Charity Cardiac Clinics For Children At Aga Khan Hospital Mombasa

The Aga Khan hospital, Mombasa once again held a successful paediatric Cardiac Clinic on Friday 25th August 2006.

Dr Tulloh a paediatric cardi-ologist with the help of the hospital's resident paediatrician, Dr Mwanisha Hatimy and Dr Alim saw a total of 120 children of who 60 will receive surgery.

The clinic was organized by the hospital's Paediatric Support Group (a team of volunteers who give support to families with children who suffer chronic conditions) in conjunction with London's MEAK Charity Project team and donors.

These clinics normally happen annually or bi-annually and are targeted at children who are already known to suffer heart conditions and due to financial constraints may not have access to good medical attention.

As part of the Aga Health Services network Cardiology Program the children who need complicated surgeries will be facilitated to have them done in future at the Aga Khan University Hospital, Nairobi and thereafter be cared for closer home at The Aga Khan Hospital, Mombasa.

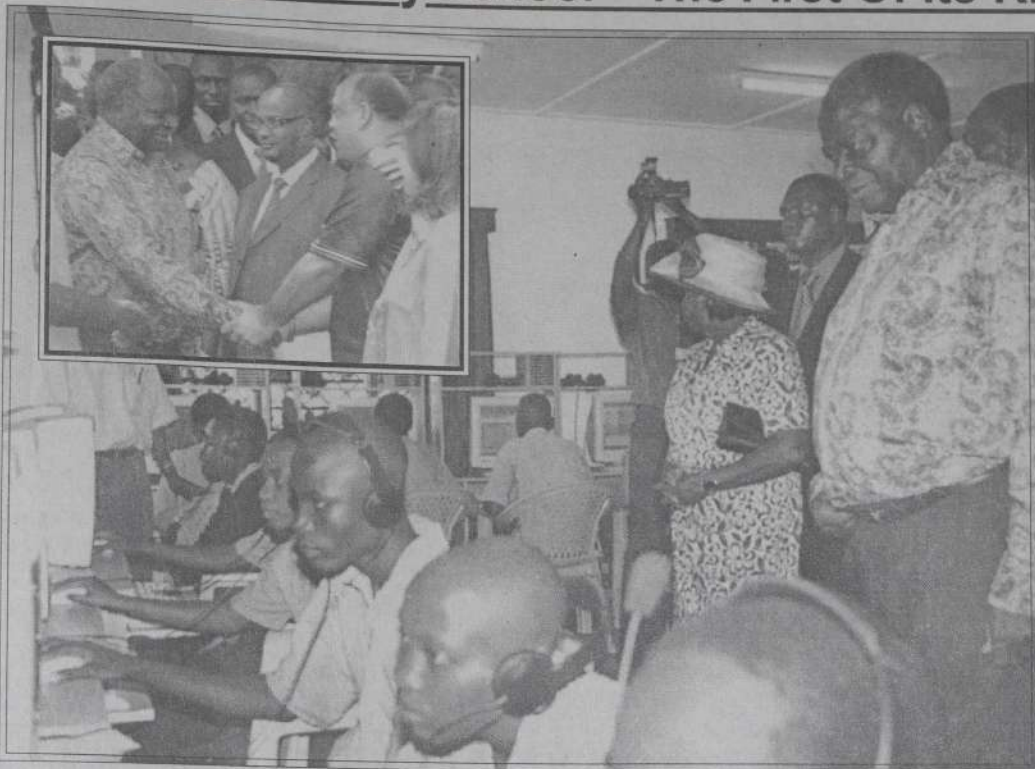

President Kibaki Opens E-School Computer Laboratory At Kikambala Primary School – The First Of Its Kind In Africa

Through a public-private partnership between Sun N Sand Beach Resort and The Microsoft Consortium the E-School lab was launched in June 2006 and officially opened on 30th August 2006 by His Excellency the President of The Republic of Kenya Hon. Mwai Kibaki, during his recent working tour of the Coast.

Kikambala Primary School a rural school in Kilifi District has become a pioneer in Information Communication and Technology (ICT) as it is the first Primary School in Africa to have e-learning facilities that include VSAT internet connection, 23 branded computers, and a fully furnished classroom with a smart electronic board.

