### **BIRD WATCH NEWS**

This was the FFJ World Bird watch bird walk.

It was good to see Nguu Tatu had emerged from the mist and the rain.

Even the ground was dry enough to walk on without falling down.

However the vegetation is now very thick and as there was not very much birdsong it was difficult to spot the birds.

The total count was only 20 which is about 10 down on the usual number.

Special birds included a Black Shouldered Kite and a rather rarer Black Chested Snake Eagle.

Our old favourite Malachite Kingfisher turned up so we were happy as no bird walk is complete without him/ her.

The only migrant in any number seems to be the Barn Swallow which came to drink at the pool at the end of the walk.

A couple of Common Sand pipers were the only other winter visitors.

Ponds are very full and beach areas for waders very limited.

Amazingly, hardly any water birds about.

The serious Birdwatch on Nov 8th, a long 10 hour stretch in the mostly pouring rain had a total list of 74 birds.

Not bad but about 20 less than expected.

The rain was so heavy from 7.00 to 9.00 a.m. that it was imperative to birdwatch from the picnic banda at Nguuni.

Interesting to note how many birds come to feed in the rain.

Once the rain stopped (for about 10 minutes) a very wet trio of myself,

Kevin and Samson waded (literally) round the site. The loudest sound was not the birds but the mini-waterfalls

When the so-called Michuki Rules were introduced oh so many years ago it seems. was a hue and cry around their introduction (or should we say enforcement ?).

The impact of enforcing those rules was slow in coming but at the end of six months it was obvious that they had contributed to better discipline on the roads and at matatu boarding locations.

Three years down the line, we seem to be back to square one.

Fitting of working speed governors was one of the key pillars of the Michuki Rules

The premise was that in spite of all the other failures that could happen in terms of people or equipment, the fact that the speed was controlled it meant that the damage to either the vehicle or people in it would be lessened.

The other key pillar was that of behaviour change.

Dressing the drivers and their assistants in uniform was all about trying to change their perception about their place in life and also give some sense of pride in what they were doing.

This was intended to rub off it terms of the service they provided on board their vehicles and also court some courtesy on the road.

As we head into the festive season in Kenya, it is sad to see that there is an increasing rate of carnage on the roads.

In the last five months, there has been an increasing number of fatal accidents on the roads in

All of the accidents that were reported are in the realm of

At least three of them would not have happened had the people involved been followers of the Michuki rules.

Elements of speed discourteous behaviour characterised those accidents.

As we take to the roads either driving ourselves or get into vehicles driven by other people, let us all make a conscious decision to speak out when we feel uncomfortable about conditions under which we are travelling.

Speak about it them minute you are uncomfortable.

then speak about is again

Should the situation not change

Continue speaking about it till it irritates the hell out of the other passengers and the driver as

It could mean that you will be called names, shouted at or even ejected from the bus or car you are travelling in.

Consider whether you want to end up travelling in an unsafe vehicle or experience dangerous driving or want to give yourself the best chance of completing

In cold and sober thought the latter would be preferable. However, we all set our ourselves such tight deadlines and do not

necessarily plan our journeys that we end up talking whatever is given us in the rush to get to

the journey alive.

The vehicles will be sub standard in all respects and they will be unlikely to have all the requirements that the Michuki Rules stipulated they must have.

So what should you do?

We will give some suggestions but they are hard choices that one must be fully committed to prior to starting on the

If you are going to book a ticket to travel out of your regular station, irrespective of the distance you will be travelling start by asking the booking clerk whether their vehicles are fitted with speed governors and seat belts.

If they are not then walk away

and go to another company and ask the same question. Continue till you get to one that is fully positive and then ask whether you can look at one whether you can look at one before you book.

This will be the second filter

If they are not rushing to show you their compliant vehicles then they are probably only saying yes in order to get your custom.

If after all the attempts you still find yourself without suitable transport then what ?

Company reputation becomes the next filter.

One should then consider what they know about the company and what they have heard about their operations.

This should give a good indicator about the level of discipline and compliance one is likely to see when they travel.

It will now be up to you to consider whether you need to travel in the first place and what risk you are willing to take should you have to travel.

This is a discussion that we should have internally with ourselves before every journey

Once one is on the road then the likelihood of a fatal road accident becomes finite

Let us take it that you have considered everything and decided that you will travel.

The next thing is to look at the condition of the vehicle. Walk round and look at the condition of the tyres including the spare

at the fitting of the seats to the

This should give a good indication about the level of care given to the vehicle by the owner

Again, if one is not satisfied then please raise the point to the most senior person you can find at the terminus.

By being loud and obnoxious about such things one can get a tyre changed or a lamp repaired.

This could be the difference between whether you end the journey alive or as a police When on the journey then holler

should the driver be speeding or driving dangerously.

Some driver take drugs when driving in the misgiven belief that it will help them stay awake or

These drugs do not exist and drivers must be stopped from driving if they endanger the lives of passengers.

It is the passenger that will alert the driver.

alert the driver.

He or she is unlikely to consider themselves as dangerous since they agreed to start the journey in the first place and considered themselves to be 0.K.

Key things if we are travelling this Christmas. We should first of all be sure that we are comfortable with the vehicle in which we will be travelling.

We have to decide for ourselves whether it is worth talking the risk to be on the road.


