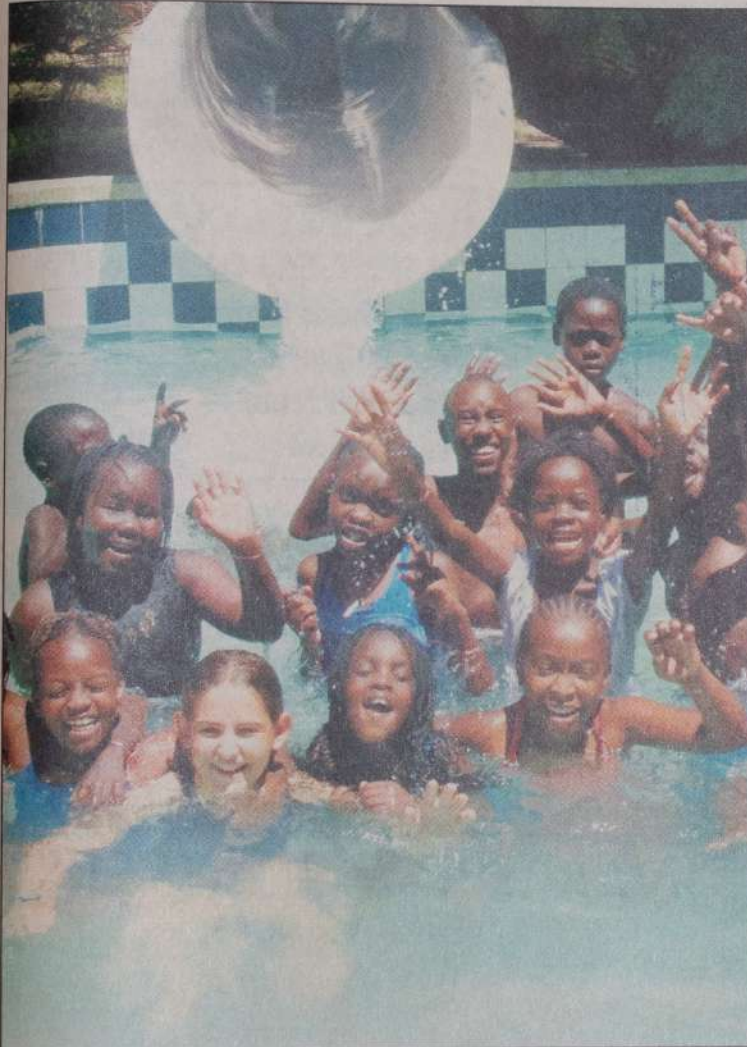

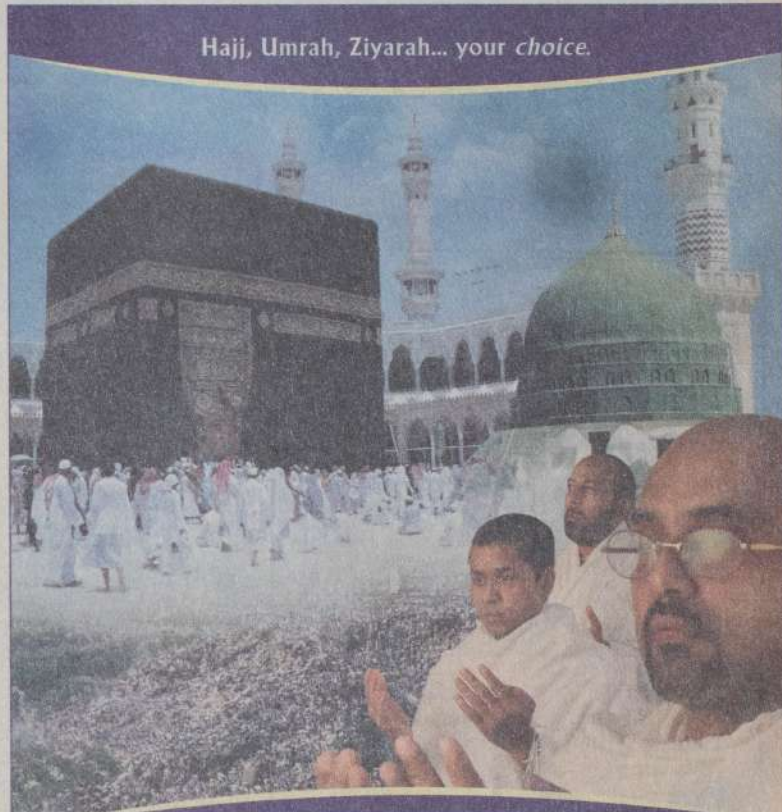

It's A Fact: Indonesian Voyagers Were, In A Sense, Africa's Vikings

"Phantom Voyagers: Evidence of Indonesian Settlement in Africa in Ancient Times"

By Robert Dick-Read

The Book: "The Phantom Voyagers" is about Indonesian mariners who came to Africa and Madagascar long before Europeans knew anything of Africa beyond the Sahara, and long before Arabs and Shirazis sailed down the African coast in their dhows to found exotic cities such as Kilwa, Lamu and Zanzibar.

We know that many years ago Indonesian mariners peopled the island of Madagascar.

But we do not know with certainty who these Indonesians were, where they came from, or even why they came.

What this book makes clear is that, though they left no written records, the Indonesian legacy on the mainland of Africa is far greater than generally recognised.

For beneath the surface of the Africa we know today, the footprints and fingerprints of those phantom voyagers are legion.

Why is "The Phantom Voyagers" important?

If the History of Britain had been written without any mention of the Vikings we would have a grossly distorted picture of the truth.

Many aspects of the Britain's ancient culture introduced by Scandinavians would have been incorrectly attributed to 'British genius'.

