Cranio Sacral Therapy

ALTERNATIVE THERAPY FOR ALL SORTS OF AILMENTS

AS THE WORLD looks towards alternative therapy for all sorts of ailments, we in Kenya are entering a new kind of treatment known as Cranio Sacral Therapy.

This treatment, which has its roots in America in the early 1900's, has found its way here, through therapists that have been professionally trained in the field.

Cranio Sacral Therapy, or CST, is a 'hands on' therapy, much like Reiki which is better known here in Kenya.

The patient lies on a treatment table is made to relax before the therapist places his or her hands on pivotal points of the body.

With this, the therapist is 'listening', through his or her hands, to the movements in your body so that the treatment can be effected to the affected part of the body.

As we go through life, we encounter many physical and emotional knocks.

This motion is so subtle that it cannot be measured by instruments but a trained therapist can feel it at its specific points.

Bones and organs of the body follow their own movement, but everything is cushioned in this fluid.

As one goes through any kind of trauma, physical or emotional and the tissues contract, there is a restriction in the flow of the fluid.

This restriction is the cause of the ensuing problems that can occur immediately or even after many years.

What the therapist does is through very gentle manipulation, releases the contractions to enable the fluid to flow freely, thus releasing the tissues into a normal condition.

The touch of the therapist is so light, between five and ten grams that the patient hardly feels it. Some patients feel light sensations like tingling, pulsation, heat or similar feelings as they go through the therapy, while

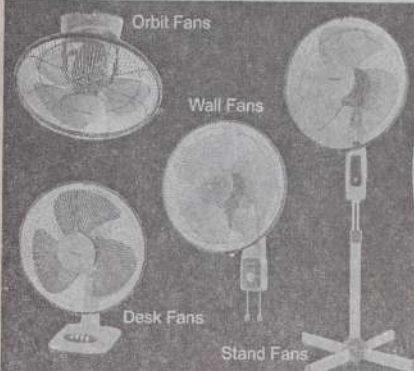

Those who tested positive to the HIV antibody test fell into the able hands of Bomu/

Mkomani Clinic who were doing the VCT and access to HIV/ AIDS treatment in their

comprehensive care clinic. Coast regional blood bank carried out blood donation.

Mombasa Serena Beach Peer Educators did drama and participatory sessions on feeling about testing for HIV".

A total of 91 people volunteered for VCT and 74 units of blood were donated.

Apart from knowing their HIV status, those who donated blood got to be screened for Hepatitis B and C as well as syphilis.

This type of regular medical check up is one of the health enhancing behaviors.

City Sewerage System Needs Rehabilitation

The heavy rains which have pounded Mombasa, recently are a great cause of worries to the residents as contaminated rain water may fizzle into piped water networks.

Mombasa streets have been flooded. Houses have collapsed, others have been submerged in floods.

Residents have been marooned in dirty water and others have fortunately been saved from trees but others have unfortunately died.

But ironically with all this water around there is still no efficient and adequate water supply for the residents of Mombasa.

It's noteworthy that some storm water and sewerage conduits in Mombasa are not functional.

Water pipes not constantly in use may cause piped water contamination.

A massive backlog in provision of proper sanitation in informal areas, ageing and deteriorating sewerage networks are allowing contaminated run off to get into piped water system and the undisputed fact that liquid waste treatment plants in Mombasa have not been functional for many years has aggravated the problem.

Theoretically effective sewerage treatment plants should deco-terminate water to an acceptable standard, after which it is pumped out into the sea.

If the sewerage plants cannot cope, contaminated water can get pumped into the sea resulting to degradation with serious effect on human and fragile marine life. This is evident in Tudor Creek.

There have also been regular instances of blocked pipes, overflows and discharge of illegal substances into storm water drain and pipes.

Oil has been confirmed in piped water in Mombasa, Old Town and source of problem traced to a filling station.

E-coli bacteria thrive in contaminated water. E-coli bacteria in water can cause severe diarrhoea, eyes, ears infection and skin diseases as well as other waterborne diseases.

Major causes of E-coli high levels in piped water have been lack of adequate sanitation in informal settlements and poor condition of many of the few available toilets; some people preferred to relieve themselves in open spaces or use 'flying toilets' which led to contamination.

