Just ten days after that, Mombasa also hosts the final round of the 2011 Kenyan National Rally Championship, the KCB Mtaani Rally.

This obviously results in a neavy load for the laundry.

This in turn puts a lot of stuff in the effluent water from the hotel.

Some have tried to condition the water before it leaves the compound and gets into the public sewers but this is an onerous task.

So innovation is that guests are now asked to volunteer and agree that they can reuse their linen several times before it is changed.

Most hotels ask the guests to take positive action when they need their linen to be changed.

The common way is to ask guests to put whatever they want changed on the floor in the

Should the guest not want the linen changed they are expected to hang them on the hooks behind doors or on the racks provided

Kachumbari arrived to check in to a five star hotel in Helsinki and found a big argument going

There was this couple who were having a go at the front office desk fellow. The lady was berating the employee about the fact that the linen in their room had not been changed.

The employee, who had by this

time called the housekeeping manager, was trying to explain that the hotel's policy was very

A Five Star Hotel Where Guests

When the guest wanted the linen changed, they were to put the items on the ground and that would be the sign for the housekeepers to do so.

At this point in the proceedings, the hotel manager arrived and asked to be part of the

conversation.

He was told what had happened and how the guests had expected their linen to be changed despite the fact that they had not put anything on the ground to indicate their wish.

The manager supported his employees and the lady got even

She informed the hotel staff that her upbringing was such that anyone leaving things lying around in the room was considered untidy and she did not expect any less from a hotel with the reputation of the one in which they were staying.

The husband on the other hand was fully sympathetic with the hotel staff and sided with them in the argument.

This made the wife even angrier and the racket around to change or not to change the linen

Eventually, the hotel manager

where it was agreed that the hotel would make an exception for the couple for the period they were there and that their lines would be changed every day but that they would pay an extra premium which would go towards the hotels environmental kitty.

This arrangement seemed to please everyone especially the staff who were so committed to the greenness of the hotel that they were loathe to let anyone

hint in anyone way that they

The management agreed to match the contribution of the guests dollar-for-dollar and at the end of the stay they had raised over two thousand dollars for the environmental kitty that the hote!

ran. At the end of the day, what raised the money was the clash between the old form of neat and hygienic and the new form.

The old form required that strict order be placed in the home by not littering in any way.

Strewing clothes on the floor for whatever reason was considered untidy and as such was frowned upon. In the modern age, it was instead an indication of the wish to comply with an environmentally friendly policy

There were several guests who did not mind paying the extra even if they did not necessarily have to have the linens changed.

It became a new and fashionable way of contributing to the conservation efforts of the hotel As Kachumbari says innovation is everywhere - ever where least expected.


