Muslims Seeking To Be Exempt

MOMBASA (KNA) The Chief Kadhi of Kenya Sheikh Nassor Mohamed Nahdy has appealed to the government to exempt the muslims from the application of the law of succession as it was unpopular among them.

He said many muslims had made presentations to him with a view to approaching the government on the issue.

Sheikh Nahdy was speaking at the 10th anniversary celebrations since the funding of the National Union of Kenya (NUKEM) at the Islamic Centre.

He said that although as a government servant he had no alternative but go along with its decision, he felt he had a moral responsibility on matters touching on the Holy Quran and its teachings.

The law of succession which is expected to apply to all Kenyans sparked off a protracted debate within the muslim community, many of them arguing that applying the law in its entirety would infringe on very tenets of Islam. Other leaders further argued that muslims have all along had their own way of bequeathing property to the heirs and expressed the fear that the new law would the subject to abuse by greedy heirs.

Flanked by the NUKEM chairman Mr. Ali Sheikh Amin, the board of trustees and the Kuwait first secretary Mr. Farouk, the Chief Kadhi paid glowing tribute to the muslim union for its commendable efforts in striving to uplift the welfare of its members apart from its religious obligations.

Mr. Ali Sheikh Amin informed the members gathered that in the past ten years, NUKEM had spent nearly six million shillings on many projects mainly mosques, madrassa and dispensaries.

He observed that although purely a religious body, it had gone out of its way to offer bursary assistance to orphans, the poor and the needy in the Coast Province.

And because of the growing demand for the unions services, NUKEM and purchased a building on Moi Avenue Mombasa whose income would assist the union in running its activities.

Mr. Amin thanked the members and their brothers in Islam in Arab countries who have consistently donated the money to the Union.

During the ceremony a jumble sale later fetched a sum of 24,000/- including a donation of ten thousand shillings from the embassy of Kuwait.

'NEEM' TREE MAY BE WONDER PESTICIDE

ONE OF THE MOST COMMON shade trees to be found on the Kenya Coast, the Neem tree, is currently the focus of considerable scientific study in the United States, where the Department of Agriculture research laboratories have derived a 'natural' insecticide from its roots and bark.

In experiments, chemicals extracted from the neem tree, a native of Asia and Africa, have deterred more than 80 different agricultural pests, including carpet beetles, tobacco budworms, grasshoppers, citrus mealybugs, navel orangeworms and confused flour beetles. Neem-laced baits also killed young cockroaches and inhibited egg laying by adult roaches.

Scientists with the Agricultural Research Service in Beltsville, Maryland, have developed a commercial neem-derived pesticide product that the Environmental Protection Agency is considering for vegetable and ornamental crops.

Horror Ship — Crew In Court

CAPTAIN FACES 20 YEARS' JAIL SENTENCE

KENYA'S SHIPPING FRATERNITY and Coast leaders have been watching with keen interest the proceedings of the current trial in Piraeus, Greece in which a Greek sea captain is accused of throwing 11 East African stowaways into the Indian Ocean last year, a few hours after the ship left Mombasa.

The trial which began eleven days ago, has heard the captain of the 9,778-ton Greek vessel *Garifalia C* who is charged with eight other Greek and three Pakistani seamen, admitting that he forced the stowaways into the shark-infested waters off the Somali Coast.

Captain Antonis Plytzanopoulos, 44, faces a 20-year jail term in a case which has gained international publicity after four crew members reported

the brutal incident on the ship's return to Athens.

Four Tanzanian stowaways, survived. The fate of the other seven, believed to include Kenyans, is still 'unknown'.

Shipping sources interviewed in Mombasa said they were happy that those who committed the ghastly crime are finally standing trial in a court of law.

"No court judgement will wipe out the horror of their crime, but it is gratifying to see that justice is being done," one source said.

They recounted the shock and horror which outraged the local shipping fraternity following the tragedy of the eleven stowaways.

Some sources expressed reservation over some of the statements made during the trial in Piraeus.

