Tourism Income Up Ten Per Cent

NAIROBI (Xinhua) - Kenya's tourism earnings between January and September rose by 10.2 per cent to K. Shs. 36.64 billion shillings (about U. S. \$488.5 million), compared with K. Shs. 33.24 billion shillings realized in the same period in 2008.

Tourism Minister Hon. Najib Balala attributed the increase in earnings to sustained marketing and publicity drives that salvaged the gains of the 2007 post-election violence which battered the nation's economy and thus scared visitors.

Balala said Kenya was still 17.9 per cent lower than in 2007, when revenues stood at K. Shs. 44.63 billion shillings.

"This drop however is not proportionate to the deficit in arrivals which stands at 12.1 per cent more than last year, this difference can partly be attributed to the global financial crisis as consumers are spending less

when traveling as well as focusing on package deals," he said.

Students And Teachers Join In Mombasa KSPCA Animal Welfare Education Project

Mombasa KSPCA's pilot project for a new animal welfare education program ended on October 24 with a ceremony for the five best students from all the participating schools.

"Education in animal welfare always remains one of the main missions for KSPCA", explains KSPCA Mombasa executive officer Marien Enz.

"For many years KSPCA have been visiting schools and teaching children about the importance of animals in our daily life and how to take care of them.

"After WSPCA left Mombasa some years ago KSPCA was the only remaining society teaching animal welfare in schools.

"In the past years we have managed to teach in two or three schools during the year, but this could never bring enough input to change the behavior of children towards animals.

"For this reason we planned, in coordination with WSPA, a new strategy and held in May this year a seminar for teachers in animal welfare at Reef hotel.

"A group of 30 teachers from 15 schools had been invited to this important day, with 14 schools attending the seminar and 12 of them later deciding to participate in the project.

"Different speakers from various organizations like Colobus trust, Turtle Watch, KWS and KSPCA and also the KSPCA veterinarian talked about different and endangered animal species and also about the environment.

"All schools went home with the necessary documentations for their lessons to the children."

The course in which two lessons were given every week ended with examinations and the celebration of the five best students from each school.

They learned about the importance of vaccinations, castrations, treatment and the behavior towards all living

creatures. They further learned about the profit they make from all their animals, dogs, cats and also their work animals like donkeys and all the farm animals if they treat them like they would like to be treated.

"They heard that animals suffer like we do, feel pain, feel loved or unloved, need attention, need food and water, need rest, need a proper place to sleep, need treatment if they fall sick.

"All what human beings need.

"They know by now that animals have a heart and a soul and as more as we give them as more we get back from them.

"As better we take care of them as better they serve us.

"As more we love them as more they are not just an animal but a friend."

The ceremony was held at the Girl guide Shanzu disabled center in Shanzu (Serena), a charity which KSPCA is very close to and is helping each other in various situations.

"This project is also about humanity.

"What we give we get back.

"Our whole life should be about being there for each other, and to reach out and love each other.

"Both human and animals: we are all on the same world.

"We all need each other."

Some of the students prepared a speech about what they learned and what has changed their feelings and their behavior towards animals.

Dr. Felsaj Faraj who is practicing in Watamu and Dr. Kioko the DVO from Mombasa corrected the speakers where necessary and added some important information.

Mrs. Claudia Loetscher was reminding all once more that we all only can win in treating animals nicely.

The 12 primary schools, with

children from class four to class eight, who participated on the pilot project included:

Mtwapa, Kwa Jomvu, Kikambala, Kiembeni, Kongowea, Mikindani, Mtomondoni, Mtepeni, Shariani primary school,

Light Academy, Ananda Marga academy and Braeburn international school.

The students from the Mikindani Primary school surprised all with a self written song which they presented

during the event.

"All our animals

"Show them kindness,

"Show them love

"When they are happy you will be happy,

"They will give you meat and eggs if you give them food and water and you build for them a shelter

"In return you have to give them food and water and you build for them a shelter

"Even donkeys: They always work for you so please give them food and water

"And remember they need to rest.

