



# **How Roman Charioteers Gave Us The First 'Highway Codes'**

Kachumbari came visiting last week and we sat down to reminisce over our travels in various countries.

The main item in our discussion was around the dangers one gets to witness on roads

These are not that different from what we know here in Kenya but it is the different national skew of risk that is interesting.

If one were to go to what we called "old Europe", that is to say the original fathers of the European Union, one would find that the risks to drivers and estrians tend to be pretty

The key unifying factor is that the Highway Code as it should be has been in existence in those countries for almost as long as vehicles have been in existence.

Take the history of road transport in those countries. Start with when the Romans

were ruling most of Europe.

They were the ones who build the first of what can count as modern roads.

These used to be as straight as

The Romans were know as very efficient especially when it came to engineering issues.

They would build to use the minimum amount of material as well as follow the shortest route.

Their roads were mainly used for military traffic and thus you find the first rules of the roads

Kachumbari gave me the benefit of a theory that I am not sure I subscribe to but I will let the historians labour on this.

He postulates that there is a good reason why the Romans decided on the rule of using lanes to demarcate direction of traffic.

In order to make most efficient use of the roads and also to use of the roads and also to minimise disputes and accidents between moving columns of road users, they decided that foot soldiers, horsemen or chariots would all use one side of the

went past each other, it was necessary that the columns of soldiers march on the right hand side of the road as they face the direction in which they were

This meant that their swinging arms would be on the outside edge of the road.

The swinging arms would thus always be away from each other and would never clash.

He added that even horse riders and those who drove chariots and carriages mainly used their right hands to wield their

It would also thus make sense for the chariots and carriages to be driven on the right side of the road so that whips would not entangle as they would only be cast on the outside edge of the road.

Kachumbari says that it is for this reason that all of continental Europe drives on the right hand side of the road.

It is a legacy from the Romans who started the whole concept when they sought to create order in the use of their roads.

The first rule in most highway codes defines which side of the road to use and would thus set the scene for all other contents

This would be the oldest common consideration in the codes in old Europe

The other common conside ration around road behaviour in these countries is that there is a general culture of discipline and obedience. but in almost everything that happens in those countries.

Whilst the Italians are considered loud and very demonstrative in the way they communicate and the French are considered slow and romantic (though they can get quite agitated when angered) and the English considered gentle and gentlemanly, they are all good at obeying the law.

You find that people tend to queue when waiting for service, they give way to elderly people and they recognise precedence.

### **PROHIBTED SIGNS**

The latter means that whoever was there first will get service.

If one were to arrive in a room and find an empty seat next to the service counter, one will probably sit in it but will ask who is next should the service counter

This translates to the fact that people will obey the Highway Code. They will not take U-turns where the signs say it is prohibited.

Drivers are unlikely to jump lanes when there are no cops to stop them from doing so.

They are likely to continue along the road till they find a suitable place to turn and then

Simply put - The Highway code simply sets the scene.

National idiosyncrasies then govern the application of the

As Kachumbari says, rules are only as good as their application.



Losses brought forward at 1/1/2010 deemed to be incurred in that year of income (Wef 12/6/2009)

## Capital Allowances/ deductions

- Capital expenditure on purchase or acquisition of right to use fibre optic cable by a telecommunication operator shall be tax deductibe upto a limit of five per cent per annum (Wef 12/6/2009)
- \*Hostels, educational buildings or buildings in use for training certified by the Commissioner to qualify for 50 per cent Industrial Building Allowance for years of income commencing on or after 1/1/2010 (Wef 12/6/
- \*Buildings in use as commercial buildings now eligible for IBA at the normal rate of 2.5 per cent. However where roads, power, water sewer and other social infrastructure have been provided the rate is increased to 25 per cent This is for years commencing 1/1/2010.
- \* Building in use as rental residential building where such building is constructed in a planned development area approved by the Minister for Housing is eligible for IBA at five per cent. However, wet 1/1/2010 where roads, power, water sewer and other social infrastructure have been provided the IBA rate is increased to 25 per cent. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Telecommunication equipment purchased by a telecommunication operator qualify for 20 per cent Wear and Tear allowance on a straight line basis. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Construction of building or purchase and installation of machinery over Shs 200 million eligible for Investment Deduction allowance (use of building not specified so construed to be any building). (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Purchase of filming equipment by a local film producer licenced by the Minister in charge of communication eligible for 100 per cent Investment Deduction allowance. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- 150 per cent Investment Deduction allowance for investments within any satellite town adjoining Nairobi, Mombasa or Kisumu. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Capital expenditure under concessionaring trangements claimable equally over the concession

· Capital expenditure for the purchase or acquisition of right to use computer software eligible for five per cent deduction for tax purposes. (Wef 12/6/2009)