"We feel that some of the statements were inadmissibly racist and outrageous. Such statements can not help heal the wounds and repair the damage caused to the international Shipping industry, particularly where the Greek merchants ships are concerned," a spokesman for one shipping firm said.

ENDANGERING LIVES

The Greek freighter captain and 10 crew members are charged with inflicting grievous bodily injuries and endangering lives.

The trial in Piraeus this week heard that the captain and his crew clubbed the stowaways and fired a shot-gun to force them overboard.

A radio operator on the ship narrated to the court how the terrified stowaways were gassed with insecticide, beaten with iron bars and thrown one by one into

the shark infested Indian Ocean off Somalia on March 17 last year.

One of the eleven sailors on trial described the captain as

MOMBASA (KNA) A man suspected of robbing an American of property worth Shs. 900 was shot dead at the weekend at a beach in Kwale after he allegedly threatened a policeman who tried to foil the robbery.

According to eye witnesses, the suspects threatened to slash him with pangas if he did not surrender his handbag, which had two trouses and a cheque book valued at Shs. 900.

Police on patrol became suspicious and ordered the suspects to stop but they defied the order and started running away with the handbag.

After a one-kilometre chase, one of the assailants turned on a police officer and tried to attack him with a panga, despite warning shots.

He was shot dead. The other suspect escaped.

HUNDREDS EXPECTED TO JOIN 'MOMBASA MARATHON' RACE

THE MOMBASA MARATHON RACE, a prelude to the international race scheduled for next year, will take place on Kenyatta Day and is expected to attract more than 500 local participants. The first event of its kind, sponsored by the Severin Sea Lodge in conjunction with the Coast branch of the Kenya Amateur Athletics Association and the Ministry of Culture and Social Services, will cover 24 kilometres.

The race will also include a select team of 45 Kenyan top runners to give it a competitive quality.

The Severin Sea Lodge will look after the general organisation of the event while the ministry of Culture and Social Services will supervise the technical side of the marathon run.

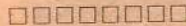
Participants are expected in Mombasa on October 18 and final preparations for the event, including medical check-ups for the participants, will be completed on the eve of Kenyatta Day.

Details of the route obtained from Severin Sea Lodge show that the race will pass through almost all north Coast hotels, through Kongwea, and back to Severin Sea Lodge where the race will have started.

According to a spokesman of the Severin Sea Lodge, next year's international event will be fashioned in the status of marathons runs organised by major world cities like London, Paris, San Francisco, New York and Sao Paulo where as many as 10,000 people are known to have participated.

The Mombasa Marathon 1985 is expected to form part of country-wide sports activities connected with this year's Kenyatta Day celebrations.

It is anticipated that many overseas tourists holidaying at the Coast will be interested to participate in the event.

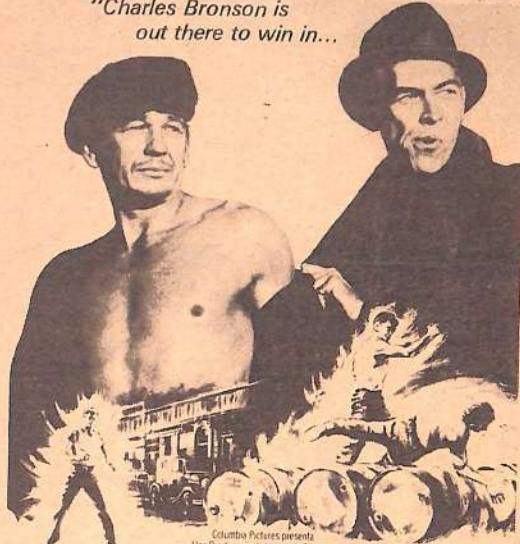

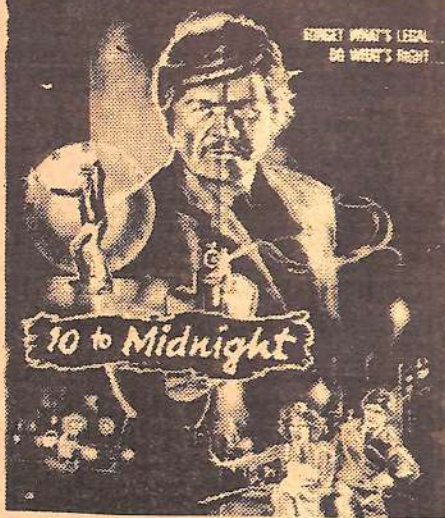

"an animal and savage". He denied that the stowaways had mutinied or that they were dangerous to the safety of the crew.

