

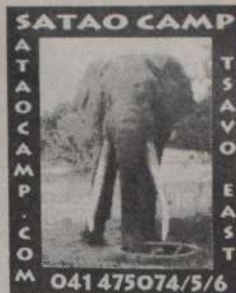

Maitha's Legacy: Relocating Beach Operators?

One of the greatest efforts by the late **Karisa Maitha** since becoming Minister for Tourism and Wildlife at the end of June 2004 was to make his 'FIRST PRIORITY' that of the relocation of Beach Operators.

It is a long standing problem which in particular **Dr. Rashid Ali**, Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and **Mike Kirkland**, 'Spokesman' for the **Beach Operators Re-Location Trust** strived hard over many years to resolve, the acquisition of land remaining a major problem, as well as the shortage of funds.

Following continued complaints by tourists about harassment by beach traders, tourist associations at the Coast decided something should be done about it, not individually but as a joint effort.

Government responded by calling fully representative meeting the outcome of which was the establishment of the **Beach Operators Re-Location Trust** to acquire the necessary funds with which to build architect designed Tourist Markets in which registered beach operators would be relocated.

It tried over many years to raise sufficient funds from within and outside the country, but with little success.

Meanwhile, Beach Operators had agreed to stop trading on the beach and be relocated into these markets.

They accepted that their business activities were keeping

many tourists away. Those at Malindi decided not to wait for a Tourist Market to be built for them but in the meantime to erect their own stalls, according to council and BORT's specifications, on land made available for this purpose.

Others are prepared to do likewise including Beach Operators on the south coast who are ready to move into Beach Access roads and build their own stalls.

They can do so within a matter of weeks if authorised to do so.

Remaining the biggest problem of all is that of Bamburi Beach.

Probably, the largest and most important meeting for the late Minister to have held on the Kenya coast was that at **Pirate's Restaurant**, Jomo Kenyatta Beach on August 6 bringing together government, council and beach operators representatives from the coast, Coast Development Authority, tourist associations, **Beach Operators Re-Location Trust** and stake holders to seek a satisfactory conclusion to this long-standing problem.

At the meeting it was agreed that trading would no longer be allowed on the beach from 1st December, 2004 and that the Coast Development Authority

would pursue the matter of land, funds and provide plans for Tourist Markets.

A 'Master Plan' for such a market near Jomo Kenyatta Beach was submitted by CDA which could be adapted for other areas.

The Minister announced at the meeting that his Permanent Secretary, **Wellington Godo**, would be taking over the relocation programme.

He hoped it would have the full support of all representatives from district and local authorities, as well as tourist associations and beach operators at the coast.

He also made it clear that 'Tourist Markets will only be built on permanent land with title deeds' and that 'a committee will manage them until beach operators can do so themselves'.

The Minister also explained that he had come to the meeting together with the Managing Director of the **Kenya Tourist Development Corporation**, **Mutua P. Nzoka** so that we can see what we can do together using money from KTDC as one of the developers of some of the areas where we can have tourist markets and also to work on business modules in terms of co-operatives, companies etc..

In his 'Welcome Address' the Chairman of the **Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association**, **Kuldip Sondhi**, told the Minister 'our operators and hoteliers are ready to give reassurances that following the relocation of traders from our beaches the number of tourists will soar with a significant increase in revenue and employment'.

To find out more about the **Coast Development Authority** I approached its Deputy Managing Director, **Dr. R.A. J. Mwandito** a few days ago.

He explained that for 'several years CDA has been leading a multisectoral Integrated Coastal

Area Management programme which, among other activities, has addressed the issue of integrated business activities at Jomo Kenyatta Public Beach.

In its current work plan, the Authority has two working committees encompassing all businessmen: one on the development activities at the beach and one on the formation of a Trust that will eventually oversee these business activities in a sustainable way.

One such is the development of a 'Tourism Centre' that will house some of the beach operators in Bamburi and Nyali and be a model for development.