The Indonesian voyagers were, in a sense, Africa's Vikings.

They brought with them important new plants, music, arts, technologies, diseases, methods of divination, and other lasting facets of culture that subsequently became absorbed into the African way of life.

It would be fair to say that without the input of Indonesians in ancient times, sub-Saharan Africa would be a very different place today.

It is doubtful, for instance, whether we would have such marvellous African icons as The Great Zimbabwe, or the famous bronzes of Benin, or whether Zanzibar and Tanzania would have been so named.

What do the 'experts' say?

For reasons best known to themselves (because detailed proof is illusive?) the influence of Indonesians in Africa is a subject that academics have studiously avoided, and thus tend to greet with scepticism.

Many views expressed in "The Phantom Voyagers" will therefore fly in the face of established African history teaching.

But early drafts of the manuscript of "The Phantom Voyagers" have met with the approval of two authoritative historians: Dr Roland Oliver, Emeritus Professor of African History, School of Oriental and African Studies, and founder of The Journal of African History, wrote:

Discussions were inconclusive, but - convinced that Indonesian penetration of Africa had once been far greater than was generally realised - the author continued his researches privately.

Robert Dick-Read's interest in African culture dates back to his first visit to South Africa, where Zulu design and Chopi music left strong impressions.

Subsequently he became more deeply involved in the world of African arts and crafts, at first commercially, then later setting up a museum for the Nigerian government in Bamenda (now in the Republic of Cameroon), and making educational films in the Sudan and Egypt.

In 1954 he published a travel book - "Sanam: Adventures in Search of African Art" (Rupert Hart Davis in London; Duttons in the USA), relating his travels through many parts of Africa.

He also made two television films in Ethiopia for David Attenborough's "Adventure" series in the early 1960s.

In 1963 he married and decamped to the British Virgin Islands where he and his family lived for 25 years before returning to England early in 1989.

MOST 'MISUNDERSTOOD WORDS' ON THE INTERNET!

Here are the ten terms that we believe are currently the "most misunderstood" by those who work in information technology.

acronym: An acronym is not any abbreviation, just one that forms a "sayable" word.

Apart from that confusion, acronyms and other abbreviations cause confusion any time a reader is likely not to know what the spelled-out version is.

One *Whatis* reader said he was especially confused by "acronyms within acronyms" and cited the example of SAX (Simple API for XML).

An acronym (pronounced AK-ruh-nim, from Greek *acro-* in the sense of extreme or tip and *onyma* or name) is an abbreviation of several words in such a way that the abbreviation itself forms a word.

According to Webster's, the word doesn't have to already exist; it can be a new word.

Webster's cites "snafu" and "radar", two terms of World War Two vintage, as examples.

Implicit is the idea that the new word has to be pronounceable

and ideally easy to remember.

Frequently, acronyms are formed that use existing words (and sometimes the acronym is invented first and the phrase name represented is designed to fit the acronym).

Here are some examples of acronyms that use existing words:

BASIC - Beginner's All-Purpose Symbolic Instruction Code;

NOW - National Organization for Women;

WHO - World Health Organization Abbreviations that use the first letter of each word in a phrase are sometimes referred to as initialisms.

Initialisms can be but are not always acronyms.

KBC, KTN, CNN, IBM, and NBC are initialisms that are not acronyms.

Many acronym lists you'll see are really lists of acronyms and initialisms or just lists of abbreviations. (Note that abbreviations include shortened words like "esp" for "especially" as well as shortened phrases.)

Summing up: An *abbreviation* is a shortening of a word or a phrase; An *acronym* is an abbreviation that forms a word; An *initialism* is an abbreviation that uses the first letter of each word in the phrase (thus, some but not all initialisms are acronyms). By the way, an acronym so familiar that no one remembers what it stands for is called an *anacronym*.

ASP - Active Server Page or application service provider (ASP) - which is it?

These are both frequently-used abbreviations in many development shops.

An Active Server Page (ASP) is an HTML page that includes one or more scripts (small embedded programs) that are processed on a Microsoft Web server before the page is sent to the user.

An ASP is somewhat similar to a server-side include or a common gateway interface (CGI) application in that all involve programs that run on the server, usually tailoring a page for the user.

Typically, the script in the Web page at the server uses input received as the result of the user's request for the page to access data from a database and then builds or customizes the page on the fly before sending it to the requester.

ASP is a feature of the Microsoft Internet Information Server (IIS), but, since the server-side script is just building a regular HTML page, it can be delivered to almost any browser.

You can create an ASP file by including a script written in VBScript or JavaScript in an HTML file or by using ActiveX Data Objects (ADOs) program statements in the HTML file.

You name the HTML file with the ".asp" file suffix.

Microsoft recommends the use of the server-side ASP rather than a client-side script, where there is actually a choice, because the server-side script will result in an easily displayable HTML page.

Client-side scripts (for example, with JavaScript) may not work as intended on older browsers.

For Web service applications, Microsoft provides a new version

of ASP support called ASP.NET.

ASP is also an abbreviation for application service provider:

An application service provider (ASP) is a company that offers individuals or enterprises access over the Internet to applications and related services that would otherwise have to be located in their own personal or enterprise computers.

Sometimes referred to as "apps-on-tap," ASP services are expected to become an important alternative, not only for smaller companies with low budgets for information technology, but also for larger companies as a form of outsourcing and for many services for individuals as well.

Early applications include: remote access serving for the users of an enterprise - An off-premises local area network to which mobile users can be connected, with a common file server.

Specialized applications that would be expensive to install and maintain within your own company or on your own computer. Hewlett-Packard, SAP, and Qwest have formed one of the first major alliances for providing ASP services.

They plan to make SAP's popular R/3 applications available at "cybercenters" that will serve the applications to other companies.