The programme enables the school to carry out interactive learning with other schools globally and the concept is aimed at equipping and training of students and teachers with relevant computer skills curriculum development.

The ten year NEPAD flagship E-Schools lab initiative involves establishment of an Africa-wide satellite network that will connect the schools to the internet as well as to points within each country from which, educational content will be fed to the school on a continuous basis.

The Lab was constructed by Sun N Sand Beach Resort whilst the equipment was donated by the Microsoft Consortium.

At the onset of this initiative Sun N Sand Beach Resort also sponsored the Head teacher

Mr. Francis Wanje and a standard eight pupil, Tyme Kazungu to a Microsoft-organized Conference in South Africa in May 2006 dubbed 'Accelerating Africa's Global Competitiveness' which was addressed by Microsoft Chair man Bill Gates and former US President Bill Clinton and was attended by the Presidents of Tanzania and Zanzibar among others.

Famous Blind German Singer Joana Zimmer Will Stage Charity Concert At Sarova Whitesands Hotel Mombasa

Joana Zimmer, the famous blind German singer will be visiting various programmes for disabled people in Kenya from 10th to 18th of September and will stage a charity concert in Mombasa.

This will be her first official tour as a "Good will ambassador" for the "Christian Blind Mission".

She stated "It is my desire to support the objectives of this

organisation as a Good Will ambassador". The 22-year old blind singer who impresses with her captivating voice is aware that there are many blind people who need support.

"Since I understand the challenges blind people face, it is my desire to partner with the mission and I am really looking forward to visit the projects in Kenya".

The focus of her tour will be Mombasa and Kikuyu.

At the Coast she will be visiting the Bombolulu workshops and the children Rehabilitation Clinic at Port Reitz.

Apart from the workshops where disabled people produce unique crafts she will also visit blind people who run their own business.

Joana Zimmer will stage a charity concert at the Whitesands

Hotel on Wednesday 13th September in conjunction with the Bombolulu cultural and fashion show.

Proceeds will go towards surgery of disabled children.

In Kikuyu near Nairobi Joana Zimmer will meet another "Good Will ambassador" of the Mission, Henry Wanyoike, the worlds fastest blind marathon runner.

The "Christian Blind Mission" supports the Kikuyu Eye Hospital and a programme for children and youth with low vision.

Henry Wanyoike became blind in 1995 at the age of 21 and was rehabilitated by the Kikuyu Eye hospital. He has meanwhile initiated three own programmes and reciprocates for the assistance he received.

Joana Zimmer and Henry Wan-

yoike met during a Triathlon in Germany this year and they both intend to practise together during this visit.

Tickets for the charity concert at Whitesands Hotel are available at Kshs. 3,000 incl. dinner or at Kshs. 2,000 for the concert only at Bombolulu Workshops, Whitesands Hotel and other hotels and shops.

Married Using 'Sign Language' In The Catholic Church Of Mombasa

An extraordinary event took place at the Star of the Sea Youth Hall, on August, 26, 2006. Mr. Stephen E. Kanyua and the former Miss Constance Kulola had their marriage blessed before friends, and relatives, and a group of supporters.

What was extraordinary is that Mr. Kanyua is Deaf, and through the use of sign language he expressed his consent, and took part in the liturgy actively and consciously.

The use of sign language is a new phenomenon in the Catholic Church in Mombasa.

But the task of the church is to reach out to all in its embrace.

A number of deaf couples are preparing for marriage while primary school children are being prepared to receive Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.

The Ministry to the Deaf was initiated by Caroline Stanfill, a Maryknoll lay volunteer, early this year.

Hopefully a few priests, sisters, and lay people will volunteer their time and effort in learning sign language.

What Continues To Be Problem Of Getting Water Into Our Taps

WHY ARE THE GOVERNMENT WATER AUTHORITIES SO SILENT ?

With an abundant supply of underground water in Mombasa one asks what continues to be the problem in getting it into the taps of 'ALL' consumers.

For many their taps have remained dry for some considerable time, yet others are getting virtually a daily supply.

Why should there be such a shortage and how quickly can it be resolved.

If it is a question of replacing old pipes, like the ones from Mzima and Baricho, let it be done as soon as possible for it has been proved that patching up old pipes is not the answer.

