Relief Pours In For 'Faza Fire' Victims

World Vision Kenya has donated to the Kenya Red Cross Society (KRCs) relief materials worth Ksh1,169,000 (\$US15,587) for the reconstruction of houses in Faza Island of Lamu, following a fire disaster that left 2500 people homeless on 5th September 2009.

More than 430 houses were razed down.

World Vision Kenya's National Director Girma Begashaw commended KRCs for the good partnership between the two humanitarian institutions in addressing the Faza tragedy.

Construction materials donated by the World Vision Kenya comprised 750 pieces of iron sheets and 385kg roofing nails.

Mr Begashaw also said the World Vision Kenya plans to assist 400,000 people who will be affected by the anticipated El Nino rains, within the areas of its operations in the region.

He thanked for continued proactive response to disasters facing communities and pledged to support the Society in reaching out to the vulnerable people.

KRCs Secretary General Abbas Gullet commented: "Kenya Red Cross Society lauds the support by the World

Vision Kenya towards the reconstruction of houses in Faza Island.

"The Government recently helped raise Ksh64 million for the reconstruction of the homes.

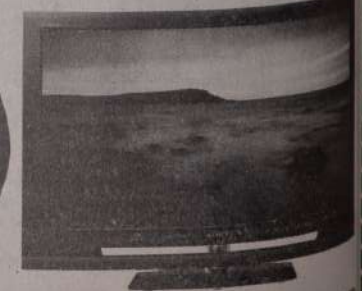

A Beach Picnic And Day Out For Disadvantaged Children

Some 1500 children and more than 100 carers and teachers experienced a day out last weekend, on a scale which has never been seen before in this province.

"We consider the advantaged and the disadvantaged are all God's children" said a member of the organising committee.

"What we wanted to do was give the less fortunate the kind of day out we would give our own kids.

"Most of the orphanages get allocations of food and other handouts from well-wishers; what we wanted to do was give

them a day out they would always remember and one which they would never have the opportunity to have otherwise."

And this they achieved - without a shadow of a doubt.

The brainchild of the women's branch of Shree Mombasa Brahma Samaj under the banner of Shree Gayatri Mahila Mandal and ably supported by the main body, organised a picnic of the year, if not the decade.

The venue was the spacious grounds of the Hindu Union, Bamburi, next to Travellers Beach Hotel on a beautiful beach frontage site.

Around 50 people were involved on the actual day in ensuring smooth running.

From the word 'go', it was fun, food and activities "and no speeches" said one of the organisers.

"This is the kids day, they don't need to listen to people talking."

As the children were arriving in different convoys, via buses sponsored by Coast Bus Ltd, Mash Bus Ltd, Kuldip Tours, Ketty Tours, Wild Water Ltd, Salim Dada and Kibarani Miik Suppliers.

Having been picked up from various points, they were immediately given a strawberry milkshake.

Like an upmarket Fete, there were stalls providing maize cobs, cassava crisps, bhajias, fried potatoes, top quality export standard oranges brought in all the way from Mweza, mangoes open cut and sprinkled with pepper; juicy water melon, there was a candy floss stall where the spun sugar was wrapped around sticks in a huge, sticky, sweet, pink mass, and a fresh coconut point where the coconuts were shelled, the flesh eaten or the juice drunk.

"Food was bought in vast quantities so we could not run out" said one of the catering team. The idea was that the children should not have to queue up, be checked on so they only got one of each thing - it was open house.

"What they wanted, they got! If they wanted a second helping, then they were given, even a third!

"This is what we give our own children so, on this day, these less fortunate got the same treatment. The demand was enormous and it never ended."

"By eleven the party had reached a crescendo most children were in and Nyota Ndogo and company with the drums guitar piano etc were in full blast.

The children jammed the stage as Nyota played their favourite numbers.

The camels at the same time were giving the children short rides on the beach.

As the temperatures rose the volunteers stormed in with lemon orange passion cocoa flavoured

ice lollies.

Meanwhile a photographer took individual pictures of each child either with the camel in the background or with Nyota Ndogo, after processing the photographs would be dispatched to the respective organizations.

By 1.00 p.m. all the biting stalls were wound up and then it was feasting time.

All the children were then seated under huge tents on chairs and tables.

The volunteers served chapatti rice and bean potato tomato curry on the table.

All the 1700 persons present at the venue had by 2.30pm had lunch.

Then it was ice cream time, and the volunteers worked tirelessly scooping vanilla chocolate strawberry ice-cream into small cups and serving to the children. Meanwhile the candy floss station was still abuzz with queues never seeming to end.