With this scenario it is not certain that water in Mombasa is clean and that E-coli levels are what is considered safe and meet World Health Organization (WHO) standards and as required by the government.

Besides the great need for elusive supply of adequate clean water to Mombasa the rehabilitation of city's ageing sewerage and storm water networks must be tackled and cleaning of refuse dumped on the pavements given top priority.

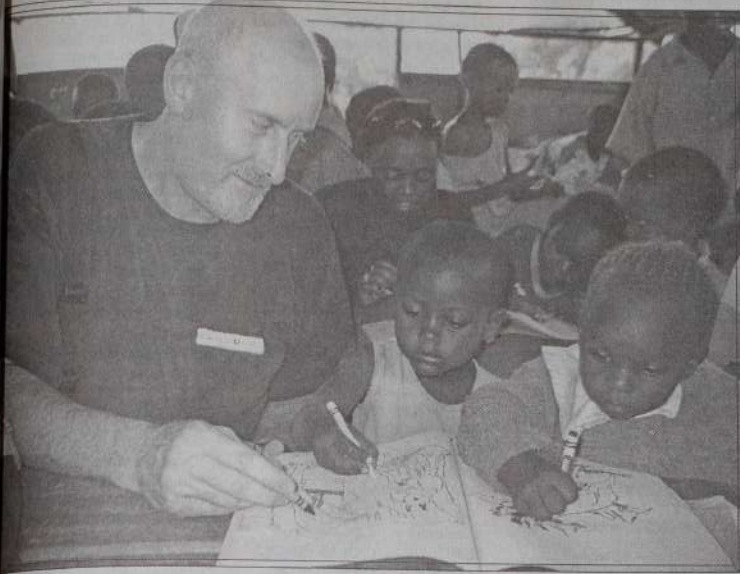

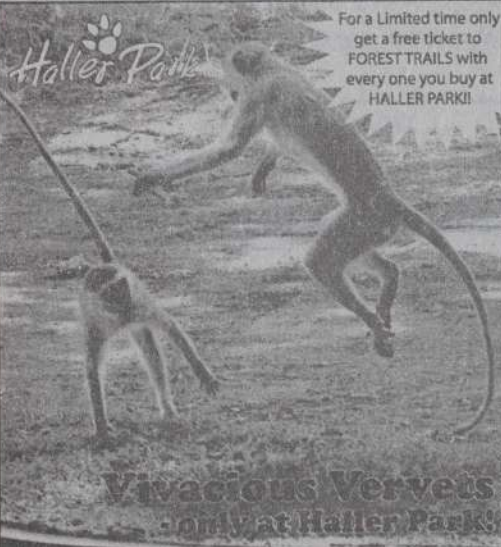

Wintersaison weiterhin auf Erfolgskurs!

WÄHREND DIE Wintersaison sehr vielversprechend aussieht, ist die Tourismusindustrie an der kenianischen Küste besorgt wegen einiger wichtiger hindernder Faktoren wie Stromausfälle und schlechte Straßen.

Mohammed Hersi, Chairman der Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers, Küste, sagte:

"Zuvielle Stromausfälle, vor allem an der Nordküste, sind ein großes Problem, das dringend gelöst werden sollte."

"Sie richten ernsthaften Schaden an, denn dadurch werden Elektrogeräte und ganze Einrichtungen beschädigt und Konferenzen störend unterbrochen."

"Wenn diese Destination weiterhin florieren und sich entwickeln soll, muss etwas unternommen werden, denn die Hochsaison steht vor der Tür."

"Die kurze Regenzeit beginnt demnächst und die Stadtverwaltung von Mombasa sollte die schlechten Straßen reparieren lassen."

Was die Sommersaison betrifft, sagte er, war sie besser als im Vorjahr mit einem Zuwachs von rund 10-

15 Prozent.

Die Wintersaison sieht gut aus, zwei weitere Charterfluggesellschaften bringen zusätzlich Touristen nach Mombasa, was ein gutes Zeichen ist.

Außer über Weihnachten und Neujahr gibt es an der Küste ausreichend Unterkunftsmöglichkeiten; in dieser Beziehung besteht eigentlich kein Problem.

