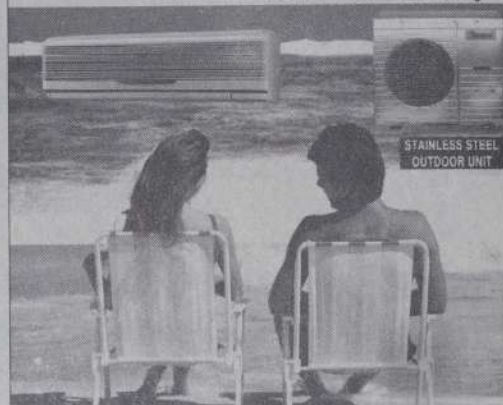

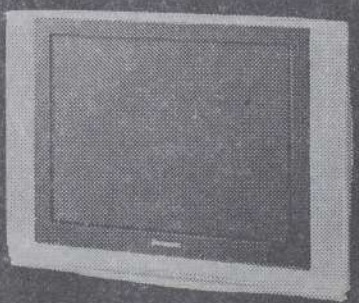

JAPANESE PEACE BOAT - LUXURY LINER 'TOPAZ' - PAYS TWO DAY CALL ON KENYA

Visiting Mombasa's Kilindini Port over the weekend - during a two-day call on Kenya - was the luxury passenger liner TSS 'Topaz'.

Formerly the "Empress of Britain" the TSS 'Topaz' was christened by Queen Elizabeth in 1955, and began life as a cruise ship in the North Atlantic, sailing between Quebec, Greenock, Liverpool and Montreal.

In 1964 she was sold to the Greek Line and after a refit was renamed "Queen Anna Maria".

After a colourful and well travelled history with several different names and cruise lines, including Carnival, Fiesta Marina and Thompson, TSS 'Topaz' was chartered by Peace Boat in 2003 for its future voyages.

Departing Tokyo on October 22, 2004 and returning to Japan on January 30, 2004, Peace Boat's 47th Voyage for 'Peace' will circumnavigate the globe on a westward route, sailing around the Cape of Good Hope and Cape Horn.

At 31,500 tons, 'Topaz' is the largest ship Peace Boat has ever chartered, and has a maximum capacity of over 1600 passengers and nearly 500 crew.

With a beam of 26 meters,

a draft of almost nine meters and length of 195 meters, TSS 'Topaz' is classed as a large ship, and is equipped with all the amenities of a modern cruise liner.

Peace Boat is a non-

governmental and non-profit organization with its headquarters in Tokyo, Japan.

Skål Club Boosts New Plan To Eradicate Crow Menace

Giving the Crow Eradication Programme 'ANGAMIZA KUNGURU' a big boost is Skål International - Kenya Coast - which has adopted it as a three year project.

Declared Chairman, Mohammed Hersi, 'the time has come to finally tackle the serious Indian House Crow menace at Mombasa.

With the guidance of Tony Archer, a highly experienced crow control expert and with sufficient financial support Skål can ensure that the crow is brought under control at the coast.

'Phase one' he said 'will be a live chick collection programme from 15th December to 15th January 2005 in Nyali, Bamburi and Shanzu.

'Phase Two' then takes over in the same areas.

Afterwards the programme will extend to other areas and ultimately concentrate on Mombasa Island.

He said 'it has been scientifically established that egg collection is ineffective, while a chick collection is highly effective.

Hence, as the Indian House Crow begin to nest so the programme will swing into action on December 15 and for each chick collected Kshs. 20 will be paid at centres in Nyali, Bamburi and Shanzu.

Schoolchildren are being encouraged to assist during their school holidays.

On the financial side he said it is estimated that for 'Phase One' alone Kshs. 300,000/- is needed and Skål members, tour firms, airlines, travel agents, hotels, ratepayers association are being invited to help.

'For Phase One it is hoped to raise through hotels 15,000; restaurants 7,500; residents 2,500; also corporate companies at their discretion.

Expected to be raised for Phase 2 through hotels 10,000; restaurants 5,000; residents 2,000; also corporate companies at their discretion.

The results of each phase will be forwarded to all.

Costs will rise in the first year (2005) and then gradually reduce as the programme becomes effective.

The Skål Chairman and others feel that the time has come to finally tackle the serious Indian House Crow menace at Mombasa.

'To be effective' he said 'the control programme must run for at least three years and, thereafter, be followed up by continuous routine action.

This, too, will require adequate funding.'

He went on to explain that crow eradication programmes had been successfully operated in Diani, Watamu and Malindi.

