Kenya Airways Sponsor Gala Dinner For Skål International Kenya Coast's 30th Anniversary

MINUTE'S SILENCE IN MEMORY OF THE LATE MINISTER FOR TOURISM AND WILDLIFE HON. KARISA MAITHA

The Anniversary Dinner of SKAL International on the Kenya Coast opened on a sombre note with all members and guests standing to observe a Minute's Silence in memory of the late Minister for Tourism and Wildlife, **Karisa Maitha**, who had died suddenly in Germany the previous evening.

He had been leading a high powered delegation on a week's visit to promote Kenya and was doing just that when he collapsed and died.

SKAL is the largest travel and tourism organisation in the world embracing some 23,000 professional members worldwide.

SKAL was not only celebrating its 30th anniversary on the Kenya coast but the 70th Anniversary of SKAL International at a Mombasa North Coast hotel on Friday, August 27, 2004, its anniversary dinner again being sponsored by Kenya Airways.

Said the SKAL Chairman, **Mohammed Hersi**, 'news of the Minister's death came as a big shock to us all and we convey our heartfelt sympathy and condolences to his family.

He was appointed Minister for Tourism and Wildlife at the end of June this year, previously being Minister for Local Government and putting a lot of energy and vigour into both.

The Chairman of the Kenya Association of Tour Operators, Coast, **Tasneem Adamji**, and I were only with the Minister last Sunday (August 22) when he gave a very powerful 45 minute long presentation on Kenya as a preferred tourist destination.

The 10 strong Kenya Airways team at the SKAL Anniversary Dinner was led by its Regional General Manager for Africa, **Robert K. Owusu**, and included **Sauda Rajab**, Area Manager, East Africa; **Fred Kabora**, Sales Manager, Coast, and **Caroline Mbotela**, Station Manager, Moi International Airport.

They also brought along with them some raffle prizes - a return ticket to J'burg being won by an ecstatic **Judy Naugbauer** and another to Djibouti which went to a delighted **Silvester Mbandi**, operations manager at a coast hotel - and an assortment of gifts for five others.

Raffle prizes from other donors included winners at restaurants and weekends at hotels and lodges.

For the Anniversary Dinner there was a *Chaine des Rotisseurs*-style service with one waiter for every two guests all receiving each item of the five course menu simultaneously.

Crocodile-style the Service Brigade marched in and out of the grill room together.

Everyone was most impressed as well as by the delicious gourmet dinner.

It started with a Galatine of Chicken stuffed with a seafood mousse on a bed of horseradish sauce ending with a most

attractive **Salfrino of Fruits** enhanced by a chocolate and vanilla sauce followed by **Cona Coffee** served from traditional brass Arab Coffee Pots and a tasty selection of **Petit Fours**.

Entertaining and receiving much applause throughout was the very talented **ED's Trio** led by **Edmund Silveira**.

Black chairs had been adorned with white satin covers and encircled by a wide black satin bow.

Receiving much applause was the Kenya Airways team each being introduced by **Sauda Rajab** as well as KA guests from the tourism industry, some being **Skalleagues**.

Said **Sauda** 'we are all very happy to see that tourism at the coast is doing so well.

She took the opportunity of thanking them for their support of KA which she hoped would continue.

Referring to KA's newly introduced twice weekly flights Nairobi - Djibouti, **Sauda** mentioned 'I understand there

are quite a number of NGOs there who may wish to come and visit our beautiful country'.

Speaking about the recently introduced Mombasa - Johannesburg operation **Sauda** mentioned 'this was part of the Kenya Airways promise to you made some time ago that we would be supporting the tourism industry and we have tried to do that as much as we can'.

Referring to the Hong Kong/Mombasa route introduced a few months ago, she said it is doing very well and soon we shall be improving flights to that particular destination.

In thanking **Sauda** the SKAL Chairman declared well done KA for responding to the coast industry's plea for a direct flight Mombasa - Johannesburg.

It is a challenge for us all in the industry to ensure it continues'.

There was much applause when he said 'we all support KA our national airline-the PRIDE OF AFRICA'.

We have all seen the investment it is making.

There is no doubt about it - KA is an international airline which competes very favourably and,

if anything, is better than many others'.

He went on 'as far as the City of Mombasa is concerned, now that the council elections are over I hope the Mayor can carry on with the good work he has been doing'.