"We believe this course has been a big success and we hope to raise enough funds for education to continue with this new way of education in animal welfare.

"In only few years we may reach all schools in our area and will try to make sure that at least our children continue thinking about what is best for the animals.

"We can only hope that will prove to be a big step towards our goal of giving all animals a better life and be a part of ours."

Leading Overseas Drivers Are In Mombasa For Kenya Airways East African Classic Safari

With less than a month to go before the Kenya Airways East African Safari Classic Rally kicks off from Mombasa preparations are in top gear with the arrival in Kenya of several leading overseas drivers.

Jeff Amin from California (USA) and Harpal Suddle from England are already in the country working on the logistics and final plans for one of the world's great marathon rally.

The event will cover over 4500 kms during a 10-day adventure between Tanzania and Kenya.

"I am waiting for my Datsun 260Z to arrive at the Mombasa port by the end of the month.

"Prior to that is to put all plans

together so that we have a successful event," said Amin, who will take part in the event for the second edition running.

Suddle's Datsun 1200, one of the smallest cars in the list of 46 entries, is already in Mombasa.

He plans to take it to his former home in Eldoret from where final preparations will be carried out.

Amin will be navigated by local co-driver Kashif Sheikh, while Suddle will guide fellow Briton, Balvir Singh Grewal who will be making his debut in the event.

Keyans will rely on Ian Duncan to carry their hopes following the official announcement of the start

order list of the KQ-sponsored rally last week.

The former Safari Rally is seeded at number two in the list of 46 crews representing over 15 countries around the globe.

Gerard Marcy of Belgium is seeded at number one at the wheels of Porsche 911.

Defending champion, Bjorn Waldegaard is missing out of the list after his sponsors failed to raise budget for him to contest event.

With Waldegaard out of the event, Europeans may miss out on equalling the number victories in the marathon event with their local rivals.

Kenians won the event twice in a row beginning in 2003 and then 2005 at the hands of Rob Collinge in a Datsun 260Z respectively.

The Swede gave Europeans its first taste of victory in 2007 at the wheels of a Ford Escort RS2000.

It was thirty-five years ago that Hannu Mikkola and Gunnar Palm finally broke the stranglehold of the local drivers and became the first crew from outside East Africa to win the Safari.

Ever since the event's inception in 1953, the winners had always been drivers living in one of the three countries - Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda - that made up East Africa.

In the ensuing thirty years, the score was eight victories to the locals and twenty-three to the visitors, a performance that brought the visitors to within four outright victories of the locals.

When the World Championship Safari Rally stopped with its last event in 2002, the KQ East African Safari Classic Rally was born in 2003.

Thus, the situation is that as far as the KQ Safari Classic is concerned, the score is two victories to the locals and one to the visitors with Waldegaard's sole win in 2007.

Can we see a little bit of history being replayed?

Although the details of the actual 2009 rally route are secret until the rally starts, the Safari organizers have released an outline of the rally with locations of the night halts.

The innovation this year is that three of the night halts are used for two consecutive nights in Arusha, Amboseli and Naivasha.

Tourism Income Up Ten Per Cent

FROM FRONT PAGE at 687,664, compared with 496,056 in 2008 translating to an increase of 38.6 per cent.

"These are encouraging results and with all factors remaining constant, it is expected that international tourism arrivals by air and sea will close at about 930,000 at the end of 2009 thus surpassing 2008 results which closed at 729,000," Balala said Tuesday.

"We are therefore happy to report that the industry is now back on track with an average recovery rate of 87.9 per cent with some source markets showing full recovery."

The minister said some of the source markets which recorded growth include the United States,

India, China, Australia, the United Arab Emirates, Russia, and the regional markets of Uganda and Tanzania.

The minister said the state-run Kenya Tourism Board (KTB) has positioned itself strategically to capitalize on the 2010 World Cup in South Africa by partnering with Soccerex, a business convention for the global football community that brings together the football industry prior to the 2010 showcase.