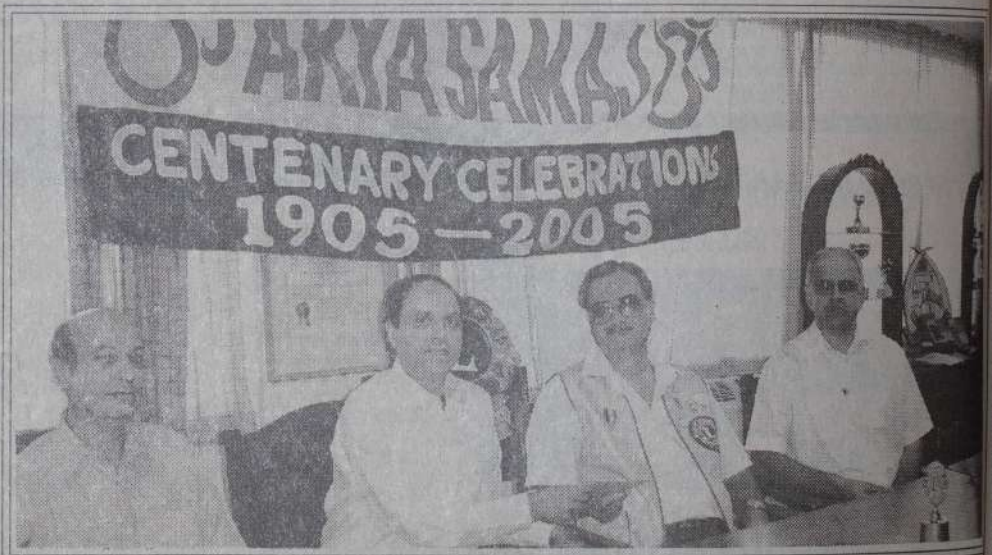

NEW SOLUTION TO FILTER OUT INTERNET SITES WITH 'UNDESIRABLE' CONTENT FOR CHILDREN

Africa Online Introduces Parental Guidance For Internet Access

Leading Internet Service Provider, Africa Online has launched an interactive web-based solution that allows Internet users to block out potentially harmful content for children.

Known as Internet Parental Guidance (IPG), the solution, which has been made available in collaboration with Web-Blocker (announced as Web-Blocker) Corporation, a US-based Internet solution provider, is designed to filter sites with undesirable content such as pornography, gambling, weaponry, drugs, alcohol, violent foul language and other Internet content not suited for children.

IPG targets mainly families, schools, public Internet centres such as cyber cafes and all Internet users in need of a guided approach to Internet access for their children.

Speaking in Nairobi during the launch of IPG, Africa Online managing director, Frederick Murunga said the new solution would be available to all Africa Online customers as a value added service.

The overarching goal is to prevent children from being exposed to undesirable content interaction over the Internet.

"Studies have shown that in most cases children stumble on these offensive sites while searching for other more recent information, be it for research or other purposes.

Marketing professionals in the marketing field, you have a responsibility of bringing out the best of the country," Awori said.

The Vice President further reiterated the governments' pledge to provide a conducive environment for investors wishing to invest and expand their operations locally.

He added that the government determined to put in place strategies and programmes that rejuvenate and restore the country's economic fortunes.

MSK Gala Night Organizing Committee Chairperson Olga Kariuki in her vote of thanks to Vice President Moody Awori's speech affirmed MSK's determination to brand and market the country.

"On behalf of my fellow MSK members, let me take the opportunity to assure you that our words of wisdom have not

"In our view therefore, using the Internet with a filter is using the Internet responsibly", said Murunga.

He added that the IPG would allow adults as the master users, access to whatever content they prefer, but deny their children access to those adult sites that would have been red-flagged and blocked.

Commenting on the launch, David Ngigi, Africa Online Business Development manager asserted that the IPG complemented the other products the company rolled out recently, in particular - the always-on

Wireless Infinity and Africa Online Games.

In introducing IPG, Murunga said that the company had taken into account, the fact that the dominant vision of a new information economy transformed by technology needed to be balanced to ensure that the effects are beneficial to society as a whole and not a privileged few.

