived and asked to be part of the

conversation.

He was told what had happened and how the guests had expected their linen to be changed despite the fact that they had not put anything on the ground to indicate their wish.

The manager supported his employees and the lady got even angrier.

She informed the hotel staff that her upbringing was such that anyone leaving things lying around in the room was considered untidy and she did not expect any less from a hotel with the reputation of the one in which they were staying.

The husband on the other hand was fully sympathetic with the hotel staff and sided with them in the argument.

This made the wife even angrier and the racket around to change or not to change the linen increased.

Eventually, the hotel manager

brought everyone round to a point where it was agreed that the hotel would make an exception for the couple for the period they were there and that their linen would be changed every day but that they would pay an extra premium which would go towards the hotels environmental kitty.

This arrangement seemed to please everyone especially the staff who were so committed to the greenness of the hotel that they were loathe to let anyone hint in any way that they weren't.

The management agreed to match the contribution of the guests dollar-for-dollar and at the end of the stay they had raised over two thousand dollars for the environmental kitty that the hotel ran. At the end of the day, what raised the money was the clash between the old form of neat and hygienic and the new form.

The old form required that strict order be placed in the home by not littering in any way.

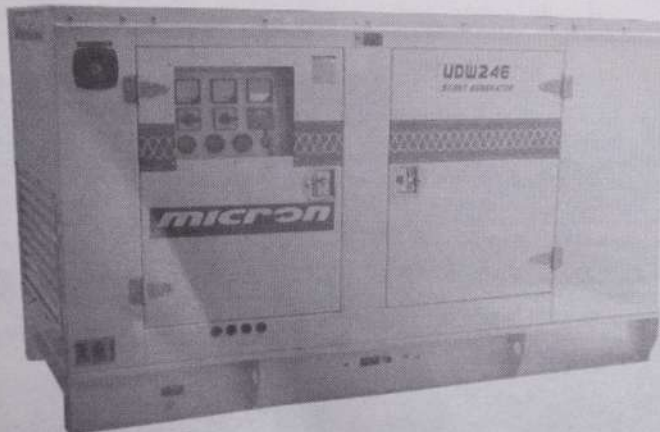
Strewing clothes on the floor for whatever reason was considered untidy and as such was frowned upon. In the modern age, it was instead an indication of the wish to comply with an environmentally friendly policy in a hotel.

There were several guests who did not mind paying the extra even if they did not necessarily have to have the linens changed.

It became a new and fashionable way of contributing to the conservation efforts of the hotel. As Kachumbari says, innovation is everywhere - even where least expected.
