



We Need More Serious Commitments Towards Slowing And Reversing These Alarming Trends

The climate change conference in Copenhagen comes to a close this week.

Over thirty thousand people congregated on this city each hoping to be there when a historic agreement is reached that will limit the growth of what I call climate change gases to levels that will slow down and stop the growth of the global temperature and that will be sustainable for the kind of lifestyle that we are used to or aspire to have in the future.

This whole discussion, whilst attracting such a large gathering, will probably be concluded by no more than five hundred of the participants.

Each of those will have been supported in earlier meetings in their countries and regions of origin by almost an equivalent number of people who have been pouring over scientific research, economic predictions, political ideology and simple people power in terms of public opinion.

A lot is expected from these talks but it is unlikely that a silver bullet will come out of the

What we will get is a series of expectations that if people live up to them, will create a new paradigm that will itself lead to future discussions.

Over time there will emerge a convergent and clearer route to sustainable climate change

Ten years ago the so-called Kyoto protocol was signed and many countries left the meeting resolved to make a difference

Several went back and delivered on their resolutions.

Many more only paid lip service to them and others blatantly refused to be drawn into the

This less than satisfactory situation led to an acceleration

of global warming which is why there is the urgency, in Copenhagen, to get some more serious commitments towards slowing and reversing this alarming trend.

There are however so many divergent opinions on what needs to be done that is unlikely that we will get a common, agreed and

At best it will be a compromise that will not achieve the overall objectives of the talks.

In spite of all this, the motor industry is going ahead with developing technology that will respond to the aspirations of reducing emissions in a sustainable way.

Earlier in the year we covered a range of options that were being

This would allow more hydrogen to be packed into a smaller volume.

There has been some progress with materials that can do this, including specially engineered carbon nanotubes.

But carbon nanotubes are very expensive to make, especially in large quantities

The people involved in research in this area think they can improve their material further by making it even more porous.

What is exciting about this What is exciting about this research is that they are well on the way to meeting the authorities' cost criteria of a hydrogen system that costs three hundred shillings per killowatt hour stored and less than fifty thousand shillings to install.

The other important con-sideration is that it could also help with another environmental problem by reducing the mountains of chicken feathers that the poultry industry has to dispose of every year.




One rarely comes across these behemoths anymore, a sad reflection of what changes have occurred within a mere thirty-five years!



Mombasa's Kilindini Port Remains Regional Hub

Throughout 2009 Kenya Ports Authority (KPA) has helped Mombasa port to remain the regional hub and the gateway to the East African region by undertaking huge investments that have improved cargo handling efficiency, seeing it emerge as the preferred port.

Container vessels turnaround imemade a record improvement of 3.0 days in the third quarter of 2009, the best in the region, from 5.0 days recorded in the same period in 2008.

The average container dwell time is now 6.4 days against 13.1 days in 2008, reflecting an approximent of 5.1 reflecting an improvement of 51.1 per cent or 6.7 days.

6.7 days.

This is attributed to enhanced efficiency in port operations due to adequate yard space that has been made possible by a number of measures KPA has under taken in the recent past.

Since 2001, KPA, which was recently ISO 9001-2008 certified embarked on automation programme which has played a key role in addressing the problem of port congestion by enabling faster clearance of the cargo.

In 2002, Enterprise Resource Planning System went live and since then, a lot has been achieved in the field of IT.

TOTAL SOFT BANK

In 2005, KPA contracted a Southern Korean firm-Total Soft Bank (TSB) - which developed Kilindini waterfront operating system (Kwatos), which has now automated all the cargo handling

The programme went live last year and has effectively addressed ship and yard planning, traffic, warehouse and general information management.

KPA has also implemented Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) intransmission of manifest from shipping lines.

The authority has implemented the gate pass module thus streamlining security control of cargo and vehicular flow.

Kwatos is now fully linked to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) Simba System, which has reduced the number of days required to clear the cargo from

The final stage of the auto-mation, Community Based

System, will be implemented by 2010 and will make all the port operations paperless.

Commonwealth Secretariat is assisting the government of Kenya to implement this project that will enable the port community to share information on a common platform online.

on a common platform online.

Apart from automation of the cargo handling operations, the efficiency at the port is also attributed to entrenchment of 24/7 working schedule that was embraced in last year and use of more Container Freight Stations (CFS's) that handle over 11,000 Teus outside the port thus freeing the port's yard.