The stowaways, aged between 17 and 25, are believed to have slipped on board the *Garifalia* in Mombasa a day before the ship sailed. They were forced overboard as the ship steamed off the Somali Coast.

According to the charge sheet, the captain "clubbed two stowaways on the head as they begged for mercy on their knees and forced them overboard screaming in desperation as blood flowed from their injuries."

The four Tanzanian survivors, who were repatriated back home through Mombasa in May last year, were identified as Mohamed D. Salim, Abdulla Juma Ali, Deo Steven and Ramadhan Juma Muharaji.

The 'Horror Tunnel' - An Explanation!

In his diary he records that he built the '39 Steps' and a wharf containing a well and underground tunnel up to his house.

He built this with the help of freed slaves whom he organised under a Swahili Mason and paid every Saturday night.

As the head of the British presence in Mombasa during the brief Owen Protector-ship of 1824-6, his main occupation was to chase and catch slaving vessels as they appeared off Mombasa.

The wharf and tunnel he built in order to speed up his anti-slavery operations.

Unfortunately after his departure, slaving activity in Mombasa continued and quite possibly various of these unfortunates did indeed enter Mombasa by way of his tunnel.

However as the tunnel entrance opened up in the front garden of Old Leven House, which during much of the nineteenth century was occupied by European missionaries, explorers and laterly British administrators, it cannot have been a favourite route.

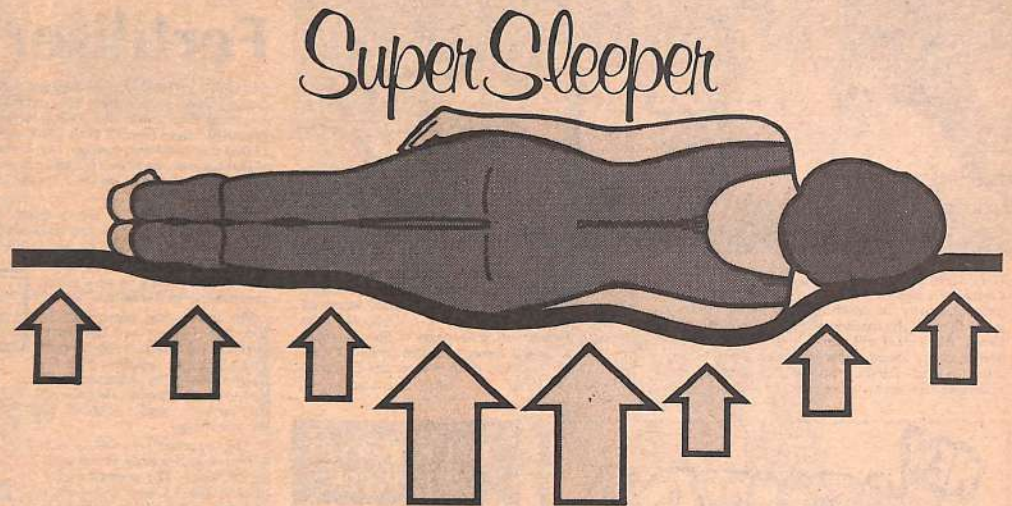
Of course the eating habits of our people have to change, but with the rate of our current population growth, that would not be asking to much of them.

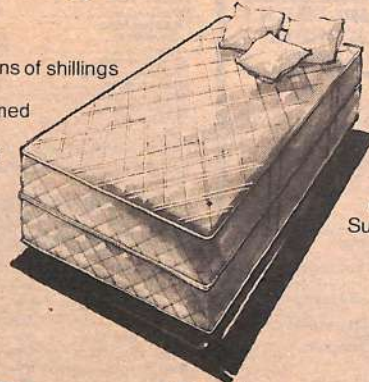

It was attended by a number of tea exporters and prominent guests from Kenya Ports Authority and Kenya Cargo Handling Services Ltd.

