KIBAKI AND ODINGA RE-ASSURE WORRIED KENYANS

NAIROBI, (Xinhua) -- Kenyan President Mwai Kibaki and Prime Minister Raila Odinga have assured the nation that the Grand Coalition Government will hold despite many economic and political challenges facing it.

Speaking during celebrations to mark the 46th anniversary since Kenya attained independence, Kibaki and Odinga said that wrangles within political coalitions were normal. "Our grand coalition is not different, therefore occasional disagreements should not be

construed to mean that the government is in a crisis," Kibaki emphasized during the national celebrations marked in central Nairobi. He said he was in good working relations with Odinga and that the coalition was still on course in fulfilling its legal mandate to Kenyans.

"I wish to assure Kenyans and our friends that the Prime Minister and I are determined to ensure that the Grand Coalition functions harmoniously. "We are fully committed to faster and sustainable development, peace, unity and stability. CONCLUDED PAGE FIVE

The winner of the 2009 Charge was Mark Glen's team who covered 39.45 kilometers in 9 hours and 10 minutes.

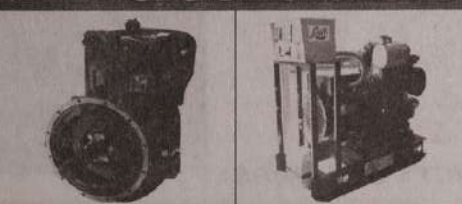
The Charge was again very well supported with 60 cars participating and with over 5000 spectators cheering them along.

He also recommended a fast speed railway between Mombasa and Nairobi which would carry passengers in no more than 5 hours either way.

A modern railway he said would not only promote domestic tourism but would

Mombasa as a destination he stated was dull and boring for most overseas visitors.

He commended the Minister for the work he has done in the Old Town but maintained that with modern development now going on it will soon become irrelevant to tourists.

He recommended a vibrant world class theme park in the pristine Light House Area.

A world class theme park in same league as Sun city in South Africa will catapult Coast tourism into the same category as Thailand, Malaysia and Egypt.

It could cost almost a billion dollar but there are entrepreneurs: Americans, Chinese, Indians and the Gulf state billionaires who would invest if there was a profit to be made out of it. He was not recommending sale of land.

Mr. Sondhi traced his own career at the MCTA during tourism most turbulent years from 2001 to 2009 including the period 2002 to 2007 as a nominated councillor in the Municipal Council of Mombasa whom he termed Coast tourism most important partner.

He thanked his colleagues in the MCTA, the public and tourism stakeholders for the enormous support they had given him to carry out his duties as the chairman of one of the country's most important tourism bodies.

Holiday Weekend Box Office Predicts Another Record Year For Hollywood

LOS ANGELES, (Xinhua) -- Moviegoers continued flooding multiplexes across the United States over the Memorial Day holiday weekend, adding to the silver lining of another record-setting year for Hollywood despite a gloomy economy, an industry analyst said Monday.

Hollywood may see its box office revenues surpass the 10-billion-dollar mark this year in North America, including the Canadian market, for the first time in its history, according to Paul Dergarabedian, analyst of movie industry review website Hollywood.com.

Solid receipts for 20th Century Fox comedy *'Night At The Museum: The Battle Of The Smithsonian'* pulled in bigger-than-expected 70 million dollars over the four-day long weekend starting Friday, latest box office figures showed.

Meanwhile, the fourth installment of Warner Bros.' sci-fi classic *Terminator* franchise, which is the

first movie without Arnold Schwarzenegger in the series, also did well.

'Terminator Salvation' opened a day earlier than the museum flick, taking in 67.2 million dollars over the five days.

Already in release for three weeks, Paramount's sci-fi prequel *'Star Trek'* was well on its way to become the biggest-grossing film of the year, poised to surpass *'Monsters vs. Aliens'* with 193.6 million dollars in ticket sales.

Globally, the real runaway box office hit of the year is Sony Pictures thriller *'Angels and Demons.'* the *'Da Vinci Code'* sequel, which has a worldwide take of 286 million dollars since its release two weeks ago.