### Taxation of insurance business

Actuarial surplus on long term insurance business transferred to policy holders (previously only shareholders) now taxable. Negative surplus transfer (limited to previous year surplus levels) can be offset against taxable income. (Wef 12/6/2009)

### Personal Tax

- Medical expenses or medical insurance cover deduction for partnerships and sole proprietorships now capped at Shs one million. (Wef 1/1/2010)
- \*Tax free limits for pension fund withdrawals increased as follows. (Wef 1/1/2010):
- Tax exemption on pension withdrawals increased from Shs 180,000 to Shs 300,000 every year
- Lumpsum commuted from registered fund increased from Shs 480,000 to Shs 600,000
- Withdrawal upon termination the lesser of Shs 60,000 per year of pensionable service or the first Shs 600,000 (up from Shs 48,000 and Shs 480,000 respectively)
- Withdrawals from provident funds limits increased to the lesser of Shs 600,000 or Shs 60,000 per year (up from Shs 480,000 and Shs 48,000 respectively)
- In case of withdrawal from NSSF up from Shs 480,000 to Shs 600,000

## Withholding Tax

- Training fee definition expanded to include payments for incidental costs, i.e., even incidental costs now subject to withholding tax. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Commission paid by a resident air transport operator to a non-resident agent in order to secure tickets for international travel now not subject to withholding tax.
- Resident rate of withholding tax on Bearer bonds with maturity of ten years and above reduced from 15 per cent to 10 per cent. (Wef 12/6/2009)

## Others changes

- Telecommunication operator now defined as a person licenced under Kenya Information and Communication Act 1998. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Payment made by a Kenyan resident for the use of reperty anywhere shall be deemed to be income accrued n or derived from Kenya. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Commissioner may serve notice to collect tax in advance if there is a risk of collection being defeated. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- \* Amendments to leasing rules on termination of a lease, if a lessee is entitled to purchase the asset at a value other than market value, the lessee will be deemed to have acquired the asset and the Commissioner shall recover the deductions previously enjoyed by the lessee in respect of such assets with effect from the date of the commencement of the lease and appropriate adjustments to be made for each year of income. The lessee will be entitled to have wear and tear allowances from the time of commencement of the lease. Similar adjustments made to lessor's tax computation. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- New employment emoluments returns to be filed on a quarterly basis. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- Tax on payments made to directors is due before the 10th day following the month in which it was paid or the fourth month after the accounting date whichever is the earlier. (Wef 12/6/2009)
- In Minister's speech reference was made to tax reliefs for physically challenged tax free income of upto Shs 150,000 per month and further deduction of Shs 50,000 to cushion them against expenses on drugs, purchase of disability related devices, home care services

and treatment. These rules are yet to be gazetted.

## Value Added Tax

The following are the proposed changes to the Value Added Tax (VAT) Act. These changes are effective from 12 June 2009;

- \*Definition inserted for "transit goods": "transit goods" means goods imported from a foreign place, through the territory of Kenya, to a foreign destination.
- VAT on imported goods now payable on the value of the goods only, if remission of customs duty has been obtained.
- Input VAT on inventories, construction of building or civil works and assets purchased for making taxable supplies claimable within six months from date of registration.
- · Withholding VAT agents to issue certificate at the time of making payment for supplies
- \* Invoices to be raised immediately for all credit sales.
- VAT registration number no longer required to appear on the supplier's invoice and credit note.
- Suppliers are now not required to indicate the customer's VAT registration number on the invoice and credit note.
- Auditor to furnish the Commissioner with a return of all VAT claims certified by him not later than the 20th of the following month after the tax period.
- · Supplies of goods and services to exporters gazetted by the Commissioner are now zero rated. The suppliers to these gazetted exporters are **REQUIRED** to maintain the following:
- · A copy of the invoice
- \* Proof of payment
- · Certificate signed by the purchaser
- . Copy of gazette notice containing the name of the
- Services shall be deemed to have been supplied in Kenya if they comply with the following:
- The supplier has established his business or has a fixed physical establishment in Kenya and the services are physically used or consumed in Kenya regardless of the location of the payer; or
- \*In connection with immovable property, the property is situated in Kenya; or
- In connection with receiving a signal or service for the supply of television, radio, telephone or any other communication service, the person receiving the signal or service is in Kenya.
- Where transportation ends outside the country, the ransport services shall be deemed to have been supplied outside the country
- Remission on taxable goods for emergency relief purposes will be given to government or it's approved agent, non-governmental organization or a relief agency authorized by the minister responsible for disaster management. The following conditions apply:
- \* The goods are for use in areas where a natural disaster or calamity has occurred; or
- \*The goods are intended for use in officially recognized
- . The goods are household utensils, food stuffs, materials for provision of shelter or equipment and materials for health, sanitary or educational purposes; and,
- . In the case of a natural disaster or calamity, the importation or local purchase is made within six months or such further period, not exceeding 12 months, as the Commissioner may permit.
- Telephones for cellular networks and other wireless networks are EXEMPT from VAT.
- \*The following financial services are now EXEMPT:
- \*The operation of current, deposit or savings accounts, including the provision of account statements
- \*The issue, transfer, receipt or any other dealing with
- money transfer services, and accepting over the counter payments of household bills, but excluding the services of carriage of cash, restocking of cash machines, sorting or counting of money;

