OMANGA MEETS HOTELIERS OVER BUFFET DINNER

THE NEED FOR SOME URGENT SOLUTION to be found to keep coast hotel beds filled all year round, instead of for only a few months, was one of the subjects aired during discussions between the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association and the Minister of Tourism & Wildlife, Andrew Omanga. They took place during an informal dinner party at the Tamarind hosted by the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association together with representatives from hotels, tour operators, municipal council and light aircraft industry.

Statistics concerning bed occupancies at some beach hotels from 1981-4 were handed to the Minister. These showed a drop of approximately 10 per cent from 1981-3.

However, in 1984 bed occupancies had risen to 60.88 per cent compared with 58.31 per cent the previous year. However, there were still many un-filled beds.

More direct flights to the coast were called for rather than flights from the UK collecting passengers from other capitals en-route to Nairobi.

There was then a change of aircraft, with passengers arriving at Mombasa about twelve hours later.

The Minister was told that such flights are not popular with tourists.

The new form issued by the Port Health Office, Moi International Airport, and sent to line representatives with covering letter was also shown to the Minister.

The letter requested aircraft pilots to complete the form after ascertaining from passengers in which country they had been ten days earlier.

MCTA members told the Minister that pilots have other specialised and very responsible duties to perform, in flying the aircraft, and could not take on administrative duties as well.

Tour operators present at the dinner discussed in some detail the adverse financial affect the new PSV insurance premium was having on members.

Many tour operators would either have to reduce their fleets or pass on the increase to clients. The hire charge for vehicles would also become exorbitant.

They pointed out that the affect on Matatu operators was too horrifying to envisage, with vehicles having to be driven even faster to recoup the additional expense and still make a profit.

Another subject for discussion with the Minister was the irregular rubbish collection by the Municipal Council from North Coast hotels in particular.

ESSENTIAL SERVICE

More vehicles for this very essential service had been promised and it was hoped they would be operational before the next tourist high season so that hoteliers are not driven to hiring private tractors at very heavy cost to move this stinking rubbish.

This matter is being pursued by the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association.

The movement of crows to the North Coast was discussed. It was pointed out that the action taken to dispose of them was not adequate and they were seen gorging themselves on the piles of uncollected hotel rubbish on the North Coast.

The MCTA Chairman, Lorna Hayes, told the Minister that she dreaded the advent of each high season 'because of a general lack of confidence in a regular and adequate supply of fresh water and electricity'.

For several years there had been problems with both water and electricity during this time.

The Minister's attention was drawn to the fact that hotel accommodation at the Coast will increase by an extra 1066 beds before 1 December 1985.

Asked the Chairman 'can the supply and distribution systems of water and electricity keep pace with this development?'

Adding 'during the high season, it is not only hotels which are virtually bursting at the seams, but also holiday houses.'

Members observed that Mwananchi also suffered from waterless days in their townships.

The Minister was aware there had been water rationing on the South Coast due to insufficient supplies.

Members were apprehensive as to what might happen this December and January with so much development taking place on this particular part of the coast.

Once again the Minister was asked to try and persuade the Ministry concerned to have a duplicate pipeline added at Mzima Springs.

(While in Mombasa President Moi revealed that government is planning to install a second pipeline from Mzima to Mombasa.)

Informal discussions at the dinner party also covered the urgent need for extending the terminal buildings at Malindi Airport which are far too small for the number of passengers handled.

Domestic tourism was discussed, and some new ideas submitted to the Minister.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Omanga for giving up his time for such informal discussions with Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association and hoped they would become 'far more frequent in the future'.

'SAVE' THE OLD TOWN

EXPERTS WARN OF DAMAGE FROM THE INDIAN OCEAN

MOMBASA'S Mji Wa Kale, the historic, mile-long Old Town seafront, is steadily being washed away by pounding waves from the Indian Ocean.

