



Cream Of Kenya's Rally Drivers Battle It Out For Honours Around The Teita Estate Near Mwatate

around the Teita Estate near Mwatate, Voi will reverberate with the roar of high-revving, turbo-charged engines as the cream of Kenya's rally drivers battle it out for the honours in the sixth round of the Kenya National Rally Championships.

The route this year is solely on private land which allows for a great deal of freedom for the organisers and guarantees that there will not be any problem with oncoming matatus or other unexpected traffic.

The owners of the Teita Sisa Estate, Connie and Philip Kyriaz nave generously allowed their operations to be interrupted for a day as they support Mombasa Motor Club by providing a beautiful venue for a smooth, fast and exciting rally.

Reconnaissance and car scrutineering is on Saturday afternoon with details of the "recce" to be confirmed in a bulletin within the next week

A social evening will take place at the Teita Estate Club House on Saturday evening with plenty of cool amber liquid available to have been out in the heat of their cars writing pace notes and memorising the route

The rally starts on Sunday morning at eight o-clock sharp from the Service Area beside Mwatate River and follows estate roads for four km to the first competitive section start near the Main Gate.

This 36 km section follows smooth, straight roads through the sisal to the north of the estate

side of the Sembe Hill (1174 metres) before doubling back on "Contour Road"

The drivers then negotiate a he drivers then negotiate a hairpin left that takes them up a road for nearly 1000ft in about one km up the side of the Sembe Hill onto the twisty and challenging "Mayhem" route (used in the event last year at

This is normal for most vehicles as the compressor runs and charges air for the brakes to be able to operate.

However, the noise was enough to startle the horse and it took off at a sharp angle to the road down the slope on the side

As the cart turned to follow the horse, the poles sticking out of the back of the cart swept the owner and propelled him towards the center of road.

The fellow flew towards the center of the road and ended up directly under the rear wheels of the trailer that was going past

him in the opposite direction He legs were crushed as a result of the vehicle going over

The driver of the truck was not

aware of what had happened and was only stopped a few hundred metres past the incident shouting and gesticulation of the
