

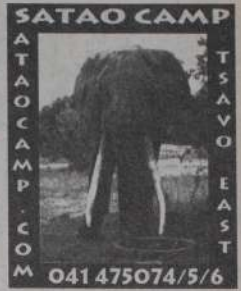

A British organisation has intensified training on leadership qualities in Kenya as part of efforts to meet the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

Speaking during the graduation of a group of 20 leaders under the programme at Mombasa Club, Stevens said quality leadership would have a positive input in community projects.

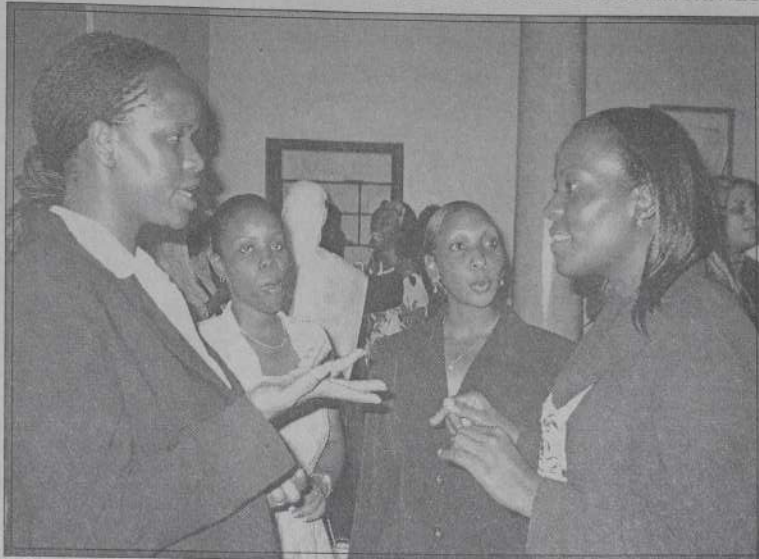
CONTRIBUTION

"The interaction leadership is an innovative programme of learning, great conversations and action in leadership by committed people of all ages who are passionate about Africa," Stevens says.

The programme also encourages people to think and act differently and encourage their contribution to bringing transformation to the continent.

By recognising Africa's contributions to the world, the "deficit" view of the continent can be challenged, she explains.

The interaction leadership training which takes a year covers 19 countries in Africa and explores possibilities and opportunities to help transform Africa.

The countries under the programme are Kenya, Nigeria, Ghana, Sierra Leone, Senegal, Cameroon, Tanzania, Uganda, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Sudan, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Malawi, Botswana, Namibia, Mauritius, Mozambique and South Africa.

The programme which started two years ago targets young leaders where participants attend workshops and go for exchange visits.

The programme which is in line with the New Partnership for Africa's Development (Nepad) has trained 630 participants and directly reached 10,000 people through community networking.

A beneficiary of the programme in Kenya Ms Christine Kipsang says it provides awareness and education necessary to inject leadership in projects that benefit the poor.

Kipsang who is a Mombasa advocate says the fact that the programme involves interaction among participants from a number of African countries enables the young leadership share exchange diverse views and experience.

"This programme programme awareness and education since it is interactive in nature.

"It focus on the poor and through it, Africans can help their lot," she said, full of praise.

Stevens says the programmes works on principles of "goodwill and good intent".

By adopting an appreciative approach, the participants can begin to activate their leadership potential with renewed confidence and play their part in developing a new perspective of Africa in the 21 century.

The British Council has already trained the first two groups of leaders and has just taken in the third lot this year as it intensifies the training.

those undergoing training run community groups with as many as 700 members," Stevens explains.

She explained that participants visit various African countries as they train before meeting to share their experiences.

Among other issues, the participants are trained to manage conflicts, questioning and communication.

This is aimed to form change agents and future leaders who would manage change and international partnership.

"Interaction, is based on the mutual beneficial principle of developing a modern and forward-looking relationship between Africa and the rest of the world based on trust, shared values and mutual interest," she said.

We will continue this week to look at the impact of the Michuki rules on public transportation.

A common myth about the Rules is that they are meant for matatus or vehicles engaged in the carriage of fare paying passengers.

This could not be further from the truth.

The Rules are just a selection of the statutes that govern proper and efficient road usage.

Seat belts for example cut across all forms of road vehicles.

So long as it has four wheels, it is expected that any seated passenger will have access to and will wear a seat belt whilst the vehicle is in motion.