- · Issue of credit and debit cards;
- Automated teller machine transactions, excluding the supply of automated teller machines, and the
- · Telegraphic money transfer service;
- Foreign exchange transactions, including the supply of foreign drafts and international money orders;
- Cheque handling, processing, clearing and settlement, including special clearance or cancellation of cheques;
- . The making of any advance or the granting of
- Issuance of securities for money, including bills of exchange, promissory notes, money and postal
- The provision of guarantees, letters of credit and acceptance and other forms of documentary credit;
- The issue, transfer, receipt or any other dealing with bonds, debentures, treasury bills and other
- forms of security or secondary security; . The assignment of a debt for consideration;
- The management of a unit trust or collective investment scheme registered by the Capital Markets Authority and managed by the trustees of the scheme;
- Credit rating bureau services provided by a credit agency registered by the Capital Markets Authority.
- The provision of the above financial services on behalf of another on a commission basis.
- Sale of buildings clarified as EXEMPT supplies.
- · The following items are now ZERO rated:
- Photographic films
- · Video recording or reproducing apparatus
- Transmission apparatus
- · DC generators
- · Generator sets
- · Wind powered generating sets
- . TV, video and digital cameras
- · Non-motorized bicycles including delivery
- Lenses for cameras, projectors, photographic enlargers or reducers
- · Parts and accessories for cameras
- Equipment for photographic (including cinematographic) laboratories; negatoscopes
- · Other photographic flashlight apparatus and flash
- Refrigerated trucks, garbage collection trucks and insulated milk tankers
- · Agricultural tractor parts
- · Locally produced and ginned cotton
- Taxable supplies in respect of tea bought from the auction centers provided the tea is for export.
- Supply of taxable goods or services for use in the construction of grain silos upon approval by the director of agriculture.
- Supply of goods, including motor vehicles and taxable services to Kenya Red Cross Society.
- Supply of taxable goods and services to a film producer approved by Minister of Information.

## **Customs and Excise**

- Import duty exemption has been given on all industrial spare parts and will be managed through a duty remission scheme.
- \* Import duty removed on raw materials for the manufacture of sanitary towels
- . Duty remission granted on inputs for use by paper and paperboard mills
- Duty on asbestos fibers used in the manufacture of brake linings and pads has been removed
- Import duty on synthetic, acrylic, polyester and high ferocity yarns reduced from 10 per cent to zero
- \*To promote the tourism industry, duty exemption was granted on all four wheel motor vehicles specially designed and built for tourism To promote the film industry, import duty of 25 per cent on television cameras, digital cameras and video camera recorders has been removed
- Duty exemption granted on equipment and inputs (except motor vehicles) for direct exclusive use in oil, gas and geothermal exploration and development to licensed companies

\*Duty on sparkling wine changed from Shs. 85 or 65 per cent per litre to Shs. 70 or 50 per cent per litre.

\*All other spirits with alcohol strength by volume of 80 per cent or higher have reduced from Shs. 280 or 65 per cent per litre to Shs. 120 or 65 per cent per litre, whichever is higher.

\*Excise duties on other beer made from both malt and normalt and also non alcoholic beverages have increased

\*Excise duty formerly charged on gaming takings of licensees of gaming premises removed.

The effective date of the above changes is 12 June 2009.

# Miscellaneous Taxes and Other Provisions

Insurance Act - Cap 487 Section 23 - Effective date 1 January 2010

The amendment restricts shareholding of an insurance company to not more than 25 per cent per person either directly or indirectly.

It also prevents persons from appointing more than 25 per cent of the board of directors.

Purthermore it prevents persons from receiving more than 25 per cent of the dividends in any given financial

The Insurance Act will now bar any person who directly or indirectly owns, controls or is beneficially mittled to more than 20 per cent of the shares or dividends of an insurance company from participating in the day to day management of the company.

The last date for compliance with the above changes is 31 December 2010.

# Section 41 - Effective date 1 January

In line with the increase in the limit of investment in a bank or a financial institution which was increased from five per cent to 10 per cent in the last budget, the computation of solvency margins for general insurance business has been changed to allow up to 10 per cent of the admitted assets.