Microsoft is allowing some companies to offer its BackOffice products, including SQL Server, Exchange and Windows NT Server on a rental, pay-as-you-use basis.

While ASPs are forecast to provide applications and services to small enterprises and individuals on a pay-per-use or yearly license basis, larger corporations are essentially providing their own ASP service in-house, moving applications off personal computers and putting them on a special kind of application server that is designed to handle the stripped-down kind of thin client workstation.

This allows an enterprise to reassert the central control over application cost and usage that corporations formerly had in the period prior to the advent of the PC.

Microsoft's terminal server product and Citrix's WinFrame products are leading thin-client application server products.

Private Sector Study Environmental Management And Co-Ordination Act

An important three-day Private Sector Training Workshop has been hosted at Mombasa's Lotus Hotel enabling 50 participants to study Kenya's Environmental Management and Co-Ordination Act 1999 and to understand the urgent need for environment improvement activities throughout the country.

It was organised and co-ordinated by the pro-active Mombasa based **Environment Trust of Kenya**.

Explained its Chairman, Mr. Z.K Nderu in his Closing Speech 'we felt it important for the private sector to study and to prepare for effective public participation in environmental management in their own environment.'

We want industries to put in place environmental management systems in their establishments.

This will in the long run benefit them through reduced operational costs and will protect and conserve the environment.

He continued 'we want business organisations to help save the environment by dispensing with the use of plastic and nylon bags and other non-biodegradable materials, and for individuals, families, schools to assume the responsibility of caring for the environment in which we live.'

A major problem for practically all local authorities, including Mombasa, is that of industrial and household solid waste and refuse management.

Said the ETK Chairman 'a timely decision must be taken to

either make garbage privatisation public policy or adequately empower local authorities to deal with solid waste and garbage, including adopting a 'waste to fertiliser' system of solid wastedisposal'.

Here he noted that in the privatisation of solid waste and garbage it must be remembered that around 80 per cent of the population might not have the ability to pay.

The Training Workshop was sponsored by **Action Aid Kenya**, with the lead consultant being **Dr. George Wamukoya of World Wildlife Fund (WWF)**, Nairobi.

It targeted professionals in leading positions of middle level management from the private sector within Mombasa District.

It was opened by **Dr. Mwandito** on behalf of **Professor Juma Lugogo**, Managing Director, **Coast Development Authority**, and closed by **James Odino**, Senior Deputy Director, Ministry of the Environment and Natural Resources, at Bandari College.

Said Mr. Odino, when reading the speech of his Minister, **Stephen Kalonzo Musyoka** 'the Environmental Management and Co-Ordination Act (EMCA) entitles every person to a clean and healthy environment, but also requires every individual to safeguard and enhance the environment.'

To ensure the harmonisation of environmental conservation efforts, the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA) is charged with the task of co-ordinating the various environmental management activities being undertaken by lead agencies.

The Authority is, however, expected to execute its mandate in consultation with the relevant lead agencies.'

He mentioned that 'EMCA also mandates NEMA to work with lead agencies and private sector organisations to ensure that their

development plans, policies and projects incorporate environmental issues.

In order to co-ordinate a national effort to manage the environment, the development of strong linkages between lead agencies and NEMA is critical.

To date, EMCA remains the only framework environmental law in Kenya.

The nine Facilitators at the Private Sector Training Workshop included distinguished lawyers and scientists in Kenya and there were eleven Resource persons who included Mrs. **Jael Ludeki**, Director, Centre for Research in Environmental Law (CREEL); Mrs **G. Mbugua**, Programme Officer, Forest Action Network (FAN) and Mr. **B. Aloo Omondi**, Provincial Director of Environment (NEMA).

Participants came up with 'Project Ideas' and asked if there might be a funder willing to assist.

Suggested projects include:

- Publish Children's environmental magazines;
- Establish an environmental resource information centre in Mombasa
- Mount an annual exhibition at the museums (mobile)
- Commercialise garbage collection
- Establish community botanical gardens
- Establish tree nurseries

These training workshops are part of ETK's environmental rights initiative in the whole of the coast province.

Other workshops are targeted for Lamu, Kwale, Malindi, Tana River, Kilifi, Taita-Taveta.

Their main purpose is for coastal citizens to know their rights 'under the Environmental Management and Co-Ordination Act 1999 since ignorance is no defence in law.'

Declared the ETK Chairman, Mr. Nderu, 'citizens have to know that they have a 'locus standi' in sustainable environmental conservation.'

Due to the amount of telephone call from the general public and tourists asking us to intervene on the issue of indigenous wild animals being kept as pets, which is contrary to the Wildlife Act of Kenya, and the Cruelty to Animals Act due to the poor manner in which they are being kept, KSPCA would like to inform those who have asked us to intervene, that unfortunately due to the inexcusable non-cooperation of some key officials, we are unable to alleviate the plight of the bush babies and illegal parrots in question.

Somehow, again, in contravention of the Wildlife Act, some people are being issued with permits to keep the said indigenous wildlife and Cites protected parrots.

This is encouraging the trade and suffering of both wildlife indigenous to this country and to parrots, which are smuggled into this country in horrific circumstances, KSPCA has spent a considerable amount of time, effort and money trying to deal with this issue.

Some of the KWS officers in Mombasa have been extremely helpful but unfortunately, due to a few individuals, their efforts and ours are being hampered, meanwhile, the suffering of the animals continues unabated.

We want your support and ask for your patience as we hope that in the near future efforts to sort out problems within KWS will bear fruit and we will be able to assist those animals which need our help.

Please do not lose faith in us.

We wish to assure you that we will continue to receive your calls and we will try to do what we can to help.

We pass our thanks to those officers of KWS who are dedicated to wildlife preservation.