"Without this kind of understanding it would be difficult to reshape or resist unacceptable and potentially dangerous developments such as undesirable influence of adult Internet content on children", said Murunga.

While calling for the right

combination of law, business incentives and technology for each problem that has made the Internet a less civil place, Murunga said that the recent appointment of an ICT champion in Kenya at a cabinet level was a clear indication that the country was beginning to take ICT seriously.

He noted that with 400, 000 Internet users, Kenya had one of the largest Internet communities in Africa and its Internet penetration of 1.2 per cent was higher than that of Uganda at 0.5 per cent and Tanzania at 0.7 per cent.

He however, said that the rate of growth of Internet in Kenya in recent years had fallen behind that of its peers for various reasons including lack of a national ICT strategy.

"What we need is a clear ICT strategy that will ensure the country has a well-developed pool of intellectual capital like India and others, acceptable infrastructure and that the players in the industry function freely and competitively", said Murunga.

He challenged government policy makers to address such key barriers to Internet as:

- excessive pricing of international bandwidth
- access to fixed-telephone lines; the cost of computers, and
- a responsive and dynamic regulatory framework.

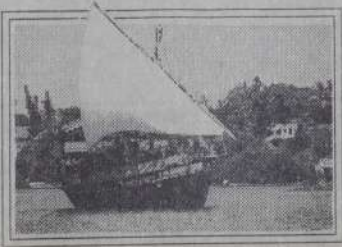

Murunga further urged the Government to consider legislating tax incentives to encourage the growth of emerging technologies.

"We have seen this done in Canada, the US and other countries with immense success.

"For example in the late 90's the U.S passed the Internet Tax Freedom Act which gave moratorium on Internet taxes in order to encourage growth of this nascent technology.

"As we speak today, they are reaping the benefits of this move".

The chief executive added that the government needed to offer substantive incentives if ICT was to become the lubricant of the country's economic growth.

- the planned sale of a large minority shareholding in Telkom Kenya,

LOCAL AUTHORITIES SHOULD PAINT YELLOW JUNCTIONS BOXES ON THE ROAD

There Are Two Such Places In Mombasa That Are Screaming Out For Such Interventions ...

During driving training in most such schools in Kenya one of the items that is missing completely is that of etiquette on the road.

Graduates of driving schools are generally nice people when they are first let loose on the road.

This is due mainly to the fact that they do not yet have the full confidence in themselves that is a prerequisite to becoming a bully on the road.

This however changes rapidly as they get more and more confident of their own abilities.

Matatu drivers tend to be the fastest to get to the belligerent state as their jobs require them to drive all the time and they get the experience and training quickly.

Normal drivers like you and me take a bit longer to get up to the levels of proficiency in belligerence that *matatu* drivers seem to be so effortless at demonstrating.

In a typical jam, everyone believes that they should be the ones who deserve to be let through as their need is greater than anyone else's.

Matatu and bus drivers have money to make and such times are where they seek to maximize the number of round trips they make.

Due to the general lack of order in terms of where people board

transport, *matatus* and buses now stop wherever it is suitable to stop or where a passenger beckons.

This is the first action that causes tempers to flare up in those affected by the slowing down.

Wananchi have taken to waiting for *matatus* and buses at

would enter into or cross the yellow box until the exit they intended to get to was clear.

In this way it was a first come first served basis to use the available space.

This meant that traffic moved in an orderly manner.

In current Kenya I have yet to see any junction where the local authorities have painted yellow boxes on the road to guide people into some semblance of etiquette on such junctions.

There are two such places in Mombasa that are screaming out for such interventions.

The first and major junction is the Saba Saba junction.

There are supposed to be traffic lights working 24-hours at this junction.

There are times they do not work.

Even if they did, whenever the lights go green, the people for whom it is green will move and fill the junction even when the exit lane they intend to take is not free.

They will thus clog the junction.