As usual it was now 'kwaheri kuonana' time, each child was escorted to the bus and given a schoolbag, soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, compass box, a box of crayons, a big mix of sweets

and biscuits and a banana in case they felt hungry on the way home with faces painted, a lolly in their mouths and hands full with gifts it seemed Santa Claus had come early this year.

When would children from disadvantaged backgrounds ever get such treats?

The joy and wonderment on their faces was a just reward for the hardworking team.

No-none - but no-one - was left out.

A Malindi school who had been invited could not make due to various difficulties, so members of the organising team went the next day all the way to Malindi with food and gifts.

"Our aim was to give to these kids everything a privileged child would have - and I believe we achieved that" said one tired but satisfied team member.

"My children are telling me this is the best day of their lives" said Elizabeth Kangome, founder and matron of Abundant Grace Orphanage, Likoni.

"And me, I loved to see all these children - some blind, some lame, some hardly able to feed themselves - having such a treat.

"I tried to help myself, pushing a wheelchair, and I was amazed to see the organisers ate the same food we did - and their children were waiting on us! I was humbled at such behaviour. God surely must have been here."

And still the treats were not over. Every child was photographed and will receive his/her own picture very shortly.

And the final accolade as the buses left to take the children home was that - although the organisers had Red Cross and a qualified doctor standing by, there was not one injury - not even a sticking plaster was needed!

With 1700 people having a good time, that is quite an achievement.

The transport team who so ably carried the children to and from the destination were vehicles from Mash Bus, Ketty Tours, Kuldip Tours, Coast Bus, Wild Waters, and Salim Dada.

The event was organized and financed by Shri Gayatri Mahila Mandal.

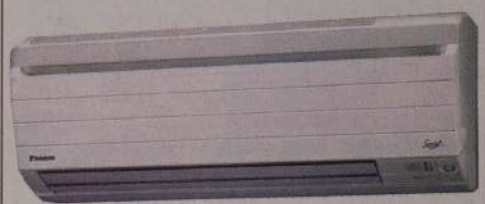

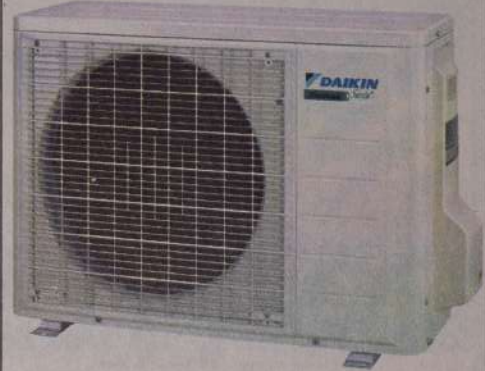



APDK Daycare Centre Has Officially Opened Its Doors

There was great excitement among children with disabilities and their parents when the Association for the Physically Disabled of Kenya (APDK) officially opened a Daycare Centre at Bombolulu Workshops and Cultural Centre on 14th of August presided over by the Provincial Director of Gender, Children and Social Development, Mr. Jared Kebaki Osoro.

The opening was witnessed by the main donors from Germany, Friedbert and Marie Hipp and friends from Talschule and Jugendclub Weingarten, the APDK Coast Branch Committee members under the Chairmanship of Mr. Zul Harunani, the National Director of APDK, Mr. Hubert Seifert and the Executive Officer for APDK Coast Branch Mr. Francis Kivull among other invited guests, parents and disabled children.

The plan of setting up such a Centre was conceived 5 years ago due to the request by parents who found it difficult to look after their severely disabled children and offer regular therapy to stimulate their development.

The Centre consists of a large Recreational Room to be used for stimulation i.e. training, music therapy, socializing and creative work such as arts, hand skills etc.

A Quiet Room will be used for relaxation and light music will be played to modify behavioural problems of hyperactive children.

The facility has an office, Reception and fully disability friendly and accessible toilets and showers as well as a play ground.

The facility is located next to the Bombolulu Nursery School and children will interact with their non-disabled peers for integration.

It is envisaged that the Daycare Centre will

relieve the parents during the day from the burdens of taking care of their children with disabilities who are otherwise not attended to by any existing intervention facility.

In practice, it is generally the mothers who take care of the needs of their disabled children, leaving no time to be engaged in meaningful socio-economic activities.

By working in turns at the Daycare Centre to take care in looking after each other's child, more time will be available for the mothers to be engaged actively in economic activities.