I have been told that as far as Mombasa is concerned the most important one is from Baricho, but also urgently needing attention there is the power supply for the efficient running of borehole pumps.

Today, one often finds in hotels, restaurants and airports unflushed toilets. With no water in their cisterns people have got out of the habit of doing, so.

Vigilant Toilet Attendants are needed.

In July 2005, the Coast Water Services Board received a mandate from the Ministry of Water and Irrigation to provide water and sewerage services in the coast region.

It does not provide these directly but through various Water and Sewerage Companies - one being for Mombasa.

Early last year I had been receiving from the then National Water Conservation and Pipeline Corporation a plentiful supply on three days of each week.

In the past eight months I have received water from the Mombasa Water and Sewerage Company only on five occasions, sometimes filling only two or three buckets.

There is nothing wrong with the pipes here. It is all a question of the tank being starved of water.

I am sorry to say that as far as many others and I are concerned, the water situation in Mombasa since the CWSB and MWSC were set up has not improved at all.

I have been asking the latter to

let me know how it is dealing with this problem, but despite promises nothing has materialised.

In desperation many have put in their own boreholes disregarding the regulation they should be fifty metres away from buildings with toilets.

Beach hotels have not only established their own boreholes but purification plants as well.

Large families are having to spend much money on buying borehole water.

They do not know from where it comes or if the borehole has been inspected and 'approved'.

No one tells us how it should be treated to make it safe for drinking. Why are the authorities so silent?

Surely, Coast Members of Parliament should be to the forefront in urging government to prioritise the availability of water to all.

More than anything else it will help them get votes in the next General Election.

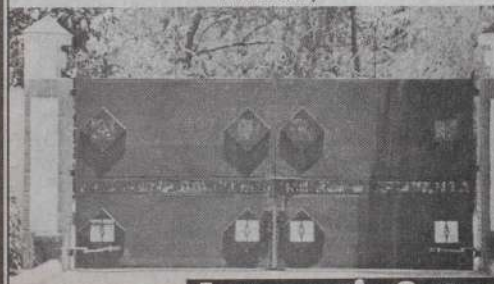

Well-known angler Alfredo Santagati was running water sports and sea safaris from the 406-bed Nyali Beach Hotel.

British Council organised a crash course on language development for 300 primary school teachers at Mombasa primary school.

AAZ Cinema was commencing its screening of "Pretty Boy," starring 12-year old Brooke Shields in a controversial film which depicted an image of an adult world seen through the eyes of a child. KENYA Cinema was showing "Thank God It's Day," with the playful catchline, "After 5,000 years of civilization-we all need a break." REGAL Cinema, meanwhile, wed to popular demand and brought back the epic "The Ten Commandments." CHOX was showing Sanjeev Kumar in "Apne Rang Hazaar," ("I have a thousand colours").

Guest writers included A. Frank Tenai of Kwale; Magbell A.S. of Riyadh, Saudi Arabia; Mustafa Said Khalil, Razia Shamedali and Bashir Akhtar all of Mombasa; Peter Wafula (Nairobi); and Zakir Datto, treasurer of the Nyali Residents' Association.

One of Kenya's top sprinters for several years, Tariq Mohamed (Nairobi), who was killed by armed robbers in his Nairobi home, is mourned by T.L.

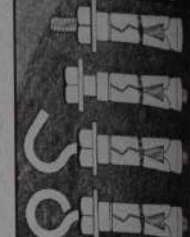

Mghendi said his sub-branch has decided to change the name because Lota Motors Limited has sponsored the league to the tune of Sh 60,000.

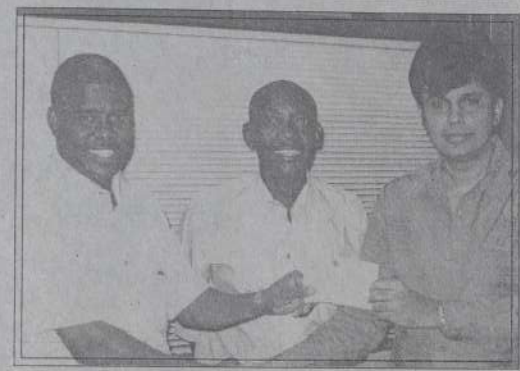
