





Inspired by the efforts made by the voluntary services of the Aga Khan Hospital's Breast Cancer Support Group, Inner Wheel members have taken it upon themselves to further the noble

They wish to embark on the awareness, prevention, and detection of "Breast Cancer" and thereafter provide emotional psychological, social, medical and financial assistance to those afflicted

The AKH Breast Cancer Support Group has held a few free breast clinics in the past.

They have held workshops in schools, colleges, religious centres and different community

Their job is to demonstrate and reiterate the need of self-examination to all those visiting the clinic and ensure early detection and treatment of any possible cancer

In the 2005 and 2006 a sum of 2,100 women were examined out of which nine cases were diagnosed as having malignant cancer and in need of immediate attention. Generally the treatment con

sists of six sessions of chemo-therapy. Mastectomy (removal of the breast) followed by 6 weeks of radiotherapy.

Depending on the individual needs each case of Breast Cancer may cost up to approx Kshs.350, 000/= per patient.

Inner Wheel members felt the need of adequate involvement of the community at large in this awareness program. It would help save a mother, daughter, sister, or wife and give them a chance to live.

Hence, a resolution was passed at the regular meeting that IW established an Inner Wheel of Mombasa Breast Cancer Endowment Fund (IWMBCEF).

The fund would grow and continue to provide benefits to the needy patients who may not be able to afford the treatment wholly or partially.

The supporters of this great cause may be individuals, groups of individuals, foundations, corporates or companies. Financial contributions to the Inner Wheel Mombasa Breast Cancer Endowment Fund would

assist Inner Wheel members in making sure that individuals can get necessary medical treatment.

NEPAD School **Project**

NEPAD (New Partnership For African Development) has undertaken to equip some 600,000 secondary schools across Africa with a state of the art Computer lab - the e-school project.

This includes a network of 20-23 computers with printers, VSat connectivity providing internet com-munications and DsTV.

This initiative has been supported by the Microsoft led consortium which include Oracle, Cisco, among others.

Anumber of schools (23) have already been equipped so far and in Kenya, three secondary schools were done by Oracle and another three have just been completed by Microsoft.

Sun'n Sand Hotel on the Kenya North Coast, in partnership with the partnership with the Microsoft Consortium, have come together to bring this e-school lab to Kikambala Primary school (approximately 2000 students).

Primary Kikambala Kikambala Primary School is the first Primary school in Africa to have this state of the art facility, which will go a long way in enhancing the develop-ment of their primary education of these young children of Kikambala.



I'm Constantly Surprised By Nature - We **Should Never Take Animals For Granted**

game parks are very familiar with the most important rule and that is that we should not get out of a car for any reason unless of course the car is on fire or some similar life threatening condition exists on or in the vehicle

There those who meet this rule half way and travel through the game parks in vehicles that have no doors or have the roofs cut out so that the passengers can stick their necks out and view the game.

I was in the Mara game park not so long ago

It was a few weeks before the wildebeest migration was due to begin and the Mara plains were relatively calm

Our game drives more often than not got us close to animals that we would have otherwise not been able to see had the world famous migration been in

We went very close to a pride of lion that ignored the fact that there were several vehicles surrounding them with cameras clicking away.

The drivers were so confident of the behaviour of the animals that they all switched off the engines and let the tourists feast their eyes on the pride

It was a typical large pride with one dominant male, a few immature males, several lionesses and cubs.

It was that time of the day

time grooming and preening themselves and each other.

Eventually they decided they would put on a show for the tourists and in a short while they had all roused themselves from slumber and siesta and were setting off across the plains.

It was soon obvious what their

While the large part of the pride lay down there was a lone sentinel that had seen a family of warthogs wandering along almost a kilometre away.

In whatever language they use the sentinel communicated the information and the whole pride

Why the story? It was inspired by an incident that Kachumbari witnessed when he recently crossed the border into Uganda.

Having crossed at Busia, he continued on his journey but had to stop at a point some thirty kilometres from the border town where he had to present papers to a revenue authority check point.

While he was stopped there, several matatus came along and as is usual they all drove to the front of the queue whilst the touts rushed to the customs officials to get their papers stamped.

While they were away and the matatus were stopped, a family of baboons appeared from the undergrowth and quickly made their way onto the roof rack of

They completely ignored the other matatus that either had no roof rack or where they were present there was nothing loaded

on top. Once there they each quickly selected a bag or sack and quickly worked their way into the luggage, picked up what they could and as rapidly as they had arrived, they clutched whatever it was they salvaged and quickly dropped to the and quickly dropped to the ground and scurried back into the undergrowth.

They were clever enough to mount and dismount from the rear of the vehicle where they could not be seen.

The touts came back, banged on the doors of the matatus ad they took off without realising that the baboons had been onto the roof rack and helped themselves to whatever loose stuff they could salvage from the luggage that could be opened easily



his win was followed by Esther Nyaga from the Coast and in 1921 another male nurse, Nelson Paramura of Rift Valley was actiated the winner.


Jocelyn Macharia from the Central Province was the 1992 Winerand Jane Baya captured the title for the Coast in 1993.

There was an article in the national press recently discus-sing the International Bacca-leurate Diploma Programme as a potentially preferred alternative to the Advanced-level ("A-Levels") secondary school education used by many private schools in Kenya.

