

The third male cast member was Zain Jaffer who played the role of the company's English lawyer. Zain effectively portrayed the character's rather sombre and laconic attitude.





This Was Breaking The 'Highway Code' And All Road Markings. But The Prison Warder Driving The Vehicle Was Not Bothered

The boys in blue continue to feature this week but still for the wrong reasons.

It is all to do with the fact that ney do not live up to what they are employed to do

They are supposed to keep the law and be custodians of the same but very often they break the law even when they are still

One wonders how often they would then break the law when they were dressed in civvies and could melt into the crowd.

In the recent past I have read story after story in the local dailies which describe as well as defence personnel, all constituents of the uniformed forces, are getting trigger happy

The number of cases where armed cops or armed forces staff have taken the law into their own hands and meted out justice that they though fit, is on the increase.

The most common case is that of man returns from work and goes to regular drinking location

At some stage of the outing comes face to face with wife, fiancée or simply someone they secretly admire and they decide that they are really mad to see them in that neck of the

quarrel or fight and ends up either causing grevious bodily harm or even kills the unsuspecting female

There is the other less serious level of rule breaking by cops and some examples of these were told to me by Kachumbari

One involved a cop and the ther a prison warder and both happened in Nairobi.

In the first instance, Kachumbari was being driven past Jogoo house in Nairobi in the late afternoon traffic lam.

The boys in blue were deployed all critical junctions and up was cleared

Just as they were about to pass e exit from the back end of the court houses, traffic stopped to allow an "Uncle Moody bus" full of prisoners to exit from there.

The bus reversed under guidance from gun toting prison warders who jumped into the bus through the back door once the manoeuvre was completed.

The bus then proceeded through traffic.

The driver decided that he would not stick to one lane but drive straddling the two lanes which were meant for traffic going in the same direction.



This caused the queue behind the bus driver to cause an even longer tail back.

After about three hundred metres, the road on which the bus and the rest of traffic was travelling in joined a main road which was a one way street.

The junction was controlled by a sole cop and the traffic appeared to be flowing well

The Moodymobile did not turn left when it came to the junction was expected but instead

When a gap appeared in the line of traffic from the right, the driver of the prison bus decided to turn down the road going in the wrong direction so that he could reach a short cut turning some fifty metres in the wrong

This disrupted the flow of traffic but the driver of the Moodymobile was least concerned

This cop did nothing.

In the second incident, one of the boys in blue was on a very early morning shift and was quietly directing traffic on one of Uhuru highway.

At some point, he received a call on his mobile and left his perch to go and answer the call.

He seemed to be looking for something.

A matatu approached at speed and the traffic cop waved this manyanga down.

The drive stopped reluctantly and one could see him telling the cop that it was wrong to stop the vehicle in the middle of the roundabout.

The cop would have nothing to do with that sentiment.

He ordered the matatu driver to open the doors anyway, a request to which he eventually

the matatu in the middle of the roundabout after it had been stationary for several minutes.

In the meantime, a large number of the vehicles coming round the roundabout were being driven at full speed with the drivers unaware that there was a stationary matatu that was in the process of getting a passenger