Programmes will be tailored to promote social contact amongst children through skills training and education of Community Workers which will promote tolerance in assisting disabled children realize their full potential.

The 15 disabled children who will attend are living around Bombolulu and its environs and will receive daily training on social stimulation, training in activities of daily living (ADLs) and life-living skills leading to semi-independence.

The Centre will be supervised by Salim Bakari, APDK Program Coordinator for Community Based Rehabilitation, (CBR) and run by an Early Childhood Development Teacher, Occupational Therapist, a Housekeeper and the mothers.

While in the Centre the children will receive nutritious food and excellent care.

The construction and equipment of this modern facility at a cost of Kshs. 2.6 Million was made possible through generous donations from Jugendclub and Talschule Weingarten, Prof. Dr. Heiss, Liliane Foundation, Mr. and Mrs. Chapman and others.

APDK is appealing to well-wishers to support the Centre by sponsoring any number of the children at Kshs. 3,000 per month per child or by donating raw food.

Coast Mourns Abdallah Said Zubedi

Prominent Coast philanthropist and Mombasa businessman Abdallah Said Zubedi has died while on a visit to Sanaa, Yemen.

Over many years he spent much of his considerable fortune in promoting Kenyan welfare institutions and helping poor students to pay their school fees.

Since his school days Abdallah was noted for his generous character, always helpful and active involvement, and possessing very positive leadership qualities.

He was educated at the Mombasa Arab Boys Primary and Arab Secondary Schools and was a leading Arab Boy Scout.

It was his 'Madrasah' teacher - Sheikh Salmin who founded the Arab Scout troop and appointed him its leader and he remained so throughout his life as its active patron.

He was nationally famous for his sponsoring the 'Round Table' Voice of Kenya television opera for fund raising in supporting welfare institutions and poor children.

The slot used to collect donated goods - such as television sets, radios, refrigerators - and auction them and the money collected would be distributed to some welfare institutions for poor by the Mombasa Lions and Rotary Clubs.

Abdallah was recognized as a highly respected Coast Arab leader who served not only his

community but the entire Coast population with great zest.

He established a profitable firm exporting coffee and tea to the Arab Gulf - his company was

known as Mwangi Coffee Ltd.

As a young man Abdallah was a prolific correspondent to *Mombasa Times* 'Letters to Editor', vehemently fighting for the Arab rights.

Among his well known close

friends included the former Deputy Governor of Central Bank, Sheikh Ahmed Abdalla, the Ship chandlers Sheikh Mohamed N. Muses and Sheikh Mohamed Gharib of Formax Insurance Brokers Ltd.

Ahmed Abdalla describing him as a reliable, honest businessman, ever hard working and deeply dedicated to welfare activities.

Mohamed N. Muses on hearing of his friend's death quoted a Qur'an verse:

"A soul does not know what is in store for him tomorrow neither does it know in which land to die."

Several hundred of his acquaintances were deeply sad for not being able to pay their last respect due to the fact that Abdallah's funeral rites were held at Sanaa.

They submitted their condolences to his widow and seven grown up offspring Said, Moha Omar and four daughters.

May Almighty Allah rest his soul in Paradise, amen.

Life And Death Among The Turkana

We have pitched our missionary tent among the pastoralist's tribes of Turkana who live among other surrounding tribes of Samburu, Borana, and Somalis.

Usually the cause of feud among these pastoralist tribes is cattle rustling.

On the September 10 or 11 we heard that a young Borana man attacked a Turkana Manyatta in one of our out-station churches at Chumvi Yere killing an elder and three young people and making away with their livestock.

It is not clear whether the Turkana caught up with the particular young man who did the assault but what is clear is that some days later it appeared there was a revenge attack on the Samburus because on the next day, a Sunday, one of the elders - among the few who attend church told me - that following my desire to meet with the elders he went around inviting them to come to church that Sunday but given the security situation they may not come in good numbers since they are at 'high alert'.

Although there were few elders but they looked distracted and due to the fact that a good number were absent, we agreed I go along with the meeting with the youth which was earlier programmed.

Between the Sunday of September 12 and 19 things

deteriorated to the extent that at least four Turkana young men were gunned down at Isiolo near the hospital by the rival tribe.

That was how the movement started - they started closing camps - moving with their few belongings to Ngar'emara - usually - women and children.

That means the two mission nursery schools in that outstation church and the primary school closed.

We did not go for the usual food drop and Pastoral Instruction program at the Primary school.