He also mentioned that while many potholes in major roads had been filled he hoped that the Ministry of Works might remember the **Bamburi Road** which many of us travel.

Adding 'while we have 45 star hotels on the Kenya Coast we need to also have roads of a high standard as well.

We should tell our leaders that they need to get down to making our country a better place.

If they do not do so we as a civil society should not keep quiet. Improvements are needed and should be attended to with greater urgency.

Needing immediate attention are street children who harass people in the town, especially motorists parking by **Telekom House** on **Moi Avenue**.

The evening venue was darkened as **Chefs** and the **Kitchen Brigade** wheeled in a sparkling Anniversary Cake which was cut by the Mombasa - Johannesburg Chairman and his team as members and guests cheered.

The evening ended with a 'Vote of Thanks' from the Mombasa - Johannesburg Vice-Chairman, **Marwan Misbah**, to Kenya Airways.


The Food and Beverage Service Brigades were introduced, also **ED's Trio** all receiving thunderous applause for a very enjoyable evening celebrating two anniversaries of SKAL.

The next SKAL dinner will be at **THE VOYAGER**, Nyaui, while for October there will be a very special event.

The Chairman revealed he will then be joining members of the *Chaine des Rotisseurs* for a dinner on board the **ROYAL STAR** courtesy of **African Safari Club**.

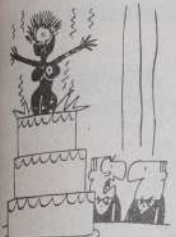

It was a celebration linked with history for the dhow as once trading along the East African Coast and in the Middle East.

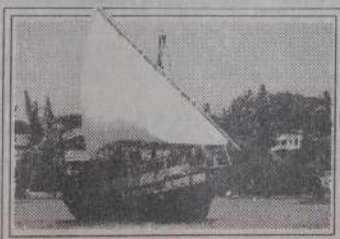

This would be a direct service to the Mombasa residents, in that they would at least have some respite from these

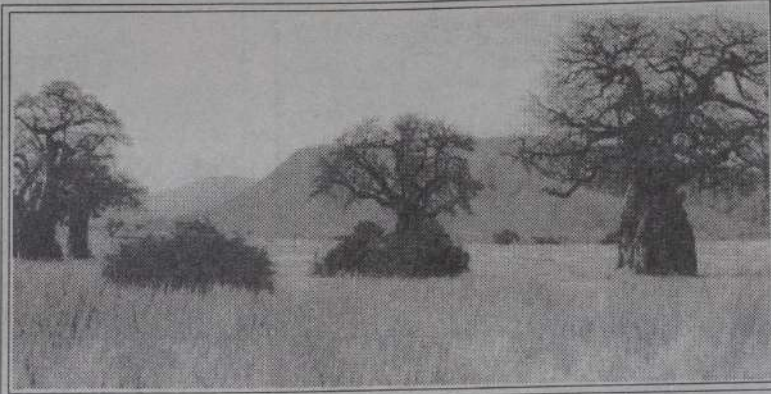
hooligans in exchange for the exorbitant amounts they pay in daily parking charges.

What they didn't realize though, is that you don't have WinZip installed.

If you don't have it installed, you really should.

WinZip is a wonderful program that can save you time, energy and frustration.

Wow! One program can do all that!

WinZip has been around since I can remember.

This program takes a file and compresses it so that it is smaller than the original.

When you uncompress it, the file is there completely un-

harmd. You can also password protect your files from spying eyes.

The program is a fully-functioning shareware (try before you buy) program. evaluation program will continue to run indefinitely but you will get a registration reminder every time you open the program.

Considering all this the program does, I think it is a good investment if you choose to buy the full version.

You can use the WinZip program to:

Unzip files that someone sent you Zip files to send in email so that they don't take as long to transmit.

Zip your files on your hard drive so they don't take up as much

Twenty Five Years Ago

Coastweek, September 07 - 13, 1979:

Over 16,000 job-seekers were registered in Mombasa during the 'ten percent additional employee intake' drive.

The Provincial Permits Officer, Mr. J.M. Odhingi, who also doubled up as the Provincial Employment Officer attached to the Kenyanization of Personnel Bureau, said that 443 job vacancies remained.