As a result much useful information had been gleaned on the most effective Control techniques.

At Mombasa past crow control attempts had been sporadic as a result of which the crow

problem had persisted.

'They are often seen in huge flocks as the birds fly to and from their communal roosting sites'.

Said the Skål Chairman, 'crows negatively impact upon all of us with hotels, restaurants, farmers, airports, airlines, hospitals,

waste disposal, food stalls and shop owners being particularly affected.'

He made it clear that 'the program- me will be conducted with the agreement of the Kenya Wildlife Service in a humane manner and with the approval of animal rights interest groups'.

He went on to reveal that Skål has incorporated in its 'ANGAMIZA KUNGURU' programme the North Coast Ratepayers Association, Kenya

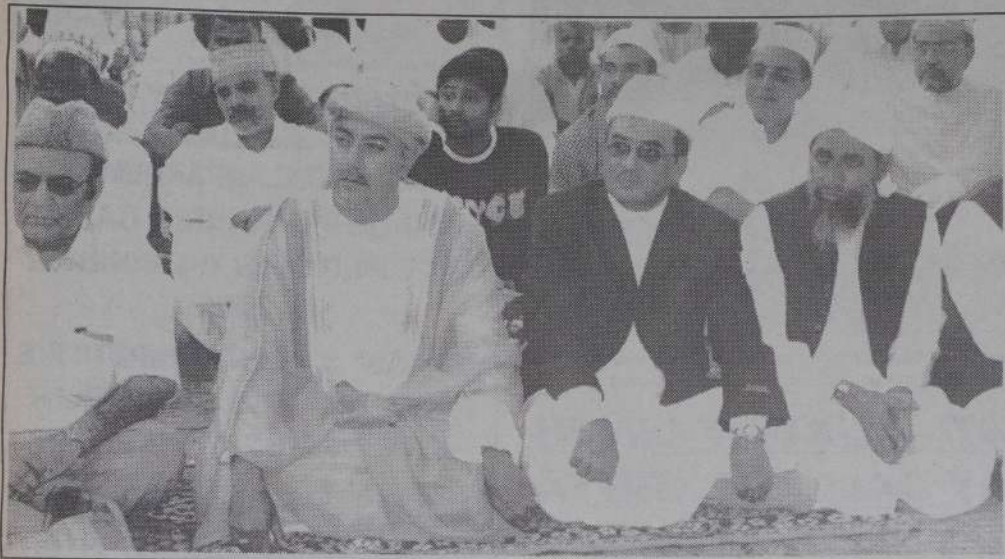

Twenty Five Years' Ago

Coastweek, November 23 - 29, 1979:

Pollmans Tours and Safaris anticipated one of the best 'high' tourist season Kenya had ever experienced.

The company planned an aircraft seat capacity of 16,000 during the October-April season, while they were looking after the ground arrangements of some 400,000 holidaymakers between November 1979 and October 1980.

Pollmans' Managing Director Dimitri Peltoko commented that "it is now virtually impossible to bring more TUI clients during the 'high' season because of the shortage of hotel beds".

Mombasa Accountant Wilson Peter Kenga won the top prize of Shs. 100,000/= on a three shilling Kenya Charity Sweepstake ticket.

Tanzania Harbours Authority launched an ambitious 1.3 billion shilling programme, financed by the World Bank, Britain and the Norwegian Agency of International Development, to modernise its ports over a span of four years and would cover Dar es Salaam, Kilwa, Lindi and Mafia ports.

The flour shortage in Mombasa had worsened and no bread was available as long queues were seen outside most bakeries in the town.

Mombasa's Ampees Shipping Agency announced a new shipping line, West European Container Lines (WEC Lines), offering a full cellular direct container service between Mombasa-U.K.-Continent.

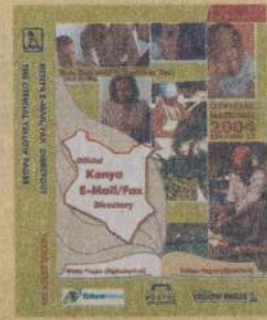

Prof. Wangari Maathai: Ironical That It Needed International Community To Recognise Her Significance And Contribution

We join in with the rest of Kenya wananchi in lauding Prof. Wangari Maathai on being awarded the Nobel Peace prize this year.

We associate with her role in mobilising support for the protection of indigenous forests and drives with numerous groups to increase tree planting.

JAMES ASHE

1925-2004: OBITUARY

It was with sadness that we learned of the death of James Ashe in Watamu.