You have our complete support.

We also thank Colobus Trust, Colin and Sharon Forbes of Kiji Cottages and Kerstin Handelmann for their assistance in rehabilitating monkeys back into wild habitat.

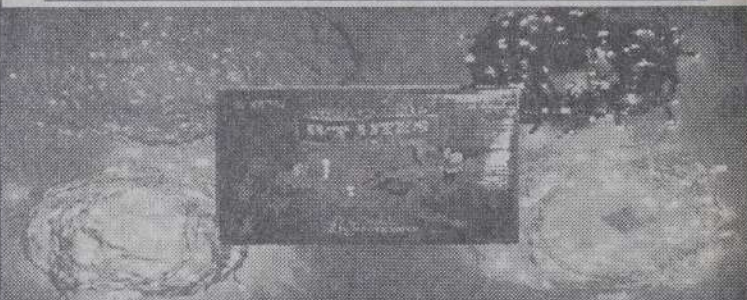

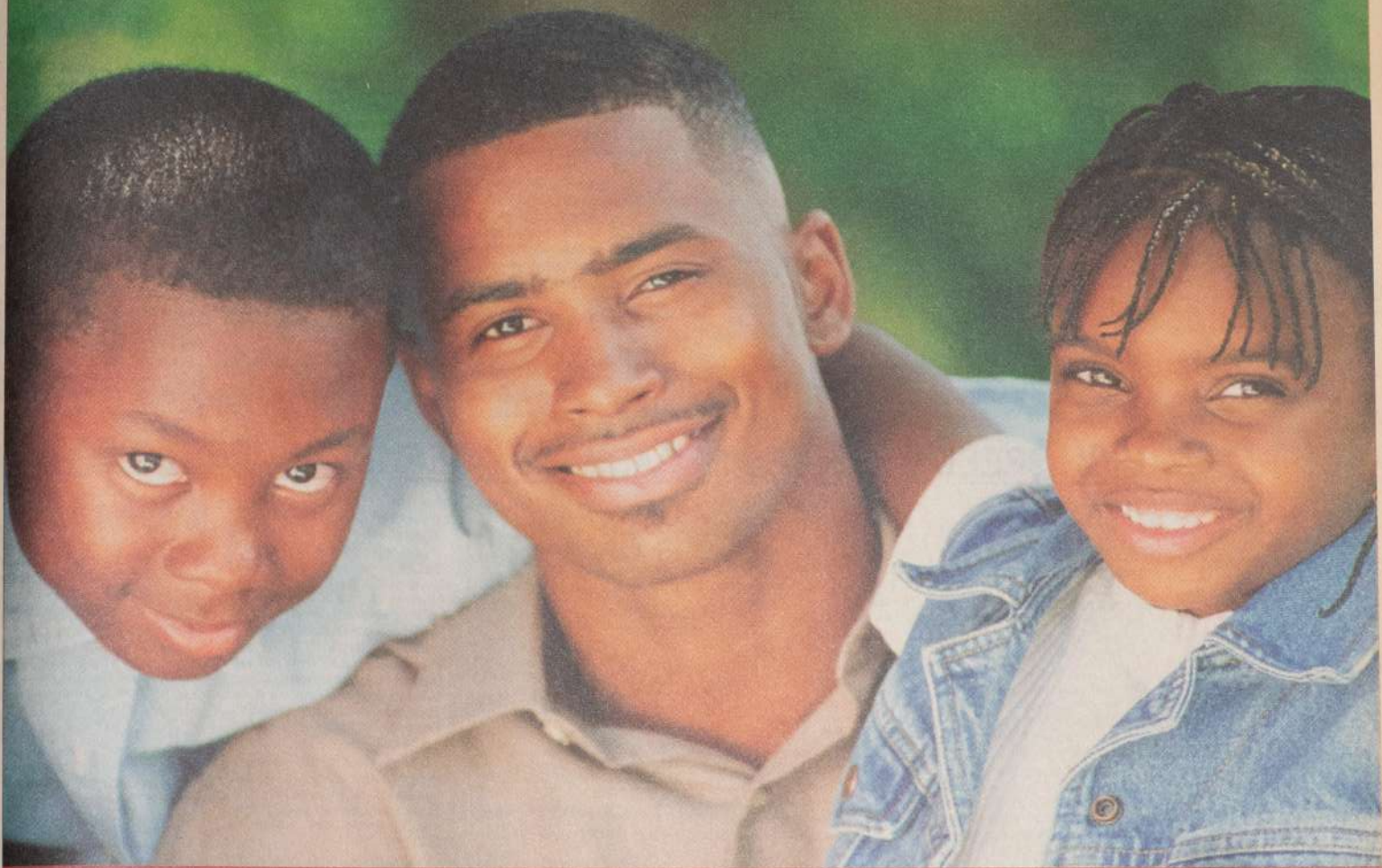

After imparting the sad news that the number of clubs worldwide is declining, the Chairman of *Skål International Kenya Coast* *Mohammed Hersi*, on declaring 'this will not happen here' then introduced a new member, *Larz Schulten*, Resident Manager, *Neckermann*, amid thunderous applause.

He then spoke of the club's impressive *Crow Eradication* programme '*Angamiza Kunguru*' and revealed that so far the response to appeals for financial support had been 'very good'.

The project is expected to run for some four or five years.

For 'Phase One' alone around K. Shs. 300,000- is needed and *Skål* leagues, tour firms, airlines, travel agents, hotels, restaurants, ratepayers association

have all been asked to assist. In this, *Skål* has sought the guidance of *Tony Archer*, a highly experienced crow control expert.

The programme is being conducted in a very humane manner, with the approval of the *Kenya Wild Life Service* and animal rights interest groups. It swings into action on December 15 at a time when the Indian House Crow begins to nest.