This partnership, Balala said, will provide an opportunity for Kenya to directly benefit from the first World Cup in Africa.

The country's tourism sector suffered after terrorist attacks on the U.S. Embassy in Nairobi in 1998 and a hotel bombing in

2002 near the coastal town Mombasa.

However, it has recovered through an aggressive marketing campaign in its source markets in Europe and in new ones in Asia, leading to tourism's best performance in 15 years in 2004, when the sector earned 44 billion shillings.

Among the key sources markets, Britain showed faster recovery during the period with 122,327 visitors accounting for 44.41 per cent increase from the year 2008, when the figures stood at 84,904.

Balala said Germany also showed an impressive improve of 73 per cent from last year, recording 48,573 arrivals compared with 28,070 in 2008,

followed with Italy with 45,184 arrivals up from 21,564 arrivals in 2008.

"The U.S. market has recorded 98.6 per cent recovery based on the 2007 results with 78,691 arrivals. In 2008, arrivals stood at 54,730," he said.

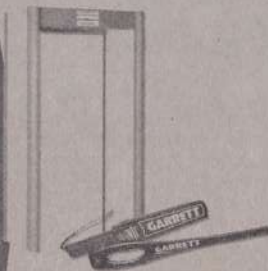
The minister said China's performance exceeded the 2007 results with 15,158 figures, compared with 13,474 arrivals in 2007.

"We are happy to report therefore that by September 2009, we were only 12.1 per cent below 2007.

"This performance reinforces our optimism that we may surpass the 2007 levels by close of the year," the minister said.

Kachumbari has been AWOL for a couple of weeks and I caught up with him to have a chin wag about his absence.

He told me that he had been away touring in the Western part of Africa.

On enquiring what interesting tales he had for us, he painted for me a picture of a *Kazi Kwa Vijana* (or KKV) type scheme that seemed to work wonders unlike our Marshall plan in Kenya that is much talked about but is yet to see the light of day.

The plan he saw also had its challenges.

Ghana had exactly the same problem that Kenya has.

It was not an issue of post election violence like us but they had one of the ingredients that could have fuelled something akin to post election violence.

The country had a surplus of youth that either had little or no education so could not hope to get the few formal jobs that existed.

The informal sector was not that vibrant either hence the opportunity to join the jua kali ranks did not exist.

Those youth that finished high school or some similar form of secondary or technical education also had a challenge getting jobs.

The short of it was that the country, just like Kenya, had a load of idle youth who could easily be turned into fighting machines, hooligans or become fodder for rent a crowd merchants.

The leadership in the country realised that they had to get these youths gainfully occupied and very quickly.

What they did not do is to throw money at youth to create entrepreneurs.

They instead decided to look at how best they could use the money made available for youth

programmes in order to create sustainable interventions that they were sure would work.

They invested a lot of money in youth but did so very cleverly.

They put them to work just like in the KKV programme in Kenya but they also took the opportunity to sort out some of the social problems bedeviling the country.

The first example is what they did to enhance security.

The police force in the country was stretched, just like ours in Kenya.

Security or lack of it was becoming a serious problem that was giving the country a bad name.

Just like in Kenya, the word community policing came up as the answer to the deteriorating security situation.

These chaps decided to train the youth in basic policing duties and then deploy them to create some order in the community.

The youth maintained order rather than maintained law ... a very subtle but important distinction.

The 'vijana' were not in a position to arrest, charge or in any way take the law into their hands.

That was left for the regular and properly trained police to do.

Theirs was to help the citizenry go about their lives in an ordered manner and intervene wherever order was about to be broken.

Arguments were broken up and prevented from deteriorating into fights through arbitration.

Where this was not possible and matters were getting out of hand, the community police bods would quickly get on the radio and summon the regular police to come and sort out the issue.

Because there were many of them, wananchi were never too far from a community 'police-

in the communities.

This is how quality control was maintained.

Senior cops would regularly tour the communities to assess and advise on the conduct of the youth so deployed.

