

# Millions For Public Beach Hawkers

#### TOURISM TRUST FUND SIGNS KSH 23.2 MILLION FINANCE AGREEMENT FOR LIBERARING SERVICES

The Tourism Trust Fund (TTF) has signed a finance agreement with Mombasa boat operators, Jomo Kenyatta Public Beach Hawkers self help Group and Jomo Kenyatta Public Beach Tube Renters Association valued at Ksh 23.2 Million for the development and upgrading of their services.

The funding will be used to purchase pedal riding boats, a 25 seater bus to transport tourists to popular tourism spots around Mombasa, construct a Lunch Banda along the Mtwapa Creek, which will offer seafood as well as traditional and Swahiil dishes, a fun fair and a boutique cum curio shop which will be an outlet for cultural and religious wares, fashionable designs, carvings, art and design, and swimming costumes.

TTF CEO Dr. Dan Kagagi said that beach products should be developed to give a variety and improve the quality of the services offered to the increasing number of tourists who flock the beaches.

"We have beautiful beaches which are frequented by many people and there is need to offer quality services which are also varied so as to keep the tourists coming back to our beaches.

"Both domestic and international tourists need to feel that the services they are getting are worth their money," Said Dr. Kagagi.

He added that with Improved services the beach operators will also benefit economically and raise their standards of living.

"By improving the services there will be an increase in revenue to all the beach operators which translates to an improvement in the in the living standards and also an increase in employment."

The Minister of Tourism and Wildlife, Hon Morris Dzoro, thanked TTF and the EU for their funding support

officially registered in 2000 with
the Department of Social
Services with the primary
objective of instilling discipline
among tube renters in order to
restore confidence in their
services.

Jomo Kenyatta Public Beach Hawkers Self-help Group was formed and registered in 1999 under the Ministry of Culture and

Social Services.

The group was formed to provide members with a common front as well as to pool resources together in order to uplift both group and individual welfare.

It has its own bank account and has been involved in communal beach cleaning activities.

Members of the group have been running individual businesses in semi-permanent structures along the Jomo Kenyatta Public Beach.

 The Tourism Trust Fund, (TTF) was established in 2002 through an agreement by the European Union and the Government of Kenya.

The EU has committed Euro 22 million (Ksh 2.2 billion) to the fund to be used to in the development of Kenya's tourism up to 2007.

The major role of the TTF is to fund the Kenya Tourist Board's international marketing programme and to fund new tourism projects that will offer visitors a new experience in Kenya, while at the same time conserving the environment

TTF has been very successful in both areas.

To date it has funded 33 projects at a value of Ksh 294 million shillings and contributed a total of Ksh 645 million to KTB for its international marketing programmes.

TTF is a funding body and its key objective is to help eradicate poverty through tourism.

The TTF allocates grants to proposals that meet the required criteria.

Under the TDSDP programme TTF funds small scale enterprises develop and sustain tourism projects that offer a new experience away from the traditional beach and safari

Projects that maintain and preserve the environment, traditional culture and work closely with local communities are given preference.





# Twenty Seven Years Ago

### Coastweek, August 24 - 30, 1979:

Operation Census: Kenyans were gearing up Friday night for the 1979 population census which was estimated to cost KSh. 45 million.

In Mombasa, projected to have about 413,000 residents, all bars, restaurants and nightspots were to close at 5.00 p.m. to facilitate the exercise and allow people to be counted at home.

According to the 1979 Kenya Population Census Guide, the 1989 census showed that Kenya's population was just under eleven million and growing at a rate of 3.3 per cent each year, the highest rate in the world.

This meant that if the population continued to grow at that rate, Kenya's population would double in another 21 years.

Muslims were celebrating Idd ul Fitr marking the end of the holy month of Ramadhan with a special Idd message from kenya's Chief Kadhi, Sheikh Abdullah Saleh Farsi.

A four-man team from the Indian Institute of Petroleum Exploration were making preliminary analyses with help from the University of Daries Salaam on traces of oil found at Songo Songo in Kilwa District, Tanzania.

The Tanzanian government meanwhile imposed restrictions on the sale of petrol to further conserve the fuel.

NAAZ cinema was ending its run of 'Scandal in the Family' and moving on to 'Heroes' starring Henry Winkler and Sally Field.

REGAL cinema was showing 'Edge of Fury' a Kung-Fu flick starring Yasuki Kurata and Bruce Lee look-alike Ho Chung Tao.

