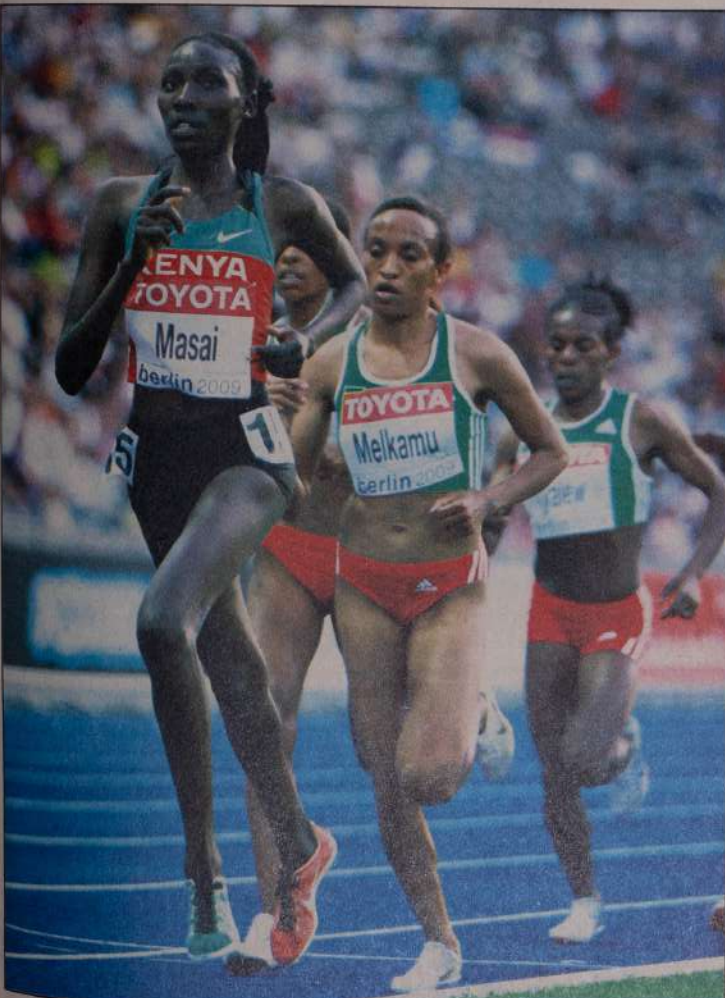

NEW WOMEN'S 10,000M WORLD TITLE HOLDER

BERLIN (Xinhua) -- Kenya's 19-year-old Linet Masai clocked a season best time of 30:50.24 to win the women's 10,000m title at the World Championships.

Masai, fourth in the Beijing Olympics, overtook Ethiopia's Meselech Melkamu in the final moment and women's 5,000m Olympic champion Meseret Defar on the line in a thrilling final with two meters to go. "I can't believe it! I'm so grateful for the win. I didn't give up," Masai said.





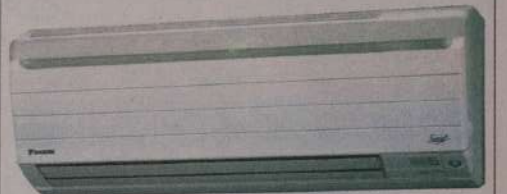

Tourism Minister Najib Balala Signs Deal With South Africa

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Kenya and South Africa on Tuesday signed a memorandum of understanding aimed at building ties on tourism between the two countries.

Kenyan Tourism Minister Najib Balala who signed the MoU with his counterpart from South Africa Marthinus van Schalkwyk said the agreement would play a major part in helping Kenya participate in South African tourism fairs to woo tourists from Southern Africa region.

"The agreement will encourage tourism investment in both countries. We will also cooperate in participation in tourism exhibitions, cultural exchanges," Balala told journalists in Nairobi.

He said the agreement will enable the two countries share information including data, market trends and information on legislative and regulatory mechanisms, institutions frame works among others.