When the green light then moves on, the next carriageways that were supposed to move cannot do so even if their exits are cleared because of those buffoons who decided to crowd the intersection just because it was their turn to move.

The other junctions in Mombasa that could do with some yellow boxes are the one next to the General Post Office where the side road from Makadara joins Digo road.

It is another situation where there should have been working traffic lights but there are none.

The same situation provides here as well as does at the Saba Saba junction.

There are several others in the town which have similar problems.

Why do *wananchi* not like seeing clear spaces on the road? Why don't we as drivers apply our common sense when required?

Whenever there is heavy traffic, we, as drivers, should always think of what will make traffic flow easier rather than sink into the selfish mode of "I must get there before the next driver".

Drivers should not block accesses or exits from junctions when the lane they want to get to is not clear.

We should leave the "yellow box" area in each junction clear to allow traffic to move.

The boys in blue should begin enforcing this kind of behaviour at busy junctions that should in principle have yellow boxes.

Matatu and mini bus drivers are the worst culprits for filling space and the cops should focus on them in order to start some behaviour change in this area.

By simply asking any driver who could cause a grid lock to drive to the side of the road and then confiscating the keys for some hours, drivers will soon learn not to enter a junction that should be left clear.

It will be sufficient to have only one cop at such junctions because drivers will know not to cause obstructions in such instances.

The presence of the boys in blue would prompt people to behave properly.

As Kachumbi says, etiquette is very simple and if applied on the road would go a long way to easing traffic congestion.

In olden days there used to be yellow boxes put at junctions where snarl ups were likely to happen.

Coastweek, September 14 - 20, 1979:

A stunning photograph of a wide-eyed, regal-looking lion from the Amboseli Game Reserve graced the front page of Coastweek.

The five-year-old predator was spotted by Mombasa camera buff Mustafa Nasser during a visit to the teeming wildlife park.

National Geographic Society magazine had a full-time correspondent in the Reserve studying the lion's behavior patterns and were expected to feature it in future issues.

Mombasa Municipal Fire Brigade reported that at least ten people had died and property worth KSh. 2,777, 697, 15 had been destroyed in fires since January.

Latest figures indicated that there was an average of 23 fire cases a month in Mombasa alone.

Insurance companies declined to give figures but admitted that pay-offs made to fire victims ran into millions of shillings.

Tanzanians were looking into the possibility of constructing a plant at Songo Songo in Kilwa district to exploit the newly discovered gas for the manufacture of ammonia and urea.

If the project succeeded, the manufacture of urea from the 30 billion cubic litres of natural gas pool at Songo Songo gas would provide a rich nitrogenous fertilizer for Tanzania's agriculture.

Mombasa branch of the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) was making plans to build a new K. Shs. 7,000,000 hostel in the Kizingo area.

The hostel was to have 144 beds and was to cater to all people irrespective of religious following.

Police in Tanga were investigating the theft of 68 bags of coffee worth 100,000/- while in transit at the port for export to Europe.

United Nations Information Center was to stage an exhibition featuring the different activities and programmes of the world organization. The two-day show organized with the cooperation of the Aga Khan Education Department, was to be held at the Aga Khan High School with an aim to "acquaint the public with the work of the United Nations and motivate them towards greater support of the United Nations programmes."

The C.C.A. League got off the ground with the inclusion of Aga Khan and Mombasa Youths, as the suspension on Coast Gymkhana was lifted.

REGAL Cinema was screening 'Bittersweet Love' starring Meredith Baxter (of 'Family Ties' fame) and Michael Lewis.

NAAZ Cinema was ending its run of 'Lawman' and moving onto another Western, 'Eagle's Wing' the story of Kiowa dog soldiers and their constant warfare with the Comanches.

EMURUA DIED INSTANTLY AND MERCIFULLY - A PAINLESS DEATH

How A Wounded Lion Became Serious Business For This Professional Hunter

Four decades ago they formed an elite group and were material for numerous fictional works by such literary giants as Hemingway, Ruark, Cloete and Gerald Henley.

Their lives were part of the history of the development of East Africa.