Speed control is also in the statutes.

As we covered earlier, the roads are clearly zoned for speed according to the law and we are expected to follow the speed limits set for those zones.

The fact that we ignore them does not make them go away.

All that Uncle John did was to punish the regular offenders (read matatus) by deciding that since they were not self regulating in the area of speed, they would have to fit speed limiters so that they cannot go beyond the absolute maximum.

They are however still able to and do break the rules in urban areas where they are expected to travel at fifty kilometres an hour.

They travel at up to eighty if they can!

What would happen if the Ministry of transport decided that the carriage from normal private vehicles was too high?

It is conceivable that one bold Minister might decide that all

private vehicles should also be fitted with speed governors that limit the maximum speed they can be driven at.

This would translate to one hundred and ten kilometres an hour for non commercial vehicles and eighty kilometres an hour for all commercial vehicles including pickups.

What a turn on this would be.

The time taken for longer journeys would be increased.

speed governors to private vehicles?

There would be a huge debate I am sure.

We should become responsible enough to obey the traffic rules voluntarily to avoid the need for Draconian enforcement.

There are many upsides to voluntary compliance.

Stress levels would stop rising and could get quite low.

Driving would become a pleasurable activity rather than the necessary chore it is to some people.

It was interesting to hear further from Kachumbari that Uncle

John did record some positives for the matatu operators when he introduced the rules.

These have sadly been lost in the mad rush to own stages, increase the number of trips and generally fall back into the status quo that the owners and drivers seemed to enjoy.

The first real gain that some of the more discerning operators who actually run the businesses professionally noticed was that their maintenance costs had dropped drastically.

They were able to measure it because they kept proper records.

One example was the reduction in the replacement frequency of simple brake pads.

Before the Rules, one of the

operators used to replace brake pads on the matatu once a week.

After they kicked in, his replacement period increased to one month.

The lower speed at which the vehicles operated combined with the courtesy forced on the drivers resulted in driving habits that were kind for the brakes.

On this alone, the payback for the speed governors was probably about six months.

There were obviously more savings on other wear and tear including the suspension, linkage bushes and other similar consumables.

The oil drainage interval was also increased when the vehicles were driven more gently and smoothly.

In one instance the oil change interval moved from five thousand kilometres to twelve thousand kilometres.

Other improvements were in the number of trips.

By behaving courteously one in fact is able to get through traffic quicker than when one bullies other road users.

The more courteous matatu drivers did not indulge in overloading hence the loading and unloading of passengers took a much shorter time than when they were packed.

Stopping at agreed places meant that there would be improved efficiency in the utilisation of the vehicle.

All these and more aspects

when combined meant that the matatu actually returned a better margin for the operator than when driven and used in eth traditional manner.

In short, the Michuki Rules did not only bring sanity to the roads but they also made good business sense for those who were following them.

There is still a number who continue to follow the Rules because they have good reason to. However, the hecklers, who were probably not following their businesses as closely as they should have been, have returned to their old habits in full voice and full throttle and cannot see

the wood for the trees

They continue in blissful ignorance of the potential that their business has and what they are not tapping.

In a few months or months couple years at the most, they will have fully dissipated their profits as they will now be subsidising the cost instead of reaping the rewards.

It will lead to a downward spiral in the business and eventual bankruptcy.

As Kachumbari says, instead of having fully depreciated matatus it would make for better sense to have the fully depreciated!

of the week. For the past eight months from the new establishments I have had water for at a short while on about five occasions providing just about three or four buckets each time.

For several weeks I have been asking MWSC to let me know what the problems are for publication in Coastweek.

It might help in getting something done.

Perhaps MPs busily engaged in planning for the next General election might spare time to help.

I will surely win them votes. Sources of water are Baricho, Mzimba and Marere pipelines and boreholes.

Baricho that Mombasa believes the most.

Meanwhile, many have to rely on private boreholes and vendors for their supply.

Said Mr. Z.K. Nderu, Chairman, Environment Trust of Kenya 'I think the problem is one of timing and he alleged, 'misuse the little money they have'

Maybe, we should go back to the old arrangement with the National Water Conservation Pipeline Corporation which is supplying water to many of no longer have it.

Let us bring local MPs on board we are not seeing any benefits from reforms in water supply and distribution.

Meanwhile, we are going ahead have water tested from boreholes and the pipeline'.