Meanwhile, KENYA cinema was winding down its run of Moonraker' and despite extra shows added to their schedule, queues continued to build at the booking office.

At the CHOX it was Randhir Kapoor and Jaya Badhuri in Jawani Diwani' (Crazy Youth).

Letter writers included Abdala wa Khalidi of Takaunga who urged readers "In the name of women's rights" and "In the name of unadulterated Christianity" to "not abolish the right to polygamy" following "recent debate and rejection of the Marriage Bill by Parliament which focussed attention on the African and Islamic institution of polygamy."

Others were Mbogholi wa Maghanga, G. L. Antoni, Mishi Mwachatam of Kwale and Nabila Ali and Shelina Vellani of Mombasa.

TOP TEN on the music charts compiled by 'Disco Bug' saw 'Bad Girls' by Donna Summer rising from sixth place to the number one slot, pushing "Good Times" by Chic down to number two. Three new entries, "Bright Eyes" by Art Garfunkel, "Bridge Over Troubled Waters" by Linda Clifford and "Ring My Bell" by Anita Ward filled in slots seven, eight and nine respectively, while "Boogle Wonderland" by Earth, Wind and Fire looked set to leave the Top Ten, sliding to number ten from number three the previous week.

## There Was This Gaping Hole In The Ground

### FAMILIAR BARITONE WAS RAISED IN PROTEST AND WAS COMING FROM INSIDE THE MANHOLE

We touched Last week on the dangers posed by work around roads

These works if not properly protected and signposted could result in serious injuries or even

We said that they could affect pedestrians, cyclists and motorists alike.

In this case, it is the fact that the work has brought the hazards into existence that we felt was

The Town Fathers should know to arrange the work better or protect road users by properly delineating or marking the

However, there is also a cause of accidents that is self inflicted due to recent dramatic lifestyle change.

Kachumbari told me of two-instances where this resulted in serious injuries.

We will take one this week

A gentlemen was walking ahead of him on a street in Mwambao and at about the same

The reason this fellow stood

out was that he was tall, well built and was quite snazzily

He literally stuck out of the crowd and one could not help but be drawn to him.

They walked almost in formation for about fifty metres.

He had an extremely loud baritone voice that cut through all the cacophony normally associated with a busy street.

His arms were also flying all over the place and other pedestrians had to duck out of the way to avoid them.

The fellow walked for quite a distance and was in intense conversation with whoever loorrespondence was.

Other people gave him a wide berth for the simple reason that they did not make eye contact and they know that he was not noticing them coming

The next thing that happened was that his head suddenly disappeared from being above

A few seconds later, the conversation suddenly stopped and the street seemed to momentarily go quiet.

A short while later there was a lot of commotion as people rushed to a spot on the street.

Kachumbari also rushed there ready to offer his medical service in the event that it was needed.

When he got there, he found that a crowd had formed around a large drainage manhole that had no manhole cover.

There was a gaping hole in the ground

There was also the familiar baritone voice but this time it was raised in protest and the owner of the voice was using choice words about his condition

The voice was coming from the manhole.

The fellow who was talking on the mobile phone was so engrossed in the conversation that he did not notice the hazard on the street and he stepped right into the manhole in full

As his hands were occupied, he did not have the time to respond to his changing circumstances and even try and grab the edges of the hole

He went straight down with the mobile phone still in one of his

Wananchi were quick to

A torch aggeared from nowhere and they were able to rapidly assess the condition of the fellow in the hole.

They confirmed from him that there were no serious injuries.

Once that was done, a makeshift ladder was commandeered from some workers who were hanging up some advertising outside a shop

This was lowered into the manhole and the fellow hauled

himself up

Kachumbari attended to him and declared that there was nothing damaged.

The only thing that was probably damaged was the fellow's ego.

He had been smartly turned out and was now a study of rough

He had a proud and confident demeanour before the incident but he now wanted to sink into a hole to get away from the stares and comments tat were going round as a result of the incident.

The worst thing as far as he was concerned, and he told a friend who happened to be passing by, was that he felt very silly for having got himself into the situation in the first place.

The fellow composed himself and then quietly left the scene as the crowd continued to grow bigger as result of other curious people stopping to find out why there was a crowd in the first place and then staying on to discuss the rather bizarre though not unexpected incident that had just occurred. just occurred.

Coming back the other way a few hours later, Kachumbari noticed that the manhole was still open and people were flirting dangerously with its open mouth.