Relentless sea waves, fanned by strong monsoon winds, have been lashing at the shoreline leaving several old buildings hanging on precariously and the very survival of some parts of the Old Town's Heritage now remains in question.

"Virtually every building on the shoreline is in danger and could come down if the problem is not checked" Old Town assistant chief Mr. Juma Kibwana told Coastweek.

More than twenty houses are affected and the 26,000 helpless residents are watching several others on the verge of crumbling. Cracks caused by sea action have split open walls and foundations of several buildings over the years.

The damage is evident from Fort Jesus to Kwa Nguru (the former old port) and right up to the creek hugging the Allidina Visram High School.

Historical Buildings and Narrow Streets

Endangered are approaches to the Old Town's ageless narrow streets, the Old Port, the 400-year-old Fort Jesus, mosques and historical buildings that tell the history and evolution of Mji Wa Kale.

Scientific study, has shown

the future of our heritage here could be bleak, indeed," he said.

'Transair Looking At Record Winter'

A ONE-hundred per cent increase in bookings for Kenya during the coming 1985-6 Winter Season, compared with the same period last year, was reported by Joachim Hunold, Manager, Contracting-Production, Transair, Dusseldorf, West Germany, when he arrived at Moi International Airport at five on Saturday morning.

He had flown to Mombasa on a LTU charter bringing with him eighteen travel agents from top travel agencies in Northern Germany to help boost bookings to Kenya.

They were warmly greeted by Khalid Shapi, United Touring Company's Tours Manager, Coast.

Interviewed at the airport, Mr. Hunold said "we have increased our allotments for this winter, and this is the first time for Transair to host a week's educational tour to Kenya."

Transair, a daughter company of LTU - (a privately owned charter airline based in Dusseldorf), is the largest and only regional tour operator from Dusseldorf.

It is 20 years old, presently sending tourists to 26 destinations in the world. Transair started operating to Kenya four years ago.

SERVICE TO INDIA PAKISTAN

TWO GROTESQUE events, the infamous 1966 slaying of eight student nurses in Chicago and the "Towpath Murders" in London, are rolled into one to provide a taut, tense motion picture *10 TO MIDNIGHT* which opened last night at KENYA Cinema.

The clock is ticking and time is running out as two detectives track down a psychotic killer whose elusive behaviour terrorizes a city while thwarting police efforts to apprehend him.

In his traditional tough, poised-for-action stance, Charles Bronson, as Leo Kessler, plays a detective who steps outside the law to apprehend the mass murder.

Big Boost For Mayor Christmas Tree Fund

MOMBASA (KNA) The Mombasa Municipal Council will spend Kshs 1.9 million on recarpeting roads in the Municipality, and a further Kshs. five million on buying refuse collection equipment.

The Mayor of Mombasa, Councillor Ahmed Mwidani disclosed this when he received Mr Amir Somji, Managing Director of Freight Forwarders (K) Ltd and Mr Jimmy Tejani, Director of the Intra-Ship company of Switzerland.

Mayor Mwidani said though the Council was experiencing financial problems the badly hit roads like Lumumba Road and the roads leading to the Pandya Memorial Hospital and the Outrigger Hotel in Liwatoni would be repaired as soon as possible.

He revealed that the tender had already been awarded to the contractor.

He disclosed that tenders for the refuse collection equipment have been advertised.

He Regretted that in the past the contractors gave the wrong quotations, and appealed to those interested parties to be honest, because in the past his Council lost a lot of revenue in awarding tenders.

The Mayor said that he has directed his inspectors to go assessing the quotations before the tenders were awarded to the qualified parties.

Mr Tejani presented the Mayor with the cheque for Shs 2,000 to wards the Mayors fund.

Thanking him the mayor said that he was the first person to contribute towards the fund, adding that he expected to launch it at the end of October.

He added that the money collected would go towards assisting the aged in the Municipality and destitute children. He urged other people to emulate his example.

major threat for its survival as a historical town.

