'WIPE OUT TRIBALISM'

K.A.N.U. LEADERS SLATE CORRUPTION AND RACIAL DISCRIMINATION

COAST KANU leaders with National Executives, led by the National Chairman, Mr. Akiki Amayo, have held a highly successful seminar which was hosted at Bandari College, Mombasa, by the Mombasa District Kanu Office.

KANU is determined to completely wipe out tribalism, racial discrimination and corruption within communities living in Kenya.

Second Mtongwe Ferry

MOMBASA (KNA) Kenya Bus Services Mombasa Limited has purchased a new vessel from the Kenya Ports Authority to act as a second ferry, for the current single-boat service at the Island's Mtongwe crossing. Likoni ferry manager Mr Tande told Kenya News Agency that the new vessel cost Shs. 200,000— will carry up to 200 passengers and is expected to enter service within the next two months. The current ferry boat has a capacity for 150 passengers per trip. The new boat will greatly alleviate the problems of overcrowding and delays, and will be especially appreciated when the current boat stops work for regular servicing, he added.

Greek Ship Breaks Up Inside Mogadishu Port

SALVAGE hopes for *Ariadne*, the ill-fated Greek ship that went aground at the port of Mogadishu in August, sunk early this week when the vessel broke into four as salvage workers made further attempts to tow it to safer waters. Reports reaching Mombasa mid-week said that the broken hull was now submerging into the water and that chances of towing or partially salvaging the ship were nil.

Shipping sources said that some 160 containers had been salvaged from the wreck before it broke into four. 110 containers are believed to be destined for Mombasa while the rest bound for Tanzania.

The salvage work began when the 28,000-ton freighter registered in Panama went aground at the Mogadishu harbour while under tow, leading to a furious spillage of fuel oil and dangerous chemicals into the sea.

The ship first broke into two when salvage workers attempted to tow it. Another attempt this week caused further cracks on the ship, breaking it into four parts.

The incident occurred while the vessel was carrying some 4,000 tons of general cargo for Mombasa, the landlocked countries of Burundi and Rwanda, and Tanzania. She had already discharged 78 containers at the port of Mogadishu.

The ship was also carrying 2,000 tons of dangerous toxic cargo and 600 tons of fuel oil, discovered only after the ship broke down and one of the containers caught fire.

Fearing a "Bhopal tragedy", the Somali government evacuated about 500 residents from the nearby shores and asked

for US warships deployed in the Indian Ocean to stand by in the event of a major evacuation operation arising.

Somali authorities reported that fish were dying in the wake of the spillage that had engulfed the shores of Mogadishu.

The Somali government also despatched a delegation to London to seek help in combating the sea pollution occasioned from the wreck and a UNEP team has been in Mogadishu to assess the situation.

Muri International's salvage tugs *Bison* and *Barbara* and the landing craft *Citabel*, all based in Mombasa, were the first to arrive at the scene, and were soon joined by salvage teams from Smit International.

'PANIC IN PORT'

Reports say that the Mogadishu harbour is still operating normally, despite the panic that gripped the port after the incident.

International shipping lines, worried by the dangerous spillage, had earlier threatened to boycott the port of Mogadishu if the situation there was not contained.

Sources close to maritime salvage circles estimate the salvage work in Mogadishu to be in excess of 100,000 U.S. dollars.

Inaugural Mombasa Flight For 'Airbus'

KENYA AIRWAYS new airbus will make its maiden touch down at Mombasa's Moi International Airport on Sunday at 12.00 hrs, bringing a group of some 176 tourists from Rome.

This will be the first time the Kenya Airways has handled such a big group, made possible by the acquisition of the airbus this week on lease from Condor, a subsidiary of the Lufthansa airline.

The national flag carrier's first airbus landed at the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport on Tuesday and began operating between Nairobi and Europe yesterday.

It has a capacity for 202 passengers, including 12 passengers seats in the first class, 40 in the club section and 150 in the economy class.

The aircraft will have one arrival and one departure every week in Mombasa, arriving on Saturday from London, Rome, and Nairobi, and departing from Mombasa on Sunday to Nairobi, Rome and London.

The Kenya Airways plans to acquire its own two airbuses at a cost of Kshs. 1.6 billion next April.