Hollywood dramatised their lives and prowess using such dashing actors as Gregory Peck, Robert Mitchum, Robert Redford and John Wayne.

Today, many of these men who tamed and shaped the African wilderness to be what it is today, and carved for themselves a way of life that was one of envy and honour lie forgotten and unsung. (I have fictionalised the name of the victim killed by the lion in this story, so as not to distress or embarrass any relatives who may be alive today.)

The Maralai Man-Eater.

During the first quarter of 1977 before a total ban on hunting was imposed in Kenya by the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife, I took a camel safari to Lake Turkana.

We were a party of five and our guide was none other than the late Denis Zaphiro whose last official appointment was as Divisional Game Warden of the Northern Frontier District.

It was a memorable trip through South Horr, North Horr, the scorching heat of the Chabbi Desert, and the splendid isolation of the Notoo Mountains.

At night the desert sky was festooned with innumerable stars as we sat by the campfire to devour and discuss the day's adventures.

Denis had guided and commended Ernest Hemingway in the 1950's and more recently Prince Charles, the heir to the British throne.

He was a wonderful raconteur who could spin different tales every night as we warmed ourselves with a Cabernet Sauvignon or a Chivas Regal by the campfire.

Our campfires at sunset were almost always accompanied by the familiarly eerie howls of hyaenas.

Sometimes the chorus of night sounds and its musicality included the rasping calls of leopards, the startled barking of baboons, the shrill penetrating cries of a bush baby or the constant warble of the African Scops owl.

These sounds signified nature's prolific variations on a theme - it was an orchestra like no other.

At the end of our unique camel trek I was invited to spend a few days with Major Rodney Elliott in Maralal.

Rodney was one of the last British Game Wardens left in independent Kenya.

His house overlooked the Maralal Hills and the vast expanse of the barren lands to the north.

On April 10th, 1977 three hours before dawn, Ole Emurua was fast asleep in his manyatta following an evening of drunken revelry at a near by village.

It was a cold, windy night as the only Acacia tree above his hut swayed and rustled while death lurked and prowled in the vicinity.

In the African bush, death can come in the form of a hyaena, a mamba or a leopard and death in these environs is a silent talker!

On this particular night a big lion was prowling around Ole Emurua's hut perhaps drawn to "by the rank smell of 'pombe'".

In an instant the big blond-haired lion pounced on Emurua, bit him in the neck and then with hardly any effort pulled him out of his manyatta.

Emurua died instantly and mercifully a painless death.

In the morning an anxious game sergeant reported the incident to Major Rodney Elliott as we were having breakfast.

Elliott invited me to accompany him to the scene of the tragedy.

Here I will spare the reader all the gory details, but suffice it to say that the victim's body was horribly mutilated and partly eaten.

The lion's paw marks were clearly visible in the sand and

When their efforts failed, he then hung baits at various places within the lion's territory and home range.

Man-eaters and marauders are not cornered easily and tales and experiences of many a hunter/naturalist including Jim Corbett, Patterson and Selous attest to this statement.

Once Mirdat and his client caught a fleeting glimpse of the big cat, and tracked it for almost eight hours without ever closing in to make a successful "kill".

The baits were not touched and rumours were rife among the Samburu that the lion was a "Shetani" disguised as a lion!

On the tenth day the hunters and their trackers were following its spoor along a dry river bed when suddenly in clear light and within shooting range, the great cat presented itself.

The lion stood broadside and no more than thirty paces from the hunters and trackers.

Immediately, and without any warning, Heinz, the client, fired his 375 Mauser.

In that same instant the lion bounded away.

On examination the trackers found drops of blood in the sand and on foliage where the lion had torn through the brush and disappeared.

A wounded lion is serious business for a professional hunter.

There are many a story where a lion so wounded through the stupidity or the impatience of a nervous client has mauled a professional hunter so badly as to inflict wounds which are life-threatening.

Mirdat was faced with no other option than to go after the wounded lion alone and aided only by his one tracker, in order to finish it.

