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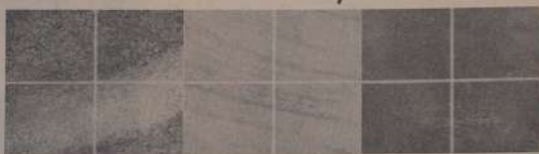
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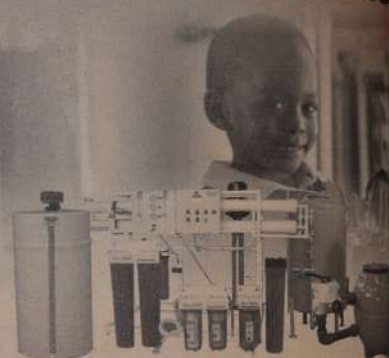
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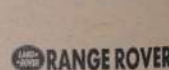

The trading in nil-paid rights will continue for the next two weeks and the Rights Issue will close on August 10th 2012.

The Rights Issue was authorized by the shareholders during the annual general meeting in May this year and subsequently received the mandatory Capital Markets approval on 19th June 2012.

With each share going for Ksh 74 for every eight held, DTB hopes to raise up to Ksh 1.8 billion which it plans to use on boosting its asset base.

With a sustained focus on growth strategies, the DTB Rights Issue is expected to raise

funds to enable the Bank's asset growth as well as investments in the branch network and alternative channels in Kenya.

EU Naval Force German And French Frigates Escort An 'AMISOM' Vessel



EU Naval Force – Operation Atalanta (EU NAVFOR) has provided protection from 04 to 13 July to a ship chartered for AMISOM (African Union Mission in Somalia) supplies.

The German frigate *Bremen* and the French navy frigate *Guepratte* took turns to carry out this mission, from the south Red Sea to Mogadishu.

The EU NAVFOR warship *FGS Bremen* took over the *MV Gigante*, a cargo vessel carrying equipments and supplies for AMISOM, in the southern Red Sea on 04 July.

After crossing the Strait of Bab el Mandeb and the Gulf of Aden, it was the turn of *FS Guepratte*, on 08 July, to take over off the Horn of Africa.

The *MV Gigante* arrived safely in Mogadishu on July 13, after skirting the coast of Somalia to avoid the effects of the monsoon which currently prevails in the Indian Ocean.

In Mogadishu, the protection task was officially transferred to an AMISOM security team by *Guepratte*.

Chartered by the UNSOA (United Nations Support Office for AMISOM), *Gigante* was transporting equipment to the African Union peace keeping force based in Mogadishu.

OPERATION HAS PROTECTED 127 RELIEF AID SHIPS

As with the World Food Programme vessels, protecting logistics for AMISOM is part of the mandated tasks of the EU Naval Force - Operation Atalanta and is part of the Comprehensive Approach of the European Union in the fight against piracy.

The aim of AMISOM is to support the Transitional Federal Government to foster stability in Somalia and the establishment of sustainable institutions, which are indeed the key factors in eliminating the scourge of piracy.

Since the operation began in December 2008, 127 ships carrying equipment for AMISOM were protected by force Atalanta.

Tuesday, June 26th 'Kuruwitu - Between a Rock and a Hard Place'

During the 60's and 70's Kuruwitu's coral reefs were regarded as the finest along the Kenyan coast.

Since then, over fishing by local fishermen, encouraged by the huge demand and high prices offered by the aquarium trade, caused severe degradation of the marine life.

The film is about how the local community, impoverished by the dwindling fish catch, decided to take steps to restore the reefs.

A 'no-fishing zone' encircling the reef was set up.

To ensure compliance the community kept an all round vigil.

Over a period of some eight years the once barren reef has been transformed and is now home to superb variety of fish and other marine life.

The inspiring thing is that the project was set up and is managed entirely by the local community.

They understood the cause of the degradation and took action without relying on government help or cash handouts.

After the screening Dickson Juma, an ex-fisherman who has been involved in the project since it started gave a brief update and answered a few questions from members.

Kuruwitu is a bio diversity hot spot, open to visitors and marine tourism is a major source of income for the local community.

There is a wide range of interesting activities such as snorkelling, glass bottom boat ride, dhow trips, deep-sea

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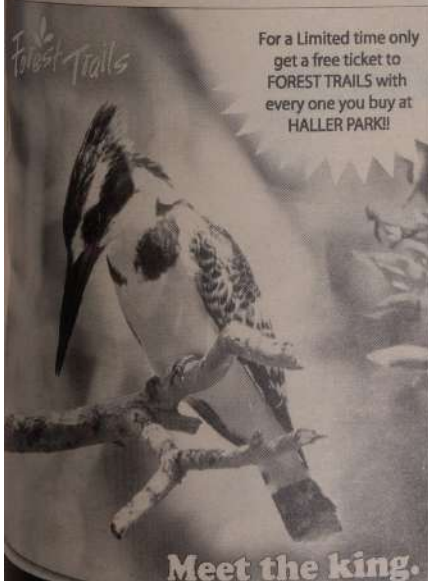

Qamar Secures Top Golf Prize

KENCONT CFS SPONSORED GOLF DAY AT NYALI CLUB

The importance of indicating one's handicap on the card was emphasised in this column last week.

Equally important are a few other basic rules that require strict compliance, turning up on the tee at one's designated time is one such rule.

In the golfing world, strict keeping of time is required not only because punctuality is considered as a virtue in itself, which it is, based as it is on the notion of consideration for others, but also due to the upset that lateness in arrival on the tee causes in the field and the flow of the game.

So important is this requirement that lateness is not excused and results in instant disqualification no matter how it was caused, whether due to just plain, simple tardiness or a genuine, unavoidable cause which will elicit sympathy for the player but no exception to the enforcement of the penalty.

Qamar Naqvi on his part dropped just three shots on the par four 16th added the two extra shots, ending with 2 over par gross of 37.

To pick up her 37 points, Diana had to make a gross of 81, which was the fourth overall in the entire field.

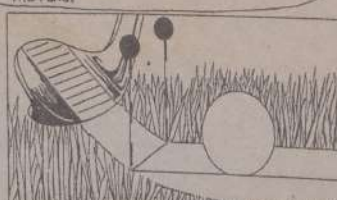