CATERING for 28,000 acres of Game Sanctuary, containing 45 different species of mammals and over 385 species of birds is now the responsibility of Taita man, Mr. Phillip Mwasi, as the newly contracted Warden of Hilton International's Taita Hills Game Sanctuary.

Other improvements in the Taita Hills Game Sanctuary are also under way, such as upgrading the standard of roads and erecting new numerical reference points.

These reference points will act as guides to all drivers and visitors to enable them to find the game with ease.

In both Lodges, situated within the sanctuary, there is also a notice board with the latest game movement recorded on it, so a check before going out on a game drive can enable visitors to find the game quickly.

All these improvements and aids to this lovely Sanctuary, where lions, elephants and buffalo are seen daily, make it one of Kenya's best game viewing areas for both the professional safari driver and the individual who wants to do the driving ones self.

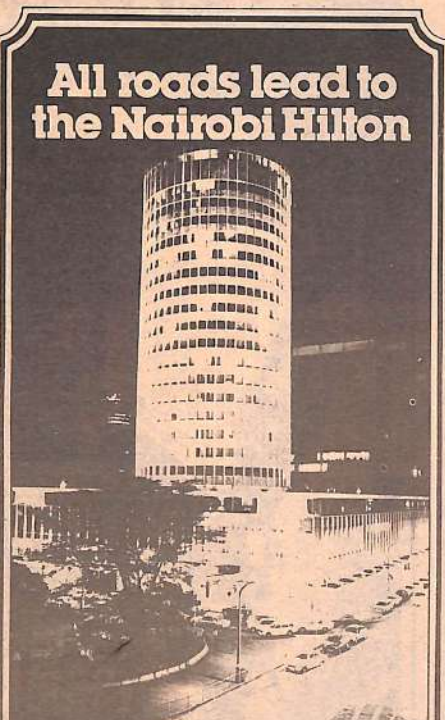

PROMISES OF HELP AND SYMPATHY FOR COAST TOUR TRADE

MOMBASA (KNA) An assistant Minister for Transport and Communication Mr Matere Keriri has disclosed that Provincial and District engineers in his ministry have been given a deadline to fill up potholes on the roads by end of October this year.

He said that those engineers who will not have completed their job by the deadline will be dealt with accordingly.

He was reacting to a questions from members of the Mombasa Coast Tourist Association at a meeting held at Mombasa Beach Hotel.

The members wanted to know what the government was doing to improve the conditions of roads at the coast which they said were literally disappearing.

Mr Keriri said his ministry was trying to improve the conditions of roads but added that this will depend on resource available. He said that roads were a major government asset and that they must be maintained, adding it was the governments policy to build roads and not to leave them unmaintained.

Members were particularly concerned with the conditions of the Mombasa Malindi, Mombasa-Nairobi, National Parks particularly the Taveta-Lotoktok road and the Lunga Lunga Shimoni roads.

Referring to the Lunga Lunga Shimoni road, the Minister asked the members to refer the case to the area member of parliament.

The permanent secretary in the ministry of water, Mr Japheth Kiti speaking at the same occasion said that Mombasa south coast will continue to have water supply problems until the second Mzima Spring under plans is completed.

He called on hoteliers in the area particularly Diani Beach to have large enough water storage tanks to help them have enough water for days when there is a water shortage in the area.

Mr Kiti called on people who put cottages and hotels in Diani Beach to consult his ministry before putting them up so that their places are catered for in the ministry's plans.

WATAMU WATER

He assured North Coast Hotels that Malindi and Watamu will have water by April or May next year, adding that the south coast will now under the new plan have seven boreholes instead of the present four, while Wasini Island is under plans to have water.

He said that steps have been under taken to cope with bursts on the pumps.

The deputy managing director for Kenya Airways, Mr J Okara said that passengers traveling between Nairobi and Mombasa have formed a habit of reporting to the Airport five or 10 minutes before departure time instead of one hour before thereby causing delays in the departure time.

Speaking at the same occasion, the Kenya Power and Lighting, chief distribution manager, Mr A L Kaitany called on people with electric sensitive equipments to look for voltage protection equipments to protect their equipments against surges in case of power failure.

The meeting was attended by, among others, the director of tourism and wildlife, Mr David Musila, Kenya Bus Service Limited Director Mr Maherali and the chairman of association Mrs Lorna Hayes.