The other area where there was a need and the youth were deployed after rudimentary training was in the health sector where they handled basic work in hospitals, health centres and clinics.

Again they would be supervised by people who had the superior knowledge.

They were not allowed to do any work that required specialist knowledge and licensing such as work that would be done by nurses and doctors.

They would do the basic menial jobs that required some basic understanding of medical skills but not rocket (or rather needle) science.

We could go on and on in giving examples of how Ghana has partially solved their idling youth problem.

For the same monetary outlay as in our KKV programme their results have been a more secure, healthier and better educated community.

However, there was one interesting side show that caught

Kachumbari's attention.

The community policing youth were drafted into many police activities including traffic control.

This was welcomed by most drivers in that the country has very few roundabouts and most junctions are controlled by traffic lights.

Due to the quality of power and the unreliability of some of the technology in use, it is not unusual to find traffic lights not working.

These community youth had been trained in traffic control and had the delegated authority and vestments to carry out the role.

This worked well and the drivers appreciated this.

However, there were plenty of junctions which became clogged at peak hours which could have done with traffic control.

There were not enough of these youth to go round.

So what happened?

There were as usual the enterprising youth who stepped into the vacuum that was thus been created.

Some of the not so lucky youth that had not been drafted into the community corps decided that they would voluntarily fill the vacuum.

They started by doing like our voluntary pothole repairers.

They would find a junction lacked order and had to be up to the cars and ask the

A lot of drivers would appreciate their appreciation of the rendered and indeed had some money.

For the motorists it meant they spent less time in the through the actions of the enterprising youth.

The 'vijana' did the job that were not authorised by the nor were they part of the community youth brigade.

Some of them became smarter and spent their coins and bought the reflective vests so that they look the part.

As it stands, there has been an arrest made of these 'community' youths.

They are filling a void that this innovative KKV programme has not been able to fill.

They do not harass motorists except for asking for money. motorists are willing to pay the service.

Why not absorb them into the community corps?

Our government needs consider this model as it make the wananchi appreciate more the KKV concept.

At the moment it is seen as a waste of time and money more as a channel of revenue for the rabble rousers and the crowd groups that position and used during the last election and also as a means of making them warm for the next election.

If they were to be put into form of disciplined work they may be convinced that they indeed being gainfully employed from loitering or from being retained for future use.

However, it has to be done with caution so that the ideal is not hijacked as in the case of KKV.

As Kachumbari says, it illustrates that even the laid plans can have some things happen.