Mr. Nderu mentioned that 'some drinks being sold on the streets are made from borehole water'.

Said Dr. Yossa, Vice Chairman of the Mombasa Medical Association, who is also a member of the Public Health Committee, 'we recognise this as a problem.

We have a committee and it is taking this up as one of the major priority issues both locally and with the national committee.

We also have in mind that the 2007 World Cross-Country Championships take place in Mombasa next March.

They too must have clean water'.

Totally Rotten Infrastructure

Commented Mohamed Hersi, Chairman, Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers, Coast, 'hotels rely for water on the Mombasa Water and Sewerage Company, and on boreholes and are getting enough.

I believe the problem to be the rotten infrastructure.

Water pipes are rusty and need to be replaced.

It is high time a big investment is made in the infrastructure for it must be realised that the population of Mombasa has risen twenty times.

Untreated borehole water is also a health hazard and needs to be dealt with as well.

Significant Number Of Appurtenances And Structures Need Rehabilitation ...

Statement outlining current supply situation issued by Coast Water Services Board and the Mombasa Water and Sewerage Company;

Overall Physical Situation:
Most of the distribution network are old (70 years for the Marere line, 40 years for Mzima related piping and 20 years for Sabaki pipeline).

In many areas the soils are corrosive and effect ferrous pipes, valves and fittings.

Pressed steel water storage tanks have been severely affected by the corrosive marine environment.

Design By Sub-System At Mombasa Island (South and North)

Existing Situation:
Two terminal reservoirs currently supply these areas; Nguu Tatu (capacity 27,100m³) situated in North Mainland and Changamwe 60 meters above sea level (capacity 27,000m³) situated in West Mainland.

The current supply situation therefore, results from an insufficient bulk supply and also from inequitable distribution of the water with some consumers enjoying continuous flow since they are well located or have the benefit of sufficient storage, while other consumers need to complement, partially or fully, their supply from other sources.

A summary of the existing mains is as follows:

1. GI pipes ranging from 75mm to 150mm diameter **six km**
2. CI pipes ranging from 75mm to 200mm diameter **eight km**
3. AC pipes ranging from 75mm to 200mm diameter **48 km**
4. Steel pipes ranging from 150mm to 900mm diameter **11 km**

Total 73 km

Considering their age (over 30 years old), the condition of AC pipes is very good as compared with some old ferrous pipes, which are corroded.

Water Demand: The residential water demand varies within a narrow range since the population density is already high in addition the reduction of leaks should compensate for the increase in water demand that will result from the progressive development of commercial and institutional facilities.

Therefore, the water demand from Mombasa Island is currently estimated at 48,000m³/d i.e. at the seasonal peak gross demand.

North Mainland (Kisauni And Nyali)

Existing Situation:

One services reservoir currently supply these areas.

Nguu Tatu at 65 meters above sea level (capacity 27,100m³) stores water transmitted by the Sabaki pipeline.

Nguu Tatu, the main reservoir supplies Kisauni, Nyali and portion of Mombasa Island.

They link the main across Nyali Bridge, which connects the Island and North Mainland, allows for supply in both directions.

Over the past decade, the North Mainland area has been characterized by a very high growth rate and hence increased water demand.

Below is a summary of the existing mains.

- 1) GI pipes ranging from 75 to 150mm diameter **23 km**
- 2) GI pipes ranging from 75 to 300mm diameter **56 km**
- 3) UPVC pipes ranging from 75 to 500 mm diameter **98 km**
- 4) DI pipes ranging from 200 to 800mm diameter **23 km**

Total 200 km

The condition of most of the pipes is good, except in the Nyali Area, where neem trees have penetrated the pipes causing blockages.

This phenomenon exacerbated by the lack of pressure in the network and the age of the pipes, is observed more often in AC pipes from 150mm in diameter and below.

In addition, a number of large diameter mains have frequent leaks.

A significant number of pipeline appurtenances and structures are in poor condition and require rehabilitation.

There is a booster station in Nyali which is meant for reinforcing the supply of water to this area of high demand.

Water Demand: Except for the beach strip, which is mainly occupied by hotels and the Bamburi Cement factory, North Mainland can be considered as a residential zone for people who provide manpower for the Island and for the prominent tourist industry along the Coast.

A number of public institutions are also situated in these areas.

Water demand for Nyali and Kisauni currently is estimated at 46,200m³/d

West Mainland

Existing Situation:

This area covers the whole of Changamwe division.