The ethics of sports hunting dictated these rules.

Given the circumstances of this botched up hunt, it seemed appropriate for Mirdat to let the lion bleed from the wound inflicted by Heinz and to allow for time to weaken it.

After an hour or so, Mirdat and Galano started to follow the spoor through dense vegetation.

Sweat trickled from Galano's forehead.

There was no conversation except by gestures or whispers.

They continued cautiously for what seemed an endless half an

hour. By this time all trace of blood had disappeared and hunter and tracker relied solely on tracks, or a trampled shrub for clues, as the lion tried to get away.

Nearly an hour later, Galano whispered something to Mirdat as they approached a clearing.

The silence was oppressive and the whole atmosphere was ominous.

In that instant there was a roar as the big cat came bounding at them.

A compressed mass of fury was projected at the hunter and tracker at a speed that translated into leaps and bounds.

Major Elliott made a keen observation of the details, including strands of blond hair obviously from the lion's mane.

From there we went to his office and checked the register, which showed the number of professional hunters who were hunting in Block 1.

The reason for this was that if the client of a professional hunter hunted the lion, the fees so accrued from the special licence could help in compensating the relatives of the dead.

To my pleasant surprise, Mr. Ghulam Mirdat was booked in hunting Block 1 for two weeks with a German client.

Major Elliott decided to call upon Mr. Mirdat at his safari camp and to notify him of the availability of a man-eating lion, should his client wish to hunt it.

On learning of this, Mr. Mirdat was only too keen to track and hunt the man-eater.

It took ten days to corner and dispose of the wily lion, which would otherwise have been a constant threat to the Samburu people in Maralal.

Mr. Mirdat first tried to track the big cat with his trackers, Galano and Tamenjoi, a skilled Ndorobo hunter/gatherer.

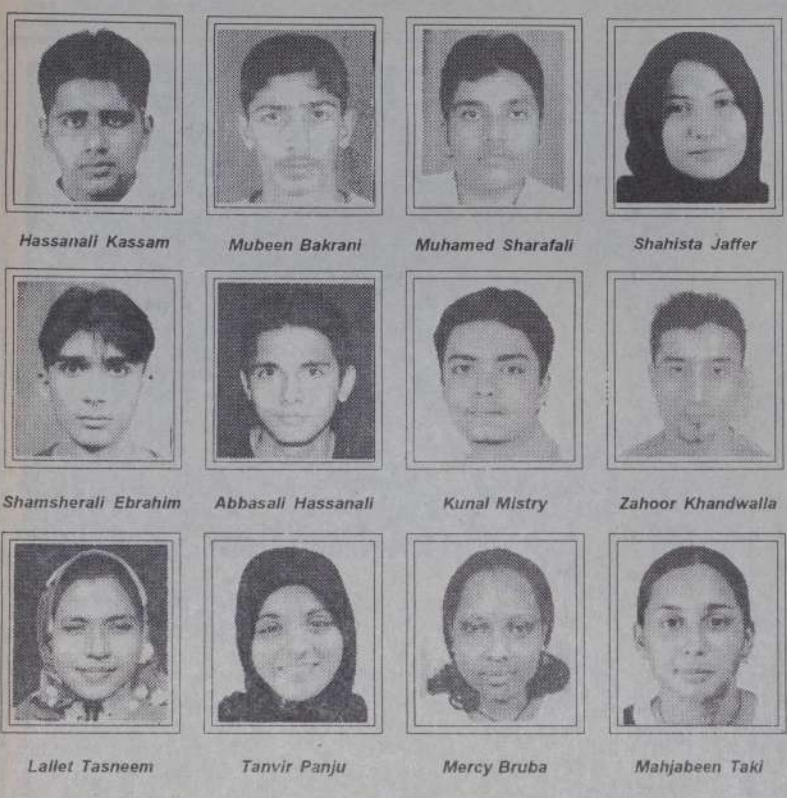

'African Safari Club' Hotels voll ausgebucht

DER TOURISMUS an der Küste hat sich offensichtlich erholt und die Zahl der Besucher entspricht fast derjenigen in der hervorragenden Sommersaison 2002.