By Monday, as we were rushing a sick man from the Mission dispensary to Isiolo hospital I counted not less than seven groups of families, mainly comprising of women and children who were on the road from Ngar'emara to Isiolo who looked like they had no clear idea of where they were going.

That was confirmed as we were coming back because very few asked for the usual lifts in the Dispensary vehicle as they usually do.

My initial apprehension that many may be heading to our church compound was not to be.

UNUSUAL ATTENTION

At the hospital as we were bringing out the sick man at the casualty drop-off stage and I observed the unusual attention given to us and when I enquired I was told people thought it was more people killed or wounded that were being brought.

That was how I received the news that up to seven bodies

had already been received in the hospital.

While going back to Ngar'emara we saw the Red-Cross Land Rover with its flag flamboyantly displayed.

It then dawned unto me that the situation was very serious.

By the time we reached the mission there were up to three lorry loads of security personnel in front of the mission near the Councillor's house.

[We have only stayed about three months here and it is a normal thing that the Mission always live at the margin of information flow].

On Sunday we had our usual service at Ngar'emara and Arimet (the most populated out-station) and our usual consultative meetings with groups.

Fr. Timothy who went to Arimet reported that the people were very few as many have deserted their manyattas (little group of huts).

In the evening, during our usual monthly mission meeting with the sisters, we had to discuss at length on what to do as a Church with respect to the IDPs (Internally Displaced Persons).

Here the Catholic Church means schools (education sponsorship), Hospital, Water, Relief food, services of which the people are for all these years still unable to pay for.

The many years drought situ-

ation tends to render everything hopeless.

In the morning, Monday, I called Bishop Anthony Ileri, and officially informed him that our Mission is the place principally affected by the present clashes and whether there are some foods available to assist the people.

He commiserated with us telling us not to lose heart even as being the first time it may be shocking to us.

He sent the Justice and Peace priest coordinator and the Development Coordinator and they left for Nairobi same Monday to try to secure some food.

The Red-Cross, going by the information from the local councillor, is going to do something.

Special report by Fr. Tim Ogutu of the Catholic Missionary Fathers [CMF]

[But all I see for now is their advertisement on the Radio and TVs making appeals for help].

The Turkana local community appear to be very remarkable in sharing their joys and sorrows.

There are about 1500 IDPs but it appears they have all been absorbed by their extended families.

We did an on the ground assessment this morning:

We have two of our outstation churches and communities (Chumvi Yere and Arimet) affected and people displaced.

Actually today we had to go around visiting the places they are camped - with extended families at different centres in Ngar'emara and also a nearby thickset bush where about 150 people have made their home for the time being.

Presently, we have an estimated number of 1500 IDPs (Internally Displaced Persons).

We are hoping that by this week they will be returning to their Manyattas (village huts) as the security situation has improved with the presence of the police for three days now.

[Though while driving through Chumvi Yere community this morning I was shocked that I never saw any of the police men, yet up to four lorry loads were added on Monday to the ones that came earlier on Saturday].

But, following the same bush road to go to Isiolo, and coming out at the road leading to the hospital road where majority I understand are Boranas, I met a group of armed police - up to 12 of them - we actually gave them a lift to Isiolo town.

It looks like the distribution of both the security and every other thing here has something political about it.

I hear the police are here demanding for the return of the four weapons taken after the killing of one administrative police and three home guards during the shootout between the two tribes.

The Turkanas do not have many people in high places and generally do not trust the government.

They believe the clashes are always caused by the Politicians to make themselves relevant to the political process.

This is hard to confirm. I remember though that the last clash this year before we came here, the news carried it that the Catholic bishops - (including Bishop Ileri) of these

arid areas - Isiolo, Marsabit and Maralal - strongly told the government to pull away their forces, that they are part of the problem and not the solution.]

Presently we have gone round, prayed with them, offered words of encouragement and shared some food offered mostly by their children living in the mission boarding facility and the Alakara (Disabled Home) who volunteered to forgo a meal daily to assist their families who are now IDPs.

[In Ngar'emara primary, it is not unusual for school pupils to sometimes eat half of the food they are served and go with half for those at home].

They will however need some basic assistance with respect to food even as they return.

Hopefully the diocese should be able to take care of this number.

What I think is needed here is a sustained conflict resolution and peace building initiatives that will cut across the pastoral tribal lines.

It is madness to see these clashes among the pastoralists as normal but that appears to be the mindset here.

We earlier on met with the parish priest, who himself is Borana but a level-headed young man, it appears, of the nearest mission at Archers' Post populated by the Boranas.