He cited a report prepared by a group of Nairobi University students in 1981, warning that the culture and history of the old town's peoples were being destroyed by the forces of time and modernisation.

The report called for a pilot project to conserve and revitalise the old town.

"We need to retain significant elements and character of this place and control its development in sympathy with its wealthy past," Mr. Bwana noted.

The 1981 ministerial report recommended a sea wall, estimated to cost millions of Kenya shillings then, to fight back the sea waves pounding shoreward.

But the lack of sufficient funds has delayed the implementation of the project since then.

The Mombasa District Development Committee hope that the Government will seek funds from UN agencies like the UNEP and the rehabilitation programme for Mji Wa Kale.

DATELINE: DAR ES SALAAM Tourist Corporation Has Almost Completed Hotel Rehabilitation

THE REHABILITATION PROGRAMME for various hotels under the Tanzania Tourist Corporation is expected to be completed in December this year. The programme, which is being supported by the World Bank, covers eleven hotels whilst another hotel, the Mafia Island Lodge, which is also under the programme will not be ready by then. The snag at the Mafia Lodge is the delivery of equipment to the Island.

The rehabilitation is only expected to cover some 40 per cent of the actual work required to bring the hotels to modern day standards but will bring back the effected hotels to their original operating standards.

The programme costing some 1144 million shilling has been principally financed by a World Bank loan to the extent of Shs. 122 million.

Work began in 1980 and was set for completion by June 1983 but work was then delayed as more faults were diagnosed during the rehabilitation exercise.

The hotels covered under the scheme include the Kilimanjaro Hotel, New Africa Hotel, New Mwanza Hotel, Lake Manyara Hotel, Ngorongoro, Seronera and Lobo Wildlife Lodges in

the Northern tourist circuit.

At the Kilimanjaro Hotel in Dar Es Salaam work is expected to be finished by October this year except for the fifth and sixth floors of the eight floor, 200 bedroom hotel, which will be completed by December.

This hotel which faced regular water problems now has this sorted out with the installation of new water facilities, while the present air-conditioning system is to be replaced by a new one.

It is expected that after the above phase completion in December, there will be a further rehabilitation exercise to bring the hotels to present day standards.

However the take-off of this phase will depend on the availability of funds from some financial backers.

Meanwhile plans are underway to build a new lodge at the Serengeti National Park in Northern Tanzania.

The lodge is to be built on the western side of the park along the Gurunet River and will cater for about 200 tourists at one time.

At present, many tourists visit the eastern side of the park only because this section has better hotel facilities.

The new lodge is expected to provide a diversification of the tourist flow to the Western side.

It is expected that the lodge will also attract tourists from Zaire, Rwanda and Burundi with the Hippos in the Gurunet River being one of the main attractions.

The construction work of this 80-room lodge is expected to begin before the end of this year.

On the shipping sector, Rwanda now plans to use the Dar Es Salaam port for its exports and imports so as to hasten delivery and transport of its goods to and from Kigali.

Traditionally, Rwanda transported its cargo through Mombasa and hauled it through Uganda to Kigali over a period of about two weeks.

Rwanda Cargo Via Dodoma To Kigali

By using the Dar Es Salaam port the shipment is expected to take not over seven days with goods passing via Dodoma to Kigali.

The Dar Es Salaam port has a capacity of handling some 2.5 million tonnes per year but is presently handling only about two million tonnes of cargo destined to Zambia, Zaire, Malawi, Uganda, Burundi and Zimbabwe.

The port has eleven berths, barking on the construction of a lighterage quay and is em-

Kenya Credit Finance Corporation Pay Out Big Interim Dividends

AN INTERIM dividend of 25 percent for the year ended 31 March has been paid by this country's only financial institution which is a public company owned and operated by Kenyans — Credit Finance Corporation Ltd.

The dividend was made on the corporation's issued capital of K.E. 1,200,000 representing 4,800,000 shares held by almost 1,000 shareholders.