"The agreement also offers for education and training in the field of tourism," the minister said.

He said South Africa has a strong domestic tourism sector where regions within the country are marketed as distinct destinations. "We can benefit from their experience in this," Balala said.

Kenya attracts about 20 percent of international arrivals from the African region whereas South Africa attracts about 70 percent.

More than nine million foreigners visited South Africa last year while locally less than a million tourists toured the country.

"The regional market is advantageous in that it was not as volatile as the overseas markets," said the minister.

He noted that the country stands to benefit immensely from the South African tourism market since it is the Africa's "economic powerhouse".

Balala expressed optimism that by the end of the year the sector would be back on its feet following good response from the European tourism market.

He added that efforts to spread wings to new source markets of Russia and Asia were paying dividends as tourists from those regions are set to tour the country in the coming months.

NEW 'EMERGENCY RESPONSE' DROUGHT RELIEF PROGRAMME

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Kenyan coalition government on Tuesday launched an ambitious emergency response program to provide rapid delivery of food, water and medicine to over 10 million people in arid and semi-arid areas of the country most affected by the prolonged drought.

The response program has been necessitated by serious challenges on the government coping mechanisms posed by the unprecedented deterioration of food security in the country, following the failure of rains for the fourth consecutive year.

The multi-faceted rapid response program was simultaneously launched in eleven arid and semi-arid districts by President Mwai Kibaki and Prime Minister Raila Odinga at Loiyangalani trading center in Marsabit North District.

WORLD FOOD

Kibaki said the interventions undertaken would complement the relief food distributed by the government in conjunction with the World Food Program covering 2.6 million adults, another 1.5 million children and over 250,000 others in supplementary feeding.

The president reassured Kenyans that the government was using all resources at its disposal including the deployment of the disciplined forces in distribution to ensure timely and

quick delivery of relief supplies to the hungry population.

To kick off the scaled-up drought response program, the president flagged off livestock off-take by Kenya Meat Commission (KMC), borehole drilling, the distribution of food and water to the affected families.

Relief food released by the government in the last one month to over 125 districts includes 132,280 bags of maize, 62,000 bags of rice, 30,000 bags of beans and 18,000 cartons of vegetable oil.

In Rwanda Cyclists Not Only Have Proper Safety Helmets, But They Insist On Wearing Them Too

This week we will continue where we left off last week and that is on the issue of compliance.

Our overall objective over the last few weeks has been to discuss how much global convergence there is in the Highway Code and then test compliance.

Compliance on the African continent and indeed in the so called Third World tends to be patchy.

However, my experience a couple of weeks back in Rwanda was a very pleasant surprise.

Consider that use of boda boda, something we understand started in Busia as a mode of transport on both the Kenya and Uganda side has now spread like wildfire across the whole of East Africa.

One finds this type of bicycle transport from Mombasa, Ukunda and Malindi at the Coast through to Goma on the shores of Lake Kivu.

Typically each bicycle carries one passenger and sometimes two especially in the mother and child case.

Almost every town has this form of transport.

It is also true that there is a rapid migration to the use of small motor cycles in this business.

As the traders get more affluent they upgrade their tool of trade from a human powered bicycle to a small engine motorcycle.

Makes the journeys faster and

also conserve on the energy of the trader.

It also takes care of the other unproven concern.

The wives of the boda boda riders in Busia once protested that their men do not have the expected full sexual function as



a result of the intense activity in the groin area during cycling.

There is no direct medical proof of this but several hundred women coming together to protest cannot be that far off the truth.

In all the countries that the boda boda is used there are actually rules that govern the conduct and safety of the bicycles as well as motorcycles.

As far as bicycles are concerned, the rules are simple.

One has to ride on the pre-

scribed side of the road and obey the laws as set.

There is very little on safety of bicycles especially when one looks at our East African regulations.