Global Container Lines whose General Agents are Shiptrade Inc., New York, have introduced a new shipping service between Mombasa and Karachi.

Their vessel M. V. Merkur River left on her inaugural voyage to Karachi on September 4, 1985 with an export cargo of tea from Kenya.

The Merkur River is 1981 built and has a deadweight of 12720 tons and a speed of 17 knots. She is capable of carrying 428 20' containers and is self sustaining.

This new service has been

well received by the trade mainly the tea exporters from Kenya who have had difficulties in the past relying on the only other regular line namely Laurel Navigations an affiliate of ZIM Lines, who have been calling Mombasa every 4/6 weeks.

SPANFREIGHT

Global Container Lines are scheduled to call Mombasa every 21 days and offer a transit time to Karachi of 7 days.

Ships Off-Load Fertiliser Cargo

SEVERAL SHIPLOADS of bagged fertiliser, largely aid cargo for Kenya, have arrived over the past week with more yet to come including the Patmos due tomorrow with 10,000 tons and two more shipments due on the 19th. The recent arrivals in port are the 25,000 d.w.ton Panamanian flag *Azzura* from Finland discharging 17,000 tons at No.10 berth and at No.1 berth the rarely seen Hungarian flag is flying from the 13 year old 13,600 d.w.ton *Ady* from Rotterdam.

She followed on at No. 1 berth after the *World Star*, which arrived on 20th August and sailed 5th September, had sailed on completion of discharge of her 20,000 tons ex Denmark.

At least these fertiliser shipments are arriving in very good time ahead of the rains.

An interesting vessel which did not appear on the Port Arrivals list made a 24 hr call last week for supplies. Named *Taiiun* with the hammer and sickle on the funnel she entered for supplies and anchored at 'A' anchorage.

She appeared to be a fish research and supply vessel with reefer space. The unusual factor is that the 15 year old *Taiiun* is listed in Lloyds as owned by H. Stinnes the well known W. German Shipowners, and flies the Panamanian flag.

I can only assume she is on charter to the Russians, borne out by her un-Russian name. With a gross tonnage of 4800 tons she was certainly much larger than the usual size of Russian vessels engaged in the 'fishing industry'.

Some export cargo to move this week is 900 tons bagged Wheat Bran by the Danish vessel with the unusual name of *Else Cat*, a modern 2 year old vessel of 1360 d.w. tons. One rarely if ever sees an ill kept vessel flying the Danish flag - their country's vessels are invariably spotless with a real pride taken in their appearance.

SHIPPING with JOHN WALTERS

The Royal Navy Squadron in port since August 23rd finally sailed last Monday morning. The port however was not long without a renewed Naval presence with the arrival on Wednesday morning of the French Navy support ship *Jules Verne* which has called at Mombasa many times before.

Our old friend the Singapore based vessel *Lady of Lorne* is back in port this week to load another 14,000 tons bulk Soda Ash for Bangkok.

GERMAN OWNERS

A vessel due to arrive yesterday is the 9,400 gross ton *Klaus Leonhardt* owned by the W. German Shipowners Leonhardt & Blumberg of Hamburg to discharge bagged sugar believed for Kenya, and fertiliser from Antwerp.

The nationality of the vessel is recorded as being Vanuatu which is quite unknown to me even taking into account my reasonably broad knowledge of geography. It is presumably some flag of convenience country.

BRIEFS

MOMBASA (KNA) Over 51,400 tons of sisal worth Shs. 342,271,328 was produced last year as compared to 46,911 tons worth Shs. 213,538,872 in the previous year of the total production 39,505 tons went to the export market earning the country Shs. 253,096,698 in 1983 and 38,486 tons of the crop was exported raising Shs. 234,599,900.