School children are among those being encouraged to assist and for every chick collected Shs 20/- will be paid at centres in Nyali, Bamburi and Shanzu. This particular crow is not only a public nuisance but a health hazard.

Referring to the re-location of beach operators which was

supposed to have become effective on 1st December, 2004, the Chairman said 'as this was not possible for a number of reasons 'brainstorming' meetings are presently taking place with all concerned to find a temporary alternative'.

He told *Skål* leagues 'we are considering putting registered beach operators into designated areas of the Beach from where they can sell their wares.

TOURIST POLICE

No longer will any trader be allowed to roam around pestering visitors.

The *Kenya Wildlife Service and Tourist Police Unit* will deal with those doing so.

He said that it was many years ago that the tourist industry and government had become concerned about the number of tourists not returning to Kenya because of constant harassment on the beach.

So the *Beach Operators Relocation Trust* was formed to put registered beach operators into tourist markets it would

provide off the beach. Unfortunately, the money needed was never forthcoming and the availability of land in many areas was also a problem.

However, at Malindi some had built their own stalls, according to Council specifications, on land made available off the beach.

Beach Operators themselves appreciate the need for this move so that tourism can flourish from which all will benefit.

The Chairman went on to speak of the need for security to be improved so that the much needed investor confidence might return.

He suggested that stakeholders might become more vociferous in their demands if they want to get anywhere.

He continued by bemoaning the fact that South Africa will be hosting the next *Safari Rally* and not Kenya.

Declaring 'it is something that belongs to Kenya so let us make sure it comes back'.

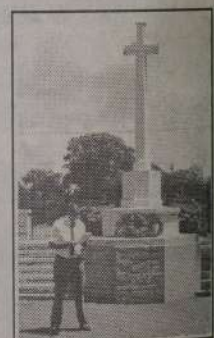
REMEMBRANCE DAY AT MBARAKI CEMETERY

Friendly Giraffe Are Highlight Of A Fascinating Visit To The New Nguuni Nature Sanctuary

'It is 'absolutely enchanting' declared some thirty holiday-makers from Switzerland and Germany on their first visit to Nguuni Nature Sanctuary.

The sanctuary is the latest development by the world famous Ecologist, Dr. Rene Haller, who has received many prestigious awards and honours for his work which includes the development of eco-tourism.

Born in Switzerland, it was Rene who developed a derelict quarry into the world renowned Bamburi Nature Sanctuary.

It was renamed 'Haller Park' in his honour.

He happened to mention to his good friend, Hans Blaser, Managing Director, Kedev Co. (Msa) Ltd, Bamburi, what he had been doing to 'create more green land for Mombasa'.

Nguuni is only about half-an-hour's drive from Mombasa and 15 minutes from Bamburi.

So Hans decided to take some friends along to see what had been happening there.

It is a small model of a National Park and has an interesting selection of wildlife, including eight giraffe, many watching the visitors as they sat around a camp fire enjoying a drink, some tasty 'bitings' and seeing the enormous sun sink.

At this 'Sundowner' they met Dr. Rene Haller who enthralled them all with tales about the work he is doing which includes the training of local people on how to improve their lives, one being through sustainable agriculture.

With so much poverty presently in the country this is so terribly important.

As dusk fell all were most impressed when the Attendant 'Sigilel' got word across to his animals that it was time to go.

In one big pack of over a hundred, with the tall giraffe in the centre, they departed en-masse as their visitors wished them 'kwaheri'.

It was yet another quite unbelievable happening.

Bewitched by the 'Sundowner' and the scenery, 23 accepted an invitation by Hans to dinner at the Aquamarine Restaurant where sitting family-style around one large table they enjoyed not only the haute-cuisine but a spectacular view over Mt Wapa Creek.

There was a big 'thank you' to Hans for such a wonderful and spectacular evening which they said they would remember forever.

It was from Switzerland and Germany that the first package holidaymakers started arriving on the Kenya coast any making a beeline for Malindi.

In those early days there were no flights there so they travelled in safari buses over bumpy, dusty, roads.

Despite this, Malindi soon became exceedingly popular.

Today, Kenya continues to receive many 'repeat' tourists from Germany and Switzerland who stay at hotels along the entire Kenya coast.

Dr. Rene Haller is presently extremely busy having recently been appointed Acting Chairman of the Kenya Wildlife Service.

He was unable to join them for dinner, but in an interview earlier at Nguuni Nature

Sanctuary did give more details about it.

Said Rene 'when I first discovered Nguuni around 1964/5 it was a holding station for cattle coming from the NFD.

'People had cut down all the trees and everything was eroded.

'We put sheep and acacia seeds in there.'

With a backdrop of the Nguuni Tatu Hills it has become a very lovely spot dotted with palms and crowned by leopard orchids and many other trees.

'A most important thing' said Rene, is that we have put in here eland, oryx, waterbuck, giraffe, ostrich - all the same original inhabitants we had at the Bamburi quarry.

There has been a population explosion so some of them are here. We had started there with 3 giraffe who increased to 15.

'NATURE WALK'

They began eating all the trees so seven were given a new home at Nguuni.

On August 23, the first baby giraffe was born there whom we have named 'Amani' So Nguuni now has eight giraffe.

As well, some 260 species of birds have been observed there including many migrants and rare species.

Bird Walks' are organised and a special two and half km. Bird Hide constructed becoming part of a 'Nature Walk'.

Champagne Breakfasts for early morning bird watchers, or a camp fire style BBQ at Sundown, can be organised.

A BBQ area can be set up but you have to provide your own food and drink.

People can go there at Sundown but it is better to come as a group as then you get a guide. There is also camel riding.

It is a very safe area as it is all fenced in.