We believe it is about time that the relevant in the five countries got together and reviewed the highway rules as well as the local road regulations to ensure that safe passage is provided for bicycles through the creation of dedicated lanes in urban areas.

There should also be specific safety requirements for all those who use bicycles.

They should as a minimum, be required to wear safety helmets.

The most common cause of fatalities to cyclists is a result of them hitting the deck when involved in an accident and getting serious injuries from that action leading to internal bleeding and death.

However, for the motorbikes there are specific requirements across all the five countries that make up the East African common market.

caught my eye and was very impressive was the level of compliance to road rules but especially that of operators of the boda boda motorcycles.

One found that every single motorcycle that was registered as a boda boda had two helmets available all the time.

It was not like in Kenya where a motorcycle taxi would as a matter of course NOT have helmets available.

The Rwandese go one further and use the helmets.

This level of compliance was not only in the urban areas where it is well policed but also in the rural areas as well.

My excursion in Rwanda took me all the way to Gisenyi on the border with the DRC Congo.

The same town is in fact called Goma if one were in the DR Congo.

All along the way I saw every single motor cycle trader wearing a helmet and had one strapped to the passenger seat.

Where there was a passenger on the seat, that passenger would

be wearing a helmet every time.

There was no need for the men to be present for the boda boda operator to comply.

This culture of compliance seems to be rubbing off on the rest of the traffic on the highway. Drivers are courteous.

There is very little holding much more less than one would find in Nairobi even on a relatively quiet Sunday.

This shows patience.

Changing of lanes with hardly happens and well ahead of other traffic also always does not happen.

We need to take a leaf from the Rwandese and implement the same in Kenya so that we improve on how we as motorists behave in traffic.

Uganda also needs to do the same and go back to the glory days when they would not to Kenyan drivers as those who do not have a code to obey.

Ugandan drivers would be censured by their passengers and a citizen's arrest and common occurrence with boda boda traders and matatu drivers finding themselves on the wrong end of the stick and being taken to the nearest police station by their passengers.

As Kachumbiri says, we need to start the shift to making roads safer through compliance.

KWS Warn Kenya Risks Losing All Its Lions In 20 Years

NAIROBI (Xinhua) - Kenya might lose all its lions in the next 20 years if the current rate of decline continues unless urgent and decisive measures are taken, wildlife authorities warned on Monday.

The national lion population has been reducing by an average of 100 per year for the last seven years due to a combination of factors, including human wildlife conflict, destruction of habitats, climate change, disease and increase in human population.

The population of lions has

dropped from an estimated 2,749 in the year 2002 to 2,280 in 2004 to the current 2,000 individuals.

To reverse this disturbing trend, the Kenyan Wildlife Service (KWS) said on Monday that it has taken a number of measures including monitoring lion movements, creating public awareness and drafting of a comprehensive national lion conservation and management strategy to be launched next month.

"The new strategy will guide efforts geared towards conserving lions in the long-term and prescribes actions that need to be taken by various stakeholders coordinated by KWS to reverse the declining national population," KWS said in a statement.

KWS scientists have begun on Monday a week-long move to Amboseli National Park to replace two movement tracking devices on two lions.

The two collars were among five GSM devices fitted on lions in July 2007 for purposes of monitoring their movements and understanding human-lion conflict in the Amboseli ecosystem.

"For the last two-and-half years, KWS scientists have collected data on the lions' movement patterns.

"However, two of the collars have since stopped transmitting data after they expired and require replacement," the statement said.

The five collared lions in the project include three females and two males: Tato, Amyjane, Shangiki, Amboga and Kip.

Tato and Shangiki lost their GSM transmission but the VHF is still working. A 12-member team will fit the two collars during the one-week exercise.

The Amboseli Lion Project is a joint effort between KWS and the Leiden University, Netherlands under a Memorandum of Understanding between the two institutions.

Lions have a special place in

Kenyan's livelihood and conservation efforts.