Currently, the area is supplied by Mazeras reservoir at 160 meters above sea level (capacity of 81000m³) and the Marere Line, Changamwe reservoir.

Located in this sub area provides storage for Mombasa Island and also serves certain low-lying areas of Changamwe.

The existing distribution network is based on a system of branches and secondary distribution loops which are connected at a few points to the Mzima North and Mzima South Pipeline, which

traverse the zone between Mazeras and Changamwe reservoirs and discharge into the Changamwe reservoir.

The distribution network is also connected to the Marere Pipeline which is over 70 years old and has frequent bursts and leaks.

Below is a summary of the existing mains; -

- (i) GI pipes ranging from 75mm to 150 mm diameter **nine km**
- (ii) AC pipes ranging from 75mm to 250mm diameter **20 km**
- (iii) UPVC pipes ranging from 75mm to 400mm diameter **32 km**
- (iv) Steel pipes ranging from 300mm to 900mm diameter **37 km**

Total 104 km

Some areas of this sub-system are subject to occasional land slides which has caused rupture of the pipelines due to strategic importance of many large facilities in this area e.g. KP&LC (Kipevu Thermal Power Generating Station, Moi International Airport, the Kenya oil refineries complex and the Kipevu Port) the network is operated to favor these consumers.

There exists therefore a number of dedicated lines for certain of these consumers some of which could usefully be integrated into the future network.

Apart from the twin trunk mains from Mazeras which are steel pipes, most of existing pipes in the sub-system are UPVC and AC with a few GI mains.

Bursts and leaks are common on non-ferrous pipes and several sections of UPVC mains are now out of commission.

A significant number of pipeline appurtenances and structures need rehabilitation.

Save Africa Holding Medical Supply Need Assessment In Marakwet East Constituency

Save Africa sources medical supplies - medicines, hospital materials and medical equipment - designed for government, private and mission hospitals, dispensaries, health centers and clinics, providing healthcare services to the needy communities.

The team of Save Africa's medical charitable mission which comprised of Dr. Sammy Wafula, Dr. Patrick Mate and Mr. Paul Chelimo Bowen from Marakwet District Health office, carried out a systematic assessment of needs in medical supplies in twenty three (23) healthcare facilities in the entire Marakwet East Division.

Save Africa Executive Chairman Dr. Sammy Wafula noted: "The medical needs assessment mission Kapyego Dispensary, Chemworor dispensary, Kamasia dispensary, Kamogo dispensary, Chesoi Catholic Health Centre, Mogil dispensary, Tot Health Centre and Tuturung dispensary, among others established that these healthcare facilities, both governmental and privately operated were providing commendable medical services to needy communities in Marakwet East constituency but are in deep need of medical equipment and hospital materials.

Accordingly, Save Africa's medical team confirmed during the needs assessment visits and discussions with the medical professionals in those healthcare facilities that there was an urgent appeal for doctors, clinical officers and nurses in Marakwet East Constituency at the moment.

In the course of their medical needs assessment, Save Africa's team also established while visiting several healthcare facilities in the Divisions that many newly constructed units using the Constituency Development Fund (CDF), were empty, lacking essential materials and equipment such as patient beds and their accessories as well as furniture to make them operational.

The latter provided local visits guidance and introduction of the professionals of Save Africa to the communities visited, especially during the visits to the community based and CDF funded healthcare facilities in the entire Constituency.

Save Africa appealed to the Ministry of Health to urgently provide essential equipment and hospital materials to healthcare facilities, especially to those built under CDF Scheme in Marakwet East Constituency and particularly to the many maternity wings in the divisions.

DIE SHIMBA HILLS WURDEN OFFIZIELL ALS "BIODIVERSITY HOTSPOT" ERKLÄRT - EINER VON 25 BIODIVERSITY HOTSPOTS AUF DER GANZEN WELT

DIE SHIMBA Hills südlich von Mombasa wurden offiziell als "Biodiversity Hotspot" erklärt - einer von 25 Biodiversity Hotspots auf der ganzen Welt.

Die Shimba Hills sind nun anerkannt als Kenias wichtigstes Gebiet für Pflanzenvielfalt; mehr als die Hälfte von Kenias seltenen Baumarten befinden sich auch dort.