"This marks the fourteenth year in succession in which CFC has paid a dividend of at least 25 percent," the corporation's Chairman, Mr. Frank Addly told CFC's Board of Directors at a recent meeting.

"I think we can feel satisfied with the payment in view of the very difficult trading conditions experienced during the year," he added.

Mr. Addly was referring to the adverse effects on the Kenyan economy of last year's severe drought, compounded by an effective reduction in lending rates and increased competition within the industry.

In fact, in its recent history, CFC has proved remarkably resilient to adverse economic conditions. In the past five years alone, dividend payments have twice topped the 35 percent mark.

In another show of confidence, CFC, currently celebrating its 30th anniversary, proposes this year to make a one for four bonus share issue — the corporation's fourth such issue since 1980.

STOCK EXCHANGE

Such a record makes CFC shares among the healthiest and most reliable on the Nairobi Stock Exchange.

An examination of the corporation's share performance over the past seven years reveals that an investment of Shs. 870 in 100 equity shares in 1979 would have yielded Shs. 1,235 in dividends by today (including the 1985 payment) — an amount exceeding the original purchase price.

The total number of shares for that investment would now stand at 246 which would fetch approximately Shs. 2,880 today. Such a performance is rarely matched by Kenya's public companies.

Global Container Lines New Service To Karachi

THE FIRST vessel of Global Containers Lines new 3 weekly direct service to Karachi, namely the *Merkur River* arrived early on Wednesday of last week and spent several days at the buoys. She was berthed on Tuesday this week to load some 220 containers mainly Tea for Karachi — excellent support for the first sailing of a new service.

Another vessel waiting at the buoys in the early part of the week was the 2 year old Dutch chemical tanker *Jo Cypress* conspicuous by her orange coloured hull. She had arrived discharge 2500 tons of Chemicals at Shimanzi.

Unhappily for her, she was third in the queue to discharge at Shimanzi Oil Jetty already occupied by the one year old 20,000 d.w. ton *Conny* discharging white oil from the Gulf on behalf of Caltex, whilst the second vessel to arrive for SOT was the Japanese owned *Johore Express* waiting at 'K' anchorage to discharge 1000 tons bulk oil.

Arriving at Kipevu Oil Jetty on Tuesday to discharge 75,000 tons crude oil was the *Sanko Honour* owned by the financially troubled Japanese Shipping organisation Sanko Steamship Co. Ltd; the *Sanko Honour* has a deadweight capacity of 96,000 tons and was built in 1976. Like all the SANKO fleet they have green hulls, across which is written the world SANKO in bold letters, and brown upperworks.

The Danish East Asiatic Vessel *Songhka* on charter to the Mediterranean Shipping Company (MSC) having made several voyages to Mombasa this year has now been sold along with 4 sister ships all built in Japan some 8 years ago as container/bulk cargo carriers.

All 5 are believed to have been sold to a Yugoslav Company whilst no doubt the East Asiatic Company will replace them by a lesser number of

Orders for cruise vessels in an ever increasing size to have become a frequent occurrence. A few weeks ago I mentioned that the Royal Caribbean Cruise Line had placed an order for a 75,000 ton vessel.

This has now been capped by the Norwegian Caribbean Cruise Line (no connection) having ordered a vessel of 90,000 tons accommodating 3000 passengers.

As the size increases one wonders how many ports or traditional cruising areas will be closed to these emerging cruise giants. These vessels will largely cater for the ever expanding U.S. West Coast market.

Asked about the Shimba Hills National Reserve — a very attractive area in Kwale District which an increasing number of people are visiting, Mr. Orumoi said that the reserve has sable and roan antelope, giraffe, with elephant occasionally visiting.

He said that his department has been putting in game proof fencing (high tensile wire) around a greater proportion of the reserve to ensure there is no conflict between farmers and animals there.