We need at least a couple of more bridges to connect the

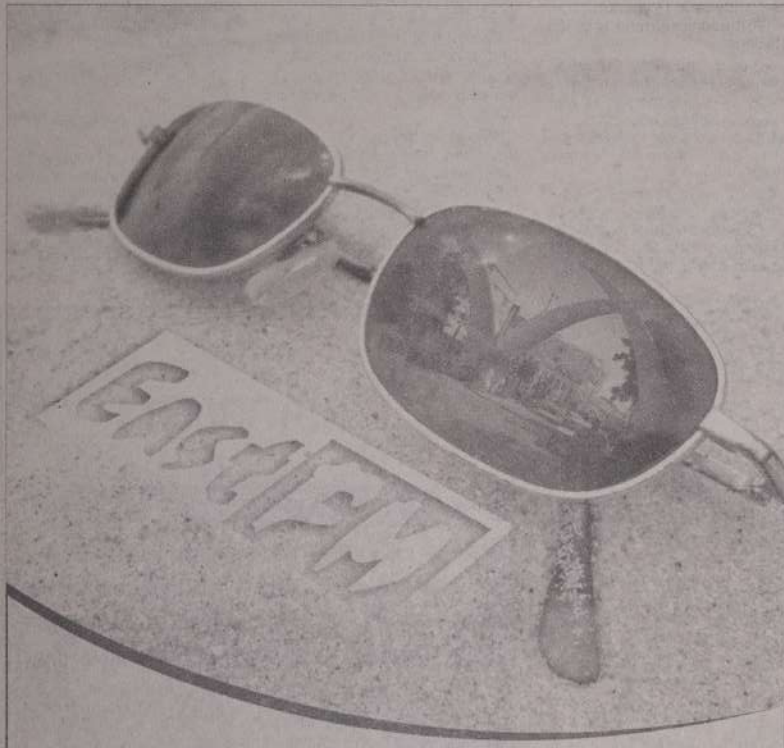

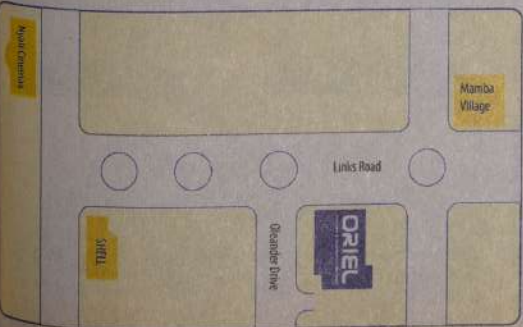

Lions Club Of Mombasa Bahari's Free Camp

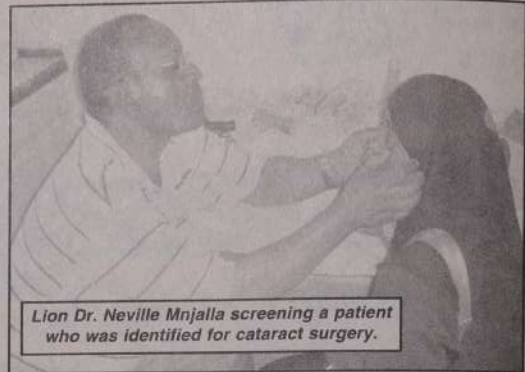

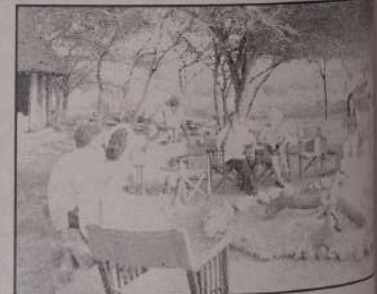

Kenya's Surinder Thatthi Becomes One Of The Vice Presidents Of FIA

Kenya's Surinder Thatthi becomes one of the seven vice presidents of the FIA to oversee motor sports activities in the African Region following the elections which saw Ari Vatanen of Finland lose by a big margin, writes **SAMSONATEKA**.

Todt's votes stood at 135 while Vatanen was down at 45. Thatthi, who is the current Event Director of the East African Safari Classic Rally, becomes the second Kenyan to hold a senior position at the helm of the World's Governing Motor Sports organization since Shekhar Mehta's reign at the FIA until his death.

Thatthi began his motor sport career in 1982 when he became a co-driver and logistics coordination manager for GM Euro Sport, Audi Sport and the Nissan Rally Team at various WRC events.

Throughout the 1980s, he worked for a wide range of rally events including Safari Rally Kenya and World Championship rallies in Brazil, Argentina, New Zealand and the Ivory Coast.

In the late nineties, he was elected President of the FIA Confederation of African Countries in Motor Sport (CACMS) and was also elected a member of the FIA Rally Commission.

Thatthi was appointed Secretary General and Director of the Kenya Motor Sport Federation in 2002 and was elected a member of the FIA World Motor Sport Council in 2004.

He was made Chairman of the KCB Safari Rally Kenya in 2005.

Thatthi has worked for the last four years as an FIA Steward in Formula One, WTCC, WRC and regional rally championships in Europe, the Middle East, Asia Pacific and Africa.

Todt has been involved in motor sport since 1966. After graduating from the School of Economics and Business in Paris, he had a successful career as a rally co-driver from 1966 to 1981, ending with a Manufacturers' World Title win with Talbot Lotus.

In 1982, Todt retired from competition and was appointed Director of Racing Activities for Automobiles Peugeot, where he founded the Peugeot Talbot Sport team.

His team went on to win two rally constructors' world championships, two rally drivers' world championships and four victories at Paris-Dakar.