Recent invest-

Recent invest-ments in modern cargo handling equipment and

business process re-engineering have resulted in remarkable growth and improved performance in port operations that has enabled the port to deal with the growing cargo volumes.

The total freight handled by the port of Mombasa rose by 2.8 per cent from 15.96 million tons in 2007 to 16.42 million tons

Total transit cargo rose from 4.4 million tons in 2007 to 4.8 million tons in 2008.

This is a manifestation of increasing usage of the port by the region and a sign of the improved regional economic performance owing to the prevailing peace.

Our forecast displays tenden-cies of continued growth albeit at a slower pace this time due to the current global recession.

Between January and September 2009, the port has witnessed further improved operational performance and an increase in Port throughput.

The Port handled a total cargo throughput of 13.7 million tons compared with 12.1 million tons realized in the corresponding period in 2008; reflecting a significant increase of 1.67 million tons or 13.9 per cent.

Recently, in the spirit of keeping pace with developments and address rising costs in maritime trade, KPA made some Tariff Adjustments which culminated in the removal of scanning and verification charges, among other minor adjustments with effect from 1st October this year.

To address the cargo traffic which is expected to reach over 30 million tonnes by 2030 compared to 16 million tonnes handled in last year, KPA has embarked on a number of

The port has improved safety of the port in compliance with the ISPS code. measures. The construction of measures. The construction of the second container terminal by the support from Japan is expected to create an additional capacity of 1.2 Teus.

The port is also dredging the channel to accommodate bigger ships currently in manufacture by ship makers.

KPA through private sector partnership intends to establish a Free Trade Zone at Dongo Kundu, create more oil handling capacity among other flag ship projects.

The port is implementing an integrated security system which will address access, controls, surveillance and detection, among others.

This is hoped to contain terrorists activities, pillerage and general crime in and around the port.

Facilities: The port is equipped to handle a wide range of cargoes including dry bulks such

as grain, fertilisers, cement and soda ash and liquid bulks such as crude oil and oil products as well as bagged products (coffee, tea, sugar, etc) breakbulk (iron and steel, timber), motor vehicles, machinery—and containerised cargo.

Somali Pirates Hijack Indian Dhow

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Somali pirates have hijacked an Indian dhow off the coast of the Horn of the African nation in the latest pirate incidents, a regional maritime official confirmed on Monday.

Andrew Mwangura, the East African Coordinator of Seafarers' Assistance Program (SAP), said the Laxmi Sagar was seized on Sunday but the reports reached his organization on Monday.

"The Indian dhow was seized on Sunday but we received the report early today.

The crew is Indian.

"I have not established where the dhow was heading from and its destination," Mwangura told Xinhua by telephone from

Sources said the Indian dhow operates frequently between Saudi Arabia and the African

Piracy has become rampant off the coast of Africa, especially in the waters near Somalia, which has been without an effective government since 1991.

An estimated 25,000 ships annually cruise the Gulf of Aden, off Somalia's northern coast.

The Gulf of Aden, off the northern coast of Somalia, has the highest risk of piracy in the world.

About 25,000 ships use the channel south of Yemen, between the Red Sea and the Arabian Sea.

Meanwhile Xinhua reports from Kiev that Ukraine is to send an anti-terrorist unit to fight Somali

Ukraine will send soldiers from an elite special forces unit to combat Somali pirates, local media reported on Thursday.

A total of 25 soldiers from Ukraine's anti-terrorist unit "Alfa "will soon travel to the Guif of Aden region, Valentyn Nalivalchenko, chairman of the Security Service of Ukraine (SBU), was quoted as saying.

The SBU's "Alfa" is considered the best-trained and equipped unit of any branch of Ukraine's armed services.

The mission of the "Alfa" soldiers would be to protect Ukrainian and other nations' commercial ships transiting

waters off Somalia, as part of the European Union's Atalanta naval operation.

The "Alfa" troopers could, along with similar special forces already sent to the region by Spain and Greece, be placed aboard cargo ships to repel pirate attacks, or board a ship captured by pirates to free hostages, Nalivaichenko

The EU launched the Atalanta anti-pirate operation in November 2008.