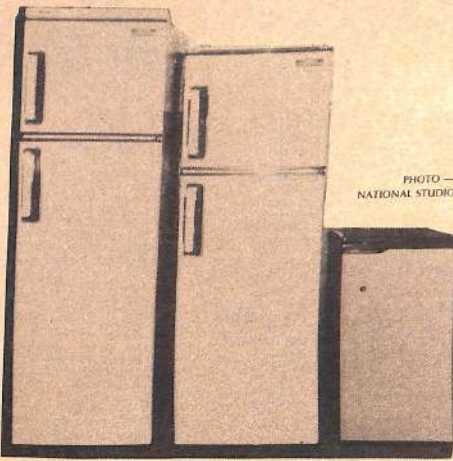

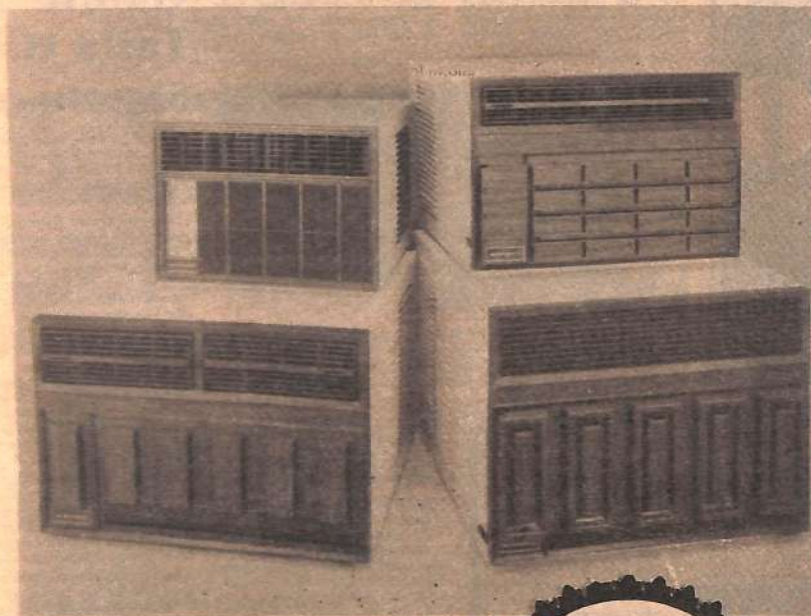

'Wildlife Galore' At Taita Hills Sanctuary

'ANIMALS Everywhere' is the only way to describe the abundance of game to be seen now throughout the Taita Hills Game Sanctuary.

The game count records for August showed an average of 74 elephants, 40 buffalo and 2 lions seen every day at Salt Lick watering hole, not to mention all the plains game, like impala, waterbuck, hartbeast, eland, oryx and zebra, which are continually around the water-hole.

Figures for this month look even better with large herds of elephants, many lions, including a huge black-maned fellow, entertaining visitors in the Taita Hills Game Sanctuary.

One of the highlights of a nights animal viewing at Hilton's Salt Lick Lodge is observing a beautiful serval cat which is now a nightly visitor to the small-animal feeding table.

Also coming into enjoy a ready meal are the white-tailed mongomongooses, civet cats and jacks.

BETRACHTUNGEN ZUM PAPSTBESUCH IN KENIA

SEINER Heiligkeit Papst Johannes Paulus II. wurde in Kenia nach seinen eigenen Worten ein sehr warmer Empfang zuteil. Kein heute lebender Mensch ist wohl mehr geliebt von Millionen seiner Anhänger und Sympathisanten und mehr gehaßt von seinen Gegnern. Immerhin muß er damit rechnen, daß vielleicht tausend Leute gerne ein Attentat auf ihn ausüben würden.