Born in Cyprus he was educated partly in Cyprus and partly in England, leaving school at 17 to join the Parachute Regiment in the 2nd World War.

In 1947 he trained as a mining engineer.

He only went where animals were interesting, working for a year in Peru, leaving in a boat down the Amazon.

In Kenya he built a private snake park and became curator of the Herpetology Dept at the National Museum.

He spent some time in USA

running safari parks and then went to Oxford to work on water bugs but returned to Kenya in 1980 to run BIO-KEN snake farm at Watamu.

He gave snake shows at the tourist hotels and one could never forget his Spitting Cobra routine, getting the snake to aim at the drawing pins on the sole of his shoe.

He was a wonderful conversationalist, very witty and knowledgeable.

To hear him and the late Barbara Simpson converse was something not to be missed.

Great adversaries in some ways but dear friends and deeply respectful of one another.

My last time to see him was May this year in his office at the farm.

He was obviously not so well but this did not stop him giving me a scintillating half hour of sparkling anecdotal conversation, something hard to come by these days.

His memorial service was simple and spoke realms of the man he was.

Afterwards a hole in the ground at the farm, surrounded by flowers into which Zanda, his wife, dropped his ashes before planting his favourite Baobab tree on top.

While the Giriama people sang their good byes and all his friends looked on.

28th September COLIN JACKSON "Watamu/ Malindi Crow Control Programme".

House Crows that dominate the Mombasa area with their never-ending cawing.

Not to mention their intimidation of the indigenous birds to the point of them being practically non-existent.

Not to have to hear or see the crows would indeed be bliss for Mombasa residents and to hear that this has been achieved in Malindi and Watamu has encouraged a group of people to engage the services of Tony Archer, a latter day "Pied Piper" of crows.

I understand that a programme of possible elimination (or at least a decimation) is under way.

FFJ is very happy to provide a forum for this kind of conservation awareness and we heartily thank Colin Jackson for his excellent talk and slides which enthused and encouraged Mombasa residents to make the effort to try to rid our City of this non-indigenous menace. (MR)

2nd October: Visit to Rabal Community Museum

On 2nd October 10 members and 3 guests made their way up the treacherous hill to Mazeras and turned right onto the much better road to Rabal.

Johan Krapf, who moved here after losing his family in Mombasa, built the first church in Kenya here in 1846.

He was German born and worked for the UK based Church Missionary Society.

In 1897 a 'new' church, St Paul's, was built.

The old church now houses the Krapf Memorial Museum.

We were welcomed by George who showed us around the museum and told us about Krapf's life.

The museum is small, but informative both about the formation of the Church in Kenya and about the local Warabai Mijikenda tribe and their customs.

We walked around the village area, and saw Krapf's original house, which has a view of the sea, and the small graveyard and tombstones.

We then visited the new church, and were fascinated by its construction.

Cast iron trusses support the roof, and the pews have cast iron legs and ends.

There is an old piano with a folding keyboard, although the font and pulpit are modern replacements.

The church is in the most wonderful position, at the top of the hill, and despite a corrugated iron roof, was deliciously cool inside thanks to large windows and doors and a good through draught.

Unfortunately modern security issues mean that all the doors and windows are being fitted with wrought iron security grilles, which rather spoils the serene atmosphere.

We had a picnic tea in the shade of the church and were provided with madafu by our guide George.

It was a lovely day out and a recommended excursion when the heat of Mombasa's summer gets to you. (AA)

16th October: BIRD WALK.

It was hoped to find water in the ponds because of the rain but sadly there was very little.

The small pond on the way up to the Hussein Car Track did have two magnificent Kingfishers, Malachite (a pair) and Mangrove. Water Diklops, Three Banded Plover and a Black Crane were the only other water birds but there was a lot of

Weaver activity in the trees.

The Car Track yielded another 22 species, including a Red Tailed Shrike, which seemed to have lost most of its tail on migration, and a beautiful Allen's Gallinule at the pond.

We had hoped to see more migrants and indeed there were Barn Swallows and several waders two of which were Wood Sandpipers and one Common Sandpiper.

Others, which may or may not have been Wood Sandpipers, were hard to identify as they were straight in the path of the setting sun.

Disappointingly no Wheatears! Better luck next time!

Ngilu At N.S.H.I.S. Whitesands Workshop

Studies have shown that social health insurance is the best approach to achieving the broader objective of improving healthcare delivery, the Minister for Health Charity Ngilu has revealed.