Diese gute Nachricht wurde verkündet von **Tasneem Adamji**, Vorsitzende der **Kenya Association of Tour Operators (KATO)**, Küste.

Er ist überzeugt, dass das erfreuliche Ergebnis dem guten Marketing der Europäischen Union und des **Kenya Tourist Board** im vergangenen Jahr in Europa und England zu verdanken ist.

Allgemein sieht man der

Wintersaison optimistisch entgegen.

Tasneem Adamji, Chairman von **KATO Küste**, erklärte, dass die Touristen aus China Kurzurlauber sind mit 1 bis 3 Übernachtungen im Rahmen einer Reise nach vielen Destinationen in mehreren Ländern.

Während die Touristen aus Hongkong 5 Übernachtungen in Kenia vorgesehen haben, sind die Besucher vom chinesischen Festland eine Mischung aus Geschäfts- und Vergnügungsreisenden mit 2-3, maximal 4 Übernachtungen in Kenia.

Sie bleiben nur kurz an der Küste und Touristen aus Hongkong unternehmen oft nur eine Safari und verzichten auf einen Besuch an der Küste.

Der chinesische Markt bedeutet für Kenia wahrscheinlich nur eine vorübergehende Angelegenheit.

Im August fand im **Pirates Restaurant am Jomo Kenyatta Beach**, Bamburi, ein Meeting statt, um das **"Beach Operators Relocation Programme"**, das heißt die Umsiedlung der Strandhändler, zu besprechen.

Reiseveranstalter und Hoteliers sagen voraus, dass die Zahl der Touristen bedeutend zunehmen wird und dadurch mehr Einnahmen und Arbeitsplätze entstehen, sobald die Strandhändler umgesiedelt worden sind.

Mit dieser Maßnahme wird

auch die allgemeine Sicherheit verbessert.

Kuldip Sondhi, Chairman der **Mombasa and Coast Tourism Association MCTA**, warf darauf hin, dass die Touristen von den "fliegenden Händlern" am Strand belästigt werden, was sich negativ auswirkt.

Als Beispiel erwähnte er Zanzibar gleich neben den wunderschönen Stränden, wo die Hotels voll belegt sind, obwohl sie 2/3 mehr veranlagen als in Kenia.

"Wir sind noch weit entfernt von 1 Million Touristen, die wir uns vor zehn Jahren als Ziel gesetzt hatten", sagte **Sondhi**.

"Unsere Verträge werden Jahr im Voraus abgeschlossen und in diesem Jahr wird bestimmt, was sich ein Jahr später abspielt."

Ab 1. Dezember soll es keine "fliegenden Händler" mehr an den Stränden geben.

Wenn das Umsiedlungsprogramm Erfolg haben soll, sind folgende vier Punkte zu berücksichtigen:

- Eine feste Zusage der Strandhändler, dass sie die Strände verlassen.
- Land für die neue Märkte
- Geld, um die Märkte zu errichten
- Die Verwaltung muss dafür sorgen, dass das Gesetz eingehalten wird und an den Stränden kein Handel getrieben werden darf.

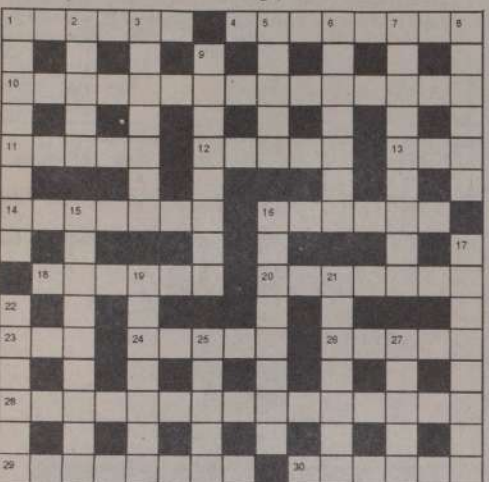