Daniel Stiles, Chairman der Shimba Support Group (SSG), berichtet:

Obwohl der Arabuko Sokoke Wald bei Watamu bekannter ist und viel mehr Beachtung erhält, übertreffen die Shimba Hills bei weitem Arabuko Sokoke an Pflanzenvielfalt.

Im letzten Mitteilungsblatt der Shimba Support Group stand:

Quentin Luke hat kürzlich die Resultate seiner Studie veröffentlicht, nachdem er fast 20 Jahre lang die Pflanzenwelt in den Shimba Hills erforscht hat.

Im East African Natural History Magazin kann die mit Anmerkungen versehene Check

liste auf der Nature Kenya Website:

<http://www.naturekenya.org/> eingesehen werden.

Luke arbeitete von 1988-1991 an der vom WWF finanzierten Erhebung über Küstenwälder und leitete daraufhin das WWF Department of International Development (UK) Coastal Forest Conservation Unit, das von den Nationalmuseen von Kenia von 1992-2001 eingeführt worden war.

Er verwendete alle früheren Studien über Pflanzen in diesem Gebiet, angefangen mit der Arbeit von T. Wakefield um 1880, sowie verschiedene andere.

Die botanischen Informationen sind deshalb sehr umfassend.

Dieses Werk führte dazu, dass die Shimba Hills aufgenommen wurden als Teil des Eastern Arc and East African Coastal Forests Biodiversity Hotspot - einer der 25 Biodiversity Hotspots der Welt.

Auf der Checkliste sind insgesamt 1396 endemische

Pflanzen aufgeführt, das heißt, dass sie nur in den Shimba Hills vorkommen.

Exotische Nutz- und Dekorationspflanzen sind auch erfasst, aber die Liste ist unvollständig.

Alle aufgeführten Pflanzen stellen 44 Prozent der Küstenflora dar und 21 Prozent der gegenwärtig geschätzten gesamten Flora Kenias mit 6500 Spezies.

276 dieser Arten sind gefährdet, 62 gelten weltweit als selten und sollten dringend geschützt werden.

Obwohl der Arabuko Sokoke Wald in der Nähe von Watamu viel mehr Beachtung erhält und bekannter ist, wird er von der Pflanzenvielfalt in den Shimba Hills übertroffen, welches Gebiet auch mehr als die Hälfte Kenias seltener Bäume enthält.

Ferner heißt es, dass die Shimba Hills als Kenias wichtigstes Gebiet mit der größten Pflanzenvielfalt gelten.

Der Bericht weist auf die Gefahr hin, die diesem wertvollen Wald

droht durch Elefanten, die sich vermehrt haben, dass die Zahl von diesem Gebiet nicht mehr getragen werden kann.

Die Checkliste schließt mit dem Hinweis, dass das Shimba Nationalreservat zum Pflanzenschutzgebiet erklärt wird.

Obwohl die Faunaverteilung in diesem Gebiet nicht so beeindruckend ist, ist seine Bedeutung kritisch für endemische und seltene kenianische Pflanzen und die Regierung sollte die Shimba Hills vermehrt als Naturschutzgebiet betrachten, um größere finanzielle Mittel für ihren Schutz zur Verfügung zu stellen.

Abschließend sagte der Chairman:

Ich möchte die Gelegenheit benutzen, um zwei großzügigen Spendern zu danken, nämlich dem Eden Wildlife Trust und der SSG mit weiteren Ksh 120.000 gesponsort hat, und dem Max Voegel für Ksh 10.000 um SSG zu helfen, die vorgesehene Projekte durchzuführen.

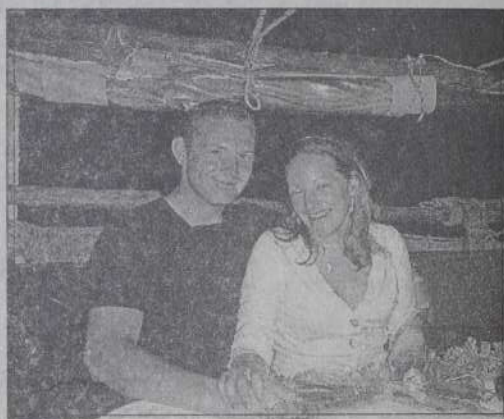

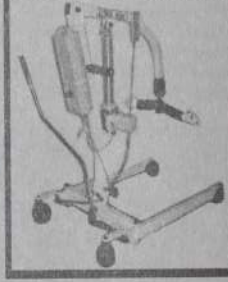