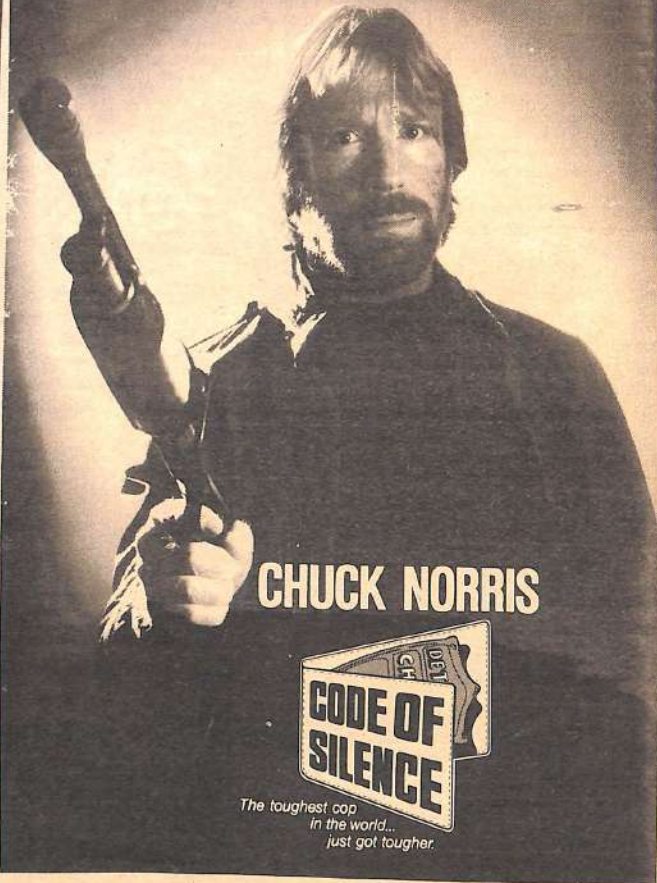

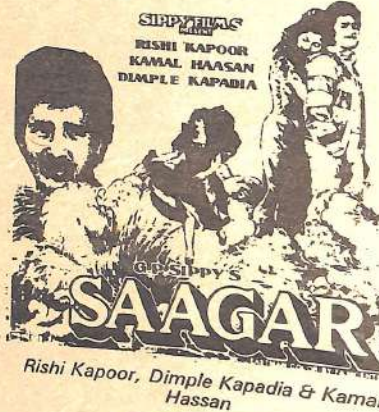

PLEASING YEAR OF PROGRESS AT PWANI ACADEMY

PWANI ACADEMY was started this year with Standards I and II.

This was a new concept in education with the school centrally located and with all modern utilities, namely central air-conditioning, good ventilation (with a breeze coming direct from the Indian Ocean) and, above all, perhaps, a happy atmosphere headed by a qualified and well-trained staff.

When this project took off at the beginning of the year some parents viewed the progress anxiously and skeptically but with solid efforts by our Management, the Academy has now established itself and the same parents have come to accept the concept.

From our point of view the Academy is doing very well and we are already receiving enquiries for Pre-Primary and Upper Primary Classes.

curriculum, our Management has the following to innovate in children the ability to express their talents: French, Music Appreciation (the school has its own Piano) and Art-Craft classes by specialised staff.

Another facility provided is Transport. This is given to lower-primary children when taking them to the swimming pool and P.E field, or when there are outings to places of educational interest. Such outings take place every term.

Despite Mombasa's heat and humidity the child does not suffer the usual lethargy at the end of the day, but is active and, in fact, eager to go to school the next day. This is attributed to the air-conditioning and good ventilation.

The school has also formed its Parents Teachers Association which has been formed to facilitate parents interest and their "say" in running of the school.

Fisheries Could Become A Major Sphere Of Economic Progress

THE DIRECTOR of Fisheries in the Ministry of Lands, Natural Resources and Tourism, Gisler Libaba, pointed out the lack of modern fishing gear as being a major drawback to the development of the fishing industry in the country. Presenting his paper on the development of the fishing industry in Tanzania at a biennial conference of regional fisheries officers, he pointed out he said that there was a particular problem in the availability of fishnets and spare-parts for boat and troller engines.

He told the conference that the adverse economic situation in the country was presently facing and the lack of foreign exchange were among the major factors which have contributed to the poor performance in exploiting the abundant fish resources. In the absence of modern equipment, many fishermen have resorted to traditional methods of fishing with the use of simple gears.