# Section 76 A - Effective date 1 January 2010

Insurance companies will only issue three months temporary cover to the new owner of a motor vehicle and will only renew it on production of the new log

# Section 188 - Effective date 1 January 2010

An application for the renewal of registration of an insurance company shall be made on or before 30 September of the preceding year.

The Insurance (Amendment) Regulations, 2009 -Effective date 12 June 2009

The insurance levy as per Regulation 51 of the principal egulations has been reduced to one per cent from 1.5

## Banking Act - Cap 488

Section 2, 3, 16, 27, 28 and 32 - Effective date 1 January 2010

The amendments allow the creation of agencies by banks to facilitate 'branch-less banking'.

## Section 12 - Effective date 1 January 2010

The Act is amended to remove the restriction on investments by banks in foreign companies licensed to carry on the business of the institution.

## Section 31 - Effective date 1 January 2010

The Act now provides for the sharing of information by Central Bank with other fiscal or tax agencies, fraud investigation agencies and similar institutions.

# The Foreign Investment Protection Act - Cap 518

Section 8 - Effective date 1 July 2009

The Act is amended to provide for the publication of agreements made with other governments.

# The Retirement Benefits Act (No.3 of 1997) - Effective date 1 January 2010

Section 37

Schemes with a fund value of up to Kshs 100 million may now invest 100 per cent of their funds in government securities and infrastructure bonds issued by public institutions.

Schemes with statutory contributions can only invest in government securities and infrastructure bonds issued

# The Retirement Benefits Act (No.3 of 1997) - Effective date 12 June 2009

The Retirement Benefits (Occupational Retirement Benefit Schemes) (Amendment) Regulations, 2009 and The Retirement Benefits (Individual Retirement Benefit Schemes) (Amendment) Regulations, 2009

The period for remitting the RBA levy has been xtended from four months to six months after the end of the financial year.

### The Retirement Benefits (Mortgage Loans) Regulations, 2009

. These new regulations now provide for members of a scheme to use their pension to secure mortgages.

### The Retirement Benefits (Minimum Funding Level and Winding up of Schemes) (Amendment) Regulations, 2009

The minimum funding level for schemes has been increased from 80 per cent to 100 per cent of liabilities.

## The Capital Markets (Licensing Requirements) (General) (Amendment) Regulations, 2009 - Effective date 12 June 2009

Stockbrokers are now required to prepare monthly reports and accounts within 15 days of the end of each calendar month and to avail them to the Authority upon request.

The regulations have made provisions for working hrough Stock Broking Agents.

All licensed institutions are now required to prepare accounts in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and to publish half yearly and audited yearly financial statements in at least two daily newspapers of national circulation.

They are also required to display a copy of the latest audited balance sheet and profit and loss account in every office and branch.

Stockbrokers and investment banks are now required to obtain professional indemnity insurance.

There are new regulations on corporate governance which include rules on:

· appointment of compliance officers,

\* changes in ownership, directors and key personnel,

· any changes in the branch network,

· changes in capital structure,

\* reporting by the auditors to the Authority,

· appointment, removal and rotation of auditors

The listing fee for new public offers of equity is reduced from 0.3 per cent to 0.15 per cent of the offer.

The appointment of approved transaction advisors for companies offering its securities to the public is now compulsory.

The arrangers of commercial paper and corporate bonds are required to submit quarterly returns by the 10th of the month following the quarter end.

### The Bills of Exchange Act - Cap 27 Section 49 and Section 74 - Effective date I January

The bill seeks to empower the Central Bank of Kenya to issue guidelines on the system of cheque clearing between banks based on electronic data or images without the conventional physical exchange of

# Kenya Airports Authority Act - Cap 395

Section 17 A and 17 B - Effective date 1 January 2010

The bill establishes the Kenya Airports Authority Fund into which the air passenger service charge and other funds of the authority shall be paid and from which expenditure shall be paid.

# The Traffic Act - Cap 403

Section 6 - Effective date 1 January 2010

The Traffic Act is amended to increase the number of days within which a commercial vehicle must be inspected and registered from 14 days to 30 days of release by the customs.

Vehicle owners can now migrate from the old generation log book to the new generation log book free of charge. This log book is electronically prepared and has more security features.

Section 98 - Effective date 1 January 2010

The validity period of a license to drive or a license to act as a conductor of a public service vehicle has been reduced from two years to one year.

# Insurance (Motor Vehicle Third Party Risks) Act - Can 405

Section 10 - Effective date I January 2010

The insurer will no longer be entitled to recover payments from the insured on judgements which may exceed the provisions of the insurance policy.

## Other proposals

The Traffic Act is to be amended to allow minor traffic ffenders who plead guilty to be fined on the spot.