In 1990, Todt became Director of Sporting Activities at PSA Peugeot-Citroen Group, which won the World Title in Sports Cars in 1992 and saw two victories at 24 Hour Le Mans in 1992 and 1993.

Todt entered his career with Ferrari as General Manager of its Racing Division in 1993. By 2001, he was General Manager of all Sporting Activities of the Ferrari-Maserati Group and in 2006; he became Chief Executive Officer of Ferrari SpA.

During Todt's time with Ferrari, the team won a total 98 Grand Prix victories and 13 world titles.

NFA Invited For The Annual German Soccer Competition

Nairobi Football Academy (NFA) team will take part in an annual soccer competition in Germany in April, next year at the invitation of Wangen Soccer Academy.

NFA director, Hussein Terry said they have received an official invitation from Wangen SA to take part in the competition which has also attracted Stuttgart, Bayern Munich, clubs from Belgium and Switzerland.

"We will be making history by becoming the first football academy in Africa to be invited in this competition," Terry, former Harambee Stars team manager told Coastweek early this week.

He said he arrived back last week from a tour of five European

countries - Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Italy and France.

Terry said Wangen SA invited them after seeing NFA participated in the Torino competition held in Italy three months ago.

The other silver medal came from the 15-16 years 50m Freestyle.

Again the race was very close where all the first three swimmers finished together and the race could only be decided by the computerized touch pads.

First place position went to Amina Magdy Moustafa of Egypt in a time of 27.65. Sylvia Brunlehner finished second in a time of 27.72 and third place position was taken by Jo-Mary Vanzyl of South Africa in a time of 27.73.

"I wanted to win gold so bad but am happy with the two silver medals. I want to dedicate these medals to all the swimmers in Mombasa especially the junior swimmers and encourage them that nothing is impossible" commented the soft spoken Sylvia.

The only thing that I can encourage them is what my coach always tells me 'train hard win easy' She added.

There were sixteen (16) countries which participated during the Africa Junior Swimming Championship.

The countries were Angola, Botswana, Egypt, Kenya, Madagascar, Morocco, Mozambique, Mauritius, Namibia, Nigeria, South Africa, Seychelles, Swaziland, Tanzania, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The Kenya team was represented by Sylvia Brunlehner (Team Captain), Talisa Lanoe, Sharnee Shah, Mikhail Teja, Edward Ilako, Deeyn Shah, Akshay Shah, Hamdan Bayusuf.

Selected Head Coach of the team was Coach Fahry Mansoor.

Out of the 16 countries Kenya managed to finish

in 5th Place Position.

First place went to South Africa followed by Egypt, third place was Zimbabwe and fourth were the host Mauritius.

Sixth place went to Morocco and seventh was triple tie between Mozambique, Madagascar and Seychelles.

Namibia finished in tenth place position.

Swaziland, Namibia, Tanzania, Botswana, Nigeria and Angola could not appear in the medal ranking as they did not win any medal.

Three Kenya records were also broken by Mikhaik Tejayawho trains in England.

Among the records are the 50m Butterfly where Mikhail swam in a time of 29.01 breaking the 12-13years Kenya record which was held by David Jones set on 24th February 2002 at Kasarani. The old record was 30.32.

The second record was the 100m Butterfly where 12-13 yrs boys.

New record is 1.07.13 erasing the old record held by Otto Niemenen set in 29th October 1995. Old time is 1.11.81 set at Nyayo Swimming Pool.

Then came in the 200m IM boys 12-13 years.

The new record stands at 2:37.02 erasing the old record of 2:39.00 held by David Jones set in 20th October 2001.

Sylvia has now landed a swimming scholarship to train and study in England as from January 2009.


"I would like to commend all the swimmers for performing exceptionally well especially those who are locally trained" Commented Coach Fahry.

Sylvia Brunlehner who is locally trained at Bandari Swimming Club has proven that our local swimmers are capable of performing in International competitions as long as they are exposed to correct training, he added.