MOMBASA (KNA) The Municipal Director of Social Services and Housing has told the council that it was losing a total of Shs. 14,000 for non-occupation of 266 stalls in markets and food vendor canteens. The cause of non-occupation of the stalls is 'illegal' hawking and issuing of licences to traders in the vicinity of the markets.

MOMBASA (KNA) Kenya Meat Commission sold their product locally totaling to Kshs. 175,532,562 while the firm fetched some Kshs. 159,041,690 from export to strengthen the countries foreign exchange during the year 1984. This was due to the influx of animals from rural area due to the drought which hit the country during that year. It was the highest figure recorded for the last few years and is said to be gaining a lot of strength. Since June Kshs. 90,209,347 was realised from the local market, while the export market and fetched Kshs. 74,490,362 during the same period.

MOMBASA (KNA) Some Shgs. 130-million is currently in circulation loans to farmers within Coast Province, according to the area Agricultural Finance Cooperation Mr Yoram Jilo. Mr Jilo noted that the area had five branches, saying that as from April to June this year some Shs. 33-million was repaid to the corporation by farmers.

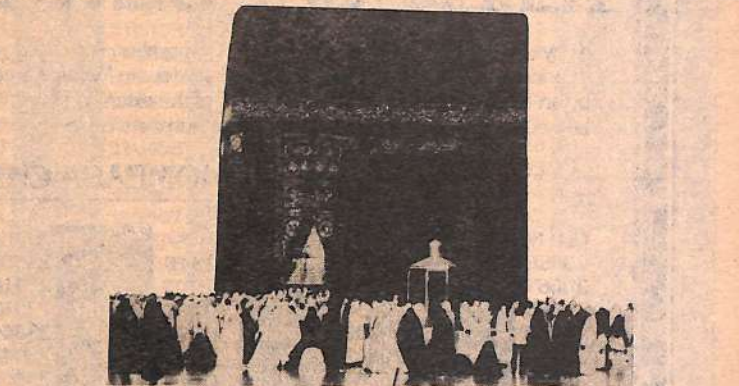
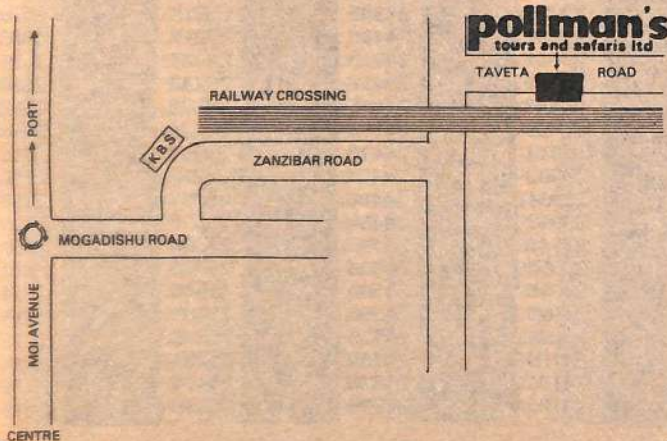

JUST LESS than one hour's flying time away from Mombasa is Lamu Island - loaded with history, culture, traditional crafts and an Islamic way of life.

It is delightfully different and world famous for its beautiful 18th century Swahili courtyard houses, *Petley's Inn*, decorative woodcarving, dhow-building, as well as for its enormous crabs, delicious mangoes and the delightful sticky sweetmeat - *Halwa*.

The island is full of narrow streets through which only people, donkeys, and hamali carts can pass. There is only one land-rover (belonging to Government) and a motor cycle, (belonging to Kenya Power & Lighting Company) there.

A more Swahili ambience is presently being given to shops to make them more attractive to visitors, some of which are offering more 'with it' coastal fashion gear with colourful cotton waistcoats and harem pants.

Fakrudin Gulamhusein's curio shop which opened forty years ago.

It is like Alladin's Cave with lots of exotic jewellery and Arab coffee pots and chests.

It is here that 90-150 year old American wall clocks are to be found, some from St. Thomas, USA.