According to Dergarabedian, overall attendance at movies in North America is up 12 per cent so far this year, with revenues increasing 14.5 per cent over the period last year.

Such figures could translate into a year in which the movie industry may cross the 10-billion-dollar threshold at box offices, the analyst predicted.

'Imperial Bank' Stars Boost This Year's Mater Heart Run

A Rare And Complicated 'Open Heart' Procedure

A RARE and complicated open heart procedure, the first of its kind in East Africa, on a six-month-old baby from Mombasa, was carried out at the Kenyatta National Hospital last month by the MEAK heart team from the UK and doctors at the Hospital.

This ground-breaking procedure was led by MEAK consulting cardiologist Dr. Aaron Bell, MEAK's consultant paediatric cardiac surgeon Mr. David Anderson and Kenyan surgeon Dr. James Munene together with a team of dedicated doctors and nurses at the Hospital.

MEAK, which stands for Medical and Educational aid to Kenya is an NGO which was founded in the UK sixteen years ago by Dee and Mike Belliere and focuses on bringing in volunteer medical teams from the UK to carry out cardiac, thoracic and orthopaedic surgery, as well as working with local teams to perform ophthalmic surgery in the remote areas of Kenya.

This historical event was made possible through sponsorship by the Medical Trust Fund of Rotary Club of Mombasa and Mamuje Brothers Foundation who have been ardent supporters of this and other health-based projects.

Hard Times For Sun, Sea And Sand Tourism Industry

SANTIAGO, (Xinhua) — The traditional "sun, sea and sand" tourism industry in Latin America and the Caribbean is facing severe challenges and is showing signs of exhaustion in the region, an ECLAC (the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean) report said here on Monday.

"Competition in the sun, sea and sand tourism industry in Latin America and the Caribbean has intensified and the price-driven, all-inclusive offer is showing clear signs of exhaustion," the report said.

Over-exploitation of the natural environment has eroded the comparative advantages that sustain the activity, bringing a range of related problems, including issues of waste disposal and beach pollution, difficulties with drinking water supply and rising crime, according to the report.

Demand has also been volatile and sensitive to external shocks, and this, combined with the low profit margins of mass tourism, has hurt the companies involved, the report said.

In the last weeks of 2008 and early 2009, real estate prices at the vacation destination in the Caribbean dropped 40 per cent.

The Mexican tourism, for example, lost momentum in recent years due to the meltdown of its heavily-dependent U.S. market after the 9/11 terrorist attacks and amid the current global financial crisis, and was affected by the recent spread of A/H1N1 flu virus in the region.

In response to this situation, the major companies have embarked on massive upgrades of their facilities in order to capture higher-income tourists.

By generating larger profit margins, the measures are opening up access to a less volatile and more predictable market, the report said.

It Is Promising - But 'Third Generation' Bio Fuels Still Have A Long Way To Go

This week we will look at the last option of 'bio fuel' production.

This area is very promising but is still very much in an almost embryonic stage.

We will be coming back to this area from time to time as research creates new breakthroughs that may be of interest.

We look at third generation bio fuels.

Third generation bio fuels are almost exclusively produced from algae - yes, those things that we know grow primarily in seawater but in fact can grow in any saline solution anywhere.

Fuel from this source is commonly called algae fuel or oilgae.

Algae are low-input, high-yield feedstocks.

The inputs for algae growth

are simple. These single-celled organisms only need sunlight, water, and carbon dioxide to grow.

They can quadruple in biomass in just one day, and they help remove carbon from the air and nitrogen from waste water.

This is an additional environmental benefit. Some types of algae comprise more than fifty percent oil.

Algae can produce from between fifteen and three hundred times more oil per acre than conventional crops, such as rapeseed, palms, soybeans,

or jatropha.

Algae have a harvesting cycle of between one to ten days, which permits several harvests in a very short time frame.

They can also be grown on land that is not suitable for other established crops.

They can be grown on arid land, land with excessively saline

soil and drought-prone areas.

This minimizes the issue of taking away pieces of land from the cultivation of food crops.

They can also grow some twenty to thirty times faster than food crops.

Not only does algae produce biofuel, it also helps with reducing carbon dioxide emissions.