However the Director said that despite the equipment problem, fishermen were able to net some 240 million kilos of fish in 1983 worth some 2.2 billion shillings compared to the previous year when some 166 million was hauled which valued at 1.5 billion shillings.

It is reported that some international donor agencies have pledged to assist Tanzania in promoting her fishing industry and amongst these is the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) which is said to have agreed to provide financial aid amounting to some 2.5 million shillings for purchasing fishing gear to be sold to fishermen.

The United Kingdom is also providing fishing equipment through the Mtwaru-Lindi Rural Integrated Development Programme (RIDEP) under which fishnets are sold to fishermen in the two regions.

The national demand for fishnets has been estimated to be some three million units per year whereas the two fishnets manufacturing industries based in Mwanza and Dar-es-Salaam have a total capacity of producing about 900,000 units only.

During the conference the Government was urged to take a more vigilant action to curb dynamite fishing which reportedly is on an increase in the

survival of other species in the lake.

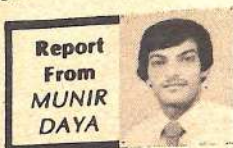
Meanwhile Tanzania and Malawi are planning to build a new bridge over the Kwira river in Mbeya Region to replace the one which was washed away by floods last March thereby seriously disrupting the use of the Ibanda-Karonga Road in handling Malawian exports and imports.

Ipyana Bridge

At present Malawian goods are ferried over Ipyana Bridge. In the process goods cover roughly some 44 kilometres before they are unloaded onto Malawian trucks in Songwe. The Ibanda bridge will reduce the distance by about 37 kilometres.

Malawian goods have been moving on the 18.8 million Ibanda Karonga road since its official opening in December last year. The road's construction was financed by the British government.

Ibanda is on the Tanzanian side and Karonga is on the Malawian side.

TANZANIANS GIVE A WARM SEND-OFF TO MWALIMU NYERERE

TANZANIANS say a fond Kwaheri to Mwalimu Nyerere and Karibu Ali Hassan Mwinyi in a historic and colourful swearing-in ceremony scheduled tomorrow in the capital Dar-Es-Salaam, which marks the end of 23 years of political leadership by Black Africa's most respected politician and thinker.

President Julius Kambarage Nyerere, 63, led nearly 7 million registered voters to the polls on Sunday to vote for the second Tanzanian President since Independence in 1961 and representatives to the 244-seat Union parliament.

Following a country-wide campaign drive headed by Nyerere himself, Mr. Ali Hassan Mwinyi was expected to receive a comfortable majority win, if not as large as the one his predecessor enjoyed during his tenure of presidency spanning nearly a quarter century.

The presidential voting results were expected to be announced yesterday or today in Dar-Es-Salaam.

60-year-old Mwinyi, former President of semi-autonomous Zanzibar, was nominated the sole presidential candidate by the Chama Cha Mapinduzi in August this year.

LAKE-SIDE HOME
Nyerere, who becomes the only third African leader to voluntarily surrender power in the history of post-independent Africa, will stay on for two years

as chairman of the Chama Cha Mapinduzi until its next election when he intends to retire to his lake-side home in north-west Tanzania.

Nyerere made his last visit to Kenya as the President of Tanzania last week and conferred with President Daniel Arap Moi.

Ali Hassan Mwinyi, who replaced the disgraced Aboud Jombe last year as the President of Zanzibar, is expected to pursue Nyerere's policies of Ujamaa, support for the liberation struggle in Southern Africa and the OAU, and continue with the quest for closer relations within the East African region.

Nyerere's departure from the political scene leaves President Moi as the sole leading figure in East African regional politics, marred by recent internal strife in Uganda.