That mission belongs to Maralal diocese.

I think we can do something in this regard as Claretians between the two Mission parishes comprising principally of Turkanas and Boranas.

The young priest has been there for up to four years now and will likely support such idea if there is some sponsorship for it.

[There is a saying I learnt from the former pastor that here in Ngar'emara an elder can smell a roasted goat within one mile distance radius.

Meaning that if you are ready to slaughter a goat they will always honour an invitation for a meeting].

Some German, Italian or Englishman man working in a restaurant is not a 'tourist' - he is a 'resident' - hence must apply for a resident permit.

Europe will not allow a Kenyan to hang around without valid papers way after the expiry of the visa - If you do, you get deported.

We equally have a lot of former tourists who have overstayed for various reasons and exceeded beyond the one year mark and eventually engage in business or even hang out in some environment that a local person

is not familiar with or brave enough to venture into.

Once these long staying visitors engage in business then they cease to be 'tourists' as they are prone to all the vulgarities of life just like any Kenyan.

I strongly appeal to the press to stop referring to long stay former tourists as 'tourists' but as 'residents' of whatever origin

as the depiction that we hurt or attack our tourists is not well received in the source market.

It also evident that from time to time certain social misfits from Europe have found safe haven in Kenya and I urge the immigration to crack the whip and deport them if and when they are seen loitering in any urban centers.

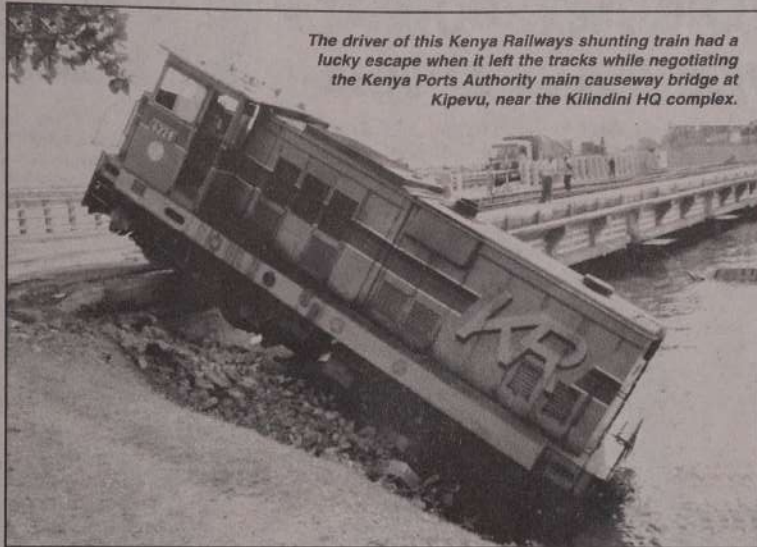
It is a fact that at the Kenya coast a number of such persons still masquerade as 'tourists' ... while they ceased being tourists at least 18 months ago.

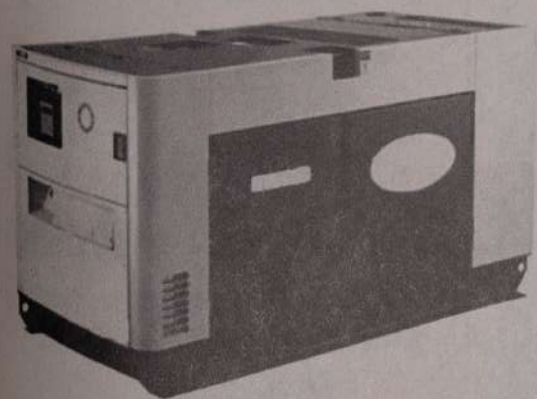

We Need To See Some Serious Investment In The Police Force

The new top cop has come in with a vengeance ... as was to be expected.

He has made the almost compulsory changes in his line up of senior officers and promised to give the power back to the cop at the operational level.

Among one of the interesting announcements he made was that the boys in blue would now be expected to follow their operational manual to the letter.

This is indeed surprising. We have had a series of Commishes who have brought in reforms and spent tonnes of taxpayers and also aid money in doing what were perceived to be good things yet here we have a top cop telling us he is going back to the basics that have always existed.

Good old policing is in fact a very basic and simple activity. There are clear laws that have been established by those in the legislature of the land.

There is the national etiquette that has been established.

We, as citizens of the land are expected to follow the law and behave in the correct and expected manner.

Some of us will not do so and this is where the boys in blue come in.

