

To help address the risks of the poliovirus spreading across the country, Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair Luis Vicente Giay approved a US \$ 350,000 rapid response grant.

The grant was announced on 17th October, a few days after the initiative confirmed news that the child, who lives with her parents at a refugee camp in Daadab, Garrisa, near the border of Somalia, had been diagnosed with police. with polio.

Rotary's contribution, channell ed through the World Health Organization, will support emer-gency Sub National Immuniza-tion Days (SNIDs) targeting communities in northeastern

UNICEF traditionally provides support for the purchase of vaccines and for communications and community mobili-

We see sporadic peaks in specific crimes.

They are not at specific times nor are there indicators that are a precursor to the specific events or crime seasons

In some cases, there are suggestions of why they happen.

One of the most common is that we get increased lawlessness and crime during school holidays because the perpetrators would be looking to raise school fees for their offspring or relatives.

This suggestion is not far fetched as looking back at news reports this tends to bear out that these periods reflect an increase in crime generally.

The approach of festive seasons also lead to undue attention by thieves

They, like all of us, need to have enough money to be able to enjoy themselves during the

In all these instances the drive and passengers are likely to be harassed, threatened and even beaten up especially if the car jackers are bent on robbing the occupants of the car and they end up finding nothing for the risks that the have taken.

Such people are normally quite hyped up and are likely to pull the trigger or unleash a rungu at the slightest sign of protest.

If they car jack you at this time, they will use your car to withdraw immediately and then hold you till after midnight when the cards have reset and they can withdraw the maximum again.

Imagine If your card were open to forty 'grand' a day.

One could lose eighty 'grand within a space of four hours when in the hands of car jackers who know what they are doing.

Always ensure that you have a small amount of money in the house and make sure it is hidden in a slightly difficult place to get

elaborate as it may then bring out the jitters in the robbers.

Same goes for ATMs, one should have them in an easily accessible place but with the minimum exposure.

If one needs to have access to large amounts of cash at all times then the cards should be kept in other places.

The mobile phone by the side of the bed or by the location you are working at in the study should be also be the disposable one

It pays to keep moving the same phone to wherever you are and then concealing the main phones that you have

Surviving the attention of criminals in this double trouble and also a bit of inconvenience.



She worked on a Pilot project at Strømmen Art Centre passing on art to primary schools in Akershus Fylke.

She likes painting motives from Africa and she mostly paints women.

Through her art, she wants to show a different, wider side of Africa and its rich cultures.