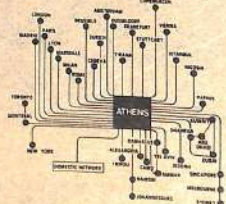

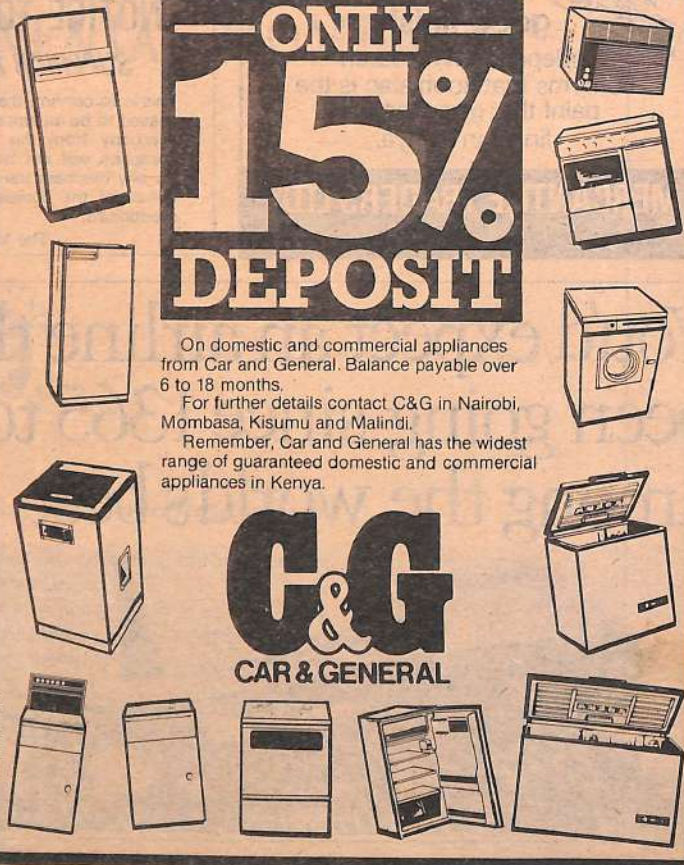

EXETER To The Rescue In The Farquahar Islands

A SERIOUS grounding on a coral reef has occurred in the Farquahar Islands (within the Seychelles Group of Islands) involving the 5 year old 2730 gross ton Greek semi container vessel *Lion of Piraeus* with a full cargo of cashewnuts from West Africa to India. The casualty occurred on Monday, 21st October when the Royal Navy destroyer H.M.S. Exeter, which was one of the squadron visiting Mombasa in August, was at hand and rescued the crew and was also able to carry out a useful survey of the damage.

Due to the weather and position of the stricken vessel being hard aground with lightening of cargo being near impossible, it would be safe to assume she is a total loss. Damage is such that in the extremely unlikely possibility of her refloating, she would probably break up when being towed to safe waters or a port of refuge.

I understand the Mombasa based Eagle tug *Black Eagle* is also present at the scene. An unfortunate end to a comparatively new ship.

The mention of salvage tugs reminds me to report the arrival last Saturday of the 1970 built *Apollon* owned by the well known Greek towage and salvage Company Tsavlis and Sons. After taking on bunkers at Shimanzi Oil Jetty she moved to Mtongwe Anchorage where she will be preparing to tow the dead ship *Kyriaki* now at M.4. buoys which readers will recall arrived in Mombasa on August 5th, having suffered a complete engine breakdown with a full cargo of Rice from India to West Africa.

The port has continued to remain well utilised of late, although some 8 or 9 heavy

loaders and dischargers are expected to sail this week.

A smart looking Turkish owned vessel, whose country's flag is rarely seen in Kilindini, is the *Celal Cesur* discharging 5000 tons fertiliser at No. 10 berth prior to loading Fluorspar at Mbaraki. Built in 1977 she is 3300 tons gross.

The third wheat discharger *Fairwind* is due to complete this week when she will thereafter await the local Mombasa Shipbreakers' yard.

Presently in port discharging-loading is a fine example of a British built and British owned multi-purpose cargo liner. I refer to the 5 year old 16500 ton gross *Myrmidon* one of a fleet of 'M' Class vessels suitable for containers or general cargo built for Ocean Fleets Ltd., Liverpool or which would have formerly been known as a Blue Funnel or 'Blue Flue' vessel until Elder Dempster Lines and Blue Funnel combined to form Ocean Transport and Trading Ltd.

On this occasion *Myrmidon* is on charter to mediterranean Shipping Company, one of the independent operators between Europe and East Africa. A sister ship the Cyprian registered *Normannia* (ex *Melampus*) was here a few months ago on charter to Nedlloyd.

This class, slowly disappearing from the British Registry, are conspicuous by having five large 'goal post' type derricks for cargo operations. *Myrmidon* will be loading and discharging concurrently at both the container terminal and general cargo berths.