The island can also boast of having one of the best restau-

rants along the Kenya coast, offering not only delicious coastal cuisine, but also a unique Swahili atmosphere with traditional wedding mats and brightly coloured khangas decorating the walls, as well as three large frames of assorted Boni combs.

To be found at the *Equator Restaurant* is Ron Partridge who once managed Nairobi's former *Equator Club* for ten years from 1951, then described by *Life Magazine* as 'one of the top twenty clubs in the world'.

It was the haunt of many famous film stars and writers when visiting Kenya.

Kenya born Roger Whittaker - now internationally famous - used to sing there under the name of 'Hank'.

The second *Equator* is styled after a dhow. On the upper deck are intimate dining alcoves each named after a different island in the Lamu Archipelago.

Ron is quite a character and has many stories to relate about East Africa.

He first came to Kenya in 1936 as a farm manager seeking a more adventurous life than that of a private secretary to a Member of Parliament in the House of Commons, Westminster, London.

FAMOUS POET

Ron has worked in many top lodges, hotels and restaurants in Kenya and Tanzania.

It was he who opened the *Silver Grill* in the New Stanley

Hotel, which later became the popular *Bacchus Club*.

Another famous personality to be found on Lamu Island is Abdullah Ali Skanda whose carpentry shop is to be found on the quayside.

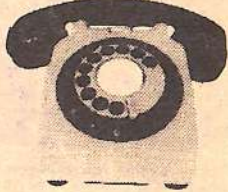
Abdulla was born in Lamu, and was trained in the art of decorative woodcarving by Kijumwa, a famous poet and woodcarver.

During the 50s Abdulla was an instructor in carpentry and woodcarving at the former Mombasa Institute of Moslem Education returning to Lamu in the 60s to start his own workshop.

Over the years he has successfully trained over fifty local people in this highly skilled craft many of whom now have

their own carpentry workshops.

He has become famous in particular for his magnificent Arab doors, chests and coffee tables which are exported to many countries of the world.

An interesting trend is the increasing 'local' demand for his furniture and doors. Many are turning away from Formica to purchase something more beautiful.

There is also a big demand for king-sized beds which could sleep four!

Soon, it is hoped - if sufficient funds become available Lamu Island will have its own Cultural Centre where local traditional crafts will be made and sold, as well as performances of traditional music and dancing given.

HANDICRAFTS

The Lamu Archipelago is rich in culture and handicrafts and the centre will bring these together under one roof, making it easy for visitors to see. It will also do much to boost business for many more people who will be able to buy what they

produce.

Siyu and Pate in the Lamu Archipelago are famous for their leather work - sandals, belts and stools. The cultural centre will also embrace crafts from the Tana River area.

The Cultural Centre will be situated in Lamu Fort built by the local people and completed in 1821. It later became a prison and is now one of the most important national monuments in Lamu.

The Fort is situated just behind the District Commissioner's Office not far from the quay-side. It is a very imposing building, in front of which is a bustling, colourful, fruit and vegetable market.

The National Museums of Kenya are doing what they can to renovate it so that it can open to visitors early next year.

Said Omar Bwana, Head of Coastal Museums and Monuments 'last year we undertook a preliminary survey of the structural repairs required.

This included the replacing of dangerous beams. It is this work which is now being carried

out on the normal grant which the Museums receive from the Kenya Government'.

Said Mr. Bwana 'with the limited resources available we are doing what we can to restore the Fort'.

However, to convert it into a Cultural Centre large sums of money are required for a tremen-

ous amount of work yet remains to be done.

The National Museums of Kenya are hoping that institutions and organisations both here and abroad interested in boosting the culture of this area might decide to assist financially.

Mr. Bwana also revealed that

in its final stages is a 'Master Plan' for the conservation of Lamu's 18th century stone town.

Its preparation is being undertaken in conjunction with the Department of Physical Planning, Ministry of Works and Housing 'to guide and assist in a policy of conservation'.

STONE HOUSES

It is an effort to save it from further deterioration and to act as a guide-line to the authorities concerned. Lamu's eighteenth century stone houses are magnificent.