Most people are not aware that the International Ba-ccalaureate (IB) programme is a comprehensive

education programme that starts at the nursery level to enable the development of a child from the early years to the secondary

At the nursery and primary years, the IB programme is called the Primary Years Programme.

Little known in Kenya, the IB PYP is designed for children of ages three to twelve, and "focuses on the total growth of the developing child, touching hearts as well as minds and encompassing social, physical, emotional and cultural needs in addition to academic develop-ment," according to the interment," according to the inter-national Baccalaureate web-site.

How does the IB-PYP achieve this lofty objective?

This innovative curriculum develops children's Knowledge. Concepts, Skills, Attitudes and Action, by guiding them to explore six trans-disciplinary themes, namely:

- . Who we are
- · Where are we in place and time
- . How we express ourselves
- · How the world works
- How we organize our-selves, and
- . Sharing the planet.

These six themes are explored through the subject areas of Language, Mathematics, Science and technology, Social Studies, Arts and Personal, social and physical education

Well, that's all gobbledygook How is all this different from

other curricula? It seems to teach the same

subjects as the KCPE. The difference is the way the subjects are taught.

Subject material is taught as

integrated units of inquiry -teachers of various subjects design and deliver a several-week long set of lessons.

The "unit of inquiry" will impart

knowledge on several subjects not just on one subject as in the KCPE - and aims to meet the IB-PYP objectives.

For example, a lesson on Living Things will include scientific Knowledge on living things and the use of Mathematics to

measure motion port by and change in living things, understanding of Concepts of life and change in life, develop Skills such as using measuring tools, develop Attitudes of respect for all forms of life and take Action

all forms of life and take Action to preserve life.

It can be seen that the six trans-disciplinary themes are also met through this lesson.

Wow, that sounds really

So what's the advantage ?

Simple – it builds children's ability to think, to inquire, to reflect on what they see around them, to value what they see and what they have and become open-

Thus, IB-PYP enables young people to become

"inquirers, thinkers, communicators, risk-takers, knowledge, able, principled, caring, open-minded, well-balanced and reflective individuals,"

qualities that make then better individuals, and better prepared to deal with the challenges of the 21st Centry.

The IB-PYP thus achieves to goal of developing children their full potential in the work of Dr. Robert Shaffer (Chair the Department of Higher Education and Student Affairsa Indiana University in the 1960r

"We must view young people not as empty bottles to be filed but as candles to be lit."

The Primary Years Program (PYP) is becoming the program of choice at 295 of the leads schools on all five continents



BREAST CANCER SURVIVORS' DAY

Most Breast Cancer survivors have harrowing tales of the stigma that they have gone through, tales of unaffordable medication, their side effects and even mistakes from doctors!

This day was a celebration of surviving this trauma and encouraging others currently experiencing the same to hang in there because the breakthrough is in sight.

The day started at 0900am at the Indiana Apartments. The Kenya Breast Health Program chairlady traveled from Nairobi to give an informative, encouraging talk to the ladies in attendance. They then asked questions, shared experiences and received valuable information on how to take care of their health. After a hearty meal the whole afternoon was spent being pampered by staff from the Rizfar Salon. A total of 30 ladies participated in this fun and fellowship event.

FREE BREAST CAMP

A two day event that was held at the Aga khan hospital, Mombasa.

Approximately 1500 men and women attended this camp where the following activities took place:

- · Registration of all participants
- Counseling sessions in English, Swahili and Gujarati. This involved lessons on self breast examinations
- Live demonstrations on lump identification by the Kenya Breast Health Program staff
- Screening by the top Mombasa Gynecologists as well as Resident Doctors from the local hospitals.

After suspicious lumps were detected by the above team, the patients were referred to our very own Resident Pathologist and Resident Consultant Surgeon.

Safaricom through the Kenya Breast Health Program donated 100 films for mammograms for needy patients. They also donated 100 Pink Scarves to the first 100 women as a sign of solidarity for Breast

AKHM Staff were so busy serving the public they barely had time to be examined themselves! The BCASG then organized "A Staff Breast Clinic" which was a big morale boost to all the staff who tirelessly worked to make the event a success!

BE BREAST AWARE



When?

Examine your breasts once a month, preferably immediately following the end of your period or, if you no longer have periods, on the same day each month.





LOOKING. First, stand in front of the mirror, hands by your side, and look closely for any changes. Lift your arms slowly above your head and turn from side to side to observe the outline. Now, with your hands on your hips, press down and tense your chest muscles. This will make any changes more prominent. Look at

your breasts from all angles, from the side, underneath, lean forwards and look at the shape of your breasts.

FEELING. You might do this lying down or with a soapy hand when you are in the bath or shower. Feel each breast in turn.



Using the opposite hand, press gently but firmly with the flat of your fingers. Moving in a circular motion cover the whole breast area from deep in the armpit, over the top of the breast, centrally and underneath it, finally circling around and over the nipple. It is important to feel around the collar bone and into the armpit (where the lymphonodes are) for any swellings.

What am I looking or feeling for?

- Any unusual change in the shape or size.
- . Has one breast become lower than the other.
- . A change in the colour of the skin or a rash.
- . Puckering or dimpling of the skin.
- A nipple which has become pulled in or changed its position or shape.
- · A lump or thickening within the breast or armpit.
- . A rash around the nipple, or discharge from one or both.
- . Constant pain in one part of the breast.