Their key role is to first remind us what we should be doing and caution us where we are veering off the straight and narrow.

This is what is called community policing.

The cops are established in a community and become part of that community.

They advise and resolve simple issues where a person in authority is required to adjudicate on interpretation.

They are more or less the custodians of the right things to do.

At this community level they are the immediate reference for

law and order.

Where we do not operate in accordance with the law and accepted etiquette they then have to take action and reprimand.

If this fails they then apprehend and let the law take its course.

There are of course certain instances when the boys in blue have a certain measure of latitude that they can exercise in executing their mandate.

This latitude, if used judiciously, can be one of the ways that they build up good will and credibility in the community in which they operate and eventually across the whole nation.

are back. Most road users will rejoice with this announcement.

However those who use the road for commercial purposes are probably peeved at the fact that they will now not be able to operate with the impunity that they have been used to.

The Rules are basic.

Wear a seat belt, do not over speed, ensure that you have a seat in whatever form of transport you are travelling in and finally be courteous when dealing with other road users including and especially passengers in public transport.

These again are basic requirements under the law.

All that Michuki did was to ensure enforcement.

The reason why we all remember the period and indeed why we gave the actions the name we did was the drastic impact it had on the reduction of accidents.

There was also a marked improvement in courtesy on the road.

Most of us will welcome the return of enforcement but we should go the whole hog.

The so called Michuki Rules addressed what the then Minister for Transport considered the low hanging fruits that would bring the quickest benefits.

However we need to go deeper into what should be enforced by the boys in blue.

They should team up with the vehicle inspectors and regularly carry out vehicle safety compliance checks.

If these are carried out randomly and regularly, we will also see fewer on-roadworthy vehicles on the road.

This would have the positive effect of both saving lives by reducing the number of accidents but would also reduce the cost of motoring by reducing damage due to malfunctioning safety critical items as well as simply better fuel consumption by the vehicles.

It would be great if Commish followed his declaration with the provision of the necessary

enforcement tools and ensured the availability for this activity.

We have in previous shown that there would be a challenge of us motorists to get away with the Highway Code and its appendices.

However there will still be a challenge of us motorists to get away with the Highway Code and its appendices.

Enforcement offers the opportunity for graft.

The bottom line in all this is the cops are grossly underpaid in this country.

Their living conditions are generally appalling.

While the government is it is trying to improve this there is really no commish in this.

We are convinced that the country is to turn the terms of attractiveness to investors and indeed to citizens, we need to see a serious investment in the force.

Salaries need to be trebled, living conditions to be improved and the force to be properly equipped.

The police stations are an example in squalid conditions and the cells holding areas are worse than prisons.

In fact some people would rather be held in a cell than in the police equivalent.

They need to be spruced up like the front office of a prosperous multinational company.

They need to attract need not to put them off.

If we are to see results we reform everything that is with the police and very much at that.

The Ransley commission the police force improvements still to issue its final report.

There are other reports that have been prepared and once done are destined the bookshelves where they gather dust till disturbed by arrival of the next report.

These must be brought into implemented as necessary.

Let Commish take advantage of this change to make necessary changes that endear the boys in blue to citizens of this country.

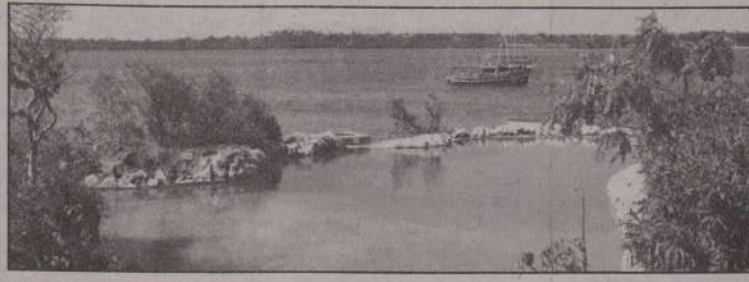

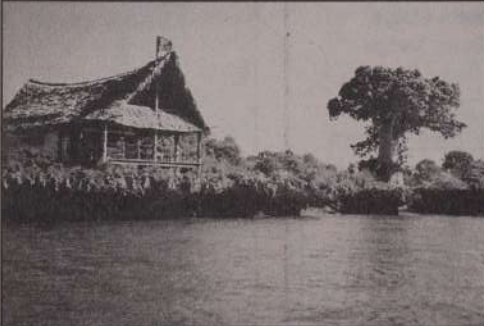

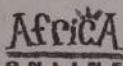