He attributed the high number of vacancies remaining to job-seekers' low skill level as well as their apathy toward formal work and non-white collar jobs.

Kenya's Civil Aviation Board (C.A.B.) rejected *Enterprise Holidays'* application for a charter service licence in a move that came as a great shock to many.

A subsidiary of *British Airways*, *Enterprise Holidays* was pioneering long-haul destinations to a hitherto virtually untapped mass market in the U.K. at very competitive prices.

A rice shortage hit Mombasa as anxious residents awaited President Moi's personal directive on the prompt delivery of wheat, flour and rice to be implemented.

Maize and Produce Board area manager Mr. P. Mbalu said that supplies of rice in areas with fewer consumers may have to be diverted to Mombasa to offset the shortage.

Master story-teller and 'griot' American-born Mary Carter Smith was visiting the Coast spending six days at the *Trunk Winds Hotel*, Diani, where she gave a free show to honour the *International Year of the Child*.

In West Africa, a 'griot' was known as 'a keeper of history and master story teller.'

Over the years she had worked for a better understanding among blacks and whites, doing it the Griot way with stories, song and poetry, history and humour.

She had in the past performed for the Smithsonian Institute and the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington.

Coast writer Jim Allen wrote a vivid description of 'Vanu', a rare Bajuni dialect of exceptional beauty that he lamented was fast disappearing as a cultural treasure, probably never to be performed again.

Naaz Cinema meanwhile was moving on to *'Lawman'* an action-packed story set in the wild West starring Burt Lancaster.

Regal Cinema was still showing *'The Ten Commandments'* with Charlton Heston and Yul Brynner to packed audiences even though it was coming to the screen for the eight time this year.

Chox Cinema played *'Ajnabee'* ('Stranger') with Rajesh Khanna and Zeenat Aman.

Letter writers included Hon. M.O. Mzamil M.P. for Lamu East, who was inviting wananchi to a fundraising towards the cost of building a sea-wall on Ndau Island; Mbogholi wa M. Dominic who argued that 'The Poor Need Development'; Ibnu el-Farouq el-Famawy who wanted to congratulate M. H. Shariff Nassir for spreading the Nyayo philosophy so effectively at the Coast as well as in the whole country; and key-king collector M. H. Mohamedali, who was looking to increase his collection from his current total of 600.

Whoops ! From This Small Miscalculation A Total Four Vehicles Ended Up Seriously Damaged !

Kachumbari recently stayed with a friend in Nairobi.

The residence was in an apartment block somewhere in Kilimani and faced a relatively busy road (by Mombasa standards).

Most times of the day there was on average a vehicle going past every twenty seconds.

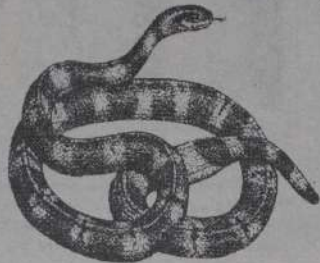

Die Touristen kommen langsam wieder zurück und werden stets herzlich willkommen heißen.

Pollman's hatte im Juli einen ganzen Zuström von Touristen aus Frankreich und Italien und hofft, dass dieser Trend mindestens bis im September anhält.

Im Mai und Juni wird Kenia von mehreren Reiseveranstaltern in Europa wegen der Regenzeit nicht empfohlen.

Tasneem Adamji, Chairman

der *Kenya Association of Tour Operators*, *Coast* und Managing Director von *African Quest Safaris*, sagte:

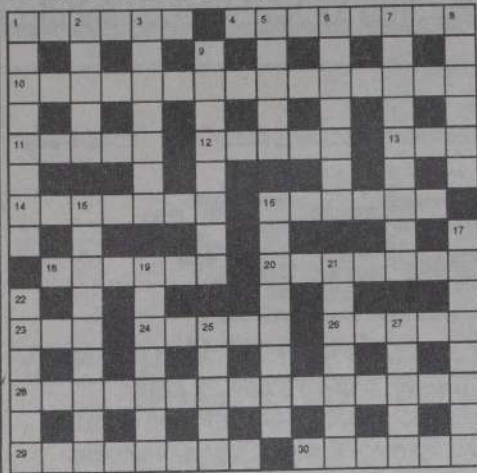