This new Nature Sanctuary was made possible by Bamburi Leferge kindly leasing to the Baobab Trust approx. one hundred hectares of its mining reserve there.

It is for conservation and community projects by Baobab Trust in and around Nguuni Tatu with the help of neighbouring farmers.

Baobab Trust's vision is a world in which ecology and economy reinforce each other and the

environment is kept healthy through sustainable ways of agriculture and other income generating activities.

Many fear the possibility of National Parks not existing any more unless a solution is found as to how more local people can also benefit from them.

Dr. Rene Haller is helping do just that.

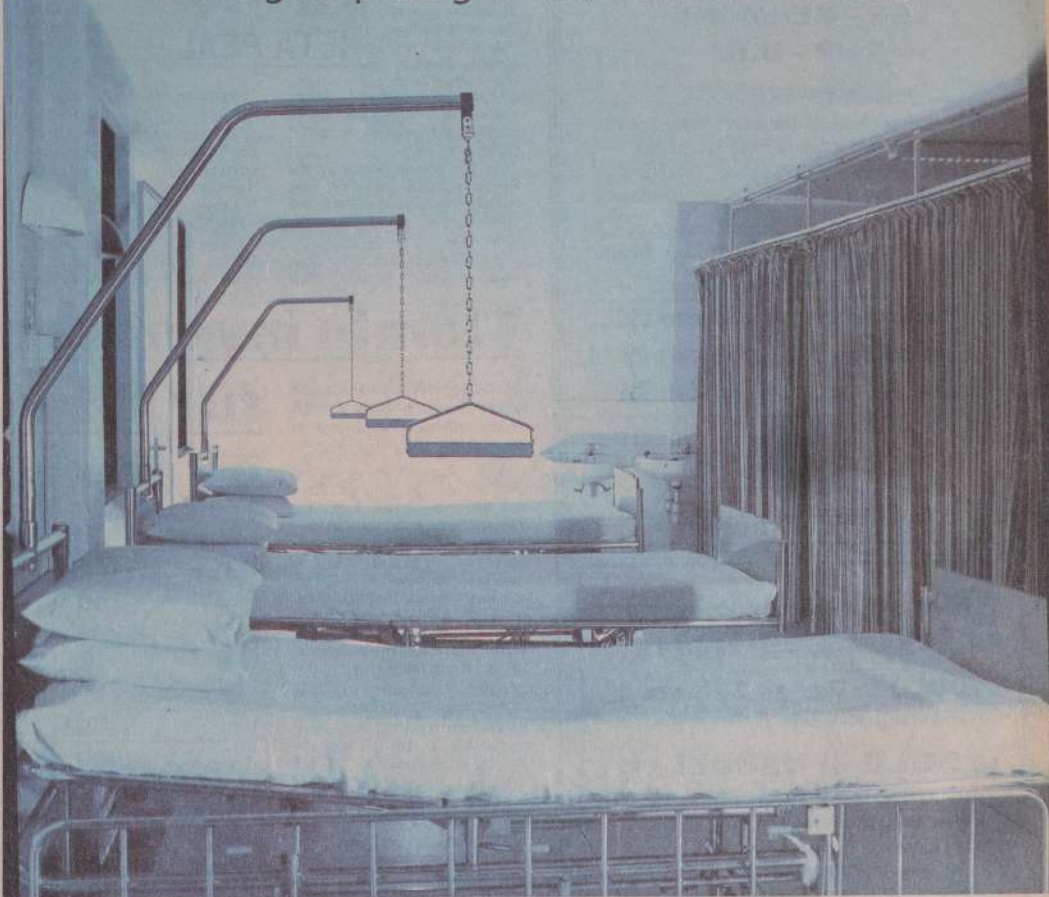

Buchungen aus Deutschland haben um 175 Prozent zugenommen!

EINE WICHTIGE Rolle in dem vorausgesagten Aufschwung des Tourismus in Kenia in dieser Wintersaison spielt **Thomas Cook** - der älteste Reiseveranstalter der Welt.

Obwohl die Firma einen englischen Namen hat, ist sie nun in deutschem Besitz und steht an zweiter Stelle in Europa und an dritter Stelle weltweit.

Das Geschäftsjahr, das im Oktober endete, konnte eine unglaubliche Zunahme der Buchungen für Keniareisen verzeichnen (mehr als doppelt soviel wie im vergangenen Jahr) mit einem Zuwachs von 175 Prozent allein aus Deutschland.

Obwohl der Tourismus in Kenia im Jahr 2003 allgemein stark zurückging, brachte **Thomas Cook** ständig Touristen hierher.

Dies wurde bekanntgegeben von **Stefanie Berk**, Vizepräsidentin, **International Hotel Contracting**, Deutschland, die sich auf einem einwöchigen offiziellen Besuch in Kenia befand.

In einem Interview im Mombasa Büro von **Abercrombie and Kent** erklärte sie, dass die Vorausbuchungen für die Wintersaison bereits um 50 Prozent zugenommen haben.

"Nachdem sich eine markante Zunahme von Touristenankünften bemerkbar macht, glauben wir, dass Kenia wirklich in Erwägung ziehen sollte, die Visumgebühren zu senken, die sehr hoch sind," sagte Frau Berk.

Die Tourismusindustrie hat die Regierung seit geraumer Zeit ersucht, die Visumgebühren um mindestens die Hälfte zu reduzieren.

Frau Berk schlug auch vor, dass ein Visum für ganz Ost-

afrika gelten sollte, denn viele europäische Touristen betrachten Ostafrika als ein gemeinsames Gebiet; alle drei Länder könnten davon profitieren.