Other than being the symbol for national strength, they are among the Big Five, a major attraction for visitors to Kenya.

"Many organizations also use it on their logos to symbolise the strength of the institutions and build their image for business development," the statement said.

The trend of lion population decline is disturbing and every effort needs to be made to ensure

that Kenya either stabilises population at the current population of 2,000 lions or increase the numbers to an ecologically acceptable level.

Quick and decisive action need to be taken to create public awareness as well as formulation of national guidelines on lion conservation and management in the long-term.

The Amboseli Lion Project, therefore, offers a good opportunity for Kenya to understand how part of its lion population behaving to enable the formulation of appropriate system level conservation approaches.

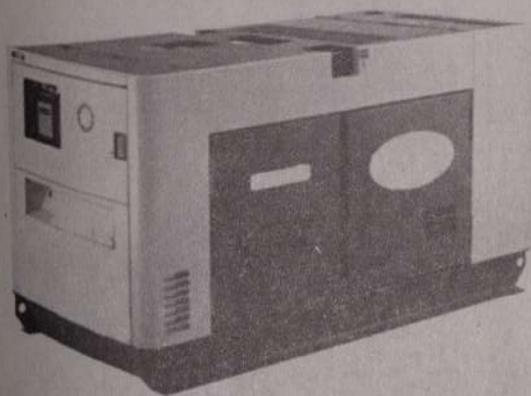
regulations for the children traveling in the bus at all times writes the spokesman Mr. Jayant Doshi.

He prayed for the deceased and assured his office is making all efforts to evacuate remaining Pakistani nationals from Somalia.

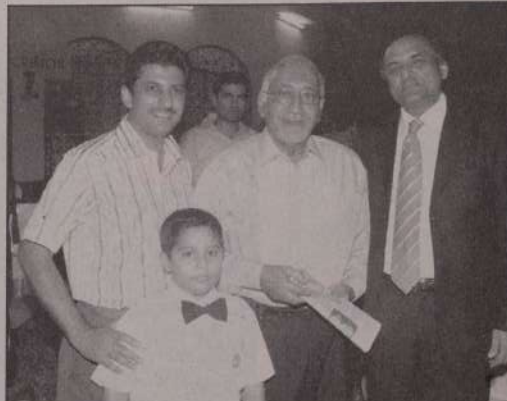

Producing Watercraft 'Safety' Equipment

Kenya Maritime Authority (KMA) has engaged local consultants to research on possibility of locally producing watercraft safety equipment.

KMA Director-General, Mrs. Nancy Karigithu said local production will make the safety equipment cheaper and therefore increase their availability among watercraft vessel operators.

Currently, Kenya imports maritime safety equipment from among other countries China, South Africa and the USA.

Most vessel operators of an estimated 20,000 watercraft plying Kenya's coastal and inland waters are fishermen and traders who can barely meet the cost of imported life saving apparatus that cost between Sh2000 and Sh6000.

"It is in this light of this statistics that KMA is looking into local production of the watercraft safety equipment expected to be cheaper," said Karigithu.

KMA is mandated to ensure maritime safety in Kenya's inland and coastal waters and also to ensure that ships calling at Kenyan ports adhere to international safety standards.

Karigithu said KMA recognized the role of maritime commercial activities and was now empowering them to follow safety standards and reduce maritime accidents.

There has been an estimated over 80 maritime accidents with over 100 fatalities since 2004.

She said KMA has started a national maritime sensitization campaign at the coasts, Lake Victoria, Lake Baringo, Lake Naivasha and Lake Turkana and for communities living around navigable rivers and dams to empower them operate within safe maritime environment.

KMA carries out inspections and issues a certificate of sea worthiness and licence only to vessels that pass this inspection.

The Authority is working with the Maritime Police Unit to ensure adherence to safety requirements.

Currently the compliance rate is low but with awareness campaigns and vigorous enforcement the Authority expects to raise the compliance rate.