Algae, like other fuels, releases carbon dioxide when it is burned.

Fortunately, algae takes in carbon dioxide and replaces it with oxygen during the process of photosynthesis whilst it is

growing. Ultimately, its net emissions are zero because the carbon dioxide released in burning is the same amount that was absorbed initially.

Current thinking is that the production of biofuels from algae will help stabilize the concentration of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere at the present level rather than reducing it to a more 'healthy' level.

As of today, such fuels remain too expensive to replace other commercially available fuels, with the cost of various algae species typically between five hundred to a thousand shilling per litre.

But several companies and government agencies are funding efforts to reduce capital and operating costs and make algae oil production commercially viable.

The yields from algae are quite versatile.

The oil directly produced can be harvested and converted easily into biodiesel.

The carbohydrate content can be fermented and then processed into bio ethanol and bio butanol.

Predictions from small scale production experiments suggest that using algae to produce bio diesel may be the only viable method by which to produce enough automotive fuel to replace current world diesel usage.

Butanol has an energy density similar to gasoline and better than that of either ethanol or methanol, the current alcohols that are seen as viable second generation bio fuels.

Butanol can be used in place of gasoline in most petrol engines with no modifications.

In several tests, butanol consumption is similar to that of gasoline, and when blended with gasoline, provides better performance and corrosion resistance than that of ethanol.

The waste left over from the algae oil extraction can be used to produce butanol.

The algae oil feedstock that is used to produce biodiesel can also be used for fuel directly as

straight vegetable oil.

The benefit of using the oil in this manner is that it doesn't require the additional energy needed for processing the oil with an alcohol and a catalyst to produce biodiesel.

The drawback is that it does require modifications to a normal diesel engine.

Rising jet fuel prices are putting severe pressure on airline companies creating an incentive for algal jet fuel research.

The International Air Transport Association has a goal that its members should be using ten per cent alternative fuels by 2017.

In January this year, an American airline ran the first test flight of an algae-fueled jet.

The test was done using a twin-engine commercial jet consuming a fifty-fifty blend of biofuel and normal aircraft fuel. It was amongst the first flights to use an alternative fuel source.

This was a test using so called drop-in fuel which meant that no modification to the engine was required. The flight completed a circuit over water and the pilots on-board, executed a series of tests at normal cruising altitude including a mid-flight engine shutdown.

The fuel was praised for having a low flash point and sufficiently low freezing point, issues that have been problematic for other bio-fuels tested for aviation use.

Third generation bio fuels still have a long way to go before they become available to us on a day to day basis but current work is very promising.

It is expected that within five years we will see the first small scale commercial production and use of third generation bio fuels.

They key attraction with these developments is that they will not compete with traditional food crops.

It is also likely that this route could lead to the production of food alternatives that will take pressure off our traditional crops and also begin to use marginalised land that currently lies waste.

As Kachumbari says, infinity is the limit of one's capability.

Kenya Planning Major Transportation Project To Open Up 'Northern Region'

FROM FRONT PAGE is keen to explore the Eastern Africa sub-region's huge and growing market.

The market includes landlocked Ethiopia, with a population of more than 70 million, southern Sudan that is set to become a major oil exporter, Uganda and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DR Congo).

However, the new market cannot be supported by the port of Mombasa as it is already near full capacity and was designed to convey 20 million tons of cargo a year.

The entry of southern Sudan into the region's market estimates

unrestricted demand of cargo, rising to more than 32 million tons a year cargo demand.

Thus, the Port of Mombasa will not sustain the growing demand for access brought by the demands from southern Sudan and Ethiopia.

Kenya, the principal gateway to the sub-region, had recognized the need for an alternative port. A study in 1975 identified Lamu as a suitable location.

For political and strategic reasons, southern Sudan cannot rely on the Port of Sudan on the Red Sea Coast for its export of crude oil.

Likewise, Ethiopia has for a

long time challenged Kenya to open up a road link through Moyale for its export and import trade.

southern Sudan has several options of seaports to choose from. But it has to take into account factors like security, number of international borders to cross, the nature of terrain, length of route and accessibility to the markets in the West and East by sea.