Many are owned by Europeans who have gone to great lengths and expense to preserve and renovate them to their former glory and furnish them in the traditional way.

These houses are extravagantly decorated with rich and masterfully carved plaster ceiling friezes, wall panels and complex wall niches, also beautifully carved trifoliate arches.

The art of carving plaster was perfected more than 200



Urlaub mit Jahn Reisen wird immer beliebter

WÄHREND DER Wintersaison 1985/86 rechnet *Jahn Reisen*, ein bedeutender Reiseveranstalter in der Bundesrepublik Deutschland, damit, über 4000 Touristen nach Kenia zu schicken, die jede Woche in drei Chartermaschinen auf dem Flughafen von Mombasa ankommen werden.

Das bedeutet einen zusätzlichen Flug, verglichen mit der vergangenen Wintersaison, als 3281 Kunden von *Jahn Reisen* ihre Ferien in Kenia verbrachten, und eine Zunahme der Touristenzahl um 35%.

Die Firma *Jahn Reisen*, die der LTU gehört, wurde 1979 gegründet und offerierte als erstes Reiseziel Kenia, das sich bei der Kundschaft zunehmender Beliebtheit erfreut.

LTU ist eine private Charterfluggesellschaft mit Hauptsitz in Düsseldorf. Zu ihren Tochtergesellschaften gehören LTS, Meiers Weltreisen und Transair.

FERNREISEN

Im Prospekt für die Wintersaison 1985/86, der soeben herausgekommen ist, wird unter den Fernreisen als Hauptattraktion wieder Kenia angeboten. Neun Seiten sind diesem Land gewidmet, 13 Hotels stehen zur

Auswahl, vier mehr als im letzten Jahr, um die stets zunehmende Zahl der Touristen unterzubringen.

Während der kommenden Wintersaison werden jede Woche zwei LTS Flüge (Boeing 757) ab München durchgeführt und eine Lockheed Tristar von LTU ab Düsseldorf direkt nach Mombasa fliegen.

Um für Ferien in Kenia zu werben, brachten *Jahn Reisen*/LTU im Juli 19 Vertreter von Reisebüros auf Informationsstour nach Kenia und machten zusätzlich Reklame in Zeitungen und im Radio.

Auch für die kommende Sommersaison planen LTU/*Jahn Reisen* einen zweiten wöchentlichen Charterflug nach Mombasa, um der zunehmenden Nachfrage zu genügen. Diesen Sommer wurde nur eine Chartermaschine pro Woche nach Kenia eingesetzt.

African Tours & Hotels (A.T. & H.) betreut stets die Kunden von *Jahn Reisen* auf ihren Landarrangements und Safaris, seit die Firma vor sechs Jahren die ersten Touristen nach Kenia schickte.

A.T. & H. ist gerade dabei, den Wagenpark zu ergänzen. Für die Hochsaison werden zwanzig neue Fahrzeuge mit 7.50 Plätzen an der Küste zur Verfügung stehen.

Dieses Jahr hat *Jahn Reisen* Gruppenreisen in 36 verschiedene Länder im Urlaubsprogramm, darunter als eine der neuesten Attraktionen die kleine griechische Insel Thassos. Sie hat sich als voller Erfolg herausgestellt, denn sie wird bisher nur von *Jahn Reisen* angefliegen.

In einem Interview am Hauptsitz in München erwähnte Herr Franz E. Tobisch, Vertragsabschließender Manager von *Jahn Reisen*, daß die Karibik nunmehr für viele Touristen zu teuer geworden ist, nachdem die Preise ständig erhöht wurden. Als Folge reisen nun viele nach Kuba, wo ein Urlaub nur halb soviel kostet wie in Jamaica oder Barbados.

MAASAI MARA

Herr Tobisch wies ferner darauf hin, daß sich bei *Jahn Reisen* viele wiederkehrende Gäste einfinden, die nach einem glücklichen Urlaub ein zweites und drittes Mal dorthin zurückkehren, vor allem nach

Kenia. Die Kunden verbringen durchschnittlich drei Wochen in Kenia, zwei in einem Strandhotel und eine Woche auf Safari, wobei das Maasai Mara Reservat am beliebtesten ist.

