## 'Direct Flights' For Mombasa-Entebbe

FROM DECEMBER 1st 'AIR UGANDA' WILL INTRODUCE THREE-TIMES-A-WEEK SERVICE

'Air Uganda' is to launch direct flights from Mombasa to Entebbe, Uganda, three times weekly from Tuesday, December 1st, 2009. The flights will operate on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday, using a CRJ-100 50 seater jet, departing Mombasa at 1615 hrs.

Mombasa will be the airline's fifth route in East Africa.

Air Uganda's fares will be from U.S. \$ 299 return for their new direct flights and there will be no high season surcharges for the Christmas holiday period.

These fares will be available on all the airline's flights to and from Entebbe.

Air Uganda celebrates its second anniversary this week as the airline was launched on November 15, 2007.





**FROM FRONT PAGE** Industry. The airline is part of the "Celestair Group" of African airlines, that includes Air Burkina and Air Mali, owned by the Aga Khan Fund for Economic Development (AKFED).

Air Uganda's current network includes twice daily flights from Entebbe to Nairobi, daily flights to Juba, four weekly flights to Dar es Salaam and twice weekly flights to Zanzibar.

The airline currently operates three aircraft in its fleet, with two 99 seat MD87s in a business and economy class configuration and one Bombardier CRJ-100 in a 50 seat one class layout.

Two additional CRJ-200s will be delivered in January and March 2010.

Future network expansion plans include routes from Entebbe to Kigali, Mwanza, Bujumbura and cities in Eastern DRC to develop a mini hub in Entebbe to serve the Great Lakes region.

Domestic destinations within Uganda are also

being evaluated for future services, when these airstrips are upgraded to enable jet operations.

Air Uganda's market research has identified growing leisure demand in Uganda for holiday breaks, honeymoons, golf and fishing weekends in Mombasa and on the Kenyan Coast.

As the main port serving Uganda, Mombasa has well established trade links with Ugandan importers and exporters and Air Uganda seeks to attract these customers onto its faster direct flights.

Hugh Fraser, Air Uganda's Chief Executive Officer, told Coastweek:

"From December, the Mombasa based shipping and freight forwarding companies will be able to fly directly to Uganda, at very competitive airfares, in our modern 50 seater jets.

"We have been very encouraged by the level of interest amongst travel agents and corporate clients in our new route linking Mombasa directly with Entebbe and Kampala avoiding the need to change aircraft and terminals in Nairobi."

**All Set For Kenya Airways East African Safari Classic Rally '09**

With hours to go before the ceremonial start beneath the crossed elephants tusks on Moi Avenue in Mombasa, the crews and officials of the Kenya Airways East African Safari Classic Rally are all ready to go.

Documentation will get under way at the Whitesands Hotel north of Mombasa this week and continue until Saturday, November 21st with scrutineering commencing on Friday, November 20th and finishing at midday on the Saturday.

That evening, there will be a welcome party for all the crews and officials while the ceremonial start is scheduled for the Sunday afternoon at 13:00.

An innovation this year is that a short twenty kilometre competitive section will follow the ceremonial start.

**CLASSIFICATION**

Its purpose is to provide a classification to give the starting order for the rally on Monday morning.

It also counts towards the final result so is important in more ways than one.

The serious rally action will commence from Whitesands at 06:00 on Monday, November

23rd and run right through to the finish back at Whitesands at 14:00 on Tuesday, December 1st, 2009

The official prize giving ceremony is the same evening and gets under way at 20:00.

Of the forty-six crews entered, the breakdown of the crewmembers by nationality is as follows :-

Kenya 33, Great Britain 15, Belgium 12, France 11, USA 4, South Africa 4, Australia 3, Switzerland 3, Sweden 2, Italy 2, Germany 1, Denmark 1 and Philippines 1.

The cars are almost equally diverse though it has to be admitted that as far as makes are concerned, Datsun wins the

day with Porsche the second most popular manufacturer and Ford third.

All the cars have to be of a type manufactured before the end of 1975 and any four-wheel drive or turbocharged cars are specifically forbidden.