In the region, the ports of Dar-es-Salaam, Doula in Cameroon, Kinshasa in the DR Congo, Port Sudan, Massawa and Djibouti were all ruled out by the southern Sudan and Ethiopia as ports of

choice. The distance between Juba, the southern Sudan capital, and Port Sudan is about 4,000 km, while the distance between Juba and Lamu is 1,500 km.

Political differences also make southern Sudan and Ethiopia not to prefer Port Sudan and Massawa respectively.

Dar-es-Salaam would involve goods transiting two countries before getting to the port and vice versa for southern Sudan. Dar's route is also longer and has no capacity to handle extra cargo.

Doula, on the continent's western shores also faces similar challenges to those of Tanzania's leading port, while the Kinshasa option has many challenges that include insecurity, long distance and tough terrain provided by the equatorial rain forest.

Libyan-Based Investment Bank To Establish Head Quarters In Kenya

NAIROBI, (Xinhua) -- Kenya will benefit from a new fund to finance infrastructure construction and poverty reduction being established by the Libya-based Sahel-Sahara (CENSAD) Investment Bank.

A statement from the Kenyan Vice President's office said senior officials of the bank, including a technical team, will be in Nairobi in July to finalize the process for setting up both the investment bank and its regional headquarters.

The statement which was received here on Monday said the bank chairman Hade Al Warfalli disclosed the development at a meeting with Kenya's Vice President Kalonzo Musyoka which was held in Libya on Sunday.

Already the Central Bank of Kenya has given the green light to the bank to establish presence in Nairobi.

Musyoka welcomed the setting up of the fund, which is being championed by Libyan Leader Muammar Gaddafi, whom he met on Saturday, adding that Kenya is keen to tap into the fund to support envisaged Public-Private Partnerships.

*Kenya is in dire need of funds

to finance road, rail, airports and industrial projects, which might inevitably take the form of Public-Private Partners" he told the bank bosses.

The bank, which operates in the Community of Sahel-Sahara Member States, (CEN-SAD), to which Kenya joined last year, has presence of 14 countries including Libya, Ghana, Gambia, Togo, Benin, Chad, Liberia, Sudan and Senegal.

"Poverty and lack of reliable infrastructure are the major issues in Africa and we are keen to support projects in these two areas," Warfalli added.

SOMALIA CONCERN

Musyoka also held a meeting with Somali Prime Minister Omar Sharmarke at the sidelines of the CEN-SAD summit, where they discussed the support of the international community for the country's transitional government, currently besieged by the Al-shabaab militia.

Musyoka expressed concern that the continued instability in Somalia could compromise the security of Kenya.

He said the international community should act now and pool resources to assist in securing peace and security in the Horn of Africa and particularly in Somalia before it becomes too late.

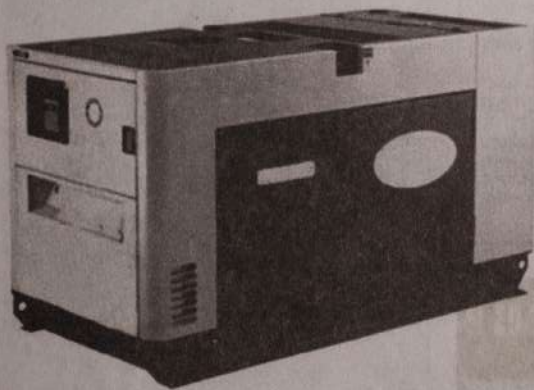

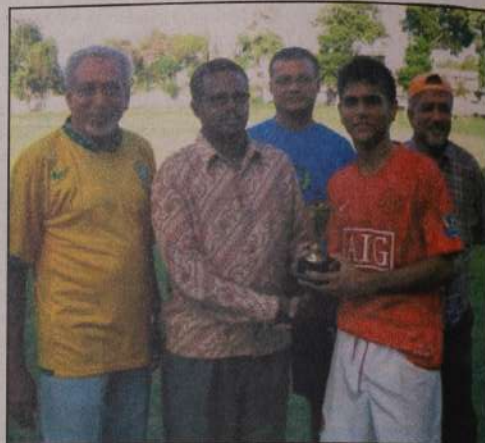