Sie erwähnte ferner, dass die Touristen im allgemeinen Kenia lieben, aber viele sich beschweren, dass sie den Strand nicht ruhig genießen können, weil sie dauernd von "fliegenden Händlern" belästigt werden.

"Wir sind auch besorgt wegen der Sicherheit, denn wir lesen soviel über Diebstahl und Raubüberfälle, von denen auch Touristen betroffen waren," sagte Frau Berk.

Sie hörte, dass das **Tourist Police Unit** kürzlich 300 zusätzliche Polizisten rekrutiert

hat, die hauptsächlich an der Küste eingesetzt werden, dass die Tourismusverbände darauf dringen, die Sicherheitsmaßnahmen in ganz Kenia zu verstärken und dass die **Kenya Tourism Federation** ein Sicherheitssystem aufgebaut hat für Leute auf Safari.

"Was Werbung für Kenia betrifft, unternehmen wir viel; wir haben zusammen mit dem **Kenya Tourist Board (KTB)** Reisenessen durchgeführt," bemerkte Frau Berk.

Sie hofft, dass das **KTB** sein großes Programm, das anfangs dieses Jahres gemeinsam von der kenianischen Regierung und von der Europäischen Union finanziert wurde, weiterführen kann.

"Diese Werbekampagne ist überaus wichtig, wenn Kenia eine konkurrenzfähige Destination bleiben will."

"Andere Märkte werden erschlossen wie Ungarn und Polen; wir möchten mehr gemeinsame Werbung für Kenia sehen."

Thomas Cook gehört **Luthansa**, der deutschen nationalen Luftfahrtgesellschaft und **Karstadt**, einer Warenhauskette in Deutschland.

Letztere Firma besitzt zwei Gesellschaften, die eine ist **Neckermann**, die seit mehr als 40 Jahren Touristen nach Kenia bringt, die andere ist die bekannte Charterfluggesellschaft **Condor**.

Das Tourismusgeschäft wurde erweitert in andere Länder in Europa wie Frankreich und England und es wurde deshalb beschlossen, den Namen **Thomas Cook** zu führen.

"Im kontinentalen Europa sind unsere wichtigsten Märkte Deutschland, Holland und Belgien, wo wir marktführend sind," erklärte Frau Berk.

Auf die Frage, wie sie die Standards in Lodges und Hotels in Kenia beurteilt, antwortete sie:

"Die Lodges, die wir besuchten, sind O.K., die Strandhotels entsprechen jedoch nicht immer den internationalen Standards und einige benötigen Renovierungen und Verbesserungen."

Mehrere Hotels sind zur Zeit dabei zu renovieren, obwohl es ein schlechtes Jahr erlebt haben, und sie werden für die Wintersaison bereit sein.

Abschließend sagte Frau Berk:

"Wir sind glücklich, dass wir so gute Partner hier haben wie **Abercrombie and Kent**, die uns stets unterstützen, und Hotels wie **Neptune**, mit denen wir langjährige gute Beziehungen unterhalten, was sich immer sehr positiv ausgewirkt hat."

Tiomin investiert Kshs 1 Milliarde für Titanabbau in Kwale

TIOMIN KENYA hat im Juli einen Pachtvertrag für 14 Jahre mit der kenianischen Regierung unterzeichnet.

In der nächsten Phase ist der Bau der Anlage anfangs 2005 und die Produktion im Jahre 2006 vorgesehen, schreibt **Andrew Kilanzi**.

Vorher müssen jedoch zwischen den beiden Parteien die finanziellen Bedingungen, der Stromtarif und das gesamte Finanzierungspaket für den Aufbau dieses Projektes in Kwale abgeklärt werden.

Dieses Projekt wird direkt und indirekt von großem Nutzen sein. Es werden rund 750 Mitarbeiter eingestellt in der 20 Monate dauernden Aufbauphase.

Überdies werden 350 Festangestellte für den laufenden Betrieb benötigt.

Dies bedeutet rund Kshs 600-700 Millionen für Löhne und Vergütungen im Jahr für die lokalen Angestellten und Arbeiter.

Tiomin investiert Kshs 1 Milliarde für den 14 Jahre dauernden Abbau des Minerals und rechnet damit, während dieser Periode mehr als Kshs 60 Milliarden in Devisen einzunehmen.

Darüber hinaus wird **Tiomin** auf Verkäufe Lizenzgebühren von 2,5 Prozent an die Regierung bezahlen.

lokale Infrastruktur verbessert wird, vor allem Straßen und Gesundheitswesen, und die Arbeiter und Angestellten fachliche Ausbildung durch Training und Arbeitserfahrung vor Ort erhalten werden.

Wenn die Arbeiter und Angestellten mehr Geld zur Verfügung haben zum Ausgeben, gibt es automatisch mehr Arbeit für die lokale Bevölkerung.

Es werden unter anderem

zusätzliche Läden, Banken und Dienstleistungen benötigt.

Ein voll arbeitender Betrieb braucht eine ganze Reihe von Zulieferern und unterstützende Dienstleistungen von außen.

Titan ist das am vierthöchsten vorkommende Metall in der Erdkruste, aber ausreichende Mengen, um das Mineral in Konstruktion und Maschinenbau zu verwenden, wurden erst kürzlich entdeckt.

Die wirtschaftlich abbaubaren Minerale in den kenianischen Sandablagerungen sind Ilmenit, Rutil und Zirkon.

Ilmenit ist das am meisten vorkommende Mineral und wird für rund US Dollar 65 pro Tonne verkauft, während für Rutil gewöhnlich rund US Dollar 450 pro Tonne bezahlt wird.

Durchschnittlich werden jährlich 330.000 Tonnen Ilmenit, 77.000 t Rutil und 37.000 t Zirkon in den ersten sechs Jahren produziert.