Stadtrat Kuldip Sondhi, Chairman der Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association, um seine Meinung gefragt, antwortete:

"Es stehen gewöhnlich nicht genügend Betten zur Verfügung in der Hochsaison über Weihnachten und Neujahr."

"Die meisten Hotels sind in der Wintersaison zu 80 Prozent und das ganze Jahr hindurch zu 60 Prozent belegt."

"Wenn Sie glauben, dass zur Zeit alles in Ordnung sei und die Konkurrenz nicht sehr stark ist, so ist das eine kurzfristige Auffassung."

"Die Konkurrenz weiß genau, was wir tun und ist dabei, auf dem Markt viel Geld auszugeben für Werbung - viel mehr als wir - um das Geschäft zu anderen Destinationen zu bringen."

"Es stimmt, dass wir neue Märkte suchen."

Das Kenya Tourist Board (KTB) hat kürzlich Wanderausstellungen durchgeführt in der Tschechischen Republik, in Polen und Russland, aber auch in Australien, China, USA, Kanada und Frankreich."

Mr. Sondhi wies darauf hin, dass unsere traditionellen Märkte immer noch 75 Prozent unserer Produkte abnehmen.

Zu einem kürzlichen Artikel in der lokalen Presse darüber, dass das KTB plant, das Wachstum der Besucherzahlen zu dämpfen, damit die Industrie aufhören kann, bemerkte Mr. Sondhi:

"Mr. Michael Opondo, KTBs Marketing Manager, scheint Lodges in den Nationalparks

"Es ist wahr, dass in den Nationalparks das Angebot an Unterküften den Bedarf nicht mehr decken kann."

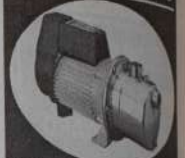

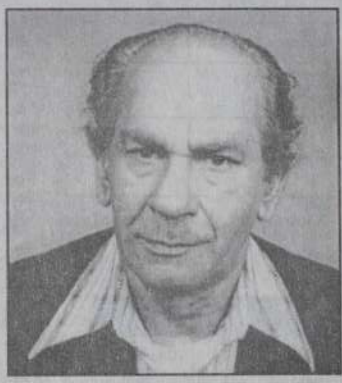

The weekend saw the long SHANZU CUP raced for by six boats on B handicap.

This trophy was presented to the Mombasa Yacht Club in 1959 by Squadron Leader and Mrs. B. MacCormack of the old Shanzu Beach Hotel.

Originally it was the race to, or at Shanzu beach; but now a race to Mtwapa Creek and back.

Just after noon, the flotilla left the Kilindini Channel against flooding spring tide with a strong current in tow and a cloudy sky.

The day was enveloped in somnambulant winds, swirling and swinging northwards slightly.

After about half an hour of slow beat into the wind, the boats took the east-south east winds on their starboard flanks for a close reach petering out into a broad reach around the English Point promontory and up the coast to northwards.

The high tide waters enabled the boats to keep off the reef breakers but once under the Nyali cliffs, the storm clouds gathered dark and everyone was in its eye. Wind died completely and the boats rolled with the huge swells, bobbing about on the oily waters like sea-fowl out on a fishy feast.

This slow "waltz on the water" continued for most part of an hour, when the south-north current slowly carried the lead boats, KENZA expertly sailed by Michael Smewing with Jennifer O'Leary, METEORITE sailed by Kalim Hassanali with Neelam Shah, CENTURION sailed by Koki Doshi with Maryam Hassanali and Katie out of the doldrums and on more open waters, but just.

The flotilla was also aided by faint whiffs of fresh breeze that made the sail slow but promised a daylight finish.

The rolling breakers and the back wash from the headlands kept everyone rolling until they reached the mouth of the Mtwapa Creek where the turned tide posed the next obstacle with very

little wind. Michael Smewing's laser2 KENZA had the Line Honors, followed by Osprey METEORITE and laser2 CONWAY'S sailed by Alfred Okoth and Teddy Ndaru.

CENTURION, Osprey INTO THE BLUE sailed by Aslam Kasmani with Shezaad Kasmani, and 420 BUNKEROO sailed by John Koyiet with young Rushabh Shah followed the leaders.

On corrected time, Laser 2 CONWAY'S won the first race,