Jahn Reisen eröffnete 1981 eine Abteilung für Kreuzfahrten und beförderte im letzten Jahr 16.000 Passagiere. Im Angebot stehen 53 Kreuzfahrten pro Jahr, von sieben Tagen im Mittelmeer bis zu 95 Tagen jährlich fünf publizierten Katalogen befaßt sich einer nur mit Kreuzfahrten, ein anderer ausschließlich mit Griechenland.

Im März dieses Jahres kam die IVAN FRANKO, von *Jahn Reisen* gechartert, mit 450 Passagieren unter anderem auch nach Mombasa. Sie verbrachten vier Tage in Kenia; die meisten gingen mit African Tours & Hotels auf Safari.

187 Passagiere verließen das Schiff in Mombasa und flogen mit einer LTS Chartermaschine nach Deutschland zurück. Die selbe Maschine brachte 173 Touristen nach Mombasa, die sich von hier aus auf Kreuzfahrt mit der IVAN FRANKO begaben.

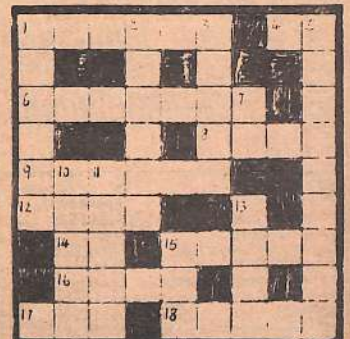

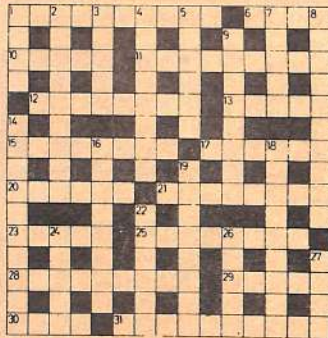

years ago. Many examples may still be found in Lamu's Stone Town.

One of the best small museums in Africa is to be found on Lamu Island. Its exhibits represent the material culture of various coastal peoples in the context in which the items are used.

This is a very special exhibit of ivory and brass Siwas, the magnificent ceremonial musical instruments which were used on special occasions in the town.

Both in the Lamu and Fort Jesus Museums are some of the artefacts found during excavations at Shanga and Manda which proved there had been a settlement of Swahili people there right from the 9th century.

Recently added to the Lamu Museum is a section devoted to Henna which is used in the Swahili culture as an adornment for ladies.

It is applied by married women on both hands and feet during special occasions, particularly for weddings and Maulidi. It is also applied before travelling, or when a husband is expected back from a long journey.

Takwa Ruins

Young women apply henna to their hands only for it is considered provocative and indecent for girls of marriageable age to decorate their feet.

Application of henna for the bride takes two to three days during which she remains confined to her room behind a curtain.

From Lamu Town or Shela you can take a traditional lateen rigged dhow to the ruins of Takwa, a national monument

However, although Aga Khan came near on two occasions with counter attacks, the full-time score was 0-0.

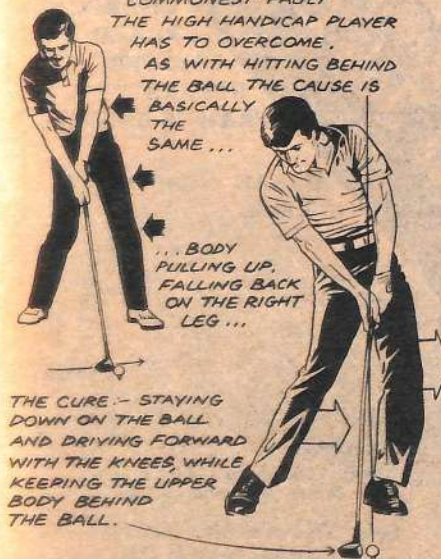
Watched by an estimated crowd of some 500 fans the penalty shoot-out was contested in an electric atmosphere, with both teams scoring four out of five in the initial stage.