Considerable interest has been aroused on the sale of the Tanzanian owned vessel *Rukwa* to Southern Engineering Company and an international Company known as LIDO Ltd. Monrovia for a reported \$315,000. She will presumably be towed to Mombasa for full examination to see whether or not it is economical to refit her for further trading.

Affirmatively drydocking will be required. Having been laid up in Dar es Salaam harbour for several years there must be grave doubts as to her condition even to reach Mombasa.

Purely from her age, a mere 14 years old, she is a good secondhand buy at the price quoted.

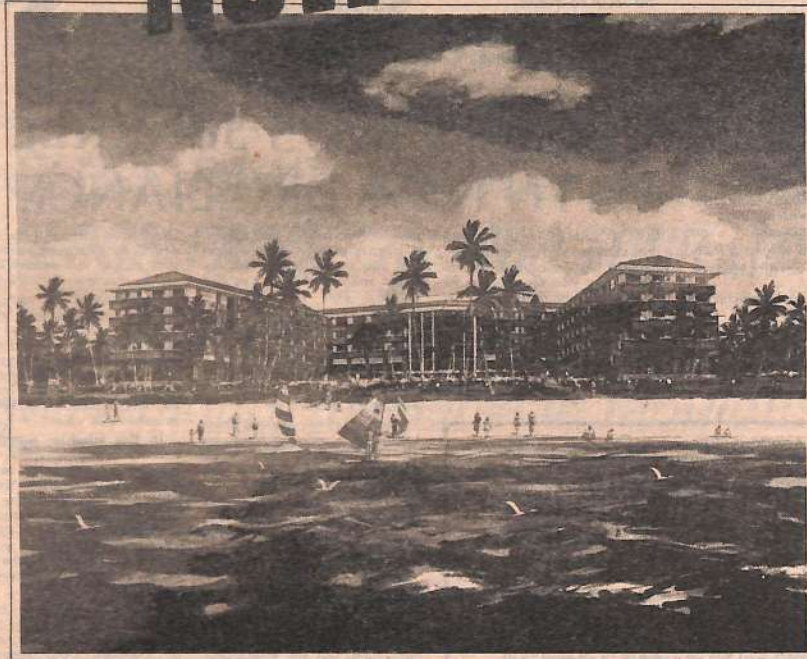

gations levelled against such member be instituted by the proposed National Disciplinary Committee.

On the issue of Youth Group of the party, the Minister of State in the Office of the President, Mr. Husein Maalim, who is also the Assistant Organizing Secretary informed the seminar that in some Districts in the Country Youth groups had been reported to usurp their power and take laws in their hands.

National Headquarters had received several complaints on this matter but he was happy to tell the Coast Province that not a single complaint had been received from any of the Districts at the Coast.

The Kilifi District Chairman, Mr. Francis Tuva who led his delegates to the seminar, at an interview with a VoK programme, presented many aspects of the District developments and expressed his happiness of their progress.

He particularly mentioned the cashew Nuts industry in the District whose factory celebrated its 10th Anniversary last week. He described cashewnut product as one of the District generating economic power.

Fish products provide the District with an appreciable economic return and means and ways were looked into to even improved greater productivity and better preserving facilities so that no catch get rotten.

He also expressed his deep appreciation on Touristic development at Kilifi District and indigenous residents benefit a great deal from this industry.

BAKARI MWAMZANDI

Similar appreciation has been expressed by the Kwale District Kanu Chairman, Mr. Bakari Mwamzandi who actually felt that Diani Area of the District does a flourishing business due to Tourist industry and the indigenous local residents are particularly happy with the mushrooming of international hotels at the Diani beaches.

The Tana-river District Kanu Chairman, Mr. Omar Soba who is also an Assistant Minister of Information and Broadcasting, at the VoK interview described Tana River as a district which is fast developing, particularly that the wananchi have been highly motivated with a two billion shilling Bura Irrigation Scheme and other projects which are taking place in the District.

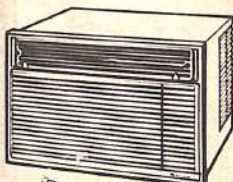
BEST HOTEL

The camp is situated on the lush banks of the Athi River with the stark Yatta Plateau behind. An air-strip runs past its back entrance making it easy for guests to fly in if they so desire.