Die Minerale werden gewonnen durch einen einfachen Prozess mit Gravitationsspiralen, wodurch das Konzentrat in die drei Mineralbestandteile ausgeschieden wird.

Titan ist ein widerstandsfähiges Leichtmetall, das Glas und Stahl ritzt.

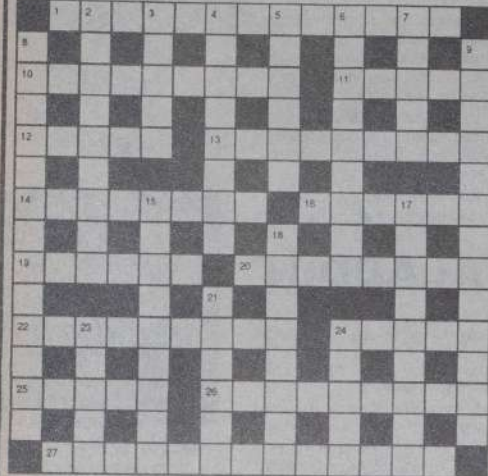

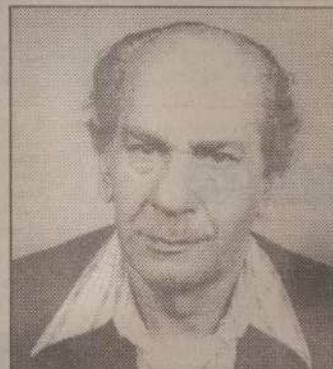

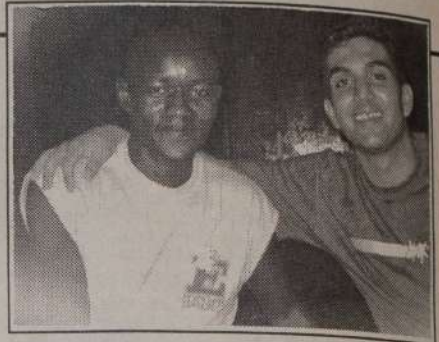

Almost Ten Per Cent Of Accidents Which Occur On Major Kenyan Roads Are Linked To Fatigue

As we approach the festive season (for most Kenyans that is), we will look at what we need to do to keep alive as motorists on the Kenyan roads.

While these ideas will be written for those who read Coastweek, we urge that those who have been through this reading share it with others as the more people who start thinking along the lines suggested, the more people there will be out there actively avoiding doing the wrong thing.

An accident more often than not involves more than one vehicle and if the other vehicle can be driving correctly then you, as the innocent participant in an accident would be saved.

It is not only our friends and relatives who would benefit from the tips but also our employees and those in whose hands we place our lives when we enter any vehicle including buses and taxis.

The first area that we will look at is that of fatigue.

About one fifth of the accidents that occur on the main highways in Kenya are caused by drivers who fall asleep at the wheel.

Almost ten per cent of all accidents that happen on the Kenyan roads are linked to fatigue in one way or another.

Moreover, sleep related vehicle accidents are more likely to result in serious injury or even death compared to the average road accident.

In order to understand fatigue one needs to understand that the body has its own clock.

A lot of research has gone into understanding how the body behaves in relation to the time of the day and also in relation to what we have been doing.

However, assuming that all factors are equal, the most dangerous time to drive is

between the hours of midnight and six in the morning.

It is at this time that one's body clock would normally be giving the signal to sleep.

That is irrespective of whether one has changed the sleep pattern or not.

It takes months for any change



of sleep pattern to have any effect. Even then, light on the eyes at any time is likely to reset the clock back to its original pattern which is for one to be awake when there is light and to fall asleep when there is darkness.

All living animals (apart from the nocturnal ones) live by the same rule and there is no reason that human beings will be any different.

The other time when the body gets into another sleep trough is between two and four o'clock in the afternoon.

This helps the body to recharge for the rest of the day.

It more often compounded by the fact that one has eaten or even worse had a drink.

Being in the heat of the day also adds to the woes of a driver at that time.

The drivers most at risk are men aged under thirty and also drivers of commercial vehicles.

This set is more likely to press on with a journey even when they are tired or the signs of sleep begin to come on.

The younger man feels that at youth is on their side and that they can cope.

The commercial driver is likely to be under pressure to deliver or even as simple as keeping the vehicle running as it is only when it is running that it is earning money.

Most drivers are aware of their sleepiness especially when they get to the point of trying to fight sleep. This is when we do things like opening windows so that the draught from the air could keep us awake.

Other things that people do that do not help anyway are things like turning the radio in the vehicle to maximum volume, pinching themselves, eating mints or other sharp tasting flavours and so forth.

The best things to do are to avoid driving at the hours when one is likely to fall asleep because of the body clock mechanism.

It is also advisable to stop for some fifteen minutes after every two hours of driving when on a long journey.

One should get out of the car and take a short walk around.

One could spend the time walking around the car to ensure that it is still in a good condition to continue the journey.

One of the key things to check every time one has the opportunity on a journey is that the vehicle is not making gurgling noises.

This would indicate that there is the likelihood of overheating or that the air-conditioning is on its last legs.

One should also check that the tyres are still properly inflated.

There is nothing worse than getting a slow puncture that stops you where the road has no shoulder for stopping on (and that is likely on most roads in Kenya).

Another thing one should do is to take a drink that has caffeine as this perks the body up.

Coffee is the most obvious one but tea also has a small amount hence one cup of coffee or many cups of tea could do the trick.

Another thing one could do is to actually stop and take a nap.

A short fifteen to twenty minute nap can be of great help when one is feeling drowsy behind the wheel.

It does not look macho for most people to be found asleep behind the wheel of a parked vehicle but that could be the one act that saves your life.

As Kachumbari says, we should not fight fatigue but rather