The breakdown by model is as follows :

Datsun 240/260/280Z 10, Porsche 911 10, Ford Escort Mk 1 8, Datsun 180B4, Datsun 1600SSS 3, Mercedes 350/450 SLC 2, Mitsubishi Lancer 2, Alpine Renault A110 2, Peugeot 504 Coupé 1, Citroën DS 21 1, Ford Mustang 1, Porsche 924 1 and Datsun 1200 1.

The whole route from Mombasa

through Kenya and Tanzania back to Mombasa is approximately 4,500 kilometres (2,800 miles) and, of that distance, no less than 1,882 kilometres (1,170 miles) are competitive sections.

**THREE SECTIONS DAILY**

There are three competitive sections each day - with of course an exception on the rest day at Amboseli on Friday, November 27th - which, including the "seeding" section on the day of the ceremonial start makes a total of twenty-five competitive sections.

This is a few more than the average number of special stages in a World Championship Rally but, on those events, the average total length of competitive mileage is around 350 kilometres (217 miles).

**FROM FRONT PAGE** "Rains have been re-reported on both sides of Tanzania and Kenya and it is something we are cautious about," said Bhalla.

Bhalla is mainly concerned about the 70-km stretch along Sanya Ju in Longido and area around Pale Mountains on the Tanzanian sector, and the road between Konza and Emali in Kenya, which could prove difficult due to the nature of the surface made up of soft and deep soils.

While several 4x4 vehicles will be on stand-by for any rescue

missions, alternative routes will be provided to cut out any major disasters such as bogging down of the day's competition.

Bhalla, with wealth of experience as rally organizer and until recently the chairman of the Rallies Commission of the Kenya Motor Sports Federation, will move with the rally headquarters to Mombasa's White Sands Hotel in a fortnight's time.

Registration of drivers and their cars was completed in Mombasa earlier this week.

The KQ-event will kick off with a spectator stage on November 22 at the Vipingo Ranch, halfway between Mombasa and Kilifi.

Bhalla will head a team responsible for arranging daily travel, accommodation and media facilities for the officials and competitors during the course of the event.

A total 89 senior officials in 28 different vehicles and well over 329 persons will be well looked after in hotels and relevant places throughout the entire route.

A total of 165 air tickets have been booked for the foreign crews while 185 rooms for officials and competitors are in place at various five-star hotels

Teams will include Security, Medical and Logistical personnel. Security officials will coordinate with the Police to make sure all competitors and organizers are well protected.

After the start from Mombasa on November 23, the crews' first stop will be at the Taita Hills Lodge. From here drivers will tackle more competitive stages leading to Arusha for the end of the second day competition.

The third and fourth day action will be based around Arusha.

The sixth day action will see cars visit stages through Kajiado and Ngong leading to Naivasha thus disconnect Nairobi from this year's route plans.

Naivasha will host the seventh and eighth day competition respectively before heading back

to Taita Hills via Ngong and Kajiado.

The final day will see crews move back to Mombasa in time for the prize-giving ceremony.

Over the last nine months I have travelled to many countries in different continents.

The countries have also represented different states of development from dirt poor to fully developed.

I was even able to land in the 'Big Apple'.

What was striking during the travels I have had is how similar port areas are, mainly in the developing world.

The approaches to the ports in most countries in Africa are through roads that leave a lot to be desired in terms of their state of disrepair.

In almost every single country I travelled to from East to West and North to Southern Africa the condition was the same.

The holes were potholed and more often than not dirty.

The areas tended to be littered with rubbish from the operations and clean up of the trucks plying into and out of the port.

There was also invariably a range of kiosks that added to the mayhem in those areas.

These ranged from the clean, air-conditioned and hygienic types to those that had open air cooking with a few trestles for tables and old tree stumps for chairs.

They all seemed to add rubbish to the roads as well.

The most striking similarity in the port areas was that they all seemed to house the most derelict vehicles one could find in each of the countries I visited.