Speaking during National Social Health Insurance Scheme (N.S.H.I.S.) workshop for members of parliament at Whitesands Beach Hotel over the weekend, the minister said this mode of healthcare delivery had been tested and implemented successfully in countries like South Africa, South Asia and Germany, he writes **ANDREW KILONZI**.

Ngilu explained that this scheme had been recommended as the best health financing system after various health financing options.

She noted that the national hospital insurance fund which has 40 years experience in providing in-patient health care insurance cover for over 30 percent of Kenyan has been bearing itself in readiness for the implementation of this new scheme.

The minister noted that different mechanisms had been used to finance the health care system with little success since independence.

She added that health services in the country has over the years experienced under-funding which has had far reaching negative repercussions to low quality of health care services and lack of access to majority of Kenyans.

The minister said good quality private health care services are only available to about 300,000 Kenyans of means.

With 56 percent of Kenyans living below the poverty line of whom 30 percent are absolutely poor, the desire to have a system that will address the question of quality and equity in the provision of health care is evident.

The minister of health has over the year finance health care, evolved health policy and regulated health services.

The scheme aims at financing curative health care leaving the ministry to concentrate on policy, regulation and preventive services thereby developing a system that will serve everybody, including the poor.

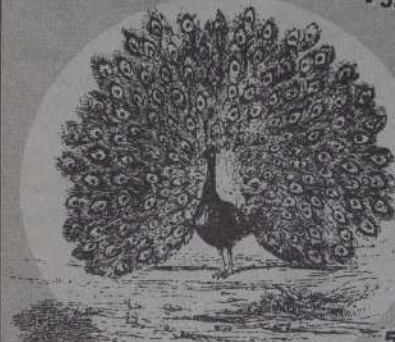

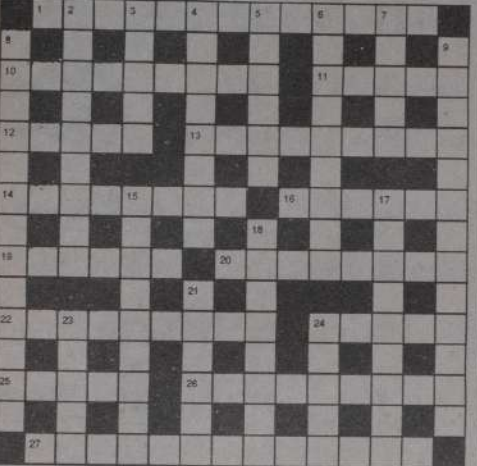

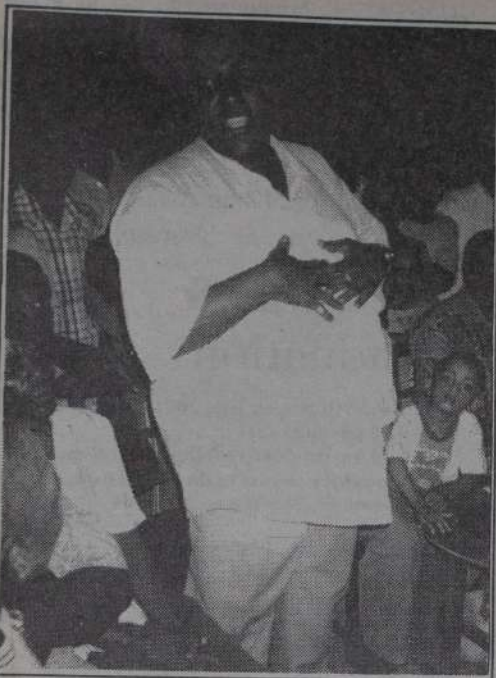

Last year when Wallace was five years old, he competed in the six years age group category and managed to scope a First Place Overall Trophy despite competing with older swimmers.

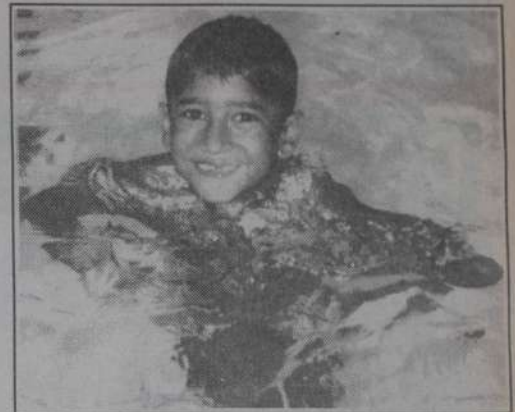
And this year when he took part in the same competition, his results were just amazing.

The 'Container' - And General Considerations For Safe Carriage

In this last but one week on roads will be looking at another common type of load on Kenyan roads, namely the container and general considerations for safe carriage of these and also a brief look at the carriage of large engineering plant.