Among its ardent supporters is the Skal Club of Mombasa which, last weekend, took over almost the entire camp for a weekend, most of them enjoying travelling together in a big bus with Roger Whittake entertaining with songs of Kenya (on tape) en-route.

Bus conductor and mine-host was Skal Chairman, Sean Gavaghan, who ensured that no one remained thirsty.

Skal is an international organisation bringing together, socially, leading personalities in the tourist industry.

An der Olympiade 1984 in Los Angeles gelangte Carlo Thranharat ins Finale und errang den achten Platz, obwohl er fünf Tage vorher beim Training seinen Knöchel verstaucht hatte.

Es war das erstmal, daß er an der Olympiade teilnehmen konnte, denn 1980 boykottierte die Bundesrepublik, solidarisch mit verschiedenen anderen Ländern, die Spiele als Protest gegen die Invasion in Afghanistan durch die Sowjetunion.

In Kenia schlug Carlo Thranharat im Hochsprung Dietmar Mogenburg, den Goldmedaillengewinner.

In einem Interview im Robinson Club Baobab gaben sie zu, daß sie hier vor allem faulzen. Als Entschuldigung erklärten sie, daß sie während zehn Monaten im Jahr zweimal täglich hart trainieren müssen.

DAS ZEITLOSE Mombasa wird demnächst eine eigene moderne Version des weltberühmten "Big Ben" in London erhalten, einen Uhrturm als neues Wahrzeichen der Stadt, der etwa eine halbe Million kenianische Schillinge kosten wird. Finanziert vom 41 Jahre alten Rotary Club von Mombasa, soll der Uhrturm direkt im Herzen der Mombasa-Insel an der Hauptkreuzung errichtet werden, dort wo die Moi Avenue, Digo Road, Nkrumah und Nyerere Straße zusammentreffen.

"Dieser neue Uhrturm wird nicht nur die Leute über die genaue Zeit informieren, sondern als modernes Symbol zusammen mit den in der näheren und fernerer Umgebung aufstrebenden Wolkenkratzern das neue Stadtbild prägen", sagte Mr. Abdulhamed Amin Aboo, Vorsitzender des ausführenden

Komitees des Rotary Clubs. Der Turm, mit Beton verkleidet und verziert, wird sich rund 8 m hoch erheben gegen das moderne Ambalal Bürohaus, den Biramur, die Heiligste Kathedrale und den geplanten Komplex der Elektrizitätsgesellschaft im Hintergrund.

"Mit den Bauarbeiten wird demnächst begonnen und wir hoffen, daß der Turm im Mai des nächsten Jahres fertiggestellt ist", erwähnte Mr. Aboo.

Die mit Sonnenenergie betriebene Uhr wiegt 50 kg. Sie ist ein Fabrikat von der weltberühmten Uhrenfabrik Seiko in Tokio, Japan, und wird als energiesparende Ausrüstung mit hoher Präzision beschrieben, die das Tageslicht mittels Solarbatterien in elektrische Energie umwandelt. Basierend auf der jahrelangen Erfahrung und bewährten Technologie von Seiko wurde die Uhr tropfenfest konstruiert, um dem feucht-heißen Klima von Mombasa standzuhalten. Sie benötigt nur einen Tag Sonnenlicht, um einen Monat lang Energie zu spenden.

Der Turm enthält in der Basis ein Kontrollsystem, das die sich auf allen vier Seiten befindlichen Uhren steuert. Die Zeiger sind aus Plastik mit schwarzem Aluminiumüberzug, die Zifferblätter milchig weiß mit schwarzen römischen Zahlen.

Wie Mr. Aboo bekanntgab, hat der Rotary Club die Architekten von Mombasa aufgefordert, ihre Entwürfe für einen solchen Uhrturm einzureichen. "Wir möchten, daß der Turm die Atmosphäre Mombasas wiedergibt als Hafenstadt und Touristenzentrum", fügte er hinzu.

Der Uhrturm ist die dritte öffentliche Zeitangabe, die in Mombasa in den letzten 80 Jahren installiert worden ist. Seit 1902 schlug die alte Uhr über dem Haupteingang des Gerichtsgebäudes einmal die Stunden in den frühen Jahren der Kolonialzeit und zeigte später gemeinsam mit der Uhr im früheren Hauptpostamt am Treasury Square, wie spät es ist.