# We Should Not Talk About Creating Cheap 'Wanjiku Friendly' Transport Infrastructure

Whilst inside the port the quayside handling equipment was generally in reasonable nick, the lorries and cars that were used to ferry cargo and people were not.

Starting with the Francophone countries in West Africa, I saw some of the oldest Renault trucks I had ever set my eyes on.

These were characterised as elsewhere by their long "noses"

hands to ostensibly speed the black smoke away.

Even the canine residents on the street side seemed to be immune to the thick smoke and would not even bat an eyelid.

The only reaction for the dogs would be on the odd occasion when an engine backfired on start up.

The retort would cause all the dogs in the neighbourhood to yelp, bark, whine or whatever expression they chose to express their disgust at being so rudely disturbed from their routine.

I also had the honour of visiting former Spanish colonies - and there are not many of these.

The ports in these countries had a mish mash of vehicles but mainly continental European models such as MAN, Renault, DAF and other unusual models that are not often seen in this day and age but had their hey days in the sixties and seventies.

The situation in these ports was exactly the same as described earlier.

The other common thing was that there were always mechanics at hand to sort out any problems the truck might have.

I was in a traffic queue trying to get to our destination which was in one of the ports when a truck, several vehicles ahead and going up hill stalled and began to roll back.

The local seemed to know what was likely to happen and had kept their distance.

The truck rolled back and the driver directed it gently against

the concrete wall that divided the two lanes of traffic.

The number of scratches on the lane divider indicated that this was a common way of stopping vehicles that had stalled their engines when the act of moving uphill exceeded the truck's engine capacity causing it to conk out.

The minute the truck came to a standstill, the rest of the traffic coin tuned and the driver came out and blew three shrill whistles.

Several mechanics appeared from nowhere accompanied by their 'grease monkeys'.

They proceeded to interview the driver and once they appeared to understand what it was had happened they huddled together to diagnose the problem and in a few minutes they each attacked different parts of the vehicle and after a short while, it was able to cough back into life with an early stream of black smoke followed by grey and then near white.

## A SCENE REPEATED IN SO MANY PORTS

At this point the driver paid his rescuers, got into the truck and drove off as if nothing untoward had happened.

This scene was to be repeated in ports that I visited in Egypt, Djibouti, Mombasa, Dar es Salaam, Nacala, Mauritius, Windhoek and many other places.

It is as if we have agreed across the whole of Africa to destine all old trucks to working in port areas.

Yet this is the exact opposite of what should happen.

A country is required to ensure that their ports handle all cargo speedily once offloaded from the ship to get to the consignee quickly.

This minimises the likelihood of theft and also ensure that the end user begins to earn money from that consignment as quickly

as possible. Using old vehicles goes completely against this maxim.

Whilst the cost per kilometre may be lowest since the vehicle has been amortised many times over, the likelihood of getting the cargo to the consignee on time is compromised.

Breakdowns mean that time is lost as broken down vehicles cause traffic jams, delay cargo and almost invariably pollute the environment as a result of the roadside repairs.

Governments across the continent must crack down on vehicle standards.

Our own so called Michuki rules need to be expanded to encompass the whole gamut so that there is structured discipline in all areas pertaining to the use of the roads in this country.

We should not talk about creating a cheap 'Wanjiku friendly' transport infrastructure.

We should talk about getting standards right and then Wanjiku follows.

Wanjiku must be safe, comfortable and get to their destination in good time.

All this if done repeatedly will lead to an overall lower cost for the nation.

Can my good friend, the ever smiling Minister in charge of transport and communication get his digits out and put some discipline on the roads.

Get driving standards enforced, get vehicle standards enforced and get our own behaviour streamlined.

If this is done consistently for three or so years, we will begin to see a change in the efficiency of utilisation of our roads infrastructure and the lowering of pressure to bend rules, over invest and overall lead to a healthier and wealthier population.

As Kachumbari says, it may seem to be punitive at first but the end result will far out weigh the costs.