The term 'container' is used to describe both a box type construction and an open frame structure enclosing the load or tank and which may in either case be lifted off the vehicle as a single unit comprising container and load.

The majority of containers in use are constructed to International standards.

A common feature in the construction of these containers is that specially designed corner castings are incorporated which can be used in conjunction with twist locks fitted on the vehicle to provide a simple and positive means of restraint.

A minimum of four used for each container carried. Provided that the twist locks are fully engaged and locked in position, the container will be adequately secured and no further restraint will be necessary.

However, a transporter will be confronted with a number of problems when attempting to carry a container on a vehicle not equipped with twist locks.

Unlike normal box type loads that spread their weight over a large area, containers are designed to stand on the twist lock sockets or feet that protrude down at each corner.

With heavy containers this reduces high point loading that could over-stress a normal platform floor.

If a container is carried on a vehicle not fitted with twist locks, a retention system must be used that fulfils the ensures that the load will stay in contact with load platform and not move at all during carriage.

The system should also be tied to the chassis of the vehicle at the appropriate points provided by the vehicle manufacturer.

Where containers are used to carry bulk liquid containers they are often carried partially full.

This can lead to movement of the load during changes in the vehicle's direction, causing conditions that could lead to instability.

The use of stepframe semi-trailers, specifically for the carriage of bulk liquid containers is recommended.

These trailers have low mounted twist locks, reducing



the combined centre of gravity of the vehicle.

Where containers do not have the ISO type corner castings they may be fitted with special attachment brackets or lashing rings.

Safe methods for securing these containers will therefore vary according to the type being transported.

Containers should not project beyond the rear or sides of the vehicle loading platform because permanent distortion of the container may take place if part of its base is left unsupported.

Incorrect loading of the contents of a container may result in dangerous situations occurring when the container is handled or transported which could adversely affect the stability of the vehicle.

In addition serious damage may be caused to the goods carried.

In many instances the driver will have no control over the packing of a container nor be able to inspect its contents when he accepts it for carriage.

If it is apparent that the container has not been safely loaded then it should not be accepted.

We now turn briefly to engineering plant.

They are generally either

tracked or wheeled.

We will cover only the transportation of engineering plant by vehicles constructed to comply fully with laws in the country.

It is also expected that manufacturers of such plant equipment normally fit lashing points or provide a recommended lashing scheme for each of their vehicles.

Heavy engineering plant is normally transported on purpose built vehicles which are specifically designed to provide easy loading and unloading facilities and are usually provided with adequate anchorage points for attaching the lashings.

Lighter engineering plant may in some circumstances be carried on general-purpose vehicles.

However, in these cases the method used to secure the load should provide equal security to that obtained by using purpose built vehicles.

High loads may endanger bridges etc. over roads, so when these are carried it is essential that the driver know the exact weight of the load and also the

width of the load at that height.

Loads with a high centre of gravity can seriously affect the vehicle's stability and such items of engineering plant should only be transported on vehicles with a low platform height.

Wheeled or tracked vehicles must be lashed down in position on the carrying vehicle, with the parking brake applied.

The effectiveness of the parking brake on its own will be limited by the frictional resistance between the vehicle and the deck of the carrying vehicle.

PIGGY BACK

Sometimes transporters want to carry vehicles in "piggy back" fashion to minimize operating costs.

When this mode of transport is desired, such vehicles and trailers should be carried on other vehicles that are suitable for that purpose.

The vehicle or trailer should be carried with the parking brake 'on', preferably with the wheels chocked, and (where applicable) the transmission in neutral.

The vehicle or trailer being carried should be positioned so that its weight is fully supported

by the carrying vehicle.

If necessary spreader plates should be used to avoid high localized loading e.g. by the landing legs of a semi-trailer.

The restraint provided by the friction between the tyres and the deck with the parking brake on will not be sufficient to prevent movement.

The vehicle or trailer being carried should be lashed to the carrying vehicle.

The carriage of laden vehicles is not recommended but if this is necessary then extra attention should be paid to the resultant higher centre of gravity of the carrying vehicle and the possible consequential loss of stability when cornering or braking.

If more than one trailer is carried in 'piggyback' fashion then each trailer should be lashed to the one on which it rests and then all those carried should be lashed to the carrying vehicle.

All loose equipment on the vehicles or trailers being carried and on the carrying vehicle should be securely stowed.

As Kachumbari says, come containers, plant and trucks, the rules of the game are the same.