Warships, aircraft, and some 12,000 naval personnel from the United Kingdom, France, Greece, Germany, Italy, Spain, the Netherlands and Belgium are participating.

Kenya Records 10 Million Loss In Regional Tourney

Cecafa has recorded a deficit of about 10 million Kenyan shillings (about 135,000 U.S. dollars) as fans remained home or asked for free entry to watch matches in the Cecafa Orange nior Challenge Cup in Nairobi

Cecafa secretary general Nicholas Musonye said on Friday the fans showed little interest to go to the venues of the matches either in humas in Western Kenya or Nairobi and has only recouped one million shillings after staging 24 matches.

The event concludes on Sunday with champions Uganda facing awarda in the defence of their title. Musonye said unlike other egional countries, Kenyan fans are very hard to work with and don't offer football enough support.

resure of the support.

Its very disappointing. We have realized less than a million from the matches, yet our budget was 40 million shillings, "said Musonye. The secretary general questioned Kenyans' love for football saying had staged the tournament to Kenya with the hope that the sada will be houseful.

Cecafa tournaments had not taken place in this country for 14 years. Against advice of other members, we pushed for having the burnament in Kenya because we felt we needed to encourage them to host tournaments," he said. "It was a great mistake."

to host fournaments, the said, in was a great mistake.

So dear the situation seems to be, that when host Harambee Stars
were playing Zambia in the opening of the tournament, only 5,000
people made it to Nyayo National Stadium compared with a sell out
during the World Cup qualification campaign.

"We must change our attitude. I am Kenyan but it has been proved Kenyan like free things. Even the few fans that turned out, they wanted to enter free," said Musonye.

Things were bound to get worse for Cecata, after Kenya were bundled out of the tournament, crashing 1-0 to arch rivals and current Cup holders Uganda in the quarter finals on Dec. 7.

Since then, echoes of players and the referees' whistles were the only sounds in the stadium, despite the match quality. The matches have been played on nearly empty stadia.

Currently, the association is operating at a 10 million shillings deficit, from the initial 40 million shillings budget.

We only have about 18.5 million shillings from the corporate sponsors. Orange came in with 13 million shillings as title sponsors if you do the math, we have a huge deficit. I guess we will just have to borrow or get from somewhere, but we must see a fruitful conclusion on Sunday," he added, saying that it was only the corporate world, who can save football in Kenya.

Elsewhere, Cecafa has registered huge surplus of up to five million shillings especially in Tanzania, Rwanda and Uganda.

My advice to Kenyans is that local corporate must consider making sponsorship that takes care of all major expenses of sporting lournaments, otherwise it will be difficult for anyone to host good international events in this country."

Comparing Kenya fans to those from other countries, "Kenyans are far from getting anywhere near Tanzania or even Rwanda".

"I dare say even Somalia, of all places, there is better following of looball than what we have here in Kenya" said Musonye.

LAGOS. (Xinhua) -- Angola, hosts of the 27th African Cup of Nations, are expecting no fewer than 8,000 foreign fans with the majority coming from Nigeria and

Antonio Mangueira, the executive director of the Local Organizing Committee, told cafonline.com that the country was also expecting more fans to come from their neighbor Mozambique.

"We are not sure the number of the fans who will visit since it is the first time for Angola to host a competition on such a great scale," he

"The number of fans will largely depend on the appetite of supporters following a particular team.

"We can imagine that Cameroon and Nigeria will bring sizeable supporters but as for Mali, Malawi and Benin, things will be different,"

"It is estimated over 8,000 overseas fans will visit and we are in partnership with the Ministry of Tourism to draw home crowd," the official said.

He said the figure was based on the number of the last edition of Ghana in 2008.

Mangueira said facilities for the three-week competition were about 85 percent ready, noting that their only concern was that they would not be tested before the tournament kicked off on Jan.10.

He said the accommodation about all four centers had been completed and the working staff were now concentrating on the arrangement of media, sponsors and other guests.

Luanda, Cabinda, Benguela and Lubango are the four host cities of the championship, which are expected to be inaugurated between Dec.27 and 30.

Mangueira said it is of great significance for Angola to host the

"As a prelude to the World Cup in South Africa, we will also portray that Africa can organize big events by staging a successful tournament," he said.

"The tournament has also led to the development of infrastructure with the construction of four new world-class stadia and the renovation of 13 others," he added.