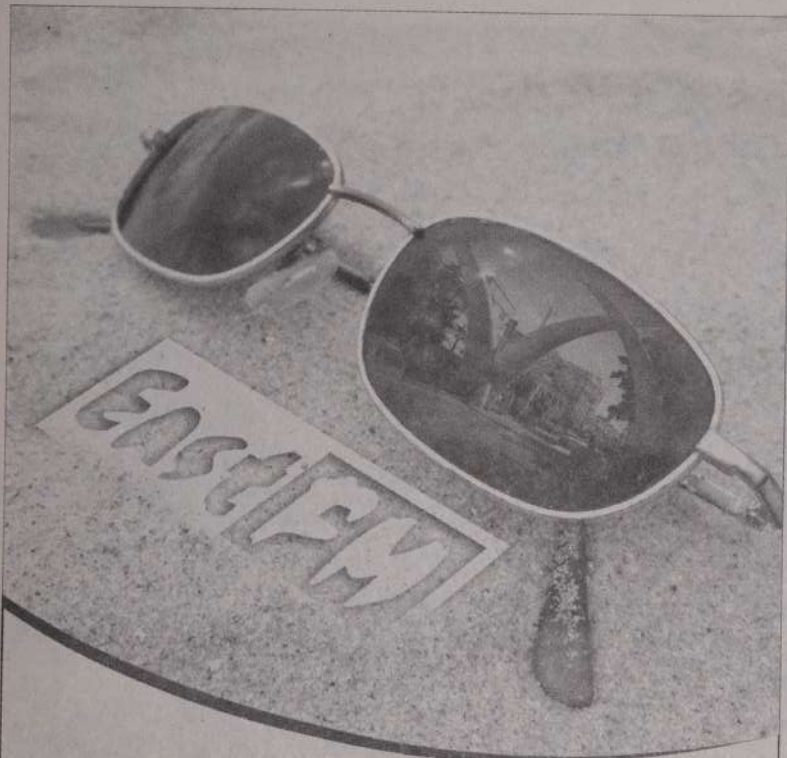
The drivers cabin was the typical rounded construction favoured in yester years.

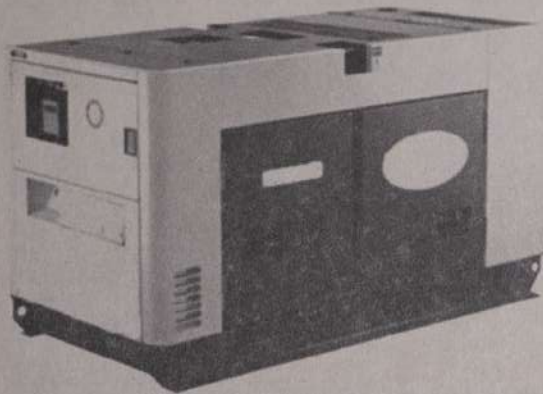

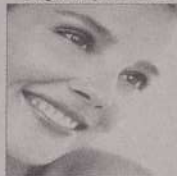

"We welcome you all to cheer up our athletes."

The races will be followed with Aquathlon in the afternoon at the same venue. This involves Run, swim, Run.

The race will start at 2pm with the little ones 5 years and under and will cover 100m run 50m swim and 100m run followed with the 7 years and under with the same distance.

The most important race of the day, the physically challenged will follow after the 7 years and under.

The Elite athletes will join the physically challenged to give

them the support and courage to do the multi sport triathlon.

The 8/9 years will cover 200m run, 50m swim and 200m run.

The Main race will take centre stage at the Fort Jesus Museum on 22nd early morning.

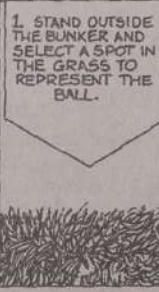

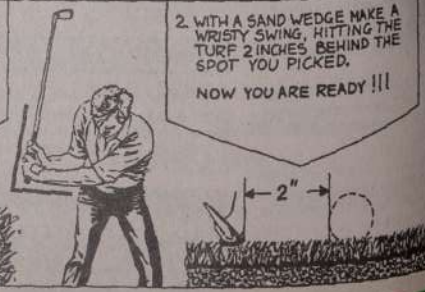