Als wohl aktivster Papst der etwa 250 Päpste, die bisher den Thron Petrus innegehabt haben, kämpft er mit wehrhaftem Heldentum unerschrocken für das Management der ca. 800 Millionen Gläubigen, gegen Kommunisten, Nihilisten, Andersdenkende, und bringt oftmals die schwerwiegendsten Anschuldigungen der römisch-katholischen Kirche gegen alle ihr Widersacher vor, was nicht immer angenehm ist und auch nicht immer in den Rahmen der Politiker hineinpaßt.

In unserer schnelllebigen Zeit ist oft das Widersinnigste von heute das Fassendste für übermorgen. Aber seine Erklärungen fundieren glaubhaft auf Gottes Wort, und er hat unter Einsatz seines Lebens bewiesen, daß er auch nach dem Attentat seinen Standpunkt genau so unerschrocken weiter vertritt.

Einer seiner heiligsten Kräfte, Rudolf Aupstein, wird sicher wieder viele Unannehmlichkeiten bei der letzten Afrikareise des Papstes entdecken. Das wirkliche Geschehen wird dabei außer acht gelassen, auch wenn die angewandten Mittel, gemessen an den Millionen von persönlich angesprochenen Menschen, nur

gering sind.

Kein roter Teppich ist zu lang und zu kostbar, um die Gesellschaft unserer Welt befragt mit den nötigen Hilfestellungen über die gefährlichen Klippen unserer Zeit zu bringen.

Die Armut Südamerikas ist nicht das Ergebnis seiner Arbeit. Als Mensch hat der Papst sicher diese Dinge mit Entsetzen festgestellt. Manche Situationen kann er ändern, viele Entwicklungen sind von der Politik bestimmt, und er kann — wie er das auch tut — ohne Rücksicht auf persönliche Angriffe, durch Gespräche mit vielen Politikern beratend und einflußnehmend die Lage zu verändern suchen.

Die Ausgaben, die gewisse Medien zur Feststellung von ihnen unpassend erscheinenden Tatsachen aufwenden, sind — wenn dabei die betroffenen oder informierten Menschen als Zahl berücksichtigt werden — von Fall zu Fall weit teurer als unter diesem Maßstab bewertete Aktionen des Papstes. Die Ergebnisse können natürlich nicht von heute auf morgen gemessen werden. Sie sind auch abhängig von vielen weiteren Besuchen und Gesprächen. Erst dann werden sich Erfolge einstellen, die von Dauer sind.

GOTTES SEGEN

Der römisch-katholischen Kirche soll die Möglichkeit gegeben werden, nicht nur 2000 Jahre zu bestehen, sondern darüber hinaus Lebensexistenz und Stütze der Gesellschaft für weitere Jahrhunderte zu bleiben.

Möge Gottes Segen den Papst bei all seinen weiteren Unter-

nehmungen folgen, denn sein Leben war bereits angefüllt mit großen Schwierigkeiten in einer sehr zwiespältigen Welt.

Lassen wir die Jahrhunderte sprechen, sind wir nicht voreilig in der Verurteilung und Abwertung, sondern sind wir dankbar dafür, daß dieser Papst es in sein Programm aufgenommen

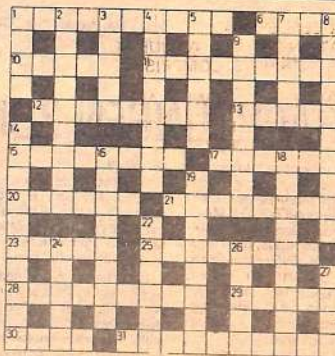

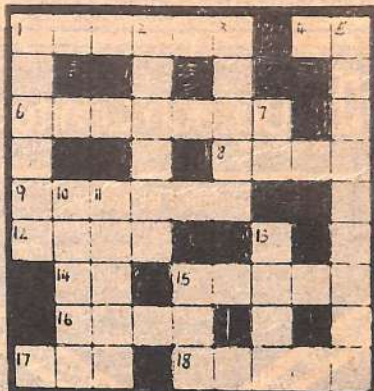
